## ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 3, 6, 7, and 8 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

CONSTITUTION OF A MEAT AREA.—SALE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation revoke my Proclamation of the twenty-fifth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the twenty-sixth day of October of the year above mentioned, in so far as it relates to the Sale Meat Area, and hereby proclaim the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, as the date on which the Sale Meat Area shall be deemed to have been constituted.

PROHIBITION OF THE USE OF A SPEAR, ETC., FOR TAKING FLOUNDERS IN THE WATERS OF CORNER INLET AND PORT ALBERT AND ADJACENT WATERS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation prohibit during the whole of each year the use of a spear or other similar contrivance for taking flounders in the waters of Corner Inlet and Port Albert and adjacent waters within or inside a line bearing north 36 degrees east (magnetic) from the south end of Rabbit Island to the eastern bank of the entrance to Shallow Inlet.

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I E. J. MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the Regulations (hereinafter called "the principal Regulations") made by the Commissioners on the 12th day of November, 1930, approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of December, 1930, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of December, 1930, and any Regulations amending the same.

2. The following Regulation is hereby substituted for Regulation 24A of the principal Regulations:—

(1) No vessel moored in the River Yarra or Victoria Dock shall leave its berth without the permission of the officer in charge of the Control Station at Dockhead, nor when the following signals are exhibited:—

(a) SIGNAL FOR VESSELS MOORED IN THE RIVER YARRA—  
*In Day Time.*—A ball suspended from the yard-arm at the Dockhead Control Station, height 45 feet.

*In Night Time.*—A single flashing red light every 5 seconds, thus: Flash 1.0 second, eclipse 4.0 seconds—exhibited on the mast at the Dockhead Control Station, height 50 feet.

(b) SIGNAL FOR VESSELS MOORED IN VICTORIA DOCK—  
*In Day Time.*—A cone suspended from the yard-arm at the Dockhead Control Station, height 45 feet.

*In Night Time.*—A double flashing red light every 7.5 seconds, thus: Flash 1.0 second, eclipse 1.0 second, flash 1.0 second, eclipse 4.5 seconds—exhibited on the mast at the Dockhead Control Station, height 50 feet.

(c) SIGNALS FOR VESSELS MOORED IN RIVER YARRA AND VICTORIA DOCK—

*In Day Time.*—Both signals exhibited as described in (a) and (b).

*In Night Time.*—A triple flashing red light every 10 seconds, thus: Flash 1.0 second, eclipse 1.0 second, flash 1.0 second, eclipse 5.0 seconds—exhibited on the mast at the Dockhead Control Station, height 50 feet.

(2) No vessel moored in Maribyrnong River shall leave its berth without the permission of the officer in charge of the Control Station at Dockhead.

Unless they are towing barges or other vessels this regulation shall not apply to self-propelled vessels of less than the following dimensions:—

Length, between perpendiculars, 130 feet.  
Breadth, 26 feet.

## NURSES BOARD.

## AMENDMENTS TO THE NURSES REGULATIONS.

THE Nurses Board of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 29 of the Nurses Act 1928, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, do hereby make the following Regulations, which shall come into force on publication in the Government Gazette:—

**FURTHER AMENDMENT OF BOOT TRADES REGULATIONS (No. 2).**

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. Regulation 8 of the Boot Trades Regulations (No. 2) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as on and from the 1st January, 1939.

2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person, or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulation, before the commencement of these Regulations.

5th year—at the rate of 43s. 3d. per week.  
6th year (for the first six months)—at the rate of 50s. 6d. per week.  
(for the second six months)—at the rate of 58s. 6d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

1st year—at the rate of 18s. 9d. per week.  
2nd year—at the rate of 27s. 0d. per week.  
3rd year—at the rate of 36s. 0d. per week.  
4th year—at the rate of 42s. 3d. per week.  
5th year (for the first six months)—at the rate of 50s. 6d. per week.  
(for the second six months)—at the rate of 58s. 6d. per week.

(c) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of four years—

1st year—at the rate of 18s. 9d. per week.  
2nd year—at the rate of 27s. 6d. per week.  
3rd year—at the rate of 36s. 0d. per week.  
4th year (for the first six months)—at the rate of 50s. 6d. per week.  
(for the second six months)—at the rate of 58s. 6d. per week.

*Route No. 32 (Night Route).*—Under the heading "Timetables to be observed" delete the words "First omnibus to leave Camberwell-road 12.30 a.m., City 1 a.m." and insert in place thereof the words "First omnibus from City to leave City at 12.45 a.m.; first omnibus from Camberwell-road to leave from there at 1.15 a.m."

Also delete "4 a.m." and insert in place thereof "3.45 a.m."

