PROCLAMATION

Country Roads (Tourists' Roads) Act 1936 (No. 4405).

PROCLAMATION OF A TOURISTS' ROAD.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 (1) of the *Country Roads (Tourists' Roads) Act 1936* it is provided that the Governor in Council may on the recommendation of the Country Roads Board, made after consultation with the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey, and on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Public Works by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim any road or any part of any road to be a tourists' road for the purposes of the said Act: and whereas the Country Roads Board (after consultation with the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey) and the Commissioner of Public Works have recommended that the road described in the Schedule hereunder be so proclaimed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby proclaim the said road to be a tourists' road for the purposes of the said Act.

SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Mount Buller Road—Shire of Mansfield.

Commencing at its junction with the Howqua River Road at a point on the western boundary of allotment 50, parish of Change, distant 6 chains, more or less, from the north-western angle of that allotment; thence easterly through the said allotment and allotment 3, section A, to the north-eastern angle of the southern portion of the allotment last named; thence generally easterly to the north-eastern angle of allotment 17A, section A, of the said parish; thence generally south-easterly through State Forest south of the Delatite River to the eastern boundary of the parish of Change; thence continuing generally south-easterly to the parking area at the chalet approximately 1 mile east of the summit of Mount Buller.

*Marine Act 1928.*PORTS OF VICTORIA—REPEAL AND SUBSTITUTION OF
PORT RULE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1928* (10 Geo. V., No. 3723), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs: And that any such regulation may from time to time be in like manner, altered, amended or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act by this Proclamation, do hereby repeal Port Rule No. 12A respecting the navigation of outward-bound deep-draught vessels through the fairway at Port Phillip Heads, which rule was made by Proclamation dated the eleventh day of October, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette*, No. 134, of the 19th October, 1927, and do substitute the following rule in its stead, that is to say:—

12A. (1)—

(a) Upon the exhibition of the following signal from the Point Lonsdale Signal Station the Port of Port Phillip shall thereupon be closed to all vessels entering or about to enter such Port from the sea—

(i) during the hours of daylight a red pennant above a black ball or shape at the mast-head thereof;

(ii) during the hours of night-time three green lights shown in a vertical line from the tower of the lighthouse thereof.

(b) No pilot or exempt master in charge of any vessel shall allow such vessel to enter the said Port from the sea whilst either of the above-mentioned signals is exhibited from the said station.

(2)—

(a) The owner, agent, or master of any vessel drawing over 29 feet of water, hereinafter referred to as an outward-bound deep-draught vessel, and which the owner, agent, or master thereof intends to send to sea through the Port of Port Phillip, shall—

(i) give notice in writing of such intention to the Port Officer, whose office is situated at the Public Offices, Melbourne, at least three hours before the time at which such outward-bound deep-draught vessel departs from its berth or anchorage in the Ports of Melbourne, Geelong or Port Phillip;

(ii) upon the arrival of the outward-bound deep-draught vessel at No. 4 Buoy, South Channel, in the Port of Port Phillip, exhibit from such vessel in a position where the same is clearly visible, either of the following signals:— During the hours of daylight a black ball or shape two feet in diameter and during the night-time three green lights shown in a vertical line.

(b) In the event of the Port Officer receiving a notice from the owner, agent or master of any outward-bound deep-draught vessel pursuant to the preceding paragraph, he shall, if he approves of such intention, communicate to the officer-in-charge of the Point Lonsdale Signal Station the name of such vessel and the time when it is anticipated that the Port of Port Phillip will require to be closed to vessels entering or about to enter such Port to enable the said vessel to proceed to sea through the said Port.

(c) Upon the receipt of a communication from the Port Officer, pursuant to the preceding clause, and upon the observation of the signal prescribed in paragraph (a) hereof exhibited from the outward-bound deep-draught vessel, the officer-in-charge of the Point Lonsdale Signal Station shall, as soon as circumstances permit, exhibit or cause to be exhibited from such station the signal prescribed in clause 1 hereof.

