Wheat Products Prices Act 1938 (No. 4595).

VARYING PROCLAMATION FIXING THE MAXIMUM
PRICE OF WHEATEN FLOUR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the
Wheat Products Prices Act 1938 (No. 4595), I, the
Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of
Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council
of the said State and on the recommendation of the Wheat
Products Prices Committee do hereby vary the Proclamation
made on the nineteenth day of June, 1939, fixing the maximum
price at which ordinary wheaten flour may be sold as follows:—

For the words "Thirteen pounds three shillings and six
pence (£13 3s. 6d.)" there shall be substituted the
words "Twelve pounds seventeen shillings and six
pence (£12 17s. 6d.)."

And I do further declare that this Proclamation shall come
into force at half-past Twelve o'clock a.m. on Thursday, the
twenty-sixth day of October, 1939.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria
aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of
October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine
hundred and thirty-nine, and in the third year of the
reign of His Majesty King George VI.
