REGULATIONS.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Acts and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*. His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Workers' Compensation Board Regulations (No. 1)", and shall come into operation on the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Whenever it is necessary by virtue of sub-section (4) (b) of section 2 of the *Workers' Compensation Act 1937* to make a joint nomination of a person for appointment as a member of the Workers' Compensation Board, the Chief Secretary shall forward to the Accident Underwriters' Association of Victoria, by post in a prepaid envelope addressed to the secretary thereof at its address, a notice in the form or to the effect of Form 1 of the Schedule hereto; and shall forward to The Victorian Employers' Federation, by post in a prepaid envelope addressed to the secretary thereof at its address, a notice in the form or to the effect of Form 2 of the said Schedule. The Chief Secretary shall forward such notices on the same day.

3. Upon receipt of a notice pursuant to and in accordance with paragraph 2 of these Regulations—

- (a) the secretary of the Accident Underwriters' Association of Victoria shall convene a meeting of insurers under the *Workers' Compensation Act 1928* for the purpose of selecting five representatives to confer with representatives of the members of the governing body of The Victorian Employers' Federation; and
- (b) the secretary of The Victorian Employers' Federation shall convene a meeting of the members of the governing body thereof for the purpose of selecting five representatives to confer with representatives of the said insurers.

4. (a) The persons selected pursuant to paragraph 3 of these Regulations shall confer respecting the person to be nominated jointly by the insurers under the *Workers' Compensation Act 1928* and the members of the governing body of The Victorian Employers' Federation for appointment as a member of the Workers' Compensation Board.

(b) The persons so selected, or a majority of such persons, shall nominate a person for appointment as a member of the Workers' Compensation Board who shall for the purposes of sub-section (4) (b) of section 2 of the *Workers' Compensation Act 1937* be the person nominated jointly by the insurers under the *Workers' Compensation Act 1928* and the members of the governing body of The Victorian Employers' Federation for appointment as a member of the Workers' Compensation Board.

5. A joint nomination in accordance with the foregoing provisions of these Regulations shall be—

- (a) made in the form or to the effect of Form 3 of the Schedule hereto;
- (b) signed by the persons selected to confer as aforesaid or a majority of such persons; and
- (c) posted by registered letter or delivered to the Chief Secretary within twenty-one days from the date of the above-mentioned notices.

6. If a joint nomination in accordance with the foregoing provisions of these Regulations is not made within the time therein prescribed, the insurers under the *Workers' Compensation Act 1928* and the members of the governing body of The Victorian Employers' Federation shall be deemed to have failed, neglected, or refused to nominate a person for appointment as a member of the Workers' Compensation Board.

7. (a) For the purpose of the nomination by virtue of sub-section (4) (c) of section 2 of the *Workers' Compensation Act 1937* of a person for appointment as a member of the Workers' Compensation Board, the Chief Secretary shall forward to the President of the Melbourne Trades Hall Council by post in a prepaid envelope a notice in the form or to the effect of Form 4 of the Schedule hereto.

(b) The President of the Melbourne Trades Hall Council or the person for the time being performing the duties of President shall, after being authorized by a majority of the members of the said Council present at a meeting called for the purpose, nominate some person for appointment as a member of the Workers' Compensation Board.

Such nomination shall be in the form or to the effect of Form 5 of the Schedule hereto signed by the President of the Melbourne Trades Hall Council or the person for the time being performing the duties of President, and posted by registered letter or delivered to the Chief Secretary within twenty-one days from the date of the above-mentioned notice.

(c) Should the aforesaid nomination be not received within such time, the members of the Melbourne Trades Hall Council shall be deemed to have failed, neglected, or refused to nominate a person for appointment as a member of the Workers' Compensation Board.

8. The members of the Workers' Compensation Board (other than the Chairman) shall each be paid a salary at the rate of Seven hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

9. The members of the Workers' Compensation Board shall receive travelling allowances according to the following rates:—

The Chairman—such allowance as is payable to a County Court Judge and with such conditions as apply thereto.

Each member (other than the Chairman)—such allowance and subject to such conditions as are prescribed by Regulations under the Public Service Acts relating generally to travelling allowances to officers of the Public Service.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "ELWOOD RESERVES."**

**W**HEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and to rescind any Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as

aforesaid, doth hereby rescind clauses numbered 22 and 25 of the Regulations made by the Board on the 8th September, 1937, and notified in the *Government Gazette* of 15th September, 1937, for certain areas of Crown lands reserved by Orders in Council of 20th November, 1882, 30th November, 1915, 7th July, 1911, and 7th April, 1937, as sites for Public Recreation in the City of St. Kilda, at Elwood, and known as the "Elwood Reserves": And doth also hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said "Elwood Reserves," hereinafter referred to as "the Reserves":

**REGULATIONS.**

No motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle shall be driven or ridden over any portion of the Reserves, or any of them, except the main carriage road between the Marine-parade and the Ormond-esplanade, and known as Bluff-road, and the carriage road laid down through the Reserves on the line of Barkly-street produced from Ormond-esplanade to Bluff-road, and the macadamized area in that portion of the Reserve between the Elwood Bowling Green and St. Kilda-street.

