DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the second year of the reign of His present Majesty King George VI. intituled the *Public Service (Transfer of Officers) Act 1937*, it is amongst other things enacted that such Act, save as otherwise expressly provided therein, shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and save as otherwise expressly provided therein, do by this my Proclamation fix the twenty-eighth day of June, 1939, as the day on which the *Public Service (Transfer of Officers) Act 1937* shall come into operation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, and in the third year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

#### APPOINTMENT OF A DAY FOR A POLL TO BE TAKEN OF THE PRODUCERS OF EGGS AND EGG PULP AS TO WHETHER THE EGG AND EGG PULP MARKETING BOARD SHOULD BE DISSOLVED.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF FOSTER RECREATION RESERVE.**

**W**HEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all Public Parks and Reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 9th day of November, 1936, as a site for Public Recreation in the Township of Foster, Parish of Wonga Wonga, and hereinafter referred to as the Reserve.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, shows, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of any and every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person offending against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall remain on the Reserve.

3. No person shall climb or jump over any fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure, or destroy the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, or remove any soil therefrom.

4. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve except in receptacles provided for the purpose.

5. No person shall camp or erect any tent in or upon the Reserve except in such places (if any) as shall from time to time be set apart for such purposes, and then only on obtaining a permit to do so, upon such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees as the Committee of Management shall determine.

6. No person shall erect any building or tent on the Reserve, nor any booth nor any structure, nor offer for sale any articles therein without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. All persons using the conveniences (if any) provided by the Committee of Management on the Reserve shall pay such charges for the use of same as shall from time to time be fixed by the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall light fires except in places (if any) set apart for that purpose by the Committee of Management, and no refuse material shall be burnt on the Reserve except by a representative of the Committee of Management, and then only in places set apart for the purpose.

No. 215.—8725/39.—3

9. No person shall break glass of any kind on the Reserve, or leave thereon anything which shall or may injure any person.

10. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, airgun, or any firearms in or upon the Reserve, except by permission of the Committee of Management.

11. No person shall put in or on the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals, or any vehicles, without permission of the Committee of Management.

12. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as defined by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

13. Permission of the Committee of Management must be obtained beforehand for the holding of all organized sports, picnics, or functions of any kind in the Reserve.

14. All fees received from camping, agistment, or any other purposes shall be expended on the liquidation of any liability already incurred in the maintenance and improvement, and in the further maintenance and improvement, of the Reserve, and an account thereof furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

15. The Committee of Management shall have the power to let the whole or any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, or person for the purpose of cricket, football, and similar games, or for holding entertainments, performances, or sports, and to authorize such club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto, or may demand the full rental in advance or on such terms as shall be specified in the "written authority to use the ground."

16. No club, association, or person shall hold or take part in any game or sport of any description, entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

17. No club or association of any kind having for its object physical recreation, or any number of members of any club or association, nor any other person, shall play, practise, train, or engage in any game or sport or athletic exercise within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, unless any such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play in the Reserve at such time. Provided that any person not otherwise offending against these Regulations may enter on the Reserve, and play tennis thereon, on paying to the club or association for the time being having authority from the Committee of Management to occupy the Reserve or any part thereof, or to the Committee of Management, a court fee not exceeding One shilling (1s.) per day or part thereof or of Five shillings (5s.) per week.

18. No person except the members of the Committee of Management and officers and employees of the said Committee on duty shall enter or drive or otherwise propel any motor car or other vehicle into any portion of the Reserve, when a charge is made for admission, without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorized by the Committee of Management.

19. No person, unless he be guilty of an offence under these Regulations, shall be required to leave during any entertainment or sports after he has paid for admission until he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATION OF TRAFFIC.

*By-law No. 120.*

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the City of Ballarat has made a By-law No. 120 under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and the Police Offences Acts for the purpose of regulating traffic in the City of Ballarat and of repealing parts of By-laws and Regulations of the City of Ballarat and the Town of Ballarat East relating to the regulating of traffic.

