Fire Brigades Act 1928. ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Fire Brigades Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the Government Gazetto may at any time by Proclamation in the Government Gazetto declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the council of the municipal district hereinafter mentioned has requested that the portion of such district enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire district specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of such fire district: And whereas a certificate has been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I. the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the Fire Brigades Act 1928, do hereby declare that the said portion of such municipal district shall be added to and form part of the fire district specified accordingly:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c., &c.

PHARMACY BOARD OF VICTORIA.

FURTHER REGULATIONS.

UNDER and by virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred by the Medical Act 1928 the Pharmacy Board of Victoria with the approval of the Governor in Council doth make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Pharmacy Regulations 1939" and shall be read and construed as one with "The Pharmacy Regulations 1930," "The Pharmacy Regulations 1933," "The Pharmacy Regulations 1933," "The Pharmacy Regulations 1933," "The Pharmacy Regulations 1934," and the Regulations made by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria with the approval of the Governor in Council on the thirteenth day of March, 1935, and thirteenth day of November, 1935, and published in the Government Gazette of the tenth day of April, 1935, and twenty-ninth day of January, 1936, respectively, which Regulations and these Regulations may be cited together as "The Pharmacy Regulations." Preliminary Examination.

The marks for a pass in any subject prescribed for the preliminary examination shall be not less than 50 per cent, of the maximum marks allotted thereto, but a candidate who gains an average of 50 per cent, of the aggregate marks allotted for all of the subjects for which he presents himself at the one examination shall be entitled to be passed in each subject the marks gained in which are not less than 40 per cent, of the marks allotted to that subject.

Candidates for the Final Examination shall have completed to the satisfaction of the Lectorial Board of the Victorian College of Pharmacy the course of lectures and practical work for, fourth year apprentices, specified in the Apprenticeship Study Course set out in Appendix B-1 of the Pharmacy Regulations. In addition candidates must submit—

(a) A practical notebook containing records of 90 discipations of apprenticeship. The preparations shall be selected from the list drawn up by the Board. This book must be handed in before the time fixed for the closing of entries for the examination for which the condition within the candidate enters.

(b) A notebook containing a complete record of at least 40 quantitative experiments on the estimation of official substances and at least 40 qualitative experiments on the identification, recognition and official tests of substances in the latest edition of the British Pharmacopoeia.

The detailed subjects of the Final Examination shall be those set out in Appendix 'C' of the Pharmacy Regulations."

A general knowledge of the processes used in the preparation of drugs and chemicals for pharmaceutical uses. An intimate knowledge of the processes necessary in the compounding of prescriptions. A good knowledge of the processes involved in estimating the purity of drugs and of the methods of analysis of water, milk, urine, foods, &c., and of the provisions of the Victorian Poisons Acts and Regulations:

Section II.—Practical Dispensing and Prescription Reading.

The conduct of such operations of the British Pharmacopoeia The conduct of such operations of the British Pharmacopoein as are practicable in the dispensary. Weighing, measuring and compounding medicines: writing the directions in a legible and neat hand and in concise language, and finishing and properly directing each package. A thorough knowledge of the British and metric systems of weights and measures. A general knowledge of posology. The detection of errors, incompatibilities, and unusual doses in prescriptions. The calculation of percentage and other quantities occurring in prescriptions, translating Latin prescriptions into English and rendering a literal and an appropriate translation of the directions for use.

In awarding marks in this subject, the time taken by the candidate will be taken into account.

Each candidate must submit to the examiners a notebook containing a complete record of at least 90 dispensing exercises selected from the official list of preparations prescribed by the Board. A statutory declaration by the candidate in the form of the Fourth Schedule to the Pharmacy Regulations with such variations as the case may require, must be submitted to the examiners with the notebook.

Section III .- Oral Examination in Pharmacy.

- I. Recognition of drugs, chemicals, and preparations of the British Pharmacopoeia.
- 2. The composition of British Pharmacopoeia preparations, methods employed in compounding or manufacturing the same, the proportions of active ingredients, incompatibilities, solubilities, doses, poisons and their antidotes.

