REVOCATION OF APPOINTMENT OF PUBLIC HOLIDAY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued on the 12th day of October, 1937, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th day of October, 1937, Tuesday, the 8th day of February, 1938, was appointed, under the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 137 of the *Public Service Act 1928*, for a public holiday throughout the north and south ridings of the Shire of Metcalfe: And whereas it is made to appear to me expedient that the said Tuesday, the 8th day of February, 1938, should not be a public holiday throughout the said portions of the said municipality: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Public Service Acts, do by this my Proclamation declare that the said

REVOCATION OF APPOINTMENT OF BANK
HALF-HOLIDAY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Box Hill has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been used as streets and right-of-ways within the said city, be so declared to be public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the lands used as streets and right-of-ways hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Box Hill aforesaid, to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

*Fifthly.—*Commencing at a point on the east boundary of View-street, distant 125 feet southerly from Windsor-crescent; thence by a line bearing east 263 ft. 3 in. to a point on the west boundary of Theodore-street, distant 125 feet southerly from the south boundary of Windsor-crescent; thence along Theodore-street bearing south 12 feet; thence by lines bearing west 119 ft. 10 in., south-west 8 ft. 6 in., south 282 ft. 1½ in., east 6 ft. 6 in., south 49 ft. 1 in., south 89 deg. 55 min., west 25 feet, north 49 ft. 1 in., east 6 ft. 6 in., north 282 ft. 1½ in., north-west 8 ft. 6 in., and west 119 ft. 5 in.; and thence along View-street bearing north 12 feet to the commencing point.

HOLIDAYS FOR CERTAIN TRADES.

(1) On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Brushmakers Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The twenty-sixth day of February, 1938, shall, in the Metropolitan district, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for every person employed in the process, trade, or business of a brush-maker.

(2) On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Hairdressers Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The eighth day of March, 1938, shall, in the Metropolitan and Geelong districts, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in the business of a hairdresser or barber, or other workers of hair, or employed at—

- (a) hair or scalp treatment;
- (b) toilet work.

(3) On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Shops Board No. 17 (Tobacconists), doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The eighth day of March, 1938, shall, in the Metropolitan district, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in tobacconists' shops.

The sixteenth day of February, 1938, shall, in the Geelong district, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in tobacconists' shops.

(4) On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Pastrycooks Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The fifteenth day of February, 1938, shall, in the Metropolitan and Geelong districts, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for every person employed in the process, trade, or business of a pastrycook.

(5) On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Carriage Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The twenty-sixth day of February, 1938, shall, in the Metropolitan district, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in the process, trade, or business connected with or incidental to the manufacturing, making, or repairing of—

- (a) carriages, carts, and other vehicles (other than perambulators), or any part or parts thereof, such as the ironwork or bodies, hoods, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tires, rims, hubs, or spokes;
- (b) motor car bodies, or any part or parts thereof, such as the hoods or cushions;
- (c) tram cars, or any part or parts thereof, such as the ironwork or bodies, cushions, springs, axles, wheels, tires, rims, hubs, or spokes;
- (d) motor cycle side-car bodies, or any part or parts thereof, such as the hoods or cushions;
- (e) aircraft.

ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF THE TINSMITHS BOARD AND OF THE ELECTROPLATERS BOARD.

Play upon Musical Instrument.

(No. 2) No person upon any street or footway shall—

(a) sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or

(b) sing or harangue,

so as to cause annoyance or obstruction to or so as to be calculated to cause such annoyance or obstruction to any other person upon such street or footway or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto.

(No. 3) No owner or occupier of any land or premises within the borough shall, within the hearing of any person being upon any street or footway or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto, make or cause or permit or suffer to be made upon such first-mentioned land or premises (whether by means of any electrical wireless set, gramophone, piano-player, or otherwise) any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound such as may be calculated to cause annoyance to any such other person as aforesaid.

Owner or Occupier not to Make or Permit Loud Outcry, &c.

(No. 4) (1) No owner or occupier of any land or premises within the borough shall upon such land or premises, within the hearing of any person upon any street or footway or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto—

(a) make any loud outcry or noise or sound or play upon any musical instrument or cause or permit or suffer any person so to do; or

(b) cause or permit or suffer any sound or noise to be emitted from any electrical wireless set, gramophone, piano-player, or other instrument so as to cause annoyance to or as to be calculated to cause annoyance to any such other person as aforesaid.

(2) Any person other than such owner or occupier operating such wireless set, gramophone, piano-player, or other instrument as aforesaid, or otherwise concerned in the making of such outcry, noise, or sound as aforesaid, shall also be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

(No. 5) No person upon any street or footway shall, after being required by any member of the Police Force or by any officer of the Council or by any inmate of any house within 50 yards of such person, to desist—

(a) sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or

(b) sing or harangue.

Penalties.

Any contravention of the foregoing provision by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

Every person who is guilty of offence against this By-law shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