No person shall put, lead, or drive any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs into, over, or through the Reserve or any of them, and no person shall put, lead, ride, or drive any horse or horses into, over, or through the Reserves or any of them except the main carriage-road between the Marine-parade and the Ormond-esplanade, and known as Bluff-road, and the carriage-way laid down through the Reserves on the line of Barkly-street produced from Ormond-esplanade to Bluff-road and the macadamized area in that portion of the Reserve between the Elwood Bowling Green and St. Kilda-street, provided, however, that horses may be led or ridden along the riding track formed in that portion of the Reserves bounded by Ormond-esplanade, Head-street, and the macadamized roadway formed south-east of the Elwood Croquet Lawns. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Regulation no person shall lead, ride, or drive any horse in a manner likely to endanger the safety or comfort of any person using the Reserves.

The Council of the City of St. Kilda has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

## PRIVATE ADVERTISEMENTS.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF MARYBOROUGH, AND KNOWN AS "PRINCES PARK."

WHEREAS by section 182 of the *Land Act* 1928 it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 14 of such Act, and has vested such land in trustees, or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 182, *Land Act* 1928: And whereas two Crown grants have issued, one in favour of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Maryborough, and the other in favour of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Maryborough and the Board of Land and Works in respect of the areas reserved by Orders in Council of 26th October, 1863, and 23rd January, 1895, for public recreation in the Municipal District of Maryborough, Parish of Maryborough, and known as "Princes Park," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve": Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and the Burgesses of the Borough of Maryborough do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said Reserve in lieu of all Regulations heretofore in force, which are hereby annulled.

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be parcelled out in the following divisions, namely:—

- (a) The grandstand and enclosure
- (b) Sports arena.
- (c) Tennis courts.
- (d) Lake Victoria.
- (e) The remainder of the Reserve.

2. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, except as hereinafter provided, but no person shall be allowed to enter the first or second divisions or to make use of any of the improvements effected on the Reserve on days on which a charge is not being made for admission without the consent of the Trustees first obtained.

3. No person shall—

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
- (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
- (c) use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve;
- (d) offer any articles of food or drink, or any other commodity whatsoever, for sale, or bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Trustees first obtained.
- (e) ride bicycles or horses or drive vehicles on footpaths in the Reserve or embankment around the oval;
- (f) obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed at the Reserve;
- (g) climb, jump, get on or over any of the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, or stick bills or advertisements or cut names thereon; or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, furniture or fittings, gates, stiles, fences, seats, or other structures in the Reserve;
- (h) interfere with, break, or remove, or damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs, or plants, or pluck any of the flowers or walk on the beds or borders in the Reserve;
- (i) leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse or rubbish whatever, therein, nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein, or leave anything therein that might injure any person;
- (j) light a fire in the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Trustees;
- (k) carry or discharge any firearms or airguns in the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any game or birds therein without the consent of the Trustees first obtained;
- (l) spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve;
- (m) erect any building, tent, or structure, or camp on any portion of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Trustees;
- (n) bring into the Reserve any dog unless under effective control by means of chain, leash, or cord, without the permission of the Trustees;

(o) do anything whatsoever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money, without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

Every person infringing this regulation in any respect shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable.

4. No person shall row, sail, propel, or use any canoe, boat, or other water craft in the Reserve without the permission of the Trustees.

5. No person shall damage or unlawfully remove or interfere with the beaching around the shore of the lake in the Reserve, nor shall any person dig or cut away any embankment, road, or earthwork or any part thereof in the Reserve.

6. The Trustees shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, or person for the purposes of holding fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows, or sports, or for athletic training or other physical training, subject to payment of such fees, and on such terms and conditions as they may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinafter provided.

7. No club, association, or person shall hold or take part in any game or sport of any description, entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written permission of the Trustees first obtained.

8. No club or association of any kind having for its object physical recreation, or any number of members of any club or association, nor any other person shall play, practise, train, or engage in any game or sport or athletic exercise within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play in the Reserve at such time. Provided that any person not otherwise offending against these Regulations may enter on the Reserve, and play tennis thereon, on paying to the club or association for the time being having authority from the Trustees to occupy the Reserve or any part thereof, or to the Trustees a court fee not exceeding One shilling (1s.) per day or part thereof or of Five shillings (5s.) per week.

9. No person except the Trustees or their officers and employees on duty shall enter part of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fees chargeable for admission, except as hereinafter provided.

10. The Trustees may from time to time select portions of the Reserve for the parking of cars, vehicles, and for the tethering of horses, and no car, vehicle, or horse shall be parked or tethered on any portion of the Reserve other than in the portions set apart for the purpose. A charge not exceeding One shilling per day may be made for admission of any car, vehicle, or horse to the Reserve on such days only as a charge is being made for admission as hereinafter provided.

11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, carnivals, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit such sum as the Trustees may at any time determine not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and the Trustees in their absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the said Trustees.

12. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve or any part thereof on such days not exceeding thirty in any one year as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, carnivals, or holiday amusements shall be as follows:—

- (a) For admission of each adult person to the grandstand and enclosure, such sum as the Trustees may determine not exceeding Five shillings (5s.).
- (b) For admission of each adult person to the remainder of the Reserve, such sum as the Trustees may determine not exceeding Two shillings (2s.).

Provided always that the Trustees may exempt any member of a sporting club or association wholly or partially from the payment of all or any of the charges or fees before prescribed.

13. No person except workmen employed on the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.

14. No person shall remain in the sports arena at any time when lawfully directed by any authorized officer of the Trustees to leave same, and no person not being a player, competitor, or official shall trespass on the playing arena during the progress of any football or cricket match, show, fête, carnival, or sports.

15. The following persons shall not be admitted to any portion of the Reserve:—

- (a) Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Trustees to be a disqualified person by any competent sporting or athletic tribunal.

(b) Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Trustees to be a defaulter.

16. No power or horse drawn vehicle or dray or other vehicle shall, without the consent of the Trustees, be driven into or on or through the Reserve.

17. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

18. The Trustees shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be deemed to be the occupier of the Reserve, and with all power incidental to that status, within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as defined by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

19. All dogs and poultry found roaming or trespassing on the Reserve shall be liable to be seized and destroyed.

20. Notwithstanding that he may have purchased or be in possession of a ticket of admission every person shall forfeit his right to remain on the Reserve, and upon request by a duly authorized officer of the Trustees, shall leave the Reserve and every part thereof if he shall have been guilty of any of the following offences or acts of misconduct, namely:—

- (a) Assaulting any other person.
- (b) Being under the influence of intoxicating liquor.
- (c) Crossing or trespassing on any playing ground, sports arena, tennis court, or running track during any sports or during practice by any person or member of any sports club for the time being occupying the Reserve, or any portion thereof, with the consent of the Trustees.
- (d) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (e) Using any threatening or abusive or insulting words.
- (f) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (g) Improperly interfering with or interrupting any sports or holiday amusements or any practice thereat.
- (h) Obtaining admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

21. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Trustees in the proper execution of his work and duty.

22. Every person or club using the tracks, courts, yards, seats, buildings, rooms, erections, enclosures, and conveniences provided or erected in the Reserve may be charged such fees and rents for their use thereof as the Trustees may from time to time consider reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

The occupier of every house, building, tenement, or premises shall provide and keep or caused to be provided and kept thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles made of non-absorbent material, not exceeding 4 cubic feet in content, so that the same may, with the contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently removable by the public scavenger or such person or persons as the Council may appoint for that purpose, and shall cause all dust, ashes, rubbish, or other house refuse produced, collected or accumulated on such premises to be from time to time placed in such receptacle, which receptacle shall be kept constantly covered except at such times as the same may be or shall be opened for the deposit therein of dust, ashes, rubbish, or house refuse as aforesaid, and such receptacle shall be kept in a clean and inoffensive condition, and shall be placed inside the entrance gate of such tenement or premises where no public right-of-way exists on such days in each week as may be specified in any notice to that effect given by the Council, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavengers or other person or persons authorized or appointed by the Council.

2. No dust box or receptacle shall be placed in or on any street, but will be removed from inside the premises where no lane or right-of-way exists.

3. For every offence against any provision of this By-law the offender shall, upon conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

4. That By-law No. 34 is hereby repealed.

CITY OF PRAHRAN.  
By-LAW No. 195.  
*Residential Area.*

A By-law of the City of Prahran made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and numbered 195 for the purpose of altering By-law No. 170, prohibiting within a certain residential area the use of any building for the purposes of certain trades, manufactures, industries, businesses, or public amusements, and for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings in the said residential area.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Prahran order as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in By-law No. 170, and so far only as relates to that portion of the area abutting on the south side of Green-street, extending from the western street alignment of Chapel-street, for a distance of three hundred and thirty feet one inch in a westerly direction to a depth of two hundred feet from the southern street alignment of Green-street, the following provisions shall apply and take effect:—

- (i) No building for the purpose of any trade, industry, manufacture, or business shall be erected in the said portion of the said area of more than two stories in height.
- (ii) The use of any such building in the said portion of the said area for the purposes of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, or business which requires the erection of any chimney or smoke stack or involves the production of or causes any sound, smoke, or smell which may be heard, seen, or smelt beyond the exterior of any such building or in which power other than electric power is used to provide power and/or heat and/or light is hereby prohibited.

2. If any person erects, adapts for use, or uses any building contrary to clause 1 (i) or (ii) of this By-law it shall be lawful for the Council to serve on the owner or occupier of such building a notice requiring him to pull down and remove such building within a time to be named in such notice, and in the event of such owner or occupier refusing or neglecting

to comply with such notice the Council may pull down and remove such building and sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of such pulling down and removal and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner of such building.

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence against the By-law is continued after a notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence or after a conviction or order of any Court in respect of such offence.
