PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 10 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby abolish the

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 4, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Marine Act 1928.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO PILOTS AND PILOTAGE, 1931.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1928*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of the said State, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the amendment following, that is to say:—

1. *Commencement and Repeal*.—On and after the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*, the whole of Part I. of the Schedule to the Regulations relating to Pilots and Pilotage, 1931, shall be and stand repealed, and there shall be substituted therefor—

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Visual Standard.

ENTRANCE EXAMINATION.

(a) In respect of an application for a licence to be granted under these Regulations—

- (1) Vision to be 6/6 in each eye, without glasses.
- (2) The total error of refraction not to exceed 1 D, and of this astigmatism not to exceed .5 D. This estimate to be made by retinoscopy with the eye under the influence of a mydriatic.
- (3) The pupillary reflexes to be normal, the fundus free from disease, visual fields normal, and balance of the ocular muscles to be normal. Candidate to possess binocular vision.
- (4) Colour vision to be normal as tested by lantern with coloured disks, Ishihara test, or other approved method.

PERIODICAL, ETC., EXAMINATION.

(b) In respect of any person holding a licence as a pilot—

- (1) The vision must be at least 6/12 fully in each eye, without glasses.
- (2) There must be no evidence of any morbid or other condition in either eye, which would render it probable that the vision would deteriorate before the next periodical examination.
- (3) (a) *Colour vision* to be normal as tested in the manner following by Board of Trade lantern.
(b) *Apparatus*.—A special lantern and a mirror have been provided for this test. The lantern should be placed directly in front of the mirror, so that the front part of the lantern is exactly 10 feet from the mirror. Care should be taken that the lantern is properly placed, that is to say, the lights reflected in the mirror must show clearly when viewed from the position of the candidate on the left of the lantern. The examiner should always satisfy himself that these conditions are fulfilled before commencing the examination.

(c) *Darkness Adaptation*.—It is essential that a candidate should be kept in a room which is either completely or partially darkened for at least a quarter of an hour before he is required to undergo this test.

Before the examination commences the examiner must satisfy himself that the room in which it is conducted is so darkened as to exclude all daylight.

(d) *Method of Testing*.—The lantern supplied for the examination is so constructed as to allow one large or two small lights to be visible, and is fitted with twelve glasses of three colours—red, white, and green. At the commencement of the examination the examiner should show to the candidate a series of lights through the large aperture, and should require him to name the colours as they appear to him. Care should be taken in showing the white light to emphasize the fact that this light is not a pure white. If a candidate makes a mistake of calling this light "red", a proper red light should be shown immediately after and the candidate's attention directed to the difference between the two.

After a series of lights through the large aperture has been shown, the examiner should make a complete circuit with the two small apertures, requiring the candidate to name the colours of each set of two lights from left to right. To prevent any possibility of the order

in which the lights are arranged from being learnt, the examiner should at least twice in each circuit go back a varying number of colours.

The foregoing amendment was passed at a meeting of the Marine Board held on the eighteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty.

A By-law of the City of Sandringham, made under section 228 of the *Local Government Act* 1928 and numbered 115, for the purpose of altering By-law No. 76.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every other power thereunto them enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham hereby order as follows:—

By-law No. 76 of the City of Sandringham for prescribing residential areas within the Municipal District is altered to the following extent, namely, by excluding from the lands therein described as residential areas in the Black Rock Ward—

- (1) All that area of land, being part of Crown portion 32, Parish of Moorabbin, County of Bourke: Commencing at a point in Balcombe-road, being the south-east corner of the intersection of Balcombe-road and Haydens-road; thence easterly along the south side of Balcombe-road to Reserve-road; thence southerly along the west side of Reserve-road to the intersection of the western boundary of Reserve-road and the southern boundary of Pacific Boulevard; thence westerly along the south side of Pacific Boulevard to a depth of 258 feet to the intersection of the southern boundary of Pacific Boulevard and the eastern boundary of Haydens-road; thence northerly along the east side of Haydens road to the commencing point, which area includes the whole of the land comprised within the said boundaries including the following streets, namely, Waratah-avenue, Rockley-avenue, Sunset-avenue, Grandview-avenue, Waiora-avenue, Seabright-avenue, Gramatan-street, Wattle-avenue, Lynette-avenue, Pasadena-avenue, Glenwood-avenue, and Pacific Boulevard; and
