REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR SUPPLY OF GRAVEL IN THE PARISH OF INGLEWOOD.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 1st November, 1937, as a site for the supply of gravel in the Parish of Inglewood.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
4. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
5. The owner of any horse, cattle, or other animals found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and in addition such horse, cattle, or other animals may be impounded.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
8. No person shall remove any stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the said Committee of such fees as the said Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid. Such fees shall not exceed the sum of One shilling per cubic yard of stone, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Before granting any person requesting such permission, a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid, and for due payment of fees for removal of such stone, earth, marl, or gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this Regulation shall be paid by the said Committee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of each half-year.

9. All gravel to be removed from the said Reserve, in accordance with the permission of the Committee of Management, shall be removed therefrom subject to and in accordance with the directions of the Engineer or Town Clerk of the Council of the Borough of Inglewood, provided that and subject to such directions all gravel shall be removed in a face and for the full depth of the deposit. No overburden shall be allowed to remain on the floor of the pit, but all such overburden shall be removed and deposited as directed by the Committee of Management. All trees, stumps, logs, roots, branches, and other debris shall be removed from the pit as they are reached and fall, and shall not be left standing on "islands."

The Council of the Borough of Inglewood has been appointed a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against these Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Tenders should be placed in the Lands Department Tender-box, State Treasury Buildings, Melbourne, C.2. at or before Noon on Wednesday, 23rd February, 1938.

NOTE.—No tender will be accepted unless the rent for the full period and fee of Seven shillings and Sixpence for licence are forwarded.

TENDERS will be accepted at or before Noon on Wednesday, 23rd February, 1938, for the right to depasture stock on the following unappropriated portions of lands subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council, and also the subjoined special conditions.

Every licence granted under section 121 of the *Land Act 1928* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

CONDITIONS.

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the *Land Acts*, except under the 121st section of the *Land Act 1928*, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council.

2. In case the said land, or any part thereof, should be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than that which the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Land Acts* may think fit.

3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miner's rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.

4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

6. 8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip-panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the *Land Act 1928* the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognized.

10. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.

11. The licence shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.

12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling or other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

A By-law of the City of Heidelberg, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and particularly under and with reference to section 197 (5) (b) and 197 (6) (a) and 228 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 119, for altering and amending By-law No. 74 and for repealing By-law No. 109, which prescribe areas within the municipal district as Residential Areas, and prohibit or regulate the erection of buildings therein and the use of such building for the purposes of trade, manufacture, and public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Heidelberg, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

2. That in lieu thereof By-law No. 74 be amended as follows:—
3. That all those areas or allotments of land having a frontage to either side of Heidelberg-road from the Merri Creek to Bond-street, Fairfield, situated between the street boundary lines and lines running parallel thereto and 200 feet distant therefrom, prescribed in By-law No. 74 as part of Residential Area number two be excised from the said Residential Area number two and added to Residential Area number one (also prescribed in By-law 74).
4. That all those areas or allotments of land having a frontage to either side of Heidelberg-road from Bond-street, Fairfield, to the Darebin Creek, Alphington, situated between the street boundary lines and lines running parallel thereto and 200 feet distant therefrom, prescribed in By-law No. 74 as part of Residential Area number two be excised from the said Residential Area number two and added to Residential Area number three (also prescribed in By-law 74).
5. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any building for any purposes for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership.
6. Should a business or trade, &c., established in a building prior to the coming into operation of this By-law and contrary to its provisions be removed, become defunct, or closed down, the Council may, on receipt of an application in writing, grant permission for the building to be used for such other purposes as the Council think reasonable in the circumstances.

2. After sub-clause 5 of clause No. 85 of By-law No. 7, there shall be added the following sub-clause No. 6:—

No. 6.—HEIGHT OF FENCES.

"No person shall on any private property, situate at the junction of streets or roads, erect or construct any fence which abuts on or is within 10 feet of such street or road unless such fence for a distance of 27 feet from the junction of such streets or roads is of a height of not more than 3 feet above the surface level of the street or road nearest to such fence."

3. For the purposes of the preceding clause 2 of this By-law, the word "junction" shall mean the point at which the building line of a street or road meets the building line of another street or road, and in cases where the corner has been rounded off or splayed the word "junction" shall mean and include the whole of the arc or line to which such corner has been rounded off or splayed.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Keilor at a meeting held on the 6th day of November, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and confirmed at a subsequent meeting of the said Council held on the 4th day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.

BY-LAW No. 23.

Hedges at Street Corners.

A By-law of the Shire of Keilor, made under the *Local Government Acts*, and numbered 23, for—

- (a) Regulating the use of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads for the growing of trees, shrubs, or hedges abutting on any such street or road, or within 10 feet therefrom;
- (b) requiring the removal or lopping of trees, shrubs, or hedges from or on private property so situate where such trees, shrubs, or hedges, abut on or are within 10 feet of such street or road; and
- (c) authorizing the council to remove or lop at the expense of the owner, trees, shrubs, or hedges growing or being on private property so situate which are not removed or lopped as required by or under this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts*, and of any other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Keilor order as follows:—

1. No person shall use any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads for the growing of any tree, shrub, or hedge abutting on any such street or road, or within 10 feet therefrom, unless for a distance of 27 feet from the junction of such streets or roads each part of such tree, shrub, or hedge is kept at a height not greater than 3 feet above that point on the surface level of the adjacent street or road which is nearest to such part of such tree, shrub, or hedge.

2. (a) Where any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads is used contrary to the provisions of clause 1 hereof, the Council of the said Shire of Keilor, at any time by notice, in writing, under the hand of the shire secretary of the said shire, may require the owner or occupier of such private property, within the time specified in such notice, to lop all trees, shrubs, or hedges (whether planted before or after the commencement of the *Local Government Act 1934*) growing contrary to clause 1 hereof on such private property where such trees, shrubs, or hedges abut on, or are within 10 feet of any such street or road in such manner that each part of such trees, shrubs, or hedges shall be kept at a height not greater than 3 feet above that point on the surface level of the adjacent street or road which is nearest to such part of such trees, shrubs, or hedges.

(b) Should default be made by such owner or occupier in complying with such notice within the time therein limited, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, the said Council may, by its surveyor, enter upon such private property so situate as aforesaid with a sufficient number of workmen and lop any trees, shrubs, or hedges growing or being thereon which are not lopped as required by such notice, and the expenses incurred by the said Council in so doing shall be forthwith paid by the owner of such private property to the said Council, and in default of such payment, may be recovered by the said Council in a Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

3. Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £1 for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order is imposed or made on or against such person by any Court.

4. In this By-law the word "junction" shall mean the point at which the building line of a street or road meets the building line of another street or road, and in cases where the corner has been rounded off or splayed the word "junction" shall mean and include the whole of the arc or line to which such corner has been rounded off or splayed, and the words "surface level" shall mean—

- (a) Where the footway on that side of the street or road which abuts on the private property in question is paved, the level of that part of the paved portion of such footway nearest to the private property in question.
- (b) If such footway is not paved, but the level of the street or road abutting on such private property has been fixed in accordance with the provisions of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government*

Act 1928, or any previous or subsequent Act of Parliament of a like nature, the level as so fixed of that part of such street or road nearest to the private property in question.

(c) Otherwise, the actual level of that part of the street or road nearest to the private property in question.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.

6. This By-law shall come into operation immediately on its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