The By-law deals generally with the regulation of traffic in the streets of the City of Ballarat. It defines such expressions as driver, intersection, major street, minor street, tram stop, and vehicle. A major street within the meaning of the By-law is any street along which tramcars travel and a minor street any street along which tramcars do not travel. Drivers of vehicles and horses proceeding along major streets are required to stop at intersections of other major streets and drivers of vehicles proceeding along minor streets to stop at intersections with major streets. The sections of roadways between the north and south roadways of Sturt street and running at right angles thereto and lying between the centre gardens blocks in Sturt-street are to be minor streets in relation to such north and south roadways. Drivers of vehicles reaching the intersection of two minor streets at approximately the same time are to give the right of way to the vehicle or horse approaching from the right. The By-law also deals with the following matters:—(a) The duties of drivers passing stationary tramcars at tram stops. (b) The right of a driver to turn his vehicle or horse to the right from the line of traffic subject to the giving of the warnings set out in the By-law. (c) The duties of drivers of vehicles when making a complete turn in street and when meeting and passing vehicles, horses, and pedestrians. (d) The distance within which it is not permitted to leave a vehicle in relation to street intersections, fire hydrants, private driveways, street excavations. (e) Requiring drivers of vehicles to have full view of traffic. (f) Drivers not to have charge of more than one vehicle except in certain circumstances. (g) Taking up or setting down of passengers or goods. (h) Giving right of way to Fire Brigade vehicles, ambulances, and police patrol cars. (i) Vehicles or horses travelling side by side. (j) Persons alighting from or boarding vehicles or tramcars. (k) Pedestrians to keep to the left on footway, pedestrians crossing streets. (l) Obedience to traffic control signals. (m) Imitation of or obscuring traffic control signals. (n) Interference with traffic control signals. (o) Driving in front of moving tramcar at intersections. (p) Alighting from or boarding moving vehicles. (q) Stopping vehicles in streets for primary purpose of advertising or broadcasting. (r) Cyclists clinging to vehicles. (s) Driving in reverse. (t) Obeying direction of Police Force or Council's officers in case of accident or obstruction to traffic. (u) Signals when stopping or turning to the right. (v) The appointment of safety zones. (w) The fixing of penalties for breaches of the By-law and the repeal of By-laws or parts of By-laws of the City of Ballarat and the Town of Ballarat East.

## CITY OF BENDIGO.

## BY-LAW No. 52.

A By-law of the City of Bendigo made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 52, for prohibiting on, from, and after a date specified herein—

- (1) the erection or use on any land within the municipal district of tents or other temporary structures or buildings for the sale of goods therein or therefrom; and
- (2) the sale of goods in or from such tents, structures, or buildings;
- (3) the sale of goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, or any other vehicle, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other receptacles standing or placed on vacant land.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Bendigo order as follows:—

1. No person shall on, from, and after the first day of July, 1939, without the previous consent, in writing, of the Council—

- (a) erect or use on any land within the municipal district of the City of Bendigo any tent or other temporary structure or building for the sale of goods therein or therefrom; or
- (b) sell any goods in or from any such tent, structure, or building.

2. No person shall, without the previous consent, in writing, of the Council, sell any goods from any stall, motor car, cart, truck, barrow, or any other vehicle, box, basket, crate, bag, or other receptacle standing or placed on vacant land (not being Crown land or land under the care and management of the municipality of the City of Bendigo or a public place within the meaning of section 3 of the *Police Offences Act* 1928) within the area set forth in the schedule hereto.

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## CITY OF BRIGHTON.

## BY-LAW No. 103.

A By-law of the City of Brighton made under the provisions of Part VII. of the *Local Government Act* 1928 and under and pursuant to all other powers in that behalf enabling for altering and amending By-law No. 81 of the City of Brighton, as amended by By-laws No. 84, No. 86, No. 97, and No. 100 of the said City of Brighton, and numbered 103.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brighton order as follows:—

1. That on and after the coming into force of this By-law it shall form part of and be read as one with By-law No. 81, as amended by By-laws No. 84, No. 86, No. 97, and No. 100, and shall have operation and effect throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Brighton.

2. Part XIV. of the said By-law No. 81, headed "Provision as to Flats," is hereby repealed and the following Part is substituted therefor:—

## PART XIV.—RESIDENTIAL FLATS.

The following conditions shall apply to the erection, building, construction, addition to, or alteration of any building or buildings which, in the opinion of the Surveyor, is or are intended to be or may be adapted to be used or occupied as a residential flat or flats:—

(1) Properly prepared plans and specifications, together with an estimate of the cost of such erection, building, structure, addition, or alteration and showing or stating the purpose for which it is intended to be used, and also a block plan drawn in ink to scale showing the boundaries and dimensions of the allotment of land, and indicating the position of the block in relation to the nearest street corner, also the position and dimensions of the proposed erection, building, structure, addition, or alteration, and the position and distance of such building in relation to such boundaries and to any other existing buildings on the same or on adjoining allotments, shall be submitted to the Surveyor for examination and report as to whether such erection, building, structure, addition, or alteration (if the work is carried out in accordance with such plans, specifications, and other particulars) will comply with the By-laws of the City of Brighton. A tracing or copy of

such plans shall be furnished to the Surveyor with full details of sizes, dimensions, and qualities of all materials intended to be used. All plans shall be of a size 22 inches x 15 inches at the least or any multiple thereof.

