#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria within the boundaries bereinafter described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the Game Act 1928.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the third year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI., intituled the Ballaarat Public Hall Act 1930, it is amongst other things enacted that sections 3. 4 and 5 of the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette, and that before any such Proclamation is made the question of the erection of a public hall upon the land described in the Schedule to the said Act shall be submitted to a poll of the ratepayers of the City of Ballaarat, and further that if at such poll a majority of the votes polled is recorded against the erection of a public hall upon the land described in the said Schedule no such Proclamation shall be made: And whereas a poll of such ratepayers upon the said question was held on the eighth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and forty, and a majority of the votes polled was not recorded against the erection of a public hall upon the lund described in the aforesaid Schedule: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Thursday, the twenty-ninth day of February. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE. PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR ORNAMENTAL PLANTATION PURPOSES IN THE TOWN OF ARARAT.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the Land Act 1928, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 6th November, 1939, as a site for Plantation Purposes in the Town and Parish of Argrata.

#### REGULATIONS.

- i. The Reserve shall be open to the public on such occasions as the Committee of Management may permit.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers or injure or destroy any native fauna in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein except in the fire places provided for the purpose, and all due precautions shall be taken to extinguish fires lighted by such person before leaving the Reserve.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, or trees in the Reserve, or leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, except in the receptacles provided therefor, or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind thereon.
- 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained
- 6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of the cattle.
- For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1928.
- 7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall erect in the Reserve any building or booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
- 11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays,
- organized game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

  12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or any holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, crection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost

of making good auch loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

14. The Committee of Management shall have power to fix such fees from time to time for use of the Reserve as may be considered reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the Town of Ararat as a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than

Five pounds (£9), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Orown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

NOTICE is hereby given that By-law No. 66 of the City of Kew, made and bassed by the Council of the City of Kew was approved by the Commission of Public Health on the 14th day of November, 1939, and by the Governor in Council on the 13th day of February, 1940.

The By-law numbered 66 is made under sections 197, 198, 217, and 797 of the Local Government Act 1928, as amended by the Local Government Act 1934 and the Local Government Act 1938, the Realth Act 1928, and every other power enabling the making of this By-law for the following purposes and for the purposes in connexion therewith:—

(a) Regulating, restricting, restraining, or prohibiting the erection, construction, use, occupation, conversion and alteration of, and any addition to buildings or erections, and regulating, restraining or prohibiting the erection and construction of hourdings, or of fences abutting on or within 10 feet of any street

- the erection and construction of hoardings, or of fences abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road.

  (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections or hoardings, or of fences abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road.

  (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections or hoardings, or fences erected or constructed contrary to this By-law or any By-laws of the City of Kev previously in force, or not oulled down or removed as required by or under this or any such By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, hoardings or fences, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any penalties due by the owner thereof.

  (d) Prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair or renewal of buildings, roofs or chimneys, flues, smoke-vents or stove-pipes.

  (e) Regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.

  (f) Regulating the height, thickness, construction or materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys, and the materials and enclosing by building or otherwise of fireolaces or furnaces to be used in the working of engines by steam or in any manufactory whatsover, although a steam engine be not used therein respectively.

  (h) Prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling house, or any shop, or any dwelling house and shop combined may hereafter be creeted.

  Providing that every dwelling house hereafter erected shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof, a prescribed area of open land.

(j) Providing with respect to buildings hereafter erected for regulating or limiting the height of buildings; for means of escape from buildings in case of fire and the prevention of fire in buildings; for the ventilation and lighting of buildings and the provision of bathrooms and baths in buildings; for exits from and stairways in buildings other than private dwelling houses; for the minimum size of any dwelling rooms; and for the minimum size of any dwelling rooms; and for the minimum area to be covered by any dwelling house or any dwelling house and shop combined.
(k) Regulating sewerage and drainage.
(l) Regulating or prohibiting the use in or on any fence or other crection on land adjoining any street or road of any wire with spikes or jagged projections.
(m) Providing for the removal of ruinous or dangerous buildings.

(b) Regulating, restricting or preventing the exhibition of advertisements in such places and in such manner or by such means as to affect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade, or to disfigure the natural benuty of a landscape.

(r) Leaving any matter or thing in relation to the erection and construction of buildings to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with or regulated by the Council by Resolution, or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case.

(8) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done, or inspection made, or service performed by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

(1) Regulating or prohibiting the keeping of any place or any animals (including birds), or the storage of any things in the opinion of the Council offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.