His Excellency doth by this Order also provide that certain other prescribed routes, on which motor omnibuses are not licensed to operate, viz., Routes Nos. 19A, 50A, 51A, 70A, 72A, 85A, 86A, 88A, and 91A, shall be deemed to have been cancelled and abolished as from and inclusive of the seventeenth day of December, 1938, and that the respective Orders in Council by which such routes and the conditions in respect of them were prescribed shall be deemed to have been revoked from and inclusive of that date accordingly.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 46 (b) of the Education Act 1928, and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby make the following Regulation:—

## REGULATION IV. (G).—INTERMEDIATE CERTIFICATE.

1. The Intermediate Certificate shall be issued to qualified candidates from schools approved for the purpose by the Director or from other schools in accordance with the conditions mentioned hereunder.

2. Candidates from schools approved for the purpose by the Director shall satisfy the following conditions, namely:—

- (a) They shall have completed an approved course of study for two years from Grade VI. in elementary schools either—
  - (i) in Forms F and E in a secondary school, or
  - (ii) in Grades VII. and VIII. in an elementary school situated more than 5 miles from a secondary school.
- (b) They shall have been in attendance for a full school year in Form D and have completed 80 per cent. of the possible attendances, or shall have submitted to the Director satisfactory medical evidence that they have been prevented by illness from completing 80 per cent. of the possible attendances.
- (c) They shall have completed successfully the third year of the prescribed course, provided that any year of the course of study prescribed for district high schools, higher elementary schools, girls' schools, central schools, central classes, junior technical schools, and elementary schools may be deemed by the Director to be equivalent to a corresponding year's work, or portion thereof, in the prescribed course for such certificate and be accepted as part of that course.
- (d) They shall have been recommended by the Head of the school and shall have been approved by the Director.
- (e) They shall submit a certificate from the Head of the school stating that—

(i) they have pursued all the subjects of an approved course of study for three years from Grade VI. in elementary schools and have made satisfactory progress in such subjects; and

(ii) they have been recommended for a pass in English (3rd year) and—

1. In any five other subjects in Group A as set out in clause 5 below; or
2. In any four other subjects in Group A as set out in clause 5 below and have completed successfully an approved course of not less than four periods per week in one subject in Group B as set out in clause 5 below; or
3. In any three other subjects in Group A as set out in clause 5 below and have completed successfully an approved course of not less than four periods per week in each of any two subjects in Group B as set out in clause 5 below.

3. Candidates from schools other than those mentioned in clause 2 above shall satisfy the following conditions, namely:—

- (a) They shall have passed, under prescribed conditions, an examination based on the course of study for Form D in district high schools or its approved equivalent.
- (b) They shall have pursued all the subjects of an approved course of study for three years from Grade VI. in elementary schools and shall have made satisfactory progress in such subjects.
- (c) They shall have passed in English (3rd year) and—
  1. In any five other subjects in Group A as set out in clause 5 below; or
  2. In any four other subjects in Group A as set out in clause 5 below and have completed successfully an approved course of not less than four periods per week in one subject in Group B as set out in clause 5 below; or
  3. In any three other subjects in Group A as set out in clause 5 below and have completed successfully an approved course of not less than four periods per week in each of any two subjects in Group B as set out in clause 5 below.

4. The subjects of the course for the Intermediate Certificate shall include the following and/or such others as may from time to time be determined by the Director and announced in the Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid, namely:—

English, languages other than English, history and civics, arithmetic and mensuration, algebra, geometry, geography, general science (physical and biological), agricultural science, commercial principles and practice (3rd year only), drawing, art crafts, musical perception, woodwork, sheetmetal work, carpentry (3rd year only), cardboard development, blacksmithing (3rd year only), home management (including cookery and laundry), needlework, dressmaking, millinery (3rd year only), physical education and hygiene, provided that the course in each of the three years shall include the subjects of English, arithmetic, physical education and hygiene.

5. The groups of subjects for examination in the third year shall be the following and/or such others as may from time to time be determined by the Director and announced in the Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid, namely:—

## Group A.—

English, any language other than English, history and civics, arithmetic and mensuration, algebra, geometry, geography, general science (physical and biological), agricultural science, commercial principles and practice (3rd year only), drawing, and musical perception.

## Group B.—

Art crafts, woodwork, sheetmetal work, carpentry (3rd year only), cardboard development, blacksmithing (3rd year only), home management (including cookery and laundry), needlework, dressmaking, and millinery (3rd year only).

And the Honorable Sir John R. Harris, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## SHIRE OF DONCASTER AND TEMPLESTOWE.

## BY-LAW No. 6.

A By-law of the Shire of Doncaster and Templestowe made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and Section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, and numbered Six, for or with respect to—

- (a) the placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footpaths, and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footpaths, for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances;
- (b) the granting, renewal, and transfer of licences and applications thereof;
- (c) licences and conditions to be contained in licences;
- (d) prescribing fees—
  - (1) for the granting or renewal of a licence,
  - (2) for the transfer of a licence;
- (e) providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and
- (f) insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Doncaster and Templestowe order as follows:—

## 1. In this By-law—

“Council” shall mean the Council of the Shire of Doncaster and Templestowe.

