Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

*Superannuation Act 1928.***ELECTION BY OFFICERS OF MEMBERS OF THE STATE SUPERANNUATION BOARD FOR THE PERIOD COMMENCING ON THE TWENTY-FOURTH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1940.**

NOTICE is hereby given, pursuant to section 61 of the *Superannuation Act 1928*, that elections will be held to elect two Members of the State Superannuation Board, one of whom shall be such officer within the meaning of the said Act other than an officer in the Railway Service, and one of whom shall be such officer in the Railway Service, as is elected by officers other than officers in the Railway Service and by officers in the Railway Service respectively, in the manner specified as follows:—

Appointment of Election Officials.

1. For the purpose of these elections, the Chief Electoral Officer for the State of Victoria shall be the Returning Officer.

2. The Returning Officer may, by writing under his hand, appoint some person to be his substitute, and may in a like manner appoint persons to assist him as Poll Clerks in the conduct of the elections.

3. The Returning Officer, the Substitute Returning Officer, and every Poll Clerk shall, before entering upon any of their duties, in connexion with the elections, make a statutory declaration in the form of the First Schedule hereto.

Voters.

4. Ballot-papers shall be forwarded to all officers within the meaning of the *Superannuation Act 1928*, provided that no election shall be invalidated by reason merely that ballot-papers have been irregularly forwarded to those who are not "officers" or have been omitted to be sent to officers unless in the opinion of the Minister such irregularity or omission has affected the result of the election.

Nominations.

5. No person shall be capable of being elected a Member of the Board unless duly nominated.

6. A nomination shall be in the form of the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect; shall be signed by not less than twenty persons entitled to vote at the election for which the candidate is nominated; shall be lodged with or delivered to the Returning Officer, at the Old Treasury Building, Spring-street, Melbourne, C.I., not later than Twelve o'clock noon on the twenty-fifth day of October, 1940, hereinafter referred to as "nomination day"; and shall contain the consent of the candidate to act if elected.

Withdrawal of Nominations.

7. Any candidate may, by written notice addressed to the Returning Officer, withdraw his consent to his nomination at any time not later than Twelve o'clock noon on nomination day, and such candidate shall be considered as not having been nominated. The Returning Officer shall thereupon omit the name of such candidate from the ballot-papers.

Nominations Advertised.

8. After Twelve o'clock noon on nomination day, the Returning Officer shall announce the full name, Department, and Branch of each officer nominated, and shall cause notice thereof to be published in the *Government Gazette*.

Uncontested Elections.

9. If at either election one candidate only is nominated, that candidate shall be duly elected, and notice thereof shall forthwith be published by the Minister in the *Government Gazette*.

Polling.

10. If at either election more candidates than one have been nominated, a vote shall be taken to decide the election, and the Returning Officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, and shall, by himself or his substitute or a Poll Clerk, sign or initial each of such ballot-papers, and shall enclose it with an unfastened envelope having his own name and address printed thereon, and shall send by post, or cause to be delivered, to every voter, one of such ballot-papers and envelopes pertaining to the appropriate election.

11. After having recorded his vote, the voter shall enclose such ballot-paper in the envelope furnished to him with the printed address of the Returning Officer thereon; shall sign his name in the space provided for the purpose on the face of the envelope; shall state his Department and Branch; and shall stamp and post, or deliver (or cause to be delivered) the same so that it will be received by the Returning Officer not later than Four o'clock in the afternoon of the fourth day of December, 1940, hereinafter referred to as "the day of the election." Any ballot-paper which is not enclosed in such addressed envelope with the voter's signature and the other particulars specified thereon, or in which the directions in the Third Schedule hereto have not been complied with, and any ballot-paper forwarded through the post the postage thereon

not being fully prepaid, shall not be counted in the scrutiny. The decision of the Returning Officer as to the validity or invalidity of a ballot-paper shall be final.

12. Upon a voter making and transmitting to the Returning Officer a statement in writing (setting out his full name, Department, and Branch) that he has not received a ballot-paper, or that the ballot-paper received by him has been destroyed and that he has not already voted, the Returning Officer may issue a new ballot-paper to such voter.

Preferential Voting.

13. A voter shall mark his ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference, and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the figures 2, 3, and 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names, so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

Scrutineers.

14. Each candidate at any election shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present when the envelopes containing ballot-papers relating to such election are being opened at the commencement of the scrutiny, and to remain during the scrutiny. Every scrutineer shall, before he acts as such, make and sign before the Returning Officer a like declaration to that which the Returning Officer and other officers employed in the conduct of the election are required to make and sign.

The Scrutiny.