(a) Fixing, subject to Part IV. of the Health Act 1928, the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any such place or animal, or to store any such thing.

(b) And for repealing all By-laws and Regulations inconsistent herewith.

#### CITY OF SANDRINGHAM. REGULATION No. 116.

A Regulation of the City of Sandringham numbered 116 made under section 26 of Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the Local Government Act 1928 in force in the City by virtue of a By-law of the above-named City numbered 91 for regulating the width, depression, and inclination of crossings across or over footways and channels, and the materials for muking and constructing the same, the mode of laying and bedding such materials, the length, width, size, strength, and fall of bridge crossings, and the said inclination and fall either absolutely or with relation to the levels, inclination, or fall of the footway or channel or otherwise in like manner. otherwise in like manner.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Govern-ment Act 1928, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham make the following Regulation which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District:-

the Municipal District:—

1. Except in the case of a bridge crossing every crossing over a footway and channel shall from the building line to a point 6 feet distant from such building line be flush with such footway and shall between such point and the invert of the channel lying along the outer edge of such footway fall with a constant inclination to the level of such invert and shall from there continue towards the roadway as far as the outside edge of such channel with a constant upward inclination to such invert equal to the inclination to such invert equal to the inclination to such invert of the outer side of such channel.

2. Every such crossing shall be of a width equal to the width of the gateway to which it leads or of a width of 9 feet whichever shall be the greater.

3. Except as is hereinafter provided all crossings shall be constructed of cement concrete.

3. Except as is hereinafter provided all crossings shall be constructed of cement concrete.

4. Except as is hereinafter provided every such crossing which is intended to be used by vehicles weighing more than 40 cwt. shall be constructed of concrete at least 6 inches in depth, and every such crossing which is intended to be used by vehicles weighing not more than 40 cwt. shall be constructed of concrete at least 5 inches in depth.

5. Where the foundation for any such crossing consists of made-up ground, clay, or other unstable foundation, such coment concrete shall be reinforced with 4-inch diameter mild steel bars placed in two rows at right angles to each other, the bars in each such row being laid to 9-inch centres, and 14 inches from the bottom of concrete.

6. All cement concrete used in the construction of any such crossing shall consist of one part by volume of the best Port-

6. All cement concrete used in the construction of any such crossing shall consist of one part by volume of the best Portland cement (94 lb. to be taken as a measure for 1 cubic foot), two parts by volume of clean sharp sand, and four parts by volume of clean 3-inch bluestone screenings so mixed that a test cylinder 12 inches by 6 inches shall at the expiration of seven days from mixing show a compressive strength of at least 1,600 lb.

7. In constructing any such crossing the concrete shall be hid on a bed of sand or ashes at least 2 inches in thickness and the surface of all cement concrete shall have a steel trowel flaish. All joints therein shall be made with a proper

trowel finish. All joints therein shall be made with a proper jointing tool.

8. Notwithstanding anything herein contained in case the footway is already constructed in asphalt crossings may be constructed of asphaltic concrete.

9. All asphaltic concrete used in the construction of any such crossing shall consist of clean 4-inch bluestone screenings mixed with liquid bitumen in such a manner that all stones are evenly coated with bitumen, but containing no excess bitumen, the whole to be covered with a 4-inch thickness of clean 4-inch bluestone toppings mixed in a similar manner with liquid bitumen, the whole to be thoroughly consolidated.

10. Where any kerbing to a footway has been cut away to permit the constructed on each side of the crossing to the same specifications as the existing kerbing. Such return kerbing shall be returned on a radius of not less than 4 feet and tapered so that the top thereof meets the rising gradient of the crossing in a manner least likely to cause inconvenience to pedestrians. to pedestrians

11. Every bridge crossing over a channel shall consist of a reinforced concrete pipe or box culvert laid with the same longitudinal gradient as the existing channel and with a cross sectional area sufficient for the volume of drainage conveyed by such channel.

12. Notwithstanding anything herein contained no such concrete pipe shall be less than 9 inches internal diameter and no such box culvert shall be less than 12 inches wide nor less than 6 inches high, internal dimensions.

13. Every bridge crossing shall be of a length equal to the width of the gateway to which it leads or of a length of 16 feet whichever shall be the greater.