(2) The original plan and specifications when approved and signed by the Surveyor shall be returned to the builder, but the tracing or copy of the plans, details of material, and block plan shall be retained by the Surveyor on behalf of the Council.

(3) No variation or alteration from the plans and specifications which have been approved by the Surveyor shall be made by the builder without the consent in writing of the Surveyor having been first obtained.

(4) When the plans and specifications have been approved by the Surveyor, and the builder or person lodging the same shall have paid the appropriate fee prescribed by this By-law, the Surveyor shall grant or cause to be granted to the builder or such person a written permit for the commencement of the building referred to in such plans and specifications and particulars. Such permit shall only remain in force and effect for twelve months from date of issue.

(5) Every person who hereafter commences or causes or permits to be commenced the erection of, addition to, or alteration of any building without having first obtained such written permit for the commencement of the same shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

(6) Every erection, building, structure, addition, or alteration coming within the provisions of this Part of this By-law shall conform to the following provisions:—

(a) The walls, partitions, stairway partitions shall be constructed of brick, stone, or concrete. In the case of partition walls dividing one flat from another the walls in brick or stone shall be 8½ inches thick and in the case of concrete shall be at least 6 inches in thickness. All partition walls shall, in the case of the topmost storey, be carried to the underside of the roof.

(b) All floors which divide one flat from another shall be of concrete of at least 6 inches in thickness, and be designed to carry a live load of 50 lb. per square foot.

(c) The roof shall be constructed of materials approved of by the Surveyor.

(d) Any building intended to be used as a residential flat or flats shall be on land of frontage not less than 75 feet, and not less in area than:—

(i) In the case of two-flat building, an area of nine thousand seven hundred and fifty (9,750) square feet.

(ii) For each flat more than two and up to and inclusive of five flats an additional area of one thousand (1,000) square feet.

(iii) For more than five flats an area equivalent to two thousand five hundred square feet to each additional flat.

(e) The distance from the building line of the street to the nearest point of the building shall in no case be less than twenty-five (25) feet. In the case of flats erected on a corner allotment the distance from the building line of the side street shall in no case be less than fifteen (15) feet to the nearest point of the building.

(f) The distance between the side boundary and the nearest wall or projection therefrom shall be:—

(i) In the case of a two-flat building be not less than eight (8) feet, and

(ii) If more than two, an additional four feet.

(g) Each flat must in itself be a complete dwelling of a floor area of not less than 800 square feet, and must be provided with a water closet, bathroom, sink, and separate wash-house as herein provided for all dwelling-houses.

(h) Each flat must have two separate entrances to the open air for the sole use of the occupants thereof.

(i) Each flat shall have at least 75 per cent. of its surrounding wall open to light and air.

(j) Notwithstanding the above conditions if the allotment in respect of which plans, specifications, and other particulars for the erection, building, construction, addition to, or alteration of any building or buildings have been submitted to the Surveyor is in an unsewered area, such allotment must be sewered before the approval of the plans by the Surveyor will be granted, or any permit to build will be issued hereunder.

(k) The provisions of this By-law as to the height of rooms, lighting, and ventilation of rooms in respect of dwelling-houses shall apply also to all flats.

(l) Notwithstanding any conditions as before mentioned no building consisting of residential flats shall exceed two storeys in height.



(7) No alteration, additions, deductions, or other work for any purpose in, to, or upon any building shall be made or done for the purpose of converting it to residential flats, or for the purpose of altering existing flats, unless such work when completed will make the building comply in all respects with the requirements of this By-law.

(8) Written notice of completion of any erection, construction, or addition to or alteration of any building shall be handed to the Surveyor within seven days of such completion. Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the ninth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, and confirmed the sixth day of February, 1939.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT FOR PROVISIONS, 1939-40, ETC.

(Published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of 26th April, 1939, pages 1414 and 1415.)

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the Health Acts, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.
2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.
3. Supplies for country districts for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.
4. The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of 8 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office, with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; the Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, and Sunbury Districts will include the Mental Hospitals, Gaols, and Police Gaols at those places; and the Bendigo and Castlemaine Districts will include the Gaols. The Geelong District embraces a radius of 2 miles from the Geelong Post Office. Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the schedules, or as directed by the officer ordering the supply.
5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the rate tendered, except butter boxes and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for; the empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.
6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.
7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the Department concerned or any officer authorized by him, and shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.
8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, who shall render his account as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.
9. Where practicable, the contractor shall use the Railways for the transport of the goods. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, except for Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in the triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignee and the quintuplicate retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which services the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.
10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the Service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.
11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions.
12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his Department and to the Tender Board.
13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.
14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations or stores are due or by the contractor in waiting for a Board to survey, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.
15. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.
16. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will be competent for a Board of Survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being, such appeal to be made in writing within 24 hours of the rejection; but, pending such appeal, he must at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required, or any like supplies suitable for the Service, may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged as in clause 10.
17. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary.
18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.
19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. *If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.*
20. It will be competent for the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.

21. The contract entered into under these conditions is not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the *Customs Act* 1901-36, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The

contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

23. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

24. For the purposes of these contracts the word "Government" shall mean the Government of the State of Victoria; and the word "Treasurer" shall mean the Treasurer of the said State.

## STIPULATIONS FOR SUPPLIES OF PROVISIONS.

### SUPPLIES GENERALLY.

For supplies under all sub-schedules, particular attention is drawn to clause 1 of the Conditions of Contract as to quality. No sub-letting is allowed, and all work must be carried out by the contractor.

Where practicable, all items must be manufactured or prepared within the Commonwealth.

Where no brand of Commonwealth manufacture or production is specifically set out in the respective sub-schedules, such Commonwealth brand as may be ordered must be supplied.

For Schedule No. 3 supplies must be delivered when ordered and, in cases of emergency, on Sundays, holidays; or half-holidays, as required.

### BREAD AND FLOUR.

A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality for fine wheaten and pure wheaten Meal Bread. *Pure wheaten Meal Bread of first quality may be substituted, wholly or in part, for fine wheaten Bread at such times and in such quantities as, in the opinion of the Medical Superintendent, may be deemed necessary, and the contractor will be required to supply such Bread at the contract rate. Reasonable notice, however, of the intention to substitute wheaten Meal Bread must be given to the contractor by the officer ordering the supply. Bread may be baked at any Government establishment without infringing these contracts. At the Gaols, Ballarat, Beechworth, Geelong, Bendigo, Castlemaine, and Sale, if required, bread must be supplied one day old, due notice to be given to the contractor of such requirement.*

In the event of bread being made at any Government establishment in the Melbourne District during the currency of these contracts, the flour required will be drawn under the flour and sharps sub-schedule. The sharps for all the country gaols is included in the sub-schedule for flour and sharps, Melbourne District, and delivery of same will be required to be made f.o.r. Melbourne.

Flour for Districts for which no local contracts have been taken may be ordered under the Melbourne District contract, for delivery f.o.r. Melbourne.

### GROCERIES.

As a guarantee of quality, Rice, when ordered in quantities of 56 lb. and over, must be supplied in original bags as delivered by the miller or dresser. Such bags must be branded "Rice, Dressed" or "Unpolished," and shall also have stencilled thereon the miller or dresser's name and the distinguishing mark indicative of the quality or grade. The bags thus stencilled shall contain Rice milled or dressed by the miller or dresser whose name appears thereon. Supplies not in conformity with the foregoing condition will be rejected.

Oatmeal must be supplied in original bags as delivered by millers.

Candles, except those for prison cells, must be supplied in 1-lb. packets. Candles for prison cells must be delivered in boxes containing from 25 to 50 lb. per box, the boxes for which must be legibly stencilled on one end showing the estimated burning time and the gross, tare, and net weight of contents.

The soap supplied must be hard throughout, ready for immediate use without waste, and shall have been manufactured at least seven weeks before leaving contractor's hands.

When the quantity admits, Tea must be supplied in original and unopened packages, labelled, as landed.

Raisins and currants must be present season's, and where the quantity admits, be supplied in original boxes labelled as packed.

For Schedule No. 3 a certain quantity of Biscuits and Preserved Meats are sometimes required in lieu of fresh bread and fresh meat, and are included to meet such contingency only.

### OATMEAL, RICE, SEED TAPIOCA, ETC.

Supplies of these items for Districts for which no local contracts have been taken may be ordered under the Melbourne District contract, for delivery f.o.r. Melbourne.