A knowledge of such gravimetric, gasometric, colorimetric and volumetric processes as are used in the Pharmacopoeia.

Section V.-Pharmaceutical Chemistry (practical work).

Preparation of compounds; the analysis of substances; the analysis, of mixtures of salts; detection of insustances; identification of B.P. Salts. B.P. synthetics. Quantitative analysis. Candidates will be expected to show nearness and dexterity in all practical work.

Candidates must submit to the examiners a notebook containing a record of the practical work done in chemistry during a complete session at the College of Pharmacy, Melbourne. or at some other school or college recognized by the Board.

Section VI.-Materia Medica-Part II. (written work).

REGULATIONS FOR THE STORAGE OF PETROLEUM, ETC., IN THE BOROUGH OF STAWELL.

HEREAS by section 656 of the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3729) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations applicable to the whole of Victoria, or to such municipal districts (including the City of Melbourne and the City of Geelong) as are specified therein for or with respect to regulating the keeping and storage of petroleum, or any product of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other volatile or inflammable liquids, and carbide or other combustible substances: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said section of the said Act and all other powers him cnabling in that behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations, and doth provide that the said Regulations shall apply and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Stawell, and furthermore that such Regulations shall be deemed to be in substitution of any By-law or By-laws made by the said Council of the said municipality for the purpose for which these Regulations are now made and shall take effect as from the first day of June, 1939.

REGULATIONS.

Storage of More than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or More than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.

- 1. Every person who shall keep, store, or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises more than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—
 - (1) The site of all buildings shall be first approved of by the Council.
 - (2) The buildings shall be constructed with walls of brick, concrete, iron, or other non-inflammable material, except that in the case of a galvanized iron structure the lower portion of the walls must be in brick.
 - (3) The floor of such buildings shall be made of earth, concrete, or brick. The roof of such buildings shall be constructed of incombustible material.
 - (4) To prevent outflow the lower portion of all walls to be without break or opening, the capacity of such enclosed space to be at least 25 per cent. of the total volume of volatile fluids kept, stored, or retained in any such buildings.

Storage of Less than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or Less than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.

- 2. Every person who shall keep, store, or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises less than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, or less than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:
 - est test shall comply with the following requirements:—

 (1) In quantities not exceeding 50 gallons in the aggregate of any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto if such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of metal or other approved material, including winchesters, so securely closed that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom, and if all due precautions are taken to prevent accident by fire or explosion and to prevent the escape of any such volatile fluids into a sewer or drain, and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits, stairways, or adjoining premises except that a reasonable quantity not exceeding 12 gallons in the aggregate of the said volatile fluids may be kept in separate glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint so securely closed or stopped that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom, and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits or stairways.

(2) In quantities not exceeding 250 gallons of petroleum or any product of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test provided such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of glass, earthenware, or metal, and are suitably closed or stopped, and the position of storage will not menace exits, stairways, or adjoining premises joining premises.

Precaution to be Taken when Volatile Fluids are Stored in Bulk Containers.

3. Every tank or other container used for the purpose of the storage or keeping of any volatile fluids shall when not in use be kept tightly closed to prevent the escape of such fluids or any vapour or gas emitted therefrom.

Precautions to be Observed in Buildings.

- 4. Whenever any person shall have in or upon or about any building or premises more than 50 gallons (or more than 12 gallons if kept in glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than 1 pint) of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, or more than 250 gallons of petroleum, or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test he shall observe the following precautions against fire:—.
 - (1) One 2-gallon carbon tetra-chloride or other approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be kept in such a position as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire and to be under the supervision of the Country Fire Brigade where practicable.
 - (2) At least two iron buckets or other suitable containers each having a capacity of not less than a quarter of a cubic foot, filled with dry sand, shall be kept in position in different parts of the building so as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire.
 - (3) Dry sand shall be used for absorbing all volatile fluids spilt or thrown upon the floor and shall after being so used be forthwith removed from the
 - (4) The use of sawdust for absorbing the said volatile fluids is prohibited.

