WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Essendon has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned; which has been used as a right-of-way by the said Council within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway. Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a right-of-way hereinafter described; and situated within the City of Essendon aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.—

Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935. NOTICE TO PRODUCERS OF ONIONS.

TN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred on me by section 33 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935, I. Edmond John Hogan, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, do by this notice require every producer of onions (other than producers of onions who have delivered the whole of the onions produced by them during the 1938-39 senson to the Onion Marketing Board or its authorized agents; to furnish to the Secretary of the Onion Marketing Board, 140 Queen-street, Melbourne, within fourteen (14) days from the date of publication of this notice in the Government Gazette, a return setting forth the following information:—

- (a) The quantity of onions held by him or under his control during the period 7th January, 1939, to 30th June, 4939 (both dates inclusive).
- (b) The names and addresses of persons to whom such onions were sold or delivered, together with the quantity sold or delivered to each such person.

Any producer of onions required by this notice to furnish a return who fails to comply fully and sufficiently with the requirements of this notice or wilfully furnishes any false or misleading return shall be guilty of an offence against the Marketing of Primary Products Act.

NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

In accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax (Assessment) Act 1936 (No. 4440) and the Regulations thereunder, I hereby require returns of all income derived during the year ended 30th June, 1939 (or the accounting period, if any, adopted under the Act in lieu of that year) to be furnished to me in such of the forms provided for the purpose as is applicable, containing the information and particulars mentioned or referred to in the form, and verified by declaration as therein set forth, and accompanied by all such balancesheets, profit and loss accounts, statements, and other documents as are mentioned in the form or as are requisite, on or before the dates hereinafter stated:—

On or before 31st July, 1939-

(a) By every person resident in Victoria (other than a company) whose total income from all sources, both in and out of Victoria, derived exclusively under one or more of the following headings, viz., remuneration as an employee, stipend, rent, interest, annuities, dividends, or any other source (not being a business in the ordinary acceptation of that term) was not less than £100.
On or before 31st August, 1939—
(b) By every person domiciled in Victoria (other than a company) whose gross income from all sources, both in and out of Victoria, derived wholly or partly from a source which is a business in the ordinary acceptation of that term, including a professional business, was not less than £100.
(c) By every company resident in Victoria whose total income derived from all sources, both in and out of Victoria, was in excess of £1.
(d) By every person not domiciled in Victoria, other than a company, whose total income derived from all sources in Victoria, was not less than £50.
(c) By every non-resident company whose total income derived from all sources in Victoria was in excess of £1.
(f) By the martners resident in Victoria or by any one

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 (f) By the partners resident in Victoria or by any one of them of the total income of every partnership. When there is no partner resident in Victoria, the return is required to be furnished by the agent in Victoria for the partnership. Each individual partner whose total income, both from the partnership and from other sources, is not less than £100, is also required to furnish a return.

(b) Firewood in quantities not exceeding 10 cubic feet in measurement, or 5 cwt. in weight;

Every person who exposes or offers for sale or sells or delivers from any vehicle, and every person in charge of any vehicle in which coal in quantities not exceeding 5 cwt. or firewood in quantities not exceeding 10 cubic feet in measurement or 5 cwt. in weight is being carried, or from which it is being additioned to the number of shall carry and deliver or ment or a cwt. In weight is being carried, or from which it is being delivered to the purchaser, shall carry and deliver or cause to be carried and delivered such coal or firewood made up in boxes, sacks, or other receptacles, or parcelled up, covered, or enclosed and kept separate and apart in such vehicle.

And every such box, sack, receptacle, parcel, cover, or enclosure shall be labelled or marked in such a manner as to indicate the weight of coal or firewood which each such box, sack, receptacle, parcel, cover, or enclosure contains.

- 4. Every person in charge of a vehicle in which coal in any quantities, or firewood in any quantities not exceeding 10 cubic feet in measurement, or 5 cwt. in weight, is being conveyed for delivery to a purchaser, shall exhibit the weight ticket or note therefore to any inspector who may demand the same, and immediately on his arrival at the place of delivery and before such coal or firewood is unloaded shall hand such ticket or note to the purchaser, or inmate, or other person in charge of the house or place of delivery.
- 5. No person shall be required to carry coal or firewood for the purpose of being weighed or re-weighed a greater distance than 1 mile.

If the Council is satisfied that any hoarding, whether constructed before or after the passing of this By-law, is objectionable or unsightly, or is otherwise undesirable, or is in such a state of disrepair as to be dangerous to the public, it may by order direct the removal thereof. A copy of such order may he served upon the owner of the hoarding, and on the owner for the time being of the land on which the same is erected, either personally or by affixing the same to some conspicuous part of such hoarding.

6. If within the time prescribed in the said order the hoarding has not been removed as directed, the Council may, by its agent duly authorized in writing, enter on the land on which such hoarding stands, and pull down and removed, or cause the same to be pulled down and removed, and sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such hoarding, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fee or penalties due by the owner thereof.