(d) Upon the exhibition of either of the signals prescribed in clause 1 hereof at Point Lonsdale Signal Station, the master in charge of the pilot steamer on duty outside Port Phillip Heads shall cause the same signal to be exhibited on the said pilot steamer.

(e) The pilot or exempt master in charge of any outward-bound deep-draught vessel shall not allow his vessel to proceed beyond the West Channel leading line until either of the signals prescribed in clause (1) hereof is exhibited from the said Point Lonsdale Signal Station.

(f) The pilot or exempt master in charge of any vessel proceeding from the sea into the said Port, and which has reached a position within the Port Phillip Heads at a time when either of the signals prescribed in clause (1) hereof is exhibited at the Point Lonsdale Signal Station, shall not allow such vessel to proceed beyond the West Channel leading line until such time as any outward-bound deep-draught vessel exhibiting the signal prescribed in paragraph (a) hereof has reached a position west of the Bowen Light situate within the said Port.

(g) Upon any outward-bound deep-draught vessel passing through Port Phillip Heads the pilot or exempt master in charge thereof shall cease to exhibit the signal prescribed in paragraph (a) hereof.

(h) Upon any outward-bound deep-draught vessel ceasing to exhibit the said signal after its passage through Port Phillip Heads, the officer-in-charge of the Point Lonsdale Signal Station and master in charge of the pilot steamer shall cease to exhibit the signal referred to in clause (1) hereof.

FAIR RENTS ACT 1938.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the third year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI. intitled the *Fair Rents Act 1938*, it is amongst other things enacted that such Act shall apply with respect to any dwelling house of a capital value of not more than Eight hundred pounds which is situate within any part of Victoria specified by the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* and whereas it is considered that those areas which are contained in the Municipalities of the Cities of Bendigo, Geelong, and Geelong West and the Borough of Maryborough should be specified as parts of Victoria to which the provisions of the said Act shall apply: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation specify those areas which are contained in the Municipalities of the Cities of Bendigo, Geelong, and Geelong West and the Borough of Maryborough to be parts of Victoria to which the provisions of the *Fair Rents Act 1938* shall apply.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3, 4, and 7, respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROHIBITION OF FISHING IN PORTION OF THE GOULBURN RIVER BELOW THE EILDON WEIR FROM 1ST SEPTEMBER to 31st OCTOBER IN EACH YEAR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the waters of the Goulburn River at Eildon Weir between an imaginary line drawn between two posts situated respectively east and west of and in line with the south wall of the State Electricity Commission's power house and the southern side of the bridge over the Goulburn River situated approximately 250 yards downstream from the Eildon Weir, from the first day of September to the thirty-first day of October (both days inclusive) in each year.

BAG LIMIT FOR TROUT (NON-INDIGENOUS TO VICTORIA) TAKEN FROM THE GOULBURN RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES ABOVE OR UPSTREAM FROM THE BRIDGE OVER THE GOULBURN RIVER AT THORNTON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation provide that no person shall on any one day, during the period from the first day of September in each year to the thirtieth day of April next following (both days inclusive), take from the waters set out hereunder more than six (6) trout (non-indigenous to Victoria), or have in his possession more than six (6) such fish taken from the said waters:—

The Goulburn River and its tributaries above or upstream from the Thornton to Alexandra-road bridge across the Goulburn River near Thornton, and including the waters impounded by the Eildon Weir.

His Excellency doth by this Order further provide in respect of Route No. 34:—

STOPPING PLACES ON ROUTE.

Motor omnibuses shall for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers, stop at the corner of Merri-parade and Union-street, and at such other points upon the route as may be convenient and desirable, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads, or the safety of passengers in motor omnibuses.

FARES TO BE CHARGED.

The fares prescribed under the heading "Fares to be Charged" shall be the fares to be charged for adults.
The fares to be charged for children under twelve years of age (other than children under three years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers calculated to the nearest higher penny.