### BUTTER, CHEESE, AND JAMS.

Butter is to be delivered to the s.s. *Rip* in 1-lb. pats, in such quantities as may be ordered, and no excess over the quantity ordered will be received.

All supplies of 56 lb. or multiples of 56 lb. must be supplied in boxes as originally packed. The boxes must bear the impress stamp of the creamery where the butter is produced; otherwise it will not be accepted. All supplies must be in new boxes.

Where the Store or Butter Factory of the Contractor is situated in the Metropolitan area all Butter to the quantity of 56 lb. and over to be supplied in any one consignment under this contract shall before despatch from the Store or Factory be first examined and passed by the Government Butter Grader, for and on behalf of the officer authorized to accept delivery. The boxes containing butter so examined and found satisfactory in quality and description will be stamped by the Government Butter Grader and the date of such examination marked thereon. No butter from a contractor located in the Metropolitan Area will be accepted unless the boxes bear the stamp of the Grader. For the purposes of the foregoing condition the Metropolitan Area is defined as being not outside the radius visited by the Government Grader. The officer authorized to accept delivery may, within 48 hours of the receipt of any supply, require the Contractor to have same re-examined by the Grader, and, if not passed by him, it shall be returned to the Contractor, who shall forthwith replace the same with freshly-examined butter.

No Butter ex Cool Store will be examined by the Grader until thermally it is in suitable condition therefor.

Where the Store or Factory from which the Butter is despatched is not within the area visited by the Grader a sample of any supplies may be forwarded to the Government Butter Grader for examination, should the supply be considered by the Officer authorized to accept delivery as not being equal in quality or description to that contracted for.

The Cheese supplied to be semi or fully matured, as ordered, and, if the quantity admits, boxed for transport.

Jams.—The weight stamped on the tins in accordance with the regulations under the Commerce Act, as indicating the minimum net quantity that each tin contains, shall for the purpose of this contract be taken as the actual contents when computing the quantity supplied.

When Jam is supplied in jars the jars remain the property of the contractor, and must be removed by the contractor at his own expense when empty.

### SOAP AND SOAP MIXTURES.

Supplies of these items for Districts for which no local contracts have been taken may be ordered under the Melbourne District contract, for delivery f.o.r. Melbourne.

### MEAT.

Fore and hind quarters of beef for Mental Hospitals are to be supplied in equal proportions of each, and must be delivered as a whole respectively, also extra buttocks separately when ordered. Meat for other institutions must be supplied as ordered. Where hind-quarters or buttocks are ordered, 9 inches must be cut off from the end of the leg from the hock upwards, i.e., the end of the leg from which the shank has been removed at the abattoirs; and when fore-quarters form a portion of the supply, 6 inches from the end of the neck and the whole of the shin at the clodbone joint must be removed. The sticking pieces also must be trimmed off, and the point and end of the brisket rendered free from blood and blood stains.

Fore and hind quarters of beef, for convenience of handling, may be cut into two parts, but each part is to bear evidence of having been cut from the same carcass.

Corned beef, rolled or round, as ordered, must be supplied without bone or cartilage and will be received, whether pumped or prepared in the ordinary way by pickling, but in the former case must have been soaked after pumping for at least 48 hours, in a good pickle, and then thoroughly drained before supply. No flank, chuck, sticking piece, shin, leg of beef, or piece under 7 lb. will be received.

All meat shall have been slaughtered in Victoria, freshly killed, and shall be well fed, good, sound, sweet, and wholesome.

Should the local supply of fresh meat become scarce or the market prices of same rise by not less than 25 per cent. above those ruling at the date of closing of tenders, chilled meat may, on the recommendation of the Permanent Head of the Department concerned and subject to the consent of the Tender Board being obtained, be supplied by the contractor in lieu of fresh meat on such occasions or during such periods as the Tender Board may determine. "Market prices" shall mean the prices ruling at the Metropolitan Meat Market as published in the *Argus* newspaper.

In cases of emergency, or on such other occasions as in the opinion of the Director of Mental Hygiene, or Heads of other institutions, may seem advisable, other forms of meat such as rabbits, tinned meats, &c., may be purchased apart from the contract in lieu of the meat mentioned in the schedule, and substituted therefor, provided 24 hours' notice (except in cases of emergency) be given to the contractor of such intention.

**Meat derived from the carcasses of Bulls, Stags, or Rams, or Mutton weighing more than 70 lbs. in the carcass, will not be received, and shall not be tendered for delivery.**

Meat containing an undue proportion of bone or fat will not be accepted.

The parts to be removed by the contractor are indicated by the shaded portions of the annexed diagram. This work must be carried out in the factory or shop of the contractor, excepting those parts usually removed at the abattoirs.

With respect to the schedules enumerated hereunder, the following stipulations shall also apply:—

For sub-schedules 9 and 10 of Schedule No. 1, the Beef must be supplied in quantities as ordered from Ribs, Sirloin, and thick Flanks. Where the quantity permits, mutton must be delivered in sides; all kidney fat to be removed.

For Schedules Nos. 1 (sub-schedules 9 and 10), 3, 4, 8, 10, 13, 16 and 17, chuck ribs of Beef, i.e., 1st to 4th inclusive, will not be accepted.

For Schedule No. 3, fresh Beef must be supplied in equal quantities from prime ribs, sirloin, or thick flanks; ribs of Beef to be cut clear of the plate bone, and sirloin to be cut clear of the wing ribs; excess of brisket or flank will be rejected; Mutton to be delivered in sides; all kidney fat to be removed; live sheep to be supplied when required. Corned Beef to be supplied in equal quantities from silverside (round) and brisket; cow, bull, or stag beef or frozen or chilled meat will not be accepted and must not be tendered for delivery.

For Schedule No. 4, fresh Beef must be supplied from prime ribs or sirloin; ribs of Beef to be cut clear of the plate bone, and sirloin to be cut clear of the wing ribs; excess of brisket or flank will be rejected. Corned beef to be supplied from silverside (round) and brisket; cow, bull, or stag beef, or frozen or chilled meat, or Mutton derived from the carcasses of rams will not be accepted and must not be tendered for delivery. All surplus bone and fat must be removed by the contractor prior to delivery and only net weights will be paid for.

For Schedule No. 7, samples (corresponding to the description given in the schedule) of meat ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test for quality.

#### TEA AND COFFEE.

Tea must be supplied in original and unopened packages, labelled as landed.

Tea and Coffee for Districts for which no local contracts have been taken may be ordered under the Melbourne District contract, for delivery f.o.r. Melbourne.

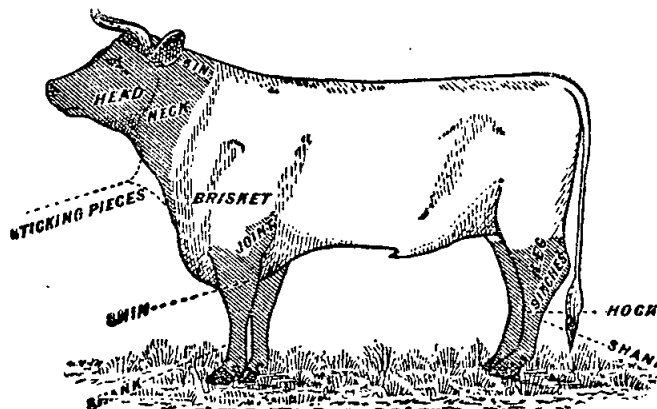
#### MILK.

The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the Department, and supplied at such times as the Department may require. Should the contractor fail to supply at the time specified in the order or at such times as may be indicated in any general notice to the contractor his contract may be cancelled forthwith and his security forfeited, or should the supply prove to be not of contract quality it will be rejected, and any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

#### POTATOES.

Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to take back all rejected before being cooked. Bags to remain the property of the contractor. Weight of bags (approx. 2½ lb.) to be deducted.

If the price of potatoes becomes abnormally high, the heads of the various departments concerned may, if they think fit, cause rice or any other suitable food to be occasionally substituted in lieu thereof.

## ADJUSTMENT OF CONTRACT RATES FOR FLOUR AND BREAD.

The contract rates, set out hereunder, are based on a price of £12 9s. 4d. for 2,000 lb. of Flour (being the maximum price fixed for wheaten flour delivered on buyer's premises at Melbourne under the *Wheat Products Prices Act 1938* by Proclamation on 15th December, 1938).

If before or during the contract period the maximum price so fixed is increased or decreased by Proclamation under the said Act, the prices to be paid under the contract shall be increased or decreased as follows:—

For deliveries of Flour made after such Proclamation comes into operation—at the rate of 1s. per cental for every £1 of increase or decrease;

For deliveries of Bread made not less than 24 hours after such Proclamation comes into operation—at the rate of 9d. per cental for every £1 of increase or decrease.