Containers to be Labelled for Retail Sale,

5. Any person who for retail sale fills into small containers on premises any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall have the fire fighting appliances as mentioned in the preceding section and shall clearly label such small containers with the name of the contents and with the following words:—"Highly inflammable. Beware of the vapours. Keep fire away."

Regulations Not to Apply to Storage of Alcoholic Spirits. 6. Nothing herein contained shall apply to the storing of alcoholic (other than methylated) spirits,

Conditions to be Observed in the Construction of Tanks.

7. Every person who shall erect or construct any storage tank for the storage of more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum turpentine, or other volatile fluids shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all storage tanks other than underground tanks not exceeding 1.000 gallons capacity shall be first approved by the Council for that purpose.
- first approved by the Council for that purpose.

 (2) Underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be constructed of galvanized steel plate not less than 14 gauge, and be placed not less than 2 feet below the surface of the ground or the lowest floor of any building. Sand shall be filled in over the tank to the level of the ground or floor as the case may require. Tanks shall be adequately ventilated and fitted with safety devices to the satisfaction of the engineer. Filling pipes may be placed where the engineer approves, but so as not to cause any obstruction to the traffic when the tanks are being filled.

 (3) Storage tanks which are erected upon or above the
- the tanks are being filled.

 (3) Storage tanks which are erected upon or above the surface of the ground or partly below and partly above the surface of the ground shall be enclosed by a wall of brick, stone, or concrete, or an earthen dam of approved construction; such wall or dam shall be in no case of less height than 2 feet higher than the level to which the oil would rise should it escape from the tanks. An opening may be made in the enclosing wall to permit access to the tank, but such opening shall contain a liquid-tight door either sliding or opening inward, made of incombustible material, and of sufficient strength to resist any pressure which may be brought to bear on such door by the bursting of the tank enclosed in such wall.

Power to Enter and Inspect.

8. Any officer authorized by the Council may for the purpose of securing the due observance of and compliance with the provisions of these Regulations enter and inspect any building or erection at all reasonable times and do therein all such acts and things as are reasonably necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and any persons who shall in any manner interfere with such officer in the execution of his duty shall he guilty of an offence.

Offence.

9. Every person who shall contravene or fail to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

10. Every person guilty of an offence under these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each succeeding day after a written notice of the offence from the Council.

Exemptions May be Made by the Council.

The Council may, if it considers reasonable care will be observed, exempt from any one or more of these Regulations inflammable liquids when kept for private use, provided the store is exclusively used for inflammable liquids, and not less than 50 feet intervene between the store and other buildings

or an adjoining property boundary.

Note.—Private use does not include inflammable liquids kept for sale or for purely business activities.

Tendors must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, by bank draft or marked cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board. Cheques, Savings Bank deposit books, faced deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits. Preliminary deposits will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

. The amount of the preliminary deposit required with each tender must be enclosed, and the amount must be clearly written in and the designation stated, whether marked cheque or bank draft, as the case may be.

Security will be required, either in bank guarantee (bank to be approved by the Tender Board), Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, Savings Bank deposit book or fixed deposit receipt in layour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and, in addition, they may be disquablted from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of cender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual, and that for a breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be furfeited and the tender declared informal.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- 1. Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates. The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedule the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.
- 2. Under this contract goods may be ordered by any Department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.
- 3. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be) all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.
- 4. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be

- allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.
- 5. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Departments requiring the goods, which shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach it to his claim for payment.
- 6. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of this contract, the Melbourne District will include a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencerstreet Railway Stations as required.
- 7. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officer ordering the supply.
- 8. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 7, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above, the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
- 3. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In the event of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as provided in clause 8.
- 10. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after the delivery of the goods, the account to be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. Where practicable, the use of more than one account form for each Department or sub-Department must be avoided. The rates and the quantities quoted in the orders cannot be increased.
- all. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedule. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.
- 12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as provided in clause 8.

