## DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 7 (COUNTRY SHOP ASSISTANTS).

Note.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State putside and excepting the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portion of the City of Sandringham as is not included within the said District: the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in or in connexion with a shop as a shop assistant, packer, storeman, or carter," has made the following Determination, viz.:—

(1) That on the 26th August, 1940, the last Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination as to the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in or in connexion with a shop as a shop assistant, packer, storeman, or carter, but not including persons subject to the Determinations of the—

Shops Board No. 4 (Butchers, Country),

Shops Board No. 6 (Chemists),

Shope Board No. 13 (Fuel and Fodder, Country), or the

Hotel and Restaurant Board.

- (3) OVERTIME.—The rate of time and a half shall be paid for all time worked—

  - (a) in any week in excess of the number of hours fixed for a week's work;
    (b) before 8.30 s.m. or after 12.30 p.m. on the day on which the weekly half-holiday is observed.
- (4) Time Wages.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours of an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three per centum, and for each hour worked beyond the one-half aforesaid shall be paid the ordinary wages rate up to but not exceeding ordinary wages rates for an ordinary week's work.
- (5) Special Rates—All work done on Sunday, Good Friday, Easter Saturday (except in localities in which the late trading night is observed on a Saturday), Easter Monday, and the days on which Australia Day, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day are observed as public holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (6) Annual Leave.—Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted one week's holiday, exclusive of the holidays mentioned in clause (5), in each year on full pay and such holiday shall be given within three months of the completion of twelve months' service, provided that, for the purposes of this clause, any service prior to the 5th April, 1937, shall not be taken into account.
- (7) SIGK PAY.—Any employee not attending for duty shall lose his or her pay for the actual time lost unless such employee has had not less than twelve month's service with the same employer, and he or she produces or forwards within twenty-four hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his or her non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such absence, but such employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health or accident for more than six days in each year commencing from the 4th July, 1938.
- (8) ALLOWANCE.—Any employee who is required to wear, when at work, a washable coat, the laundering of which is not paid for by the employer, shall be paid 2s. 6d. per week, in addition to the ordinary wage.
  - (9) PAYMENT OF WAGES .- Wages shall be paid not later than Thursday in each week, and must be paid during working hours.
- (10) Reference.—An employee, on severing his or her connexion with an employer, shall be entitled to and shall receive from such employer a reference in writing, stating his or her period of service and qualifications.
- (11) TRANSFER OF EMPLOYEE.—Where any employer transfers an employee from one township to another, the employer shall be responsible for and shall pay the whole of the moving expenses, including fares and transport charges, for the employee and his family.
- (12) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT,—Except in a case where an employee has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.
- (13) Rent of Residence.—The employer shall not charge any manager or assistant who resides on the premises in connexion with the shop in which the business of such employer is carried on a greater sum as ront for such premises than 10s. 0d. per week.
- (14) TIME AND WAGES RECORD.—The employer shall keep a time and wages record showing the name of each worker, the number of hours worked each week, and the wages and overtime paid each week. Such record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited representative of the Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Federation of Australia or of the Victorian Storekeepers' Association.

## DETERMINATION OF THE ASBESTOS-CEMENT WORKERS BOARD.

Notes.—(a) This Determination on the 21st day of August, 1940, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(b) On the 27th November, 1934, the Cement Articles Board was deprived of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the process, trade, or business of making portable articles of material containing asbestos and cement in the proportion of not less than one part by weight of asbestos in each twenty parts by weight of the material, and such power was conferred exclusively on the Asbestos-Cement Workers Board.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which since 24th April, 1939, has had the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons:—

employed in the process, trade, or business of making portable articles of material containing asbestos and cement in the proportion of not less than one part by weight of asbestos in each twenty parts by weight of the material; has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 21st August, 1940, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (3) ALLOWANCE FOR AFTERNOON AND NIGHT SHIFT.—Persons working on afternoon or night shift, shall be paid at the rate of 5s. per week in addition to the rates set out in Clause (2).
  - (4) OVERTIME.—Time and a half shall be paid for all work done:—
    - (a) outside the usual starting and finishing times.
    - (b) within the usual starting and finishing times, in excess of the number of hours fixed as a week's work.

