AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown land comprised in Classes 3, 6, 7 and 8 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

LEONGATHA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1939 (No. 35).

THE Leongatha Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby makes a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes, otherwise than by measure, of One shilling and ten pence in the pound on the net value (municipal) of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Leongatha Urban District

All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.