 13. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of clauses 15 and 16 of these Conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulci not exceeding Fifty pounds as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as provided in clause 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay to terminate the contract forthwith and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve mouths from the date of such disqualification.
- 14. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business tabel.
- 15. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any Department excepting Departments of the Commonwealth, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible

and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignee in accordance with clause 16, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of Commonwealth Departments, however, the Commonwealth consignment note only, which accompanies the order, must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note must not be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as is provided in clause 13.

16. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. 2. No charge or entrance fee to any gardens shall exceed Two shillings for each person over the age of twelve years and One shilling for children under twelve years of age unless the Council previously authorizes a higher charge or fee.

3. No person, unless otherwise authorized by the Council, shall enter any portion of any gardens when a charge or entrance fee is made without first paying such charge or fee.

4. No person shall expectorate on the paths or seats or any structure or other erection within any gardens.

5. No person shall interfere with, remove, damage, or destroy any seats, trees, shrubs, plants, grass, flowers, fish, statuary, fountains, soil, stakes, or supports or any other property in any gardens or throw stones or other missiles or light fires therein or leave in any gardens any bottles, fruit, peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, or refuse of any kind.

6. No person shall allow any dog or other animals to run loose or to be exercised or trained in any gardens.

7. No horse shall be broken in, exercised, or trained in any gardens.

8. No horse uncontrolled shall enter or pass over or through

 9. No person shall make any wager for money or play any unlawful game or by unseemly behaviour interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within any gardens.

No person shall cliub or stand on or jump over any seats in or fences around any gardens, or lie on the seats or grass therein, or stick bills on any fences, gates, seats, trees, posts, or other structures therein or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences or other structures therein or otherwise deface the same or write thereon

No person shall in any part of any gardens wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the same or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any members of the Police Force or gardener or other servant of the Council therein.
- 12. No person shall remain within any gardens at any time after being lawfully directed by any members of the Police Force or any officer or employee of the Council to leave the
- 13. No person shall within any gardens sell or offer for sale any article of food or drink or any other commodity or operate any money-making amusement without first obtaining from the Council permission so to do:
- 14. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly or not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in any gardens, and no person therein shall use any indecent or abusive lauguage or commit any unisance or indecent or offensive act.

15. The Council shall have the power to hold performances and demonstrations in any gardens and to make a charge for admission thereto, but such charges shall not exceed those set out in clause 2 of this By-law.

16. No assemblies for fêtes, picnics, or concerts or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind or meetings of a like character shall take place in any gardens without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

17. Any dog running loose or any other animal found in any gardens may be seized and destroyed by any employee of the Council.

18. No person shall ride or propel or otherwise use any biogele, motor cycle, motor car, scooter, box on wheels, or other similar contrivance or any other vehicle in any gardens.

19. No person shall bring, carry, or take into any gardens any fermented or spirituous liquors, nor shall any person consume or drink in any gardens any such liquors, nor shall be found therein having any fermented or spirituous liquors in his possession or under his control.

20. No persons expent workmen employed in any gardens

20. No persons except workmen employed in any gardens shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations or for other purposes.

21. No person shall put in any gardens any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission of the Council first obtained.

No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play any musical or noisy instrument, or sing in any gardens, nor shall any person preach or declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in any gardens without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

23. No person shall give out for distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in any gardens or litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.

No games or athletic sports shall be played in any gardens without the written permission of the Council first had and obtained, on the application of the secretary of any society or club or of any person desiring to play such games or sports respectively, and then only in such portions of any gardens as may be set apart for the purpose and indicated by the officers of the Council.

25. No person shall play or practise cricket, football, golf, or other game, or engage in training or exercise for any sport, game, or contest in any gardens without the written permission of the Council first obtained.

26. No person shall without proper authority carry, use, or discharge any firearms in any gardens.

27. No booth, tent, or other structure shall be erected within any gardens without the consent in writing of the Council first obtained.

28. No motor ear, motor cycle, motor truck, van, delivery-cart, eart, dray, lorry wagon, truck, barrow, or other vehicle may enter or pass over or through any gardens unless with the permission of the Council first obtained, and then only on the portion thereof specially provided for wheeled truffic.