If at any time before or during the contract period there is no Proclamation in force fixing such maximum price, the prices to be paid under the contract shall, from time to time, be increased or decreased at the rates aforementioned according to whether the wholesale market price of Flour, delivered Melbourne or suburbs, published in the *Argus* Newspaper is greater or less than £12 9s. 4d.

Particulars of adjustment of rates will be gazetted as and when required.

## DETERMINATION OF THE WATCH CASES BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of manufacturing or preparing watch cases" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 29th June, 1939 the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(2) WAGES PER WEEK OF 44 HOURS.

NOTE.—The rates prescribed above for apprentices or improvers shall apply only to such employees as are under 21 years of age.

### PROPORTION (IN ANY PLACE).

#### Apprentices.

One apprentice to every one male worker receiving not less than the minimum wage.

#### Improvers.

Such number of improvers as together with the number of apprentices does not exceed three to every adult worker receiving not less than the minimum wage.

An indenture of apprenticeship has been prescribed by the Board.

Leading hands, male or female in charge of not less than six employees shall be paid at the rate of 5s. per week in addition to the rates fixed above.

(3) DEFINITIONS.—(a) "First Class Watch Case Tradesman" means an employee working at a bench and engaged in making complete cases which require hinges, and making by hand and fitting any special loop attachments.

(b) "Second Class Watch Case Tradesman" means an employee working at a bench engaged in assembling cases, but not being required to make loops by hand, hinge cases, or make and fit any special hand-made attachments.

(c) "Experience" means work done in the trade of watch case making for any employer whether as an adult worker, apprentice, or improver.

(4) TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK BY EMPLOYEES NOT ENGAGED ON NIGHT SHIFT.—

	Time of Beginning.	Time of Ending.

On the other working days of the week .. .. .	7.30 a.m. ..	6 p.m.

- (5) OVERTIME.—The following rates shall be paid for all work done—  
(a) Outside the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work . . .  
(b) Within the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work in excess of 44 hours in any week } Time and a half.
- (6) SHIFTS.—Where an employee is employed on night shift he shall be paid Ten per cent. in addition to the rates fixed in clause (2).
- (7) PAYMENT FOR A SHORT WEEK.—Subject to the provisions of this Determination, where in any week any factory is open for work for less than 44 hours, the legal rate of payment for such week shall be  $\frac{1}{44}$  of the rate provided in this determination for the class of work done, multiplied by the number of hours actually worked.
- (8) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted. Provided that in Bendigo "Picnic Day" shall be observed as a substitute for Melbourne Cup Day.
- (9) HOLIDAYS.—All employees shall be entitled to the ten holidays hereinafter mentioned without any deduction from the weekly rate of pay, viz., New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or any other day which may be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted therefor. Provided that in Bendigo "Picnic Day" shall be substituted for Melbourne Cup Day.
- (10) TEA MONEY.—Any employee required to work overtime for more than two hours without being notified the day before that he will be so required to work, shall either be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid 1s. 6d., or if work extends into a second meal hour, 2s. 6d. for the two meals, but such payment need not be made to employees living in the same locality as their workshop who can reasonably return home for meals. If an employee pursuant to notice has provided a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime he shall be paid for each meal so provided.
- (11) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Except where the conduct of an employee justifies instant dismissal, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or employee, or one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited in lieu thereof. Provided that this clause shall only apply to an employee who has been continuously in the same employment for not less than four weeks.
- (12) TOOLS.—The employer shall provide the necessary tools required by him to be used by each employee under 21 years of age.

(a) making plaster of paris;

(b) excavating or preparing the raw materials for plaster of paris "

has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 23rd June, 1939, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

### PROPORTION (IN ANY PLACE).

One improver to every five or fraction of five workers receiving not less than 92s. per week.

Improvers shall be subject to the number of hours per week as fixed for their respective sections.

(3) PROHIBITION OF EMPLOYMENT.—The Board determines that no person shall be employed as an apprentice.

(4) HOURS—

(a) *Weekly Hours.*—The ordinary number of working hours per week shall be as follows:—

For persons, other than those employed in gypsum pits .. 44  
For persons employed in gypsum pits .. 48

(b) *Daily Hours.*—(i)—Shift workers—A shift shall consist of eight continuous hours, inclusive of a meal break of forty minutes.

(ii) The daily hours for persons employed in gypsum pits shall be eight and three-quarters on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and four and one-quarter on Saturdays.

(iii) The daily hours for employees, other than shift workers and persons employed in gypsum pits, shall be eight on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and four on Saturdays.