7. No person shall attach, fix to, or paint any advertisement may building, fence, rock, cliff, or tree which is unsightly, objectionable, or otherwise undesirable.

8. The Council may, by its agent authorized as aforesaid, abolish, obliterate, or remove any advertisement upon any hoarding, building, fence, rock, cliff, or tree, if in its opinion such advertisement is unsi

9. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty

pounds.

DETERMINATION OF THE CARETAKERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination applies to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District and the Geelong District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, such portions of the City of Sandringham as are not included within the said Metropolitan District, the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo. and Warrnambool. and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board which since the 5th April, 1939, has had the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to persons employed as caretakers of buildings—

(a) in which any process, trade, business, or occupation is carried on for profit;

- (b) which are temporarily untenanted but in which, ordinarily, any process, trade, business, or occupation is carried on for profit;
- (c) which contain flats;
- (d) which contain halls let for public entertainment or for other purposes." has made the following Determination, namely:—
- (1) That on the 19th July, 1939, the last previous Determination of this Board, and any adjusted Determination issued pursuant thereto, shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

provided that overtime shall not be paid more than once in respect of the same period of work.

- (7) Terms of Employment.—(a) All employees other than casual employees shall be engaged by the week and shall be paid weekly. Employees to become entitled to payment on a weekly basis must be available and ready and willing to perform such work as the employer shall from time to time require on the days and during the hours usually worked. Notice equivalent to 46 working hours shall be given at any time. This shall not affect the right of the employer to dismiss any employee without notice for malingering, neglect of duty, or misconduct (in which case wages shall be paid up to time of dismissal only), or to deduct payment for any day the employer cannot be usefully employed through any breakdown of machinery, or any stoppage of work, or any cause for which the employer cannot be reasonably held responsible.
- (b) In lieu of such 46 working hours' notice, except in circumstances referred to above, the employer may pay 46 hours' wages; and vice versa, the employee leaving his employment without notice shall forfeit 46 hours' wages, which may be deducted from any wages due.
- (c) Provided that any notice determining the employment solely for the purpose of evading payment for prescribed holidays, and not to determine finally the engagement, shall not deprive the employee of payment for any prescribed holidays occurring or observed between such notice to terminate and the re-engagement, if any.
- (8) CASUAL EMPLOYEES.—i.e., persons engaged for less than the working week of 46 hours shall be paid for the first 23 hours at the rate of time and a quarter and for every hour thereafter ordinary time. Such payment shall be in addition to any overtime to-which they may be entitled under clause 6.
- (9) ANNUAL LEAVE.—Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted with pay eight working days in each year (exclusive of the holidays mentioned in clause 10) and such holiday shall be given within three months of the completion of twelve months' service, provided that, for the purposes of this clause, any service prior to the 19th July, 1939, in the case of caretakers of flats and halls and to the 29th September, 1938, for all other caretakers shall not be taken into account.

Provided further, that any employee who leaves or is dismissed before the expiration of twelve months shall be given or paid for holidays pro rata in accordance with the length of service, viz., one day for each complete six weeks of service.

(10) SPECIAL RATES.—Time and a half shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

Any employee other than one employed in connexion with flats and halls who is required to work on any such days after 8 a.m. shall be paid for at least 4 hours' work.

- (11) CLEANING MATERIALS.—All materials and implements for cleaning purposes shall be provided and maintained by the
- (12) The employer shall nominate himself or some other person as being the person who shall have the ultimate control and direction of the work of the caretaker.
- (13) TIME BOOK.—Every employee shall indelibly record and initial daily his correct times of beginning and ending work in a book which shall be furnished by the employer. Such book shall be open for inspection by the Secretary or Assistant Secretary of the Victorian Branch of the Federated Miscellaneous Workers' Union between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. of any working day except Saturday at the employer's office or other convenient place provided that only one demand for each inspection shall be made at the same establishment in any calendar month. Such demand shall not be made unless the Secretary or Assistant Secretary of the Union suspects that a breach of this Determination has been committed.

PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.

(14) The wages rates set out in clause (2) are based upon the following basic wage rates and, pursuant to the provisions of section 21 of the Factories and Shops Act 1934, shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount, and at the same time, as such basic wage rates, provided that the amount of wages for all junior employees shall be adjusted proportionately to the basic wage rate in the same place calculated to the nearest 6d.; every change of amount not exceeding 3d, to be disregarded. The basic wage rates shown hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause (15).

ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.

- (15) (a) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in September, 1939, the amounts of the basic wage shall be as prescribed in clause (14).
- (b) For each future period of or near a quarter beginning with the first pay period to commence in a September, a December, a March, or a June, the amounts of such basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statistician's "All Items" retail price index numbers.

 For the purposes of this Determination the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer, or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician.