“Licence” shall mean a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

“Licensee” shall mean the holder for the time being of a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

“Municipality” shall mean the municipality of the Shire of Doncaster and Templestowe.

“Petrol Pump” shall mean any pump for supplying motor spirit and shall include a portable petrol pump.

“Portable petrol pump” shall mean a petrol pump which is constructed on wheels and is not fixed in or on the footpath and is not allowed to remain on the footway.

“Regulations” shall mean the regulations from time to time made and in force under the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

2. Any person may apply for a licence in respect of any petrol pump placed or to be placed in, on, or under any footpath in any highway within the municipal district of Doncaster and Templestowe used or to be used by such person for the purpose of the business carried on or to be carried on by such person of selling or supplying motor spirit. Every such application shall be in the form of the first schedule to this By-law. Every licence granted shall be in the form of the second schedule to this By-law.

3. It shall be the duty of every person to whom a licence has been granted under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* to maintain in a safe and efficient condition and free from leakage and in accordance with this By-law all petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footpaths for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps.

4. Every licence shall expire on the 30th day of September next following the date of issue, and shall after such 30th day of September be of no force and effect—

- (a) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a petrol pump other than a portable petrol pump in or on any footway a licence fee of One pound one shilling per annum.
- (b) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a portable petrol pump which is used on any footway for the purpose of selling or supplying motor spirit a licence fee of One pound one shilling per annum.
- (c) Provided that where a licence is granted for any number of months less than twelve months a proportionate reduction of the fee based on the number of months unexpired shall be made by the Council.

5. No licence or renewal of a licence or transfer of a licence shall be granted unless the fee prescribed in such case has first been paid.

6. Where a licence granted under the provisions of this By-law is about to expire the Council may, upon application being made to it in the form of the third schedule to this By-law, renew such licence for a further term of one year.

7. Every application for a renewal of a licence shall be lodged with the Council at least fourteen days before the expiration of the licence and shall be accompanied by the annual licence fee hereinbefore prescribed.

8. The Council may refuse to grant or renew or transfer any licence where the pump in respect of which an application for a licence or transfer or renewal of a licence is made is

not placed or proposed to be placed in front of premises occupied or to be occupied by the applicant for the purpose of carrying on the business of selling or supplying motor spirit.

9. No licence shall be transferred save in accordance with the following provisions. The person desiring to transfer the licence shall first make application, in writing, to the Council for the approval of the Council to such transfer and shall enclose with such application a transfer of the licence, in writing, signed by the licensee and an acceptance of such transfer (conditional upon the approval of the Council being granted thereto) by the transferee and shall pay to the Council a transfer fee of Ten shillings.

10. Immediately on the approval by the Council of any transfer of licence being given the policy of insurance herein-after referred to taken out by the transferor shall be transferred to the transferee or the transferee shall effect a new policy in a company of repute to the same effect.

11. Every licensee under the provisions of this By-law shall, before the petrol pump is erected in respect of which such licence is granted or if erected prior to the application before the petrol pump is used for the sale or supply of motor spirit, insure himself and thereafter at all times keep himself insured during the currency of such licence and any renewal thereof in some insurance company of good repute against all damages and liabilities for which he may become liable to any person arising from the use, control, or possession by him of such petrol pump in the sum of at least £500. Every licensee shall produce on demand to the Council or any duly appointed officer of the Council, the said policy of insurance and the receipts for the premium for the then unexpired period of licence.

12. A licensee shall make good any damage to conduit, drains, or pipes under any footpath caused by or arising from the installation or removal of a petrol pump, or any part thereof, or any apparatus, pipes, or appliances for the supply of motor spirit to such pump and shall make good any portion of the footway broken up for the purpose of such installation or removal.

13. Every licensee whose licence shall have expired and has not been renewed or whose licence shall have been cancelled under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* shall, within seven days after such expiring or cancellation, remove the petrol pump referred to in such licence and all apparatus, pipes, and appliances connected therewith in, on, or under the footway.

14. No licensee shall cause or permit the petrol pump in respect of which his licence is granted or the apparatus, pipes, or appliances connected therewith to be altered in design or position without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

15. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Doncaster and Templestowe.

2. No child (as defined by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928*) shall be employed as a street hawker or itinerant trader or be permitted to manage or occupy a stand in any such street, road, or public place.

3. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for a first offence to a penalty of not less than £10 nor more than

£20, and for any second or subsequent offence to a penalty of not less than £15 nor more than £20, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of £10 for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court.