15. The scrutiny shall not commence until after Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day of the election.

16. The Returning Officer or the Substitute Returning Officer, with the assistance of any Poll Clerk duly appointed, shall—

- (a) produce unopened all envelopes containing ballot-papers received up to the time of closing the poll;
- (b) examine each envelope, and if it is properly signed, and if it contains the necessary particulars thereon and otherwise complies with the provisions herein contained, accept the vote for further scrutiny;
- (c) if an envelope is not properly signed or otherwise does not comply with the provisions herein contained, reject the vote without opening the envelope;
- (d) place the unaccepted envelopes on a table face downwards, so that the signatures of the voters shall not be visible;
- (e) open each unaccepted envelope, withdraw the ballot-paper contained therein, and without inspecting the vote or permitting any other person to do so, deposit the ballot-paper in a ballot-box;
- (f) when all unaccepted envelopes have been opened and the ballot-papers withdrawn therefrom and deposited in the ballot-box, open the ballot-box and count the votes.

Adjournment of Scrutiny.

17. The Returning Officer may from time to time adjourn the scrutiny to a day and hour fixed by him and notified to the scrutineers.

Provisions of State Laws to Operate.

18. Subject to the provisions contained herein, each election shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the law for the time being regulating elections for the Legislative Assembly, so far as they can be made applicable, *mutatis mutandis*.

Recounts.

19. At any time before the gazettal of the result of any election, as hereinafter provided, the Returning Officer may, if he thinks fit, on the written request of any candidate setting forth the reasons for the request, or of his own motion, make a recount of the ballot-papers.

If the Returning Officer refuses on the request of a candidate to make a recount of the ballot-papers, the candidate may, in writing, appeal to the Minister to direct a recount, and the Minister may, as he thinks fit, either direct a recount or refuse to direct a recount.

Cases of Equal Voting.

20. If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes, the Returning Officer shall decide by lot which candidate shall be declared defeated or (in the case of a final count) which candidate shall be declared elected.

Publication of Results.

21. The Returning Officer shall announce the result of each election, and transmit a statement of such result to the Minister, who shall notify such result in the *Government Gazette*.

Disposal of Ballot-papers, &c.

22. The Returning Officer shall, after publication of the results of the elections in the *Government Gazette*, destroy all ballot-papers and envelopes used at such elections.

TOWN OF ARARAT.

WATER BY-LAW No. 38.

THE Council of the Town of Ararat, hereinafter referred to as the "Council," in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for preventing the waste or misuse of water supplied by the said Council within the Ararat Water Supply District:—

1. During the period commencing with the 10th day of October, 1940, and ending the 30th day of June, 1941, no person shall use or permit to be used or allowed to run on any premises any water for any other than domestic purposes, manufacturing, mining, or fire-fighting purposes, except between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. on each day, and unless through a garden hose of not more than 1 inch in diameter, which during use shall be continuously held in the hand.

2. Every person who shall use or permit or suffer water supplied by the Council to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily, before any court of competent jurisdiction, and in cases of continuing the offence, to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Council.

3. If any person supplied with water by the Council wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Council may (without prejudice to any remedy thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Council to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water, as provided by the Water Acts.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "PORTLAND FORESHORE RESERVE."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations and to rescind Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 6th March, 1917, as a site for Public Purposes in the Borough of Portland, and known as the "Portland Foreshore Reserve," in lieu of all previous Regulations, which are hereby rescinded:—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person offending against decency in dress, conduct, and/or language shall remain in the Reserve. All persons bathing from the Reserve shall be decently attired in a suitable bathing costume.

2. No person shall permit any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals to enter in or upon the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first had and obtained, except upon such portions thereof as may be set apart for that purpose from time to time by the Committee of Management, and any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals straying within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded. Bathing horses or other animals in the sea contiguous to the Reserve is prohibited excepting from that portion of the foreshore situated between the two piers. Persons in charge of such animals shall take them by a direct route from the ramp near the baths to this place, and shall return them by the same route. The exercising of horses or other animals in any part of the Reserve is strictly prohibited.

3. No person shall destroy, disfigure, break down, carry away, climb upon, jump over, or otherwise injure or damage any of the buildings, fences, seats, or other erections, trees, shrubs, plants, or other vegetation in or upon the Reserve, nor post bills upon, or write, paint, or carve any words or other device upon such buildings, fences, trees, shrubs, or other erections. No adult person shall make use of any swing, see-saw, or other playground structure marked "For the Use of Children Only."

4. No person shall erect any bathing-box, boat-house, shed, or other structure upon the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and no such permission will be given to any person until such person has submitted, and the Committee of Management has approved of, plans and specifications of such bathing-box, boat-house, shed, or other structure. All buildings on the Reserve must conform to plans and regulations as to position and design, approved by the Committee of Management. After erection, such buildings shall be painted and kept painted in the manner directed by and to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management.

5. No person, after having obtained such permission aforesaid, shall use or cause or permit to be used, any bathing-box, boat-house, or other erection, for residential purposes.

6. No person shall camp, or erect any tent, or utilize any car or trailer for residential purposes in or upon the Reserve, except in such places as shall from time to time be set apart for such purposes, and then only on obtaining a permit to do so upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management shall determine.

