The Fisheries Acts.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROHIBIT ALL FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM THE TARWIN RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES FROM 1ST MAY TO 15TH DECEMBER (BOTH DAYS INCLUSIVE) IN EACH YEAR.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation—

- (a) Varying the Proclamation made the seventeenth day of April, 1924, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-sixth day of April, 1924, regarding prohibition of fishing in certain waters, by deleting from such Proclamation all reference to the Tarwin River and its tributaries;
- (b) revoking the Proclamation made the thirty-first day of March, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the second day of April, 1930, regarding prohibition of fishing in the western branch of the Tarwin River and its tributaries;
- (c) revoking the Proclamation made the eighteenth day of September, 1933, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twentieth day of September, 1933, regarding prohibition of fishing in Turton's Creek and portion of the Tarwin River;

- (d) prohibiting all fishing in or the taking of fish from the Tarwin River and its tributaries above or upstream from where such river is crossed by the Melbourne to Yarram railway line, from the first day of May to the fifteenth day of December (both days inclusive) in each year.

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT TOOLERN VALE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IT THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the seventeenth day of December, 1935, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the eighteenth day of December, 1935, respecting the protection of native game at Toolern Vale, and in lieu thereof direct that the parts of Victoria hereunder described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*:—

PARTS OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO.

County of Bourke, Parish of Yangardook, allotments 81A, 81B, 81C, and the Timber Reserve abutting on the northern boundaries of allotments 81A and 81B, containing 369 acres 28 perches more or less, together with the roads abutting on the western boundary of allotment 81B, the southern boundaries of allotments 81B and 81C, and the eastern boundaries of allotments 81C and 81A respectively.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation remove from the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928* the names of all birds and animals at present included therein, together with the periods of the close season set opposite the names of such birds and animals, and I do hereby name the birds and animals set out hereunder as birds and animals which shall be included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*, and set opposite the names of such birds and animals the periods specified, which periods shall be the close seasons in respect of the birds and animals so included in the Third Schedule aforesaid.

This Proclamation shall come into force after the expiration of a period of one week from the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3, 4, 7, and 8 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 3865.—URBAN DISTRICT SUPPLIED WITH WATER FROM THE COLIHAN SYSTEM OF WATERWORKS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, herein after referred to as "the Commission", in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for preventing the waste or misuse of water supplied by the said Commission within the Urban District supplied with water from the Colihan system of waterworks:—

1. During the period commencing with the 1st day of April, 1939, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1939, no person shall use or permit to be used or allowed to run on any premises any water for other than domestic purposes, manufacturing, mining, or fire-fighting purposes. The use of hoses, other than for fire-fighting purposes, is prohibited.

2. Every person who shall use or permit or suffer water supplied by the Commission to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and in cases of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Commission.

3. If any person supplied with water by the Commission wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Commission may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Commission to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.

LIGHTING ORDER No. 140, 1918.

SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipality of the President Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Donald (herein referred to as "the undertakers") was authorized by an Order in Council made on the 15th day of October, 1918, under the *Electric Light and Power Act 1915* cited as "The Council of the Shire of Donald Electric Lighting Order No. 140, 1918" to supply electricity within a certain area in and near the Township of Donald and more particularly described or referred to in the said Order: And whereas the undertakers are supplying electricity within the said area by means of the 230-volt direct current system of supply, and

WARRACKNABEAL SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

ALTERATION IN THE CONSTITUTION OF THE AUTHORITY

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the 24th day of May, 1938, a certain Sewerage Authority, known as the Warracknabeal Sewerage Authority, was duly constituted, and it was ordered and provided that the Councillors for the time being of the Shire of Borung shall be the members of the Sewerage Authority.

And whereas the name of the said Shire of Borung was altered to Shire of Warracknabeal by Order in Council bearing date the 24th day of May, 1938.