Provided that a shift worker shall not be entitled to overtime unless he has worked more than 132 hours during any three consecutive weeks.

(5) HOLIDAYS.—All employees shall be entitled to the ten holidays hereinafter mentioned without any deduction from the weekly rate of pay, viz.:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

This shall not affect the right of an employer to require any employee to work on any such day (except Anzac Day) provided that such employee is paid the extra rates as set out in Clause (6) (Special rate for Sundays and Holidays).

- (6) SPECIAL RATE FOR SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, then the special rate shall be payable only for the day so substituted.
- (7) Annual Leave.—Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months, shall be granted as holidays with pay the working days between the Christmas holidays and New Years' Day. Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause, an employer may require his employees to continue work on the working days between the Christmas holidays and New Year's Day, in which case he shall grant within three months thereafter to every employee so entitled a continuous holiday equivalent to the working days between the Christmas holidays and New Year's Day.

Provided that any employee, who leaves or is dismissed before the expiration of any twelve months' service, or who leaves or is dismissed after having completed twelve months' service without receiving holidays under this clause, shall be given or paid for holidays pro rata in accordance with the length of service, viz., one day for each completed four months of service.

Payment for such holiday pay shall be calculated on an average of the three completed weeks immediately preceding such holidays.

### DETERMINATION OF THE ANIMAL MANURE BOARD.

Notes.—(A) This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(B) On 25th May, 1914, the powers of the Animal Manure Board were extended to enable it to fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, or business of the extraction of tallow.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, or business of the manufacture of manure from animal matter," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 23rd August, 1940, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(2)

- (3) CASUAL EMPLOYEE.—A "casual employee" shall be paid the ordinary rate with the addition of 12½ per centum, purpose of this clause a "casual employee" shall mean a person who works less than three full days in any one week.
  - (4) Hours of Work.—The maximum number of hours to be worked, without payment for overtime, shall be-

- (a) Day work.—(i) 44 hours per week;
  (ii) 8 hours per day on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday;
  4 hours on Saturday.

  (b) Shift work.—(i) 44 hours per week or by mutual agreement between any employer and his employees 88 hours per fortnight, with a maximum of 48 hours in any one week;
  (ii) 8 hours per day on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.
- (5) Overrime.—All time worked in excess of the number of hours prescribed in clause (4) shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.
- (6) Holidays.—All weekly wage employees shall be granted the following holidays without deduction of pay:—The days observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing.
- (7) Special Rates.—Double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays and holidays specified in clause (6). No. 313.- 10183/40.

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(8) PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.—The wages rates set out in clause (2) are based upon the following basic wage and, pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of section 21 of the Factories and Shops Act 1934, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount, and at the same time as such basic wage. Provided that the wages of apprentices and improvers shall be adjusted proportionately to adjustments of the basic wage, such adjustments to be to the nearest 1d., half or less than half of a 1d. to be disregarded.

The basic wage shown hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause (9).

<sup>(9)</sup> ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.—(a) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1940, the amount of the hasic wage shall be as prescribed in clause (8).

For the purposes of this Determination the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's Retail Price Index Numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such Index Numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician.

- (1) The Index Number set to be applied is that assigned to Melbourne.
- (2) The index number for the calendar quarter next preceding the period of thirteen weeks for which the adjustment is made is to be ascertained.
- (3) The amount assigned in the following table (or in any extension thereof) to the Index Number Division comprising that Number is to be ascertained.

N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed either inside or outside a factory or work-room in the process, trade, or business of—

A wire-worker, using six gauge or smaller wire, but not including persons employed in making wire netting, barbed wire wire nails, or wire mattresses," has made the following Determination, viz.:—

(1) That on the 31st August, 1940, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(2) Apprentices or Improvers.	Juvenile Workers, i.e., persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers).	Other Employees.