14. Every concrete pipe and every precast culvert used in the construction of a bridge crossing shall comply with the Australian Standard Specification No. A35, and all cement concrete used in the construction of any bridge crossing cast in place shall consist of one part by volume of the best Port-

land cement (94 lb, to be taken as a measure for 1 cubic foot); two parts by volume of clean sharp sand, and four parts by volume of clean 4-inch bluestone screenings, so mixed that a test cylinder 12 inches by 6 inches shall at the expiration of seven days from mixing show a compressive strength of the least 1 cool 15.

tion of seven days from mixing show a compressive strength of at least 1,600 lb.

15. The floor walls and top of every such bridge crossing east in place shall be at least 5 inches thick and the top shall be reinforced with 4-inch diameter mild steel bars placed in two rows at right angles to each other, the bars in each such row being laid to 6-inch centres, and 14 inches from the button of concrete

16. Where a bridge crossing has been constructed over a channel the crossing over the footway shall, from the building line to a point 5 feet distant from such building line, be flush with such footway and shall between such point and the outside edge of the channel lying along the outer edge of such footway full with a constant inclination to the level of the top of such bridge crossing.

17. Notwithstanding anything herein contained—

(a) In case the roadway has not been metalled for the full width between channels, bridge crossings over pitched channels may be constructed in timber and every such timber crossing shall consist of 4 inches by 2 inches Hardwood decking spaced 1 inch apart securely fixed to 4 inches by 3 inches Hardwood bearers spaced not more than 4 feet apart and supported on and securely fixed to 4 inches by 4 inches Jarrah or Red Gum bearers.

(b) In case the difference in level between the invert and

inches Jarah or Red Gum bearers.

(b) In case the difference in level between the invert and outer edge of the channel exceeds 2 inches, bridge crossings over concrete channels may be constructed of wrought iron plate and every such wrought iron plate rossing shall consist of 3-inch wrought iron plate, securely fixed to 4 inches by 4 inches concrete bearers.

(a) Any person engaged in the construction of any building may cart building materials over any footway or channel if he causes such footway and channel to be adequately protected by a covering of battens or planks hald on the surface and firmly secured in position so as not to cause any obstruction or be a source of danger to pedestrians using such footway and so as not to cause any obstruction in such channel to the free flow of water therein. water therein.

1. The whole of the Township of Euroa, as hereinafter defined, shall be and is hereby prescribed a residential area.

2. The erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of any of the classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements (as provided and set out in Schedule A of this By-law) within such residential area, shall be and is hereby prohibited.

3. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coning into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, re-building, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, re-building, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership.

4. This By-law shall apply to and operate throughout the Township of Euroa as hereinafter defined.

Commencing at the north-west corner of allotment 9, section E.1, Parish of Euroa; thence east-south-easterly along township, Boundary-road to south-west corner of allotment 3, Parish of Euroa; thence north-easterly to

Any person who shall be guilty of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds (£5) and not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and if such offence is a continuing one, to a further penalty of not less than One pound (£1) per day and not exceeding Five pounds (£5) per day for each day such offence is committed.

- 3. (a) No person in any street or footway shall sell or offer for sale any goods in such a manner as to cause any obstruction in such street or footway or to obstruct or hinder members of the public in the free and proper use of such street or footway.

(b) Every person selling or offering for sale any goods in any street or footway in such a manner shall move on upon being so required by any officer of the said Council or any member of the Police Force.

- 4. No child shall be employed as a street hawker or itinerant trader nor be permitted to manage or occupy a stand in any street, road, or public place.

Factories and Shops Acts.

#### DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 4 (BUTCHERS, COUNTRY).

NOTE.—(a) This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) and the Order in Council thereunder; such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not included within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; and the Moorpanyal and Peak Ridings of the Shire of Corio.

(b) Butchering and/or Small Goods Making were proclaimed on 9th October, 1939, as Apprenticeship Trades under the Apprenticeship Acts for the Metropolitan District as defined in the said Acts. The areas subject to this Determination which are affected by the said Acts are:—The Western and River Ridings of the Shire of Braybrook, the South Riding of the Shire of Mulgrave, the East, North and West Ridings and that portion of the South Riding north of Lower Dandenong Road of the Shire of Dandenong.

Full particulars of the apprenticeship regulations for these trades may be obtained on application to the Secretary, Apprenticeship Commission, Gisborne-street, Melbourne (Price 3d.)

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a butcher or seller of meat, or maker or seller of small goods," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the £3rd February, 1940, the adjusted Determination of this Board which came into operation as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in December, 1939, shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

In such portions of the State of Victoria as come within the purview of the Apprenticeship Commission after a probationary period of four months male juniors shall only be employed as apprentices. The periods and conditions of such employment (except wages rates) and the duties and responsibilities of such apprentices and their employers shall be as prescribed by such Commission.