LICENSING AUTHORITY.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 15 (1) (c) of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1928* (No. 3742) the Governor in Council by this Order confers upon the Licensing Authority full power and authority for carrying into effect by the said Licensing Authority of the foregoing provisions of this Order.

ADDITIONAL REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF KARDINIA PARK.

A By-law of the Shire of Swan Hill made under section 750 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 45, for the following purposes, that is to say:—

- (a) For regulating the market place known as the Swan Hill Municipal Cattle Market and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or in the immediate approaches thereto.
- (b) For fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the Market shall be held.
- (c) For licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the Municipal District and for fixing (subject to the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1928*) the dues to be paid for such licences.
- (d) For regulating the carriers resorting to the market and fixing the rates for carrying articles therefrom within the limits of the Municipal District.
- (e) For preventing the sale or exposure for sale of unwholesome provisions in the Market.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Swan Hill order as follows:—

MARKET PLACE.

1. That the Market known as the Swan Hill Municipal Cattle Market, being all that piece of land being part of Crown allotments 1 and 2 of 4A, section B, plan of subdivision 5388, Parish of Castle Donnington, County of Tatchera, shall be

open daily on every lawful day from sunrise until 7 o'clock post meridian for the reception, delivery, and sale of cattle and other live stock.

AUCTIONEERS.

2. Every auctioneer desirous of exercising his vocation within the said Market and its immediate approaches shall on obtaining the consent in writing of the Council of the Shire of Swan Hill be authorized to sell in the said Market and approaches thereto subject to the provisions of any By-law and/or Regulation now or hereafter to be in force in the said Shire for the regulation and government of the said Market.

3. No auctioneer shall exercise his vocation within the said Market or its immediate approaches without such consent nor otherwise than in accordance with the terms hereof.

4. Every auctioneer or firm of auctioneers exercising his or their vocation within the said Market and its immediate approaches shall be responsible for the payment to the Council of the Shire of Swan Hill of the sum of Fifteen pounds per annum for the right to use and occupy on sale days one of the office premises provided by the Council, and provided that as regards any period commencing after the sixth day of March in any year the sum payable shall only be the proportionate part of the sum applicable to the period yet to run of such year for the particular class or classes of cattle to be sold, and every term shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in each year. Should any auctioneer or firm at any time require any extra accommodation the Council may provide same at such additional rental as to it may seem reasonable.

5. That any auctioneer or firm of auctioneers not entitled to the use of any of the office premises as set out in clause 4 hereof shall pay to the said Council the sum of One pound for every day on which he shall use such premises, and this amount shall be payable (excepting special sales) whether an auctioneer be selling in conjunction with any other auctioneer already entitled to the use and occupation of such premises or not. Provided, however, that no auctioneer shall be required to pay more than the sum of Fifteen pounds in any one year for such right.

6. That whenever two or more auctioneers or firm of auctioneers are selling in the said Market a draw shall take place prior to the sale determining the order of sale by the respective auctioneers or firms of auctioneers, and the auctioneer drawing first sale shall be allotted the most westerly part of section A of the yards, and the remaining auctioneers shall have allotted to them the adjoining space in the order of the draw referred to.

UNSOLD CATTLE.

7. For cattle and sheep exposed or offered for sale in the said Market or in any additions to be made thereto and taken out of the Market unsold no fees or dues shall be payable.

8. The word cattle herein shall include goats or pigs.

MARKET COLLECTOR.

9. That the words Market Collector or Inspector shall mean the Collector or person appointed to collect the stallages, rents, or tolls authorized by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and shall include the assistants to the Market Collector.

10. That there shall be appointed for such cattle market a Market Collector or Inspector thereof whose duties shall be as follows:—

Duties of Collector.

- (a) To see that this By-law and the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1928* relating to markets are duly observed.
- (b) To demand and receive all stallages, rents, market tolls, and dues.

