LIST OF CROWN LANDS AVAILABLE

THE under-mentioned areas are available for application as provided by various sections of the *Land Act 1928*, and all applications received on or before Wednesday, 8th May, 1940, will be deemed to have been simultaneously made, but any application lodged after such date may be considered if received in time for inclusion in the advertisement of the cases to be heard at the Local Land Board. Applications on proper form, accompanied by 5s. duty stamp uncancelled (registration fee), may be delivered or forwarded by post to the Local Land Officer or to any Crown Lands Office in Victoria. Applicants may obtain from Local Land Offices, or the Enquiry Office, Lands Department, Melbourne, a certificate authorizing the issue by the Railway Department of a return ticket at concession fares to enable them to inspect available areas or to attend Local Land Boards. Subject to the approval of the Minister, when the survey fee exceeds £10, a deposit of £5 may be paid, and the balance over six years in half-yearly instalments.