#### (b) In other areas covered by this Determination unapprenticed juniors may be employed on the following terms:-

After a probationary period of six months each junior for a period of at least four years shall be trained to be a general butcher and shall not be dismissed from his employment during such period except for inefficiency or misconduct or in the event of the employer ceasing to carry on business or who for financial reasons becomes unable to employ labour.

- (4) CASUAL EMPLOYEES.— (a) A casual employee, that is, an employee who is not employed for a full week, shall be paid one-sixth of the weekly wage prescribed in this award for the class of work he performs, plus 10 per cent. of such one-sixth for each day or part of a day on which he is employed. For time worked in excess of 8 hours on any one day, time and a half rates shall be paid.
- (b) Where a casual employee is required to perform more than one class of work on any one day, he shall be paid for the whole of that day at the highest wage prescribed in this award for any of the work which he performs.
- (c) In addition to the rate payable under sub-clause (a) hereof casual employees shall be paid all fares above 4d. per day reasonably and necessarily incurred.
- (5) Special Rates and Allowances.—Where an employee is temporarily transferred during working hours from one shop or factory to another the employer shall pay such employee all costs of transit and travelling time.
- (6) Hours of Labour.—(a) (1) In retail butchers' shops, small goods factories and in abattoirs the ordinary working hours shall not exceed in number 44 per week.
  - (2) No time worked on a Sunday shall be reckoned as part of such ordinary hours.
- (3) (i) Each daily period of work comprised in such ordinary working hours shall be unbroken except by prescribed meal intervals
  - (ii) No such daily period of work shall exceed in duration nine hours exclusive of prescribed meal intervals.
- (iii) Such daily periods of work shall be so arranged that on at least one day in each week the employee concerned shall finish his ordinary hours of work not later than 12.30 p.m.
  - (4) No time worked before 6 a.m. or after 8 p.m. shall be reckoned as part of such ordinary hours.
- (5) (i) Subject to compliance with the foregoing provisions and with those hereinafter contained the employer may for any of his employees fix each day's starting and finishing times of ordinary work (inclusive of special starting and finishing times for any day next preceding a public holiday) observed by him for the employee concerned.
- (ii) The employer shall state such times in advance in a notice posted in his establishment so as to be readily accessible and visible to the employee concerned.
- (iii) The employer may from time to time substitute other starting and finishing times if not less than a week in advance of the substituted times he states such times in a notice posted so as to be visible to the employee concerned together with the next previous notice concerning such times.
- (iv) Every fixation of starting and finishing times shall be made in respect of a period which shall not be less than a week in length.
- (7) MEAL INTERVALS.—(a) Employees shall be granted one hour for lunch on a full working day between noon and 2 p.m.
- (b) Employees called upon to start work before 7 a.m. shall be allowed one hour for breakfast to commence before 10 a.m.
  - (c) Meal intervals, where allowed, shall not be counted as part of the daily or weekly hours worked.
  - (8) OVERTIME-All time worked-
    - (a) in excess of 44 hours per week;
    - (b) in excess of 9 hours on five days of the week and 5½ hours on the day on which the ordinary hours of work are fixed to finish not later than 12.30 p.m.; or
- (c) before the fixed starting time or after the fixed finishing time; shall be paid for at overtime rate, namely, time and a half.
  - No employee shall be called upon to work overtime after 7 p.m. without a break of one hour or payment of 2s. tea money.
- (9) Holidays.—(a) The following days or the days observed in lieu thereof, except for the unavoidable delivery of small goods, shall be holidays and shall be paid for as though worked:—

New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and Union Pienic Day.

For work done in the delivery of small goods on these days, time and a half rates shall be paid after 9.30 a.m., but on Good Friday after 11.30 a.m.