MARKET CARETAKER.

11. That there shall be appointed for such cattle market a Market Caretaker, whose duties shall be as follows:—

Duties of Caretaker.

- (a) To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of parties bringing stock to the Market for sale, and to allot the order of trucking of cattle in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such Caretaker to be most convenient, and to prevent any unbroken horses or cattle from being roped within the Market yards before Five o'clock p.m. on the days of sale.
- (b) To preserve order and cleanliness within such Market and to remove or cause to be removed therefrom any person creating a riot or disturbance or cursing, swearing, or using any gross or indecent language or being guilty of gross or indecent conduct therein, and if directed to take legal proceedings against such person.

USE OF MARKET.

12. Notwithstanding anything herein contained as to hours during which the Market shall be open, the Market Caretaker shall at all times give such facilities for the reception and delivery of stock as may in any case be actually necessary.

REMOVING STOCK.

13. That no person shall release any stock from the Market or shall remove the same from one part of the Market to another without the authority of the Caretaker.

LIABILITY FOR TOLLS, ETC.

14. That every person placing stock in the Market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls, dues, and charges accruing thereon, and in no case shall any stock be taken out of the Market until all tolls, dues, and charges payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied.

FEEDING STOCK.

15. That if any stock brought to the Market for sale are not removed within 24 hours after the close of the Market, such stock shall be provided with sufficient food by the person placing or entering them in the Market for sale, or by the Caretaker at the expense of the person placing or entering them in the said Market for sale (in case the name and address of the purchaser of such stock, if sold, cannot be ascertained).

OVERCROWDING OF PENS.

16. That all cattle brought to the Market for sale shall be placed in the pens, and that no person shall be permitted to remove cattle from one pen to another except with the consent of the Caretaker: that in case of any dispute arising as to overcrowding of pens, or as to priority of occupancy, the Caretaker shall alone be competent to decide, and the disputants shall be bound by his decision.

17. That the Caretaker shall have power to remove, or order to be removed cattle from one pen to another, and that any orders he gives in that respect shall be promptly carried out on pain of removal of the owner and cattle from the Market.

AUCTION BY NUMERICAL ORDER.

One-half minute shall be allowed for the sale of each calf.

22. The auction sales of dairy cattle shall commence on the completion of the sales of store cattle, and three minutes shall be allowed for the sale of each pen with a minimum of three to a pen.

23. All fat cattle left over from all auctioneers' first sales shall be penned up and offered in the same order as the first sales prior to any store cattle being offered.

SHEEP.

24. Auction sales of sheep shall be held on alternate Thursdays.

25. The auction sales of fat sheep and lambs shall commence at 1.30 p.m., and one minute shall be allowed for the sale of each pen, with a minimum of ten sheep to a pen, with five minutes' grace to the time of the auctioneer drawing first sale and reasonable time to be allowed by the Caretaker in transferring buyers from one salesman to another.

26. The auction sales of store sheep shall commence on the completion of the sale of fat sheep. Three minutes shall be allowed for the sale of each yard of store sheep.

PIGS.

27. Auction sales of pigs shall be held on alternate Tuesdays.

28. The auction sales of baconers shall commence at 1 p.m. Two and a half minutes shall be allowed for the sale of each pen with a minimum of three to a pen, with five minutes' grace added to the time of the auctioneer drawing first sale, and reasonable time to be allowed by the Caretaker in transferring buyers from one salesman to another.

29. The auction sales of porkers shall commence on the completion of the sale of baconers. Two and a half minutes shall be allowed for the sale of each pen with a minimum of six to a pen.

30. The auction sales of store pigs shall commence at 1.15 p.m. The agent drawing last sale of fat pigs shall commence selling store pigs fifteen minutes after the first selling auctioneer has commenced selling. Four minutes shall be allowed for the sale of each pen of store pigs, with a minimum of ten to a pen, with one minute's grace added to the time of the auctioneer drawing first sale.

