SHIRE OF BACCHUS MARSH

BY-LAW No. 33.

A By-law of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, made under the provisions of section 197, section 222, and section 719 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 33, for—

- (a) The management of public baths and swimming pool situated in Grant-street, Bacchus Marsh, and all buildings, furniture, fittings, appliances, and other property or effects used in connexion therewith.
- (b) Preventing damage to such baths, swimming pool, buildings, furniture, fittings, appliances, and other property used in connexion therewith, and for preserving good order and decency therein.
- (c) Fixing the hours during which such baths or swimming pool shall be available to the public, and the amounts to be charged for admission thereto.
- (d) Imposing a penalty for any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh order as follows:—

1. The baths and swimming pool will be open to the public from the 1st of October in each year to the 30th of April in the succeeding year, between the hours of 6.30 a.m. and 10.30 p.m. The Council may, however, by resolution, close the baths to the public on any day or days, or at any times, should it be considered necessary to do so, and may also vary the periods or hours during which the baths shall be open to the public.

2. The Council reserves to itself and shall have the right of closing the baths, or any part thereof, at any time, and from time to time for cleansing, repairs, or other purposes without incurring any liability to any person.

3. For the purpose of maintaining good order, the baths attendant may refuse admission to the baths to any person.

4. No child under the age of eight years shall be admitted to the baths unless, in the opinion of the baths attendant, such child is in the care of a responsible person.

5. No person shall remain in the baths for a longer period than one hour unless such person shall again pay to the baths attendant the sum payable under the By-law as charge for admission to the baths, and no person shall remain in the shower baths for an unreasonable time.

6. No person using the baths, nor any bath attendant or officer or servant, or other person employed thereat, shall at any time bring into the baths, or any part thereof, spirituous or other intoxicating liquors.

7. No person shall enter or remain in or on the baths whilst in a state of intoxication.

8. No person shall, while in an uncleanly condition, or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease, enter into, or upon, or make use of the baths. Any such person shall, in addition to the penalties set out in this By-law, be ejected from the baths immediately, and handed over to the proper authorities.

9. No person shall, by forcible or improper means, seek admission to any dressing-room, shower, or convenience which shall be occupied by any other person.

10. No man or boy over the age of six years shall enter or use any dressing-room, shower, or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any woman or girl, or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

11. No woman or girl over the age of six years shall enter or use any dressing-room, shower, or conveniences which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any man or boy, or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

12. No person other than the person in charge shall hawk, sell, or offer for sale in the baths any goods or articles without the written consent of the Shire Secretary.

13. No officer or servant employed at the baths, other than duly authorized baths attendants, shall receive from any person resorting thereto any payment for the hire or use of any article or articles, or for any purpose whatsoever, without the knowledge and consent of the Shire Secretary.

14. The municipality, or any of its officers or employees, shall not be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the baths. Valuables may be handed to the attendant for safe keeping.

15. Any person finding any article in any part of the baths shall, immediately after finding such article, deliver the same to the baths attendant or other person acting on his behalf, who shall thereupon register a description of same, and all particulars relating thereto, in the book kept for that purpose, and any person who shall have lost such article shall, upon giving satisfactory proof thereof, receive such article from the

baths attendant or other person authorized to receive such article upon entering his or her signature and address in the book referred to.

16. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to him or under his control to enter or remain in the baths. Any dog or other animal found in the baths may be destroyed.

17. Every person using the swimming baths shall wear a suitable bathing gown or other sufficient dress or covering to prevent indecent exposure of the person. Such costume shall previously have been thoroughly washed with soap and boiling water, rinsed, and thoroughly dried.

18. No person shall use soap in the baths (except as mentioned in clause 20 hereof).

19. No person shall use any towel, bathing costume, drinking cup, comb, hair brush, or other toilet articles which has previously been used by some other person, unless it has first been thoroughly cleansed.

20. Every person shall, before entering the swimming pool, or after using the closets or urinals, thoroughly cleanse himself or herself in the nude with soap and water under the showers provided, and shall thoroughly rinse off all soapsuds.

21. No person shall at any time use the swimming pool whilst using, or after having used, any substance or preparation whereby the water in such swimming pool may be discoloured or rendered turbid, or otherwise unfit for the proper use of bathers.

22. No person shall wilfully or improperly foul or pollute the water in the swimming pool, or the shower baths, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel, bathing costume, or any bathroom, dressing-room, convenience, or passage-way, or any part of the baths, or any furniture or other article therein.

23. No person shall use blasphemous, profane, obscene, indecent, offensive, or abusive language in the baths or their vicinity.

24. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself or herself, or commit a nuisance, or behave in an unseemly, improper, indecent, riotous, or noisy manner, in or on any part of the baths.

25. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in any part of the baths open to the public view.

26. No person shall expectorate in the baths or its environs, nor spout water from the mouth, or blow the nose in the pool.

27. No person shall smoke in any dressing-room, convenience, or passageway, or within 15 feet of the swimming pool.

28. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or walls of the baths, or roll or throw stones in the baths.

29. No person shall bring into or deposit in the baths any rubbish, filth, or other offensive matter, nor deposit or leave therein any tins, bottles, broken glass, orange or other peel, papers, cast-off clothes, or other litter.

30. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently injure or destroy any towel, bathing gown, bathing trunk, or other article supplied for use in the baths.

31. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure, or improperly interfere with the due and efficient action of any lock, cock, valve, pipe work, or engine or machinery in connexion with the baths, or carelessly or negligently injure any furniture, fittings, or conveniences of any dressing-room, shower, or conveniences, or any part of the baths.

32. No person shall use or interfere with the lifebuoys or life-saving appliances unless in case of accident and danger occurring to a bather rendering their use necessary for the saving of life.

33. No person shall deface any wall, furniture, fittings, or any portion of the baths by cutting or writing thereon.

34. No person shall remove any sand or soil from the baths, nor damage or remove any placard or notice-board therein.

- (d) A block plan showing ground plan of building, boundaries and location of the land, and the position of the buildings thereon.
