# PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesail, do heroby diminish of increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown Lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway; and that such land shall thereupon and theneforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Moorabbin has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Moorabbin aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

WHEREAS by the Fire Brigades Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the Government Gazette declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the council of the municipal district hereinafter mentioned has requested that the portions of such fire district set forth hereunder be added to and form part of such fire district. And whereas a certificate has been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the Fire Brigades Act 1928, do hereby declare that the said portions of such municipal district shall be added to and form part of the fire district specified accordingly:—

(i) The continuance of a scholarship under clause 28 (f) or (g) shall be conditional on the holder's satisfactory conduct

and progress.

(j) Holders of scholarships under clause 28 (f) and (g) shall receive free tuition and shall be paid allowances at the

rate of £40 per annum.

(k) Holders of scholarships under clause 28 (f) shall be awarded nominated courses under the provisions of Part II. of this Regulation.

- (b) the diversion of streams or rivers; at the construction of storm-water drains (other than main storm-water drains) and any work incidental thereto; at asphalting or tar-paving (except where such work is subject to the jurisdiction of the Builders Labourers Board);

- (6) in connexion with a gravel pit at labouring work. excavating, handling, or removing gravel for trade or sale or excavating, handling, or removing gravel for the construction or maintenance of roads, but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Carters and Drivers Board.
- (b) Adjust the powers of the Excavation or Roadwork Board and of the Asphalters Board by depriving the said Asphalters Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of asphalting or tarnavirus and confirming the process. paving and conferring such power exclusively on the said Evcavation or Roadwork Board.