7. No person shall bring or place any motor car, motor cycle, cycle, buggy, cart, or other vehicle in or upon the Reserve except in or upon such portions thereof as shall from time to time be set apart by the Committee of Management as parking areas. All persons using such parking areas for the accommodation of any motor car, motor cycle, cycle, buggy, gig, cart, or other vehicle shall pay, on demand, such fees as shall be from time to time fixed by the Committee of Management, but the maximum fee therefor shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings per day. Such persons shall park their vehicles in the manner directed, and in the position ordered by a duly authorized officer of the Committee of Management, or by notices posted in the area.

8. Fires shall only be lighted in the Reserve upon the open sandy beach, or in fireplaces specially provided therein by the Committee of Management.

9. No person shall erect any booth, tent, or other structure on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. No person shall hawk or offer for sale any goods or articles of any description in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No assemblies, or meetings for fêtes, galas, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, or preaching or public speaking, or meetings of a like character, shall take place upon the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall play or perform in any band of music, or take part in any entertainment of any kind, in or upon the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

12. No person shall throw, or cause to be thrown, any stones, sand, or other missiles, or commit any nuisance in the Reserve, or in any property therein.

13. No person shall play cricket, football, hockey, handball, rounders, baseball, golf, or any other athletic game or games on the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person shall engage or take part in any motor car, or motor cycle, or cycle racing upon the Reserve, and it shall be an offence for any person to ride or use any motor car, motor cycle, or other vehicle on the Reserve in any way or manner that may endanger the safety of or cause bodily harm to any person.

15. No person shall moor and/or use any boat in or upon the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

16. No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, any paper, bottles, fruit skins, food, or other litter or refuse in or upon the Reserve, except in receptacles provided for that purpose by the Committee of Management. No person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Reserve, nor shall litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.

17. No person shall break any glass of any kind upon the Reserve, nor leave thereon any substance likely to cause injury to another.

18. No person, except a workman or labourer duly authorized by the Committee of Management shall enter upon any enclosure or plot upon the Reserve set apart or enclosed for the plantation of trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, or other vegetation. No person shall obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed in the Reserve.

19. No person shall make, or cause to be made, any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound in the Reserve.

20. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, race meetings, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

21. The Committee of Management may set apart and enclose certain parts of the Reserve for the holding of fêtes, sports, concerts, or other amusements on not more than six days in any one year, on any of which occasions a charge not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every person to such enclosure.

22. All fees payable and received for camping, agistment, parking of vehicles, use of bathing-boxes, sites for sheds, tents, booths, bathing-boxes, or other structure, or for any other purpose or purposes, shall be expended in the maintenance, upkeep, and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

23. No person shall, in any part of the Reserve, obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or obstruct or neglect to obey the lawful direction of any duly authorized officer of the Committee of Management. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or using obscene language, or creating or taking part in a disturbance in the Reserve, shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom.

The Council of the Borough of Portland has been appointed a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

CITY OF KEW.

By-Law No. 70.

A By-law of the City of Kew, made under the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, as amended by section 26(5) of the *Local Government Act 1934*, and numbered 70, for—

- (a) Prohibiting or regulating the use of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads for the growing of trees, shrubs, or hedges abutting on any such street or road or within 10 feet therefrom;
- (b) requiring the removal or lopping of trees, shrubs, or hedges (whether planted before or after the commencement of the *Local Government Act 1934*) from or on private property so situate where such trees, shrubs, or hedges abut on or are within 10 feet of such street or road; and
- (c) authorizing the Council of the City of Kew to remove or lop, at the expense of the owner, trees, shrubs, or hedges growing or being on private property so situate which are not removed or lopped as required by or under the provisions of the By-law made under the preceding paragraph.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, as amended by the *Local Government Act 1934*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Kew order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Kew.
2. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette* of Victoria.

3. No person shall on private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads in the City of Kew plant or allow to grow any tree, shrub, or hedge within a distance of 10 feet from the junction unless each such tree, shrub, or hedge is kept at a height not greater than 3 ft. 6 in. above the level of the footpath at the point nearest to the tree, shrub, or hedge.

4. The owner of any private property situate at the junction of streets or roads in the City of Kew—

- (i) On which there is any tree, shrub, or hedge (whether planted before or after the commencement of this By-law) within 10 feet from the junction; or
- (ii) on which there is any part within 10 feet from the junction of any tree, shrub, or hedge growing on the property,

shall, within fourteen days after service of a notice in the form or to the effect of the notice set forth in the Schedule hereto, either—

- (a) remove every part within 10 feet from the junction of each such tree, shrub, or hedge; or
- (b) lop each such tree, shrub, or hedge not so removed so that no part of it within 10 feet from the junction is at a height exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. above the level of the footpath at the point nearest to the tree, shrub, or hedge.

5. If the owner of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads on whom the Council has served a notice in the form or to the effect of the Schedule hereto fails to comply with the notice, the Council may—

- (a) At his expense remove or lop in accordance with the requirements of the notice all trees, shrubs, and hedges not removed or lopped by the owner as required by the notice; and
- (b) recover the expense of so doing from the owner in a Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

6. Notwithstanding any action taken under the last preceding clause and apart from and in addition to any liability under that clause, any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every offence to a penalty not exceeding £20.