TIME FOR SELLING.

31. The said times shall be deemed to be a maximum in each case, but in the event of a heavy yarding of any class of cattle, the auctioneers entitled to draw for sales may, prior to making such draw, agree to reduce the time to not less than one minute in the case of fat sheep and lambs or store sheep, and one-half minute in the case of pigs. In case any auctioneer has not disposed of the whole of the cattle on his hands in the pen at the expiration of the allotted time, the cattle in his hands not disposed of shall not again be offered for auction until all other similar stock that day in the Market for disposal by auction have been offered for sale. Should any dispute arise regarding allotment of time, the decision of the Caretaker shall be final and binding on all concerned. The Market shall be opened by the ringing of a bell, or by direction of the Caretaker.

SALE OF HORSES.

32. That all auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction at the cattle markets held on alternate Thursdays shall offer the stock placed in their hands in turn after the completion of the sales of cattle and sheep, and no auctioneer shall be permitted to occupy more than five minutes in offering any horse or horses by auction while any other auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction are present except with the consent of the whole of such other auctioneers, and in no case shall more than one auctioneer be permitted to offer horses for sale by auction at the same time. In case of dispute arising as to priority of right to offer by auction, the Caretaker's decision shall be final. In case of any auctioneer wilfully infringing or attempting to infringe this rule he shall be debarred from offering any other horses by auction until after all the other auctioneers have finished offering the horse stock in their hands for sale by auction.

33. Auction sales of horses only shall be held in the said Cattle Market on such days as shall be approved by the Council or the Shire Secretary. All horses for sale by auction shall be paraded in the shed or ring erected in the said Cattle Market for that purpose.

SPECIAL SALES.

34. Special sales may be held in the Market on days other than the ordinary market days referred to herein subject to application to and approval of the Council or the Secretary of the said Shire and payment of a fee of One pound on each such application for each such sale. The said sum of One pound shall not be returned in the event of a sale not being held, but shall be retained whether a sale is held or not and shall be additional to the usual market dues, which shall be charged and payable in addition thereto. The right to hold a special sale shall not be transferable to any other person or to any other date.

ALL CATTLE AT RISK OF OWNER OR AGENT.

35. All cattle brought to the Market and or placed in the yards or pens thereof by the owner of such cattle or by his agent, shall be at the sole risk of such owner or agent, and neither the Council nor any employee of the Council shall in any circumstances incur any liability or responsibility in connexion therewith.

SUPPLYING INFORMATION.

36. Every auctioneer shall declare to the Caretaker before he shall commence selling the correct number and description of the lot and/or lots of stock he intends to offer.

AUCTIONEER'S PASS.

37. That no cattle, sheep, or horses which have been placed in any auctioneer's hands for sale shall be permitted to leave the Market without the production of a pass from the auctioneer in whose hands they were placed for sale.

PERSONS OBSTRUCTING OR INTERFERING.

38. That any person or persons who may obstruct the Caretaker or his assistants in the performance of his or their duty, or shall release any stock from the market, or shall remove the same from one part of the Market to another without the authority of the Caretaker, or shall wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, or premises of the Market, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Five pounds, and in addition thereto be required to make good any such damage at his or their private expense.

39. That the amounts set out in the Council's Regulation numbered 3 shall be the fees or dues payable by every person selling any cattle of the description therein mentioned in such Market or the immediate approaches thereto, or who shall use for the sale of any such cattle any yards or premises within the Municipal District of the said Shire and outside such Market.

RUBBISH IN MARKET.

40. That no person shall sweep, throw, or deposit or cause to be swept, thrown, or deposited any rubbish, dirt, or market refuse of any kind into or upon any of the thoroughfares, gutters, footways, stands, shops, stalls, enclosures, or spaces of the said Market, or allow any rubbish, dirt, or market refuse of any kind to remain in or near any stand, shop, stall, enclosure, or space therein, but shall when requested so to do by the Market Collector, Caretaker, or officer duly authorized by the Council, forthwith deposit such rubbish, dirt, and market refuse in the bins provided for that purpose.

