Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE POTTERY BOARD.

Note.—(a) This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(b) On the 7th April, 1937, the Board was deprived of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business or preparing material for, or making acoustic tiles moulded into slab form and having an earth base and conferring such powers exclusively on the Fibrous Plasterers' Board.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of making pottery, tiles (other than cement tiles), or pipes, and digging the clay used in connexion therewith," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 25th May, 1939, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (10) The Board determines, under the provisions of Section 150 of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed in the glazed pipes and salt-glazed ware, general pottery, tile, and terra-cotta sections of the trade at work for which piece-work prices have not been specified above, provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates that are fixed by the Board for such work.
- (11) Periodical Adjustment of Wages.—The wages rates for males set out in clause 2 are based upon the following basic wage, and pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of section 21 of the Factories and Shops Act 1934, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount, and at the same time as such basic wage. Provided that proportionate adjustments to the rates for females, and for apprentices and improvers, and to the piece-work prices shall be made at the same time as follows:—
 - (a) The rates for females and for apprentices and improvers to the nearest 3d., half or less than half of 3d. to be disregarded.
 (b) The piece-work prices as set out in clause 9 to the nearest farthing.

The basic wage shown hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause (12).