(5) TIMES OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.—The time of beginning and ending work for employees, other than those employed in gypsum pits or on shift work shall be—

Time of Beginning.	Time of Ending.
6 a.m.	12 noon on Saturday.
6 a.m.	5 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive.

(6) OVERTIME.—(a) *Shift Workers.*—Any shift worker who works in excess of seven hours twenty minutes in any one day shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and thereafter double time.

(b) *Persons Employed in Gypsum Pits.*—Any person employed in a gypsum pit, who works in excess of eight and three-quarter (8½) hours on Monday to Friday inclusive, or in excess of four and a quarter (4¼) hours on Saturday shall, for such excess work, be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours in any one day, and thereafter double time.

(c) *Other Employees—*

- (i) All work done outside the hours specified as the times of beginning and ending work
  - (ii) Any work done within the hours specified as the times of beginning and ending work, in excess of eight (8) hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive or in excess of four (4) hours on Saturdays
- shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours in any one day, and thereafter double time.

(7) *MEAL MONEY.*—Any employee, except one who is employed in a gypsum pit, who is required to work overtime for more than two hours in any one day, and who has not been notified on the previous day that he would be required to work such overtime, shall, unless provided with a reasonable meal by the employer, be paid an allowance of two shillings.

(8) *TIME WAGES.*—With the exception of—

(a) Persons, other than gypsum pit managers, employed in gypsum pits (see clause 10), and

(b) Casual Employees (see clause 9)—

any person who is employed on time wages for less than the number of hours of an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work be paid at ordinary wages rates with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum, and for each hour worked beyond the one-half aforesaid shall be paid the ordinary wages rate up to but not exceeding ordinary wages rates for an ordinary week's work.

(9) *CASUAL LABOUR.*—Casual employees, i.e., persons employed in the capacity of "all others" at a plaster of paris mill for not more than eight (8) hours during any one week, shall be paid not less than the ordinary wages rate calculated pro rata, according to the number of hours worked.

(10) *PRO RATA PAYMENT.*—Persons, other than gypsum pit managers, who are employed in gypsum pits and who work less than 48 hours in any week, shall be paid not less than the ordinary wages rate calculated pro rata according to the number of hours worked.

(11) *SPECIAL RATES.*—Double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day (21st April), Anzac Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(12) *PAYMENT FOR HOLIDAYS.*—All employees shall be entitled to the holidays mentioned in clause (11) without deduction in pay. Any employee absenting himself from work on any portion of the working day preceding a holiday, provided for herein without the permission of the employer or without having reasonable cause for having absented himself from work, shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

(13) *PAYMENT OF WAGES.*—Except in the case of persons employed outside a radius of 20 miles from the Flinders-street Railway Station—

- (a) All payment of wages shall be made on a day not later than Friday in each week.
- (b) Payment of wages shall commence within a quarter of an hour after the usual time of ceasing work on pay day. If the pay is not then available employees shall be paid at the rate of time and a half after that quarter of an hour, with a minimum of a quarter of an hour for the time lost as a result of such delay in payment.

(14) *PAYMENT WHEN REQUESTED TO ATTEND FOR ENGAGEMENT.*—Any employee, other than one employed in a gypsum pit, who has presented himself for work, as requested by the employer or his responsible representative, shall—

- (a) If not engaged, be paid a sum equal to the rate for two hours' work.
- (b) If engaged, be deemed to have commenced work at the hour he presented himself for engagement.

(15) *TRANSPORT AT NIGHT.*—Any employee, other than one employed in a gypsum pit, who completes his work during the night after trams and other public conveyances have ceased to run, shall, unless provided with means of transport by the employer, be reimbursed for any expense necessarily incurred in reaching his home.

(16) *FACILITIES FOR MAKING TEA.*—The employer shall provide an urn or other heating apparatus for employees, other than those employed in gypsum pits, to heat water for making tea at meal times.

(17) *TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.*—Except where the conduct of an employee justifies instant dismissal one week's notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or employee or one week's pay shall be paid or forfeited in lieu thereof.

(18) *CONTAINERS FOR EMPLOYEES CLOTHING.*—Adequate provision of containers for employees to hang their clothes in shall be made by all employers and the containers provided shall be of such construction as to reasonably protect the clothing from dust.

(19) *PROVISION OF RUBBER GUM BOOTS.*—All employers shall provide a pair of rubber gum boots for employees other than those employed in gypsum pits, who are required to clean out settling pits or to work in other wet places.
