# PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Fire Brigades Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the Government Gazette declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the council of the municipal district hereinafter mentioned has requested that the portion of such fire district enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire district specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of such fire district: And whereas a certificate has been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the Fire Brigades Act 1928, do hereby declare that the said portion of such municipal district shall be added to and form part of the fire district specified accordingly:—

# EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Orbost.—Township and Parish of Orbost, County of Croajingolong: Commencing at a point on the southern boundary of allotment B, section A, Parish of Orbost, distant

1,213 links east from the south-western angle of same; thence northerly by a line 8,100 links, more or less, to a point on the southern boundary of allotment 18 distant 1,000 links west from the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence easterly by the southern boundary of allotment 18, northerly by the eastern boundary of allotment 18, northwesterly by part of the eastern boundary of allotment 26, north-easterly by the south-eastern boundary of allotment 17B, south-easterly across a road 1 chain in width, southeasterly by the north-eastern boundary of allotment 17A, northerly across a road 1 chain in width and by the eastern boundary of a Rubbish Depot site and portion of the eastern boundary of allotment 29B; thence easterly by the southern boundary of allotment 29B, across a road 3 chains in width, and by the southern boundaries of a Night Soil Depot site and allotment 55A to the south-western angle of allotment 55B; thence north 0 deg. 4 min. east 1,000 links by the western boundary of allotment 55B; thence east 1.000 links and south 1,100 links to a point on the northern boundary of allotment 70, 636 links east from the north-eastern angle of allotment 70; thence west by the northern boundary of allotment 70 to the north-eastern angle of allotment 70 and south by the castern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to a point on that boundary 2,573.3 links north from the south-western angle of allotment 70; thence cast 4,188½ links to the south-eastern angle of allotment 70; thence south 4,229.7 links and west 2,864½ links to the south-eastern angle of allotment 2, section B; thence west by the southern boundary of allotment 2 to its south-western angle; thence south 79 deg. 39 min. west 1.696½ links to the south-eastern angle of the Cemetery Site in the Township of Orbost; thence south-westerly and south by the western boundary of allotment 1, section B, to the frontage boundary on the left bank of the Snowy River; thence north-westerly, westerly, and southerly by that frontage boundary to the south-eastern angle of allotment B, section A; thence westerly by the southern boundary of allotment B 2,141 links to the point of commencement. 1,100 links to a point on the northern boundary of allotment

In the City of Footscray.—Commencing at the intersection of Francis-street and the railway line between Yarraville and Spotswood railway stations; then proceeding in a northerly direction along the railway line to Anderson-street; then crossing Anderson-street to Birmingham-street; then proceeding north along Birmingham-street to Avoca-street; then proceeding west along Avoca-street to Fehon-street; then proceeding morth along Fehon-street to Somerville-road; then proceeding west along Somerville-road to Williamstown-road; then proceeding north along Williamstown-road to Chaffeld-street; then proceeding west along Chatfield-street; then proceeding south along Queensville-street to Somerville-road; then proceeding west along Somerville-road to the intersection of Somerville-road and Tuppen-street; then proceeding south along Tuppen-street to Crow-street; then
