2. Any person or persons may apply in writing to the said Council for such consent, and shall lodge with the application the amount of the fee for such consent as hereinafter men

3. The Council may grant or arbitrarily refuse any such application and may impose such conditions upon the granting thereof as the Council may deem expedient, and in the event of consent being given shall determine the period during which the same shall be effective, and shall issue such consent

which the same shall be effective, and shall issue such consent under its corporate seal.

4. The fee payable for each such consent as aforesaid shall be the sum of Five shillings (5s.) or such other sum or sums as the Council shall or may from time to time prescribe.

5. Any person or persons so using or operating or permitting or allowing to be used or operated any amplifier, loud-speaker, or other device as aforesaid shall, upon being respectively. speaker, or other device as aforesaid shall, upon being requested so to do by any member of the Police Force, discontinue such use or operation.

6. Any person or persons committing a breach of this Bylaw shall be liable to a penalty for each and every such offence of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Township of Kaniva in the Shire of Lawloit.

A By-law of the Shire of Lawloit, made under Part VII., Division 1 of the Local Government Act 1928, and numbered 13, with reference to appointing in streets and roads, standing places for motor cars.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1928, and every other Act, or power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lawloit, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. Definitions .- In this By-law and schedule thereto, unless the context otherwise requires-

"Township" means the Township of Kaniva.

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Lawloit.

"Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle.

"Footpath" means every footpath, land, thoroughfare, or other public place within the township habitually used by pedestrians and not vehicular traffic.

"Motor car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power and includes a motor cycle and side-car.

side-car.

"Parking area" means any standing place for motor cars duly appointed by the Council under any By-law.

"Street" includes every highway, road, carriageway, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the township other than a footpath.

"Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human, animal, or mechanical power and includes a material.

mother ear.

"Writing" includes lithography, printing, and other modes of representing or reproducing words in the visible form. Words importing the musculine gender include females, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

2. Parking Area.—The streets and public places, or parts thereof respectively mentioned or set forth in the schedule hereto (hereinafter called "parking area") shall be and are hereby appointed by the Council as standing places for motor cars within the township.

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- 3. No person shall park his motor car in any place in the township not being a parking area.
- 4. Mode of Parking.—Motor cars and motor vehicles shall park in the township in the following manner, namely:—
 - (a) Commercial-street and Madden-street, at an angle of 45 degrees or thereabouts with the line of the kerb and with the left or near side front wheel not more than 12 feet from the line of the kerb. No portion of ear to project over the foothpath.
 - (b) In all other streets:—At an angle of 45 degrees or thereabouts with the line of the kerb and with the left or near side front wheel not more than 3 feet from the line of the kerb.
- 5. Where parking places are shown on streets by marked lines, drivers of vehicles must conform to the parking places allotted.
- A driver shall, in any parking area, park his car— (a) As directed by the officer in charge of the parking
- (b) if no such officer be present, shall take up his position in such a manner as will enable him to take up or leave without disturbance to other motor cars already parked and also in such a way as will permit the latter to leave their respective positions without difficulty and not otherwise, and there shall he only one line of cars parked on each side of the street.
- 7. Openings for Cross Traffic.—It shall be lawful for the Council by notice, in writing, under the hand or by direction of the Shire President, or in his absence, of the Shire Secretary, from time to time as may be convenient or necessary to tix or appoint openings through any such parking area to permit of cross traffic, and also from time to time to fix the hours during which such parking areas or any of them shall be available for use, or to discontinue the same or any of them.
- 8. No person shall obstruct any such openings as aforesaid By placing his vehicle therein, or otherwise,
- 2. Orders to be Observed.—Every person in the township shall at all time observe and comply with any order or direction given under the authority of this By-law and any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council.

10. Any person who neglects or refuses to immediately comply with or wilfully disobeys any order or direction given as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

11. Penalty.—Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than Five pounds

THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

All streets in the Township of Kaniva shall on every day in the week be parking areas, excepting the following parts thereof, namely:—

- (a) Any portion of any street required for access to any (a) Any portion of any street required for access to any fire plug, petrole pump, right of way, lane or footpath, water trough or crossing over footpath at entrance to property whether public or private.
 (b) Any portion of any street within a distance of 30 feet of an intersection:
