VARYING PROCLAMATION, FIXING THE MAXIMUM
PRICE OF BREAD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c. &c. &c.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Wheat Products Prices Act 1938 (No. 4595)*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee do hereby vary the Proclamation made on the fifteenth day of December, 1938 fixing the minimum and maximum prices of wheat flour and the maximum price of bread by deleting the following portion of the said Proclamation fixing the maximum price at which bread may be sold, viz.:

"2. (a) The maximum price for bread delivered to the buyer in the municipalities of Collingwood, Richmond, Fitzroy, Northcote, Preston, Heidelberg, Brunswick, Coburg, Essendon, Melbourne, Hawthorn, Kew, Camberwell and Box Hill at Ten pence halfpenny (10½d.) per 4-lb. loaf.

(b) The maximum price for bread delivered to the buyer in the municipalities of St. Kilda, Prahran, Malvern, Oakleigh, Port Melbourne, South Melbourne, Footscray, Williamstown and that section of Caulfield north of Glenhuntly-road at Eleven pence (11d.) per 4-lb. loaf.

(c) The maximum price for bread delivered to the buyer in the municipalities of Brighton, Sandringham, Moorabbin, Mordialloc, Chelsea,

Dandenong and that section of Caulfield south of Glenhuntly-road at Eleven pence halfpenny (11½d.) per 4-lb. loaf.

(d) The maximum price for bread sold in shops in the municipalities of Collingwood, Richmond, Fitzroy, Northcote, Preston, Heidelberg, Brunswick, Coburg, Essendon and Melbourne at Ten pence (10d.) per 4-lb. loaf.

(e) The maximum price for bread sold in shops in the municipalities of Hawthorn, Kew, Camberwell, Box Hill, St. Kilda, Prahran, Malvern, Oakleigh, Footscray, Williamstown and that section of Caulfield north of Glenhuntly-road at Ten pence halfpenny (10½d.) per 4-lb. loaf.

(f) The maximum price for bread sold in shops in the municipalities of Port Melbourne, South Melbourne, Brighton, Sandringham, Moorabbin, Mordialloc, Chelsea, Dandenong and that section of Caulfield south of Glenhuntly-road at Eleven pence (11d.) per 4-lb. loaf."

And substituting the following in lieu thereof:—

"2. (a) The maximum price for bread per 4-lb. loaf in the municipalities of Brunswick, Coburg, Collingwood, Essendon, Fitzroy, Footscray, Heidelberg, Melbourne, Northcote, Port Melbourne, Preston, Richmond, South Melbourne and Williamstown at Eleven pence (11d.) delivered to the buyer and Ten pence halfpenny (10½d.) sold in shops.

(b) The maximum price for bread per 4-lb. loaf in the municipalities of Box Hill, Brighton, Camberwell, Caulfield, Chelsea, Dandenong, Hawthorn, Kew, Malvern, Moorabbin, Mordialloc, Oakleigh, Prahran, Sandringham and St. Kilda at Eleven pence halfpenny (11½d.) delivered to the buyer and Eleven pence (11d.) sold in shops."

And I do further declare that this Proclamation shall come into force at half-past Twelve a.m. on Wednesday, the twenty-fourth day of April, 1940.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF RICHMOND.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of

such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Richmond has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Richmond aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF RICHMOND.

All that piece of land situate in the Parish of Jika Jika, County of Bourke, being part of Crown portion 24: Commencing at the intersection of the west boundary of Rotherwood-street with the north boundary of Sherwood-street; thence by the last-mentioned boundary bearing north 89 deg. 44 min. west 40 ft. 8 in.; thence by lines bearing north 19 deg. 7 min. east 11 ft. 11 in., north 38 deg. 27 min. east 9 feet, and north 87 deg. 43 min. east 31 ft. 2½ in. to a point on the west boundary of Rotherwood-street; and thence by the last-mentioned boundary bearing south 19 ft. 9 in. to the commencing point.

SHIRE OF NUMURKAH WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Chairman and Commissioner of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, hereinafter called the Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law:—

BY-LAW No. 158.

1. So much as is not already repealed of By-law No. 65 as approved by the Governor in Council on the 20th day of November, 1906, the whole of the By-law No. 141 as approved by the Governor in Council on the 14th day of December, 1922, By-law No. 142 as approved by the Governor in Council on the 14th day of December, 1922, By-law No. 153 as approved by the Governor in Council on the 12th day of November, 1930, and By-law No. 154 as approved by the Governor in Council on the 5th day of March, 1930, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall apply to the Urban District of Numurkah, as such district is proclaimed and defined by Orders in Council bearing date the 23rd day of June, 1890, and the 30th day of September, 1895, and the 17th day of July, 1899; and to the Urban District of Nathalia, as such district is proclaimed and defined by Order in Council bearing date 5th day of December, 1900; and to the Urban District of Strathmerton, as such district is proclaimed and defined by an Order in Council bearing date the 23rd day of September, 1901; and to the Urban District of Wungah, as such district proclaimed and defined by an Order in Council bearing date 25th day of February, 1905.

PART I.—INTERPRETATION.

3. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“The Act” means the Water Act 1922.

“Fittings” includes all appliances and things whatsoever (other than pipes) used in connexion with the conveying, supplying, storing, or regulation of the flow of water in or derived from a main.

“Main” means any pipe belonging to or under the control of the Trust and used for the conveying or supplying of water.

“Private service” means and includes all pipes and fittings used in connexion with the supply of water from a main to a tenement and/or in connexion with the use or consumption of such water in or on such tenement.

“Service pipe” means any pipe (not being a main) used for the conveying or supplying of water derived from a main.

“Trust” means the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust.
“Works” means works of or in connexion with the laying, constructing, altering, repairing, or renewing of a private service or any part thereof.

All words used in this By-law which are also used in the Act shall have the meanings assigned to them by the Act.

PART II.—CONSTRUCTION AND ARRANGEMENT OF WORKS.

4. No person shall execute any works (except such works as are authorized by sections 191 and 194 of the Act)—

(a) Without having given to the Trust two days prior to the commencement of the execution of such works—

(i) Notice, in writing, of his intention so to do, specifying the tenement in, on, or in respect of which it is proposed to execute such works, and the time or times (being between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any week day, except a public holiday or a Saturday, or between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon on any Saturday other than a public holiday) during which it is proposed to execute such works.

(ii) A complete specification, in writing, of the works proposed to be done, setting out the mode, form, strength, material, construction, dimensions, and arrangements of all pipes and other works intended to be used in the execution of such works.

(iii) A properly prepared plan drawn to a scale specified thereon of the premises in, on, or in respect of which it is proposed to execute the said works, showing thereon all buildings, erections, and structures on the said premises and the proposed arrangement of all pipes and other works which it is proposed to lay or construct therein or thereon.

(b) Otherwise than during the time or times set out in the notice mentioned in sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of this clause.

(c) At any time save between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any week day except a public holiday or a Saturday, or between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon on any Saturday except a public holiday.

(d) Contrary to or not in conformity with this By-law or such specifications and plan mentioned in sub-paragraphs (ii) and (iii) of paragraph (a) of this clause.

5. No person shall lay, construct, repair, or alter any private service unless every service pipe forming part thereof for such portion of its length as lies in or on private property is laid and constructed in such manner that the same is at all points at a depth of not less than 10 inches below the surface of the ground, nor unless every such service pipe for such portion of its length as lies in or on any public street, lane, or right-of-way, or where it may be exposed to vehicular traffic, is laid and constructed in such manner that the same is at all points at a depth of not less than 24 inches below the surface of the ground.

6. No person shall connect any lead pipe with any iron pipe, except with a brass union coupling.

7. No service pipe which supplies (for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure) water to any tenement shall have a bore exceeding $\frac{3}{4}$ inch. No service pipe which supplies, by measure, water to any tenement shall have a bore exceeding $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches.

8. No person shall—

(a) Lay, construct, or alter any private service, or any part thereof; or

(b) Erect or construct any building, erection, or structure in such place, position, or manner that the whole of such private service is not easily accessible for the purposes of inspection, repair, and renewal.

Licensing of Plumbers.

9. Unlicensed Persons Not to Interfere with Pipes or Services.—Before any person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service pipe, cock, or meter, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, meter, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence.

Period of Licences—Cancellation of Licences—Fees Payable.

10. Each licence shall be for the period ending 31st December next ensuing after the issue thereof, but may be renewed by the Trust, at its discretion, from time to time in each case to the following 31st December. The Trust shall have power at any time to cancel a licence in the event of the holder thereof performing his work in an unsatisfactory manner, or committing any breach of the Water Acts or of this By-law, and in such matters the Trust shall be sole judge. For each licence, the licensee shall pay to the Trust a fee of One pound.

Proof of Fitness to be Given.

11. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the By-laws of the Trust relating to water supply and with the Water Acts so far as they apply to town supplies. The Trust may, if it so sees fit, refuse to grant such a licence.

Plumbers to Report.

12. Each licensed plumber shall report to the Trust Secretary the completion of any new work, extensions, or repairs in connexion with any service within 24 hours of effecting same.

Miscellaneous.

13. Consent of Trust—Notices to be Addressed to Secretary—Consent (how given)—To be Notified to Trust.—In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act of commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice, in writing, addressed to the Secretary of the Trust, and delivered at his office, of such length as is mentioned in the Act or in this By-law, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work; and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced; and such act shall not be done, or work commenced save upon the Trust's consent, in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the Chairman of the Trust, the Secretary, or the Engineer, who severally shall be competent to give the Trust's consent, and on behalf of the Trust to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto, and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of every such consent shall notify the same to the next following meeting of the Trust for confirmation.

PART III.—MATERIALS.

14. No person shall use any pipe or fittings in or in connexion with a private service, unless the same shall comply in all respects with following specifications:—

(a) Subject to the provisions of clause 17 and sub-clause

(c) of clause 23 hereof, the whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (other than thimbles connecting the service pipes and mains), bends, reducing couplings, plugs, and the like shall be of best quality galvanized wrought-iron, copper, brass, lead, or fibrolite.

- (b) All pipes and pieces shall be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, clear in bore, and (in the case of wrought-iron piping) properly galvanized throughout, and shall be of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.
- (c) All ends of pipes (other than lead pipes), bends, and the like shall be properly and truly threaded and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, or fittings.
- (d) All stopcocks and bibcocks shall be screw-down high-pressure cocks made of hard brass or gunmetal.
- (e) The whole of the pipes and fittings shall be of the best quality and workmanship, and shall be sound and free from all defects.
15. All lead piping used pursuant to the provisions of clause 17 and sub-clause (c) of clause 23 hereof shall be of best quality new lead piping of the following weights:—
- For piping $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. diameter—weight 6 lb. per yard.
 For piping $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. diameter—weight 9 lb. per yard.
 For piping 1-in. diameter—weight 14½ lb. per yard.
 For piping 1½-in. diameter—weight 22 lb. per yard.
 For piping 2-in. diameter—weight 30 lb. per yard.

PART IV.—CONNEXIONS TO MAINS.

16. No person shall affix or connect or cause or permit to be affixed or connected to any main more than one service pipe or private service for the supply of water for domestic purposes to any one tenement.
17. No person shall affix or connect any service pipe to any main save by means of a stopcock ferrule to which a quarter bend of wrought-iron or copper alloy or a length of not less than 3 feet of lead pipe is properly and securely attached.
18. No person shall connect or affix any service pipe to any main save by means of a tapping not exceeding in the case of each of the sizes of mains set out in the first column of the table hereunder written the size set opposite such size of main in the second column of such table:—

The Table Hereinbefore Referred To.

Size of Main.	Maximum Size of Tapping Allowed.
Not exceeding 2 inches	$\frac{1}{2}$ inch.
Exceeding 2 inches but not exceeding 4 inches	$\frac{3}{4}$ inch.
Exceeding 4 inches but not exceeding 6 inches	1 inch.
Exceeding 6 inches but not exceeding 8 inches	1½ inches.
Exceeding 8 inches but not exceeding 9 inches	2 inches.
Exceeding 9 inches	2 inches.

19. A high pressure screw-down stopcock properly secured and covered with a cast-iron top shall be fixed on each service pipe (connected with or affixed to a main) between the main in or to which it is connected or affixed and the building line of the tenement which it supplies in such place and manner that such stopcock is within 3 feet from such building line and is easily accessible for the purpose of and may be used completely to cut off the supply of water to the private service of which such service pipe forms part.

PART V.—REPAIRS.

20. Any person using any private service or meter shall at all times keep the same in proper repair.
21. If any person refuses, neglects, or delays to have any private service or meter, or any part thereof, used by him properly repaired after having been required, in writing, by an officer of the Trust so to do, the Trust by its officers, servants, or agents may enter into or upon any premises supplied by such private service or meter, or any part thereof, and may, where necessary, repair or renew such private service or meter, or any part thereof, so as to prevent the waste of water, and may charge such person with the cost and expense of such repair or renewal, and such cost and expense shall be a debt due by such a person to the Trust.

PART VI.—METERS

22. No person shall use any private service save for the supply of water for domestic purposes solely, unless the whole of the water supplied to such private service passes through a meter.
23. No meter shall be affixed to or used in connexion with any private service or service pipe, unless—
- (a) It is capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons;
- (b) In the case of a meter attached to a $\frac{1}{2}$ -in., $\frac{3}{4}$ -in., or 1-in. private service it is capable of registering a flow of not less than 10, 15, and 30 gallons per hour, respectively;
- (c) It is properly and securely affixed to such private service or service pipe by means of lead connexions or quarter-bends of wrought-iron or copper alloy;
- (d) It is fixed truly level on a solid foundation of brick, stone, or concrete, the top of which foundation is level with the surface of the ground;
- (e) It is fixed in an easily accessible position;

- (f) It is fixed in such position and with such coverings that it is adequately protected from the possibility of accidental damage;

- (g) All washers used for connexion couplings in respect thereof are made of leather.

24. No person shall construct, place, stack, or store, or permit, or suffer to be constructed, placed, stacked, or stored any building, erection, material, or thing over or upon any meter connected or affixed to any private service, or shall do or permit or suffer to be done any act, matter, or thing whereby inspection of such meter shall be prevented, obstructed, or in any way rendered difficult or interfered with.

25. The remuneration in money for which the Trust may, pursuant to section 201 of the *Water Act 1928*, let for hire to any consumer of water supplied by measure any meter or instrument for measuring the quantity of water supplied and consumed is hereby fixed in the case of meters for use in connexion with $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. private services, at 4s. per annum; in the case of meters for use in connexion with $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. private services, at 4s. per annum; and in the case of meters for use in connexion with 1-in. private services, at 6s. per annum.

26. Rents shall be payable yearly in advance. Such rent shall be exclusive of, and in addition to, the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid yearly in advance on the 1st day of January in each year, and first payments to be made as from the date of installation to the end of the current year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Trust, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

27. Meter to be Tested if Hirer Dissatisfied.—Hirer to give Notice of Removal.—In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Trust, he may, by notice in writing, require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Twenty shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead thereof, at the cost of the Trust, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to do so shall be guilty of an offence.

28. No person shall connect any service pipe with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing on such service pipe, between such boiler and any meter which records the quantity of water passing through such service pipe, a self-acting valve, in such manner and position as will prevent the pressure of the steam reversing or otherwise affecting the mechanism or dial of such meter.

PART VII.—WASTE AND MISUSE.

29. No person shall use or permit or suffer the use of any private service for the supply of water to more than one tenement.

30. No person shall use or permit or suffer the use of any private service, or any part thereof, for the supply of water to any cistern, tank, or water trough, unless such cistern, tank, or water trough is watertight and is provided with an equilibrium ball, valve, or other mechanism efficiently regulating the flow of water thereinto, in such a manner that such water shall not overflow such cistern or tank. No person shall affix any overflow-pipe to any cistern or tank in such manner or position that is not open to inspection. In this clause water trough means a water trough used for the supply of water to animals.

31. No person shall construct, lay, or use any service pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with or supplies water to any urinal or water closet, or any part thereof, save through a cistern or tank.

32. No person shall use or permit or suffer the use of any private service for the purpose of supplying water to any bath capable of containing more than 100 gallons of water.

33. No person shall affix an overflow pipe to any bath.

34. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall waste the same, or permit or suffer the same to run to waste.

35. Every person supplied with water by the Trust shall exercise such vigilance and take all such measures as shall prevent the water running to waste.

36. No person shall take or carry away or permit or suffer any other person to take or carry away any such water from any premises supplied with water by the Trust, and no person shall sell any water supplied by the Trust.

37. No person, other than a servant or agent of the Council of the Municipality of Numurkah or the Numurkah and Nathalia Fire Brigades in execution of his duty as such servant or agent, shall, without the written permission of the Trust, open, close, or otherwise interfere with any hydrant attached to any main.

38. No person, other than a servant or agent of the Corporation or body having the care or management of a public park or garden, shall, without the previous consent of the Trust, open, close, or otherwise interfere with any tap, valve, or other like regulator in, on, or connected with any service pipe used for the supply of water to such public park or garden.

Restrictions of Use other than Domestic Supplies.

39. No person shall, between the hours of 9 p.m. on any Saturday and 9 a.m. on the next succeeding Sunday, or between the hours of 6 p.m. on any Sunday and 6 a.m. on the next succeeding Monday, or between the hours of 9 p.m. on any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday and 6 a.m. on the next succeeding day, respectively, use or permit the use of water for the purpose of gardening, or for any purpose whatsoever other than domestic or manufacturing purposes.

PART VIII.—INSPECTION.

40. Any person authorized by the Trust in that behalf, either generally or for any class of cases or in any particular case, may at all reasonable times—

- (a) Enter into or upon any premises for the purpose of inspecting, and may inspect any private service, or any part thereof, or any works in course of execution therein or thereon; and/or
- (b) Enter into or on any premises for the purpose of superintending the execution of any works in course of execution therein or thereon, and may give to the owner or occupier of such premises or any person engaged in executing such works any directions or instruction necessary for the purpose of ensuring that all relevant provisions of this By-law shall be duly complied with and observed during and in connexion with the execution of such works.
- (c) For any such person as aforesaid may dig or excavate in or upon any such premises.

41. Any person who obstructs, hinders, impedes, resists, or opposes, or refuses admission to any premises to, or fails or neglects to carry out and observe all lawful directions and instructions given to him by any person duly authorized in that behalf shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

42. Any person who is guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty, not exceeding £5, for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, by bank draft or marked cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board. The amount of the preliminary deposit required with each tender must be enclosed, and the amount must be clearly written in and the designation stated, whether marked cheque or bank draft, as the case may be. *Cheques, Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits, which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.*

Security will be required, either in bank guarantee (bank to be approved by the Tender Board), Commonwealth Treasury bonds, Savings Bank deposit book or fixed deposit receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the service may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is satisfactory and the prices tendered are considered reasonable.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual, and that for a breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for _____ at _____" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the Health Acts, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in

the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

3. Supplies for country districts for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

4. The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office, with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; the Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, and Sunbury Districts will include the Mental Hospitals, Gaols, and Police Gaols at those places; and the Bendigo and Castlemaine Districts will include the Gaols. The Geelong District embraces a radius of 2 miles from the Geelong Post Office. Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the schedules, or as directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the rate tendered, except butter boxes and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for; the empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds; as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the Department concerned or any officer authorized by him, and shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, who shall render his account as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

9. Where practicable, the contractor shall use the Railways for the transport of the goods. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, except for Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in the triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignee and the quintuplicate retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which services the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.

10. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered at the time mentioned in the order or within such other time as the officer ordering the supply may specify for delivery, it will be competent for such officer, or the head of the Department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions.

12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either

by the person to whom the rations or stores are due or by the contractor in waiting for a Board to survey, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

16. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will be competent for a Board of Survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being, such appeal to be made in writing within 24 hours of the rejection; but, pending such appeal, he must at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required, or any like supplies suitable for the Service, may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

17. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. *If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.*

20. It will be competent for the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.

21. The contract entered into under these conditions is not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the *Customs Act 1901-36*, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

23. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

24. For the purposes of these contracts the word "Government" shall mean the Government of the State of Victoria; and the word "Treasurer" shall mean the Treasurer of the said State.

(5) The Council may from time to time appoint such officers as it thinks proper to supervise such parking areas, and every driver shall park his car as and where he shall from time to time be directed by any such officer, and not otherwise or elsewhere.

(6) No person shall obstruct any opening that may be left or appointed by the Council or any such officer for the purpose of facilitating traffic by placing or permitting any vehicle to be or remain therein or otherwise howsoever.

(7) A driver shall, in any parking area, park his car—
(a) As directed by the officer in charge of the parking area or by any member of the Police Force.

(b) If no such officer or member of the Police Force be present, shall take up his position in the order of his arrival at such parking area and in such manner as will enable him to leave such position without disturbance to other motor cars, and also in such a way as will permit such other motor cars to leave their respective positions without difficulty, and as will not obstruct or interfere with any traffic, and shall, when requested by any such officer to do so, remove his motor car to any position and in such manner as may be directed by such officer or member of the Police Force.

(8) Any person not being a duly appointed or authorized officer of the Council or member of the Police Force, who, without authority, shall on any pretext pretend to be a parking area attendant or other officer of the Council, or who shall in any way assume the duties of a parking area attendant or other officer of the Council, or who shall otherwise obstruct, hinder, or delay any parking area attendant or other officer of the Council as aforesaid in the execution of his duty under this By-law, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