And whereas it has been deemed expedient that the Councilors for the time being of the Shire of Warracknabeal holding office as members of the said Sewerage Authority shall cease to hold office as such members and that they be succeeded by the Councilors for the time being of the Central Riding of the Shire of Warracknabeal and three other persons.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the provisions of the Sewerage Districts Acts, doth hereby order that the persons holding office as members of the Warracknabeal Sewerage Authority by virtue of their office as Councillors of the Shire of Warracknabeal for the time being, shall after the thirty-first day of March, 1939, cease to hold office as such members accordingly, and shall, after such day, be succeeded by the Councillors for the time being of the Central Riding of the Shire of Warracknabeal and three other persons appointed by the Governor in Council.

WARRAGUL SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

EXTENT OF SEWERAGE DISTRICT INCREASED, CONSENT TO THE PURCHASE OF LAND SITUATED OUTSIDE THE SEWERAGE DISTRICT, AND APPROVAL OF THE ESTABLISHMENT OF TREATMENT WORKS AND SEWAGE FARM AND CONSTRUCTION OF OUTFALL SEWER.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby declare, order, and direct that the extent of the sewerage District of the Warragul Sewerage Authority be increased by adding to the same the lands comprised within the boundaries described in Schedule 1 hereto, and as on and from the date hereof, the extent of such district shall be deemed to be increased accordingly, and doth hereby consent to the purchase by the Warragul Sewerage Authority of the lands described in Schedules 2 and 3 hereto, which lands are situated without the Sewerage District of the said Sewerage Authority, and doth hereby approve of the establishment of treatment works and sewage farm on the lands described in the said Schedule 2 hereto, and the construction of outfall sewer on the lands described in Schedule 3.

Extent of Sewerage District Increased.

Portion I.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Money Lenders Licensing Regulations 1939*.

2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Act” means the *Money Lenders Act 1938*;

“Licence” means a licence under the said Act;

“Registrar” means the registrar appointed under the said Act.

3. An application for a licence or the transfer of a licence or for the substitution of a new authorized address for the authorized address shown in a licence, or for any endorsement to be made on a licence pursuant to the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act, shall be made in the form or to the like effect of the one appropriate to the case contained in the First Schedule hereto and every such application shall be made in duplicate.

4. A licence which a Clerk of Petty Sessions is authorized to issue pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be in the form applicable to the case contained in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. The notice of every application for a licence or for the transfer of a licence or for the substitution of a new authorized address for the authorized address shown in a licence or for any endorsement thereon, required by the Act to be posted by the Clerk of Petty Sessions in a conspicuous place inside and also outside the Court building shall be in the form or to the effect of the one contained in the Third Schedule hereto.

SEVENTH SCHEDULE.

Money Lenders Act 1938.

SUMMARY OF THE PROVISIONS OF PART II. OF THE ACT WHICH AFFORD PROTECTION TO BORROWERS.

Section 23.—No contract for repayment of money lent and no security taken therefor shall be enforceable unless a memorandum embodying all the terms of the contract was, prior to such lending or taking, signed personally by the borrower, and a copy of such memorandum was, along with this summary, delivered or posted to him within seven days.

Section 26.—Prohibits the charging of compound interest or any increase in interest rate by reason of default in payment.

Section 27.—Money-lenders prohibited from making any charges in connexion with a loan or the negotiations therefor other than stamp duties and fees payable to the Registrar-General or Registrar of Titles.

Sections 28, 29.—The Courts may, within the time limited by sub-section (4), section 28, re-open any money-lending transaction, take an account, and relieve the borrower from the payment of any sum in excess of the sum adjudged by the Court to be fairly due by him in all the circumstances. When the rate of interest charged exceeds the rate which may be prescribed by the regulations under the Act, the onus of proof that such rate is not excessive is on the lender. The publication of names of parties to proceedings is prohibited.

Section 30.—Money-lenders are required to supply on demand in writing by the borrower a signed statement giving particulars as to the state of the loan, and a copy of any document relating thereto.