REMOVAL OF REFUSE.

41. That no holder of any stand, shop, stall, enclosure, or space shall neglect or refuse to remove therefrom and from the precincts of the said Market when required to do so by the Market Collector, Caretaker, or other duly authorized officer of the Council, any carcass, fat, offal, or refuse liable to or in a state of putrescence.

VEHICLES, ETC., IN MARKET.

42. That no person shall place or keep any cart, vehicle, wheelbarrow, signboard, or any article whatsoever in any part of the said Market without the consent of or contrary to the directions of the Market Collector, Caretaker, or of any officer duly appointed in that behalf by the Council.

OBSTRUCTING THOROUGHFARES.

43. That no person shall place any produce, article, or thing whatsoever so as to obstruct any thoroughfare or avenue in or of the said Market, or neglect or refuse to remove the same on being required to do so by the Market Collector, Caretaker, or other duly authorized officer of the Council.

AFFIXING PLACARDS, ETC.

44. That no person shall place, affix, or attach any poster, sign, or placard on or place any nail, hook, or peg in any part of the wood, stone, brickwork, or asphalt of the said Market, or any way fit up or enclose any stall, without the consent or contrary to the directions of the Market Collector, Caretaker, or other duly authorized officer of the Council; and no stallholder shall neglect or refuse to take down any hook, nail, peg, or fittings of any kind in his or her stall when required to do so by such Market Collector, Caretaker, or other duly authorized officer.

CANVASSING.

45. That no person shall enter or use the immediate approaches or other parts of the Market premises for the purpose of soliciting orders or offering for sale any commodity without having first been assigned a stand, shop, stall, enclosure, or space and paid the dues therefor.

LOITERING.

46. That no person shall loiter or trespass in the Market or climb or attempt to climb on any roof, stand, shop, stall, in the Market premises, or wilfully or carelessly break, injure, damage, or destroy or improperly interfere with any portion of such premises or fittings or erections therein.

GATHERING OF PERSONS.

47. That no assemblage of persons shall be held in or upon the Market area for other than Market purposes unless with the previous consent of the Council or the Market Committee being first obtained.

DISTURBANCE.

48. That no person shall in or upon the Market area make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or play any musical or noisy instrument or sing or harangue.

DISTRIBUTING HANDBILLS, ETC.

49. That no person shall in any thoroughfare or avenue in or of the said Market or in the immediate approaches thereto, give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers, or take up collections of money or goods without the consent of the Council or Market Committee.

DOGS.

50. That no person shall bring, cause, or allow any dog to enter or remain in the Market area if forbidden so to do by the Market Caretaker, Collector, or other authorized person.

BICYCLES, ETC.

51. That no person shall ride or drive any bicycle, motor, or any cart or other vehicle over the footways of the Market.

52. That no person shall push, propel, drag, lead, ride, use, or cause to be pushed, propelled, dragged, led, ridden, or used upon or along any footway of the Market any barrow, truck, hand truck, box on wheels, trolley, carriage, roller skate, scooter, or similar contrivance.

SPITTING.

53. That no person shall spit or expectorate on any footways or thoroughfares in the Market area.

INTOXICATING LIQUOR.

54. That no person shall enter or remain in the Market whilst in a state of intoxication or bring any intoxicating liquor therein.

OFFENSIVE CONDUCT.

55. That no person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, indecent, or offensive manner in the Market, or use any indecent or offensive language or incite any riot or disturbance therein.

AUTHORITY OF INSPECTOR AND POLICE.

56. That any person who shall refuse or neglect to comply with any lawful direction of the Market Collector or Caretaker or Police Constable, or obstruct, hinder, or resist the Market Collector, Caretaker, or other officer or servant of the Council or Police Constable in the discharge of his duty in the Market, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

PENALTY.

57. That any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Swan Hill.
