## CERTAIN PLANTS DECLARED TO BE NOXIOUS WEEDS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* (No. 3799), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the plants named hereunder to be noxious weeds for the purposes of the above Act, viz.:—

*Scolymus hispanicus*, L. ("Golden thistle" or "Spanish salsify"), within the Shire of Bet Bet.  
*Salpichroa rhomboidea*, M. ("Pampas lily of the valley"), within the City of Prahran.  
*Foeniculum vulgare*, Gaertn. ("Fennel"), within the City of Ballarat.

## DEVENISH WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1939.

THE Devenish Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes, otherwise than by measure, on lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Devenish Urban District.

On such lands and tenements a rate of Four shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation not exceeding Thirty pounds, and Three shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation exceeding Thirty pounds but not exceeding Seventy-five pounds, and One shilling in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation exceeding Seventy-five pounds.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Five pounds and, in respect of any land on which there is no building, less than Ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1939, and shall be payable on the 20th day of April, 1939, at the office of the said Trust.

## REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Milk and Dairy Supervision Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. Every owner of a factory shall cause all cream used in manufacture at such factory to be passed through cream strainers as follows:—

(a) A strainer of adequate size and of approved metal or metals situated so as to receive and strain efficiently all cream as it enters the receiving vat. The apertures of this strainer shall be either in the form of circular perforations none of which exceeds  $\frac{3}{4}$ th inch in diameter or square meshes not less than nine to the square inch.

(b) A strainer of adequate size and of approved metal or metals situated so as to receive and strain efficiently all cream as it leaves the pipe from the pasteurizer to enter the cream cooler after pasteurization or at an approved point between the pasteurizer and the holding vat. The apertures of this strainer shall be either in the form of circular perforations none of which exceeds  $\frac{1}{10}$ th inch in diameter or square meshes not less than 100 to the square inch.

(c) A strainer of adequate size and of approved metal or metals situated so as to receive and strain efficiently all cream as it leaves the pipe which delivers it from the holding vat to the churn or at an approved point between the holding vat and the churn. The apertures of this strainer shall be either in the form of circular perforations none of which exceeds  $\frac{3}{4}$ th inch in diameter or square meshes not less than 64 to the square inch.

2. Every owner of a factory shall cause all thermometers used in connexion with the manufacture of cheese to be effectively protected against breakage in a manner approved by an Inspecting Officer.

ADDITIONAL REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR THE RECREATION AND CONVENIENCE OF THE PEOPLE IN THE PARISH OF PRAHRAN, AT MURRUMBEENA, AND KNOWN AS THE "WARREIN RESERVE."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following additional Regulation in respect of the Reserve for the recreation and convenience of the people in the Parish of Prahran, at Murrumbena, and known as "Warrein Reserve."

## REGULATION.

No person shall break in, train, or exercise any horse or pony in the Reserve, nor shall any person ride or drive any horse, pony, or other animal therein.

The Council of the City of Caulfield has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulation.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE WAHGUNYAH RACECOURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council, dated the 8th February, 1864, as a site for Racing and other purposes of Recreation in the Parish of Carlyle, and known as "Wahgunyah Racecourse and Recreation Reserve."

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve, which is composed of the two (2) divisions mentioned hereunder, shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereunder provided—

1st Division.—Racecourse training track, football and cricket grounds, grandstand, and all other enclosures and buildings.

2nd Division.—The remainder of the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve.

4. No person shall climb or jump over fences or gates or stick bills thereon or cut names on or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, or roll or throw stones therein.

5. No person shall light any fires in the Reserve or erect any dwellings thereon nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or set up for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

7. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

8. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1928.

9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for public sports, nor be permitted to bring any horses, carriages, or other vehicles therein, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management, duly authorizing the admission of such person, horses, carriages, or other vehicles, but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any buildings, erections, enclosures, plantations, or cultivated plots within the Reserve.

11. Every person paying for admission to the Reserve, or driving therein any horses, carriages, or other vehicles shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which he shall, upon demand, produce, and (if required), surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the Committee of Management to demand, the production or surrender thereof.

12. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall, together with any horses, carriages, or other vehicles in his possession and care, be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding that such person may have purchased and may be in possession of a ticket of admission—

- (1) being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language;
- (2) assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner;
- (3) trespassing upon any enclosures, plantations, or cultivated plots, or upon any portion of the grounds set apart for sports or interfering with, or interrupting any person engaged by the authority of the Committee of Management in carrying out any sports or amusements;
- (4) being found in any portion of the Reserve or any building, erection, or enclosure for the time being thereon, and not producing on demand or surrendering (if required) to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand, production, or surrender of a ticket duly authorizing admission to the place wherein he may be found, unless he shall forthwith satisfy the Committee of Management or any person deputed by it that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such place, and that the ticket of admission supplied to him has been lost;

13. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the Reserve and to any buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon, on such days, not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year as the Reserve may be set apart for public sports, shall be as follows:—

- (1) For admission of each person to the Reserve, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.
- (2) For admission of each person to any stand, building, erection or enclosure, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and six pence (2s. 6d.).
- (3) For admission of each saddle horse (exclusive of rider) to the Reserve, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.
- (4) For admission to the Reserve of every private carriage, cart, or other vehicle (exclusive of passengers) drawn by one horse or other animal, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings (2s.).
- (5) For admission to the Reserve of every private cart, carriage, or other vehicle (exclusive of passenger) drawn by two or more horses or other animals, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Three shillings (3s.).
- (6) For admission to the Reserve of every vehicle plying for hire, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Ten shillings (10s.).

14. No person shall be allowed to exercise or train any horse or horses in the Reserve except on payment of the fees specified. For a single trial of a horse Two shillings and six pence (2s. 6d.). For every horse for one year, Thirty shillings (30s.).

15. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any public sport may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding Ten pounds, which the Committee of Management may determine by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure; and the Committee of Management may make repairs, or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the Reserve or the buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being therein.

This Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "MADDINGLEY QUARRY RESERVE."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 19th December, 1938, as a site for a Quarry in the Parish of Parwan, and known as the "Maddingley Quarry Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards language, dress, or conduct.
3. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
4. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
5. The owner of any horse, cattle, or other animals found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and in addition such horse, cattle, or other animals may be impounded.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
8. No person shall remove any stone, earth, or gravel from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the said Committee of such fees as the Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any earth, stone, or gravel as aforesaid. Such fees shall not exceed the sum of Five shillings per cubic yard of stone, earth, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission the Committee of Management may require from any person requesting such permission a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of stone, earth, or gravel as aforesaid, and for due payment of the fees for removal of such stone, earth, or gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this Regulation shall be paid by the said Committee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of each half-year.
9. All stone to be removed from the said Reserve, in accordance with the permission of the Committee of Management, shall be removed therefrom subject to and in accordance with the directions of the Engineer of the Council of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, provided that, and subject to such direction all stone shall be removed on a face and for the full depth of the deposit.