Section 33.—Certain assignments to money-lenders (as e.g. of an interest under a will or in an estate) must be in writing and executed before a Police Magistrate, County Court Registrar, Clerk of Petty Sessions or an independent solicitor.

Section 35.—All loans must be made in current money, bank notes or cheques on bankers, and are to be made in full without any deduction for interest or otherwise, except stamp duties and fees payable to the Registrar-General or Registrar of Titles.

SEWERAGE DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AND AUTHORITY CONSTITUTED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the application of the Mornington Shire Council for the proclamation of a sewerage district and for the constitution of a Sewerage Authority to carry out works for the sewerage of Mornington for the purpose of the said Acts, and doth hereby appoint as follows:—

(b) That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Sewerage Authority shall consist of reticulation and branch sewers, main sewers, pumping stations, rising mains, treatment works, and outfall drain to Port Phillip Bay.

(c) That the limits of the land within which the said Sewerage Authority shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Clayton.REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE BENDIGO CREEK RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the Land Act 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all Public Parks and Reserves not conveyed to and vested in Trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of (a) the land in the Parish of Huntly indicated by pink tint on plan marked "A" attached to Lands Department file C. 70197 (Rs.2490); (b) of the land in the Parish of Huntly indicated by pink tint on plan marked H.2/6/25 attached to Lands Department Correspondence Rs.2490; (c) of the areas in the Parishes of Sandhurst and Huntly indicated by pink tint on plans marked √12.3.31 and H/12.3.31 respectively attached to Lands Department Correspondence Rs.2490, and known as "Bendigo Creek Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers resident within 1 mile of the Bendigo Creek Reserve may depasture thereon four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or portion thereof in small cattle on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the Reserve one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every 10 acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. Stock will be accepted for agistment on the Creek Reserves on the following terms and conditions:—

The fees to be paid shall be as fixed from time to time by the Committee of Management, at present:—

For each cow or steer over 15 months old, 26s. per annum;
for each horse over 15 months old, 60s. per annum;
for each calf over 3 and under 15 months old, 13s. per annum;
for each foal over 3 and under 15 months old, 30s. per annum—

payable quarterly in advance on the first Wednesday in January, April, July, and October, and all stock not paid for within seven days from the commencement of each

of these months will be impounded. Stock accepted during part of a quarter shall be charged *pro rata* until the first Wednesday in the next quarter.

3. Bulls or entire horses over 9 months old will not be allowed upon the Reserves unless by consent from the Committee of Management, in writing, first obtained.

4. Applications from owners of stock to register such must be made at the herdsman's residence, Huntly, accompanied by a full written description of each and every animal, with brands, and the prescribed fees paid.

5. Stock may be mustered and checked with owners' descriptions at such times as may be considered necessary by the Committee of Management without notice to stock owners, and any stock not agreeing with owners' descriptions or not registered may be impounded.

6. All diseased or injured stock found on the Reserves shall be at once removed by the owner, and any dead animal shall be removed or buried on receiving written notice from the herdsman, and the owner of any stock who neglects or refuses to remove or bury any such animal 24 hours from receipt of notice shall be liable for all expenses incurred by the herdsman in removing, destroying, or burying such animal.

7. All stock placed on the Reserves shall be entirely at the risk of the owner, and the Committee of Management will accept no responsibility therefor.

8. If the herdsman shall report any animal to be a nuisance through straying or damaging fencing or otherwise, the Committee of Management may require the owner of such animal or animals to remove such or may refuse to re-register such.

9. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserves, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserves (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1928.

10. No person shall damage in any way the trees, fences, banks, or other formations on the Reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein except by the herdsman in dealing with the eradication of noxious weeds and vermin.

11. No person shall camp in the Reserves, nor erect any dwelling or other structures therein.

12. No person shall carry firearms in the Reserves or engage in shooting of any kind in or upon the Reserves, or throw any stones or missiles of any kind therein, or bring any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission of the Committee of Management in writing first obtained.

13. Any fowls, cats, geese, turkeys, pigs, dogs, or goats found wandering on the Reserves may be destroyed.

The Bendigo Creek Trust has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

CITY OF RICHMOND.

BY-LAW No. 125.

A By-law of the City of Richmond, made under sections 198 and 217 of the *Local Government Act 1928* and the Thirteenth Schedule of the said Act, and numbered 125, for regulating and restraining construction of buildings, and for amending Part 10 of By-law No. 81 of the said city, and repealing Division 1 of that part, and for repealing By-law 117 of the City of Richmond.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond order as follows:—

1. By-law One hundred and seventeen (117) of the City of Richmond, passed by a resolution of the Council of the City of Richmond on the fifth day of November, 1934, and confirmed on the third day of December, 1934, is hereby repealed.

2. Division 1, Part 10, of By-law 81 of the City of Richmond, relating to the frontage of buildings passed by a resolution of the Council of the City of Richmond on the twenty-third day of September, 1918, and confirmed on the twenty-first day of October, 1918, is hereby repealed, and the following provisions shall be substituted therefor:—

122. (a) No buildings shall be built, erected, or constructed on any allotment of land unless such building be at least 16 feet wide between the external faces of the external walls.

(b) Every building consisting of a separate and self-contained set or sets of premises constructed or used for the purposes of a dwelling shall be so constructed or erected in accordance with the following conditions:—

1. The materials shall be of brick, stone, concrete, or other fire-resisting materials, approved by the Building Surveyor.

2. The allotment of land upon which it is intended to build or convert an existing building into such a building shall have an area of not less than 4,000 square feet and a frontage to a street not less than 66 feet in width.

3. There shall be an open yard space at the ground level clear of any buildings erected thereon, and exclusively attached and belonging thereto, of the extent of at least—

In the case of a building with two sets of premises—600 square feet.

In the case of a building with three or four sets of premises—800 square feet.

In the case of a building containing more than four sets of premises, 800 square feet, plus 100 square feet for each set of premises above four.

4. Every dwelling-room in such building shall have a minimum floor area of 100 square feet and a minimum height of 10 feet from the floor to the ceiling, and a minimum width of 8 feet.

5. Each set of premises in such building shall be provided with a kitchen or kitchenette, bathroom (with bath), water closet, and sink.

6. The minimum floor area for such a kitchen or kitchenette shall be 60 square feet.

7. Each set of premises in such building shall have a separate entrance to the open air for the use of the occupants thereof.

8. Every room in such building shall have one or more windows opening directly into the external air with a total superficies clear of the sash frames, free from any obstruction to light, equal to at least one-tenth of the floor area of the room, and be so constructed that a portion equal to at least one-twentieth of such floor area can be opened.

9. All party walls between sets of premises in such building shall have a minimum thickness of 9 inches, and, where more than two sets of premises are provided above the ground floor, such party walls are to be carried through to the underside of the roof covering when so ordered and required by the Building Surveyor.

10. No such building shall have external walls of a height exceeding 30 feet.

11. Where more than two such sets of premises are contained in such building above the ground floor, a second escape stairway shall be constructed from each floor above the ground floor. Such stairway shall be built of concrete, redgum, or jarrah if external, and fire isolated if internal.

12. No addition, extension, or alteration shall be made to any such set of premises in such building that would reduce such open yard space to an area less than set out in sub-clause 3 hereof.

13. No portion of such building shall be nearer to the alignment of another property than 8 feet on each side.

14. No portion of such building shall be nearer to the building alignment of the street than 10 feet.

15. No second-hand material of any description is to be used in the erection of such building or in the conversion of a dwelling into such a building.

16. Each set of premises shall contain not less than three living rooms in addition to kitchen or kitchenette, bathroom, and lavatory.

(c) This By-law shall have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
