PUBLIC HIGHWAY .- CITIES OF NORTHCOTE AND PRESTON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1923 (No. 3720), sections 518 and 519, it is amongst other things onacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Councils of the Cities of Northcote and Preston have requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Viotoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter named and described, and situated within the Cities of Northcote and Preston aforesaid, to be a Public Highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

All water supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

REGULATIONS REGULATING TRAFFIC ON STATE HIGHWAYS, MAIN ROADS, AND TOURISTS' ROADS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Country Roads (Traffic Regulation) Act 1938, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice

- of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):--
- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Traffic Line Regulations 1938," and shall come into force upon the date of publication thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 2. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter, vehicle includes any conveyance propelled or drawn by animal, mechanical, electric, or other power.
- 3. (a) The driver of a vehicle upon any State highway, main road, or tourists' road the carriageway of which has been divided into traffic lanes by a longitudinal line placed at or near the centre of such carriageway shall keep such vehicle to the left-hand side of such line.

Provided, however-

- (i) That the driver of such vehicle may when it is safe to do so, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, drive the vehicle to or on the right-hand side of such line when he is about to overtake or is overtaking or passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction.
- (ii) That the driver of such vehicle may when it is safe to do so, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, drive the vehicle across such line for the purpose of turning to the right into another road or street or when crossing from the left-hand side of such carriageway to the other side.
- 3. (b) When the driver of such vehicle has driven the vehicle to or on the right-hand side of such line for the purpose mentioned in paragraph (i) of the proviso to clause 3 (a) hereof he shall, as soon as it is practicable, go back to the left-hand side of such line immediately he has overtaken or passed the other vehicle proceeding in the same direction in which he is proceeding.
- 4. (a) Whenever the carriageway of any State highway, main road, or tourists' road has been divided into three traffic lanes by marks, lines, or other indications placed thereon the driver of a vehicle shall keep such vehicle within the lane on the left-hand side of the carriageway.

Provided, however-

- (i) That the driver of such vehicle may when it is safe to do so, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, drive the vehicle along the centre lane of such traffic lanes when he is about to overtake or is overtaking or passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction.
- (ii) That the driver of such vehicle may when it is safe to do so, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, drive the vehicle across or into the centre lane of such traffic lanes and the traffic lane on the right-hand side of such carriageway for the purpose of turning to the right into another road or street or for the purpose of crossing from the left-hand side of such carriageway to the other side.
- 4. (b) When the driver of such vehicle has driven the vehicle along the said centre lane for the purpose mentioned in paragraph (i) of the proviso to clause $4 \, (a)$ hereof he shall, as soon as it is practicable, go back to the traffic lane on the left-hand side of such carriageway immediately he has overtaken or passed the other vehicle proceeding in the same direction in which he is proceeding.
- 5. The driver of a vehicle upon any State highway, main road, or tourists' road the carriageway of which has been divided into traffic lanes by double longitudinal lines placed at or near the centre of such carriageway shall keep such vehicle to the left-hand side of such lines.
- 6. The driver of a vehicle shall not stop such vehicle nor allow such vehicle to remain stationary on any part of the carriageway of any State highway, main road, or tourists' road on which double longitudinal lines have been placed, nor within a distance of 1 foot of the edge of any part of the carriageway.

Any person who commits a breach of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