- (b) On any such holidays except Christmas Day, Anzac Day and Union Picnic Day, employees except those engaged in the making of small goods if required shall work without extra payment for not more than two hours but on Good Friday for not more than four hours.
- (c) If an employee is dismissed within fourteen days before any of the holidays abovementioned and is re-engaged within fourteen days after any of the holidays abovementioned he shall be deemed to have been dismissed for the purpose of evading payment for such holidays and any payment so evaded shall be due and payable to the employee.
  - (d) For any work done on holidays except as provided in the preceding sub-clauses of this clause double time shall be paid.
- (10) SUNDAY WORK.—All work performed on Sundays except attention to horses or other live stock shall be paid for at double For attention to horses or other live stock on Sundays ordinary rates shall be paid.
- (11) PAYMENT OF WAGES .-- (a) Wages due under this determination to a weekly employee shall be paid in cash not later than
  - (b) Employers may, if they so desire, keep two days' pay in hand.
  - (c) Where the services of an employee are dispensed with all wages owing to him shall be paid to him on the day of dismissal.
- (d) Wages due under this determination to a casual employee shall be paid immediately on the termination of work on each day on which he is engaged.
- (12) TIME BOOKS.—(a) Each employer at each place at which he carries on business under this determination shall provide a time book or time sheet in which each day's hours of work of each employee shall be entered (including overtime, if any), and the wages received each week; such entries shall, at least once a week, be vouched for by the signature of the employer or his representative.
- (b) The time book or time sheet so entered and vouched for if countersigned by an employee representing the Union of employees shall be evidence of the time actually worked by an employee for all purposes under this determination, including
- (c) The time book or time sheet, shall, on demand, be produced by the employer for inspection at the place where it is kept at any time between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday to Thursday inclusive and between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Friday to an official of the Australasian Meat Industry Employees Union who has been authorized, in writing, to inspect the same by the general secretary of the secretary of a State branch of the said Union; or to an official of the Master Butchers Meat and Allied Trades Federation of Australia who has been authorized, in writing, to inspect the same by the general secretary or the secretary of a State branch of the said Federation.
- (d) An inspection shall not be demanded unless the secretary of the Union or Federation or the district secretary or organizer of any division of the Union or Federation suspects that a breach of this determination is being or has been committed.
- (e) Only one demand for such inspection shall be made in any one fortnight at the same establishment and no inspection shall be demanded on a Saturday.
- (f) The official making an inspection shall be entitled to take a copy of entries in the time book or time sheet relating to the suspected breach of this determination.
- (13) Right of Entry.—A duly accredited representative of the Australasian Meat Industry Employees Union shall have the right to enter employers' premises during the meal hour for the purpose of interviewing employees on legitimate Union business on the following conditions:—

  - (a) that he produces his authority to the manager or such other person as may be appointed by the employer;
    (b) that he interviews employees only at the place where they are taking their meal;
    (c) that not more than one representative visits the premises at any one time;
    (d) that not more than one representative visits the same premises more than once in a week; and
    (e) that if any employer allege that a representative is unduly interfering with his business or is creating disaffection amongst his employees or is offensive in his methods or is committing a breach of any of the previous conditions such employer may refuse the right of entry.

(14) Engagement.—(a) Except in casual employment, all employment shall be by the week. An employee, to become entitled to payment on a weekly basis, shall perform such work as the employer shall from time to time require on the days and during the hours usually worked by the class of employee affected.

(b) Employment other than casual shall be terminated only by a week's notice on either side, and such notice may be given at any time during the week. This shall not affect the right of an employer to dismiss an employee without notice for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty or misconduct, in which case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only, or to deduct payment for any day on which an employee cannot be usefully employed because of any strike or through any breakdown of machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible.

(c) An employee not attending for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of such non-attendance unless he produces or forwards to his employer, within twenty-four hours of the commencement of such absence, ovidence satisfactory to the employer that his non-attendance is due to personal accident arising out of and in the course of his employment or to personal ill-health necessitating such absence.

absence.

Provided that an employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal accident or personal ill-health or both, for more than six days in each year. An employer may be agreement with any employee grant such employee a clear week's holiday on full pay in lieu of payment for absences through sients.

For the purposes of this clause the period between the coming into operation of this clause and the 1st day of July, 1940, shall constitute a year, and thereafter each year shall commence on the 1st day of July.

Where are employee performs on any day functions of a mixed character, he shall be paid for that day

- (15) Mixed Functions.—Where an employee performs on any day functions of a mixed character, he shall be paid for that day the wage rate applicable to the function for which the highest rate is payable.
- (16) Leave to Attend Union Business.—Leave of absence from work to attend any Union business shall be allowed by the employer to any employee member of the Australasian Meat Industry Employees Union named by such Union, provided fair and reasonable notice is given to the employer. Provided also that such leave shall be restricted to one employee at a time in the employment of any one employer and such employee shall not be entitled to payment for the time he is so absent from his employment.
  - (17) MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.—(a) The employer shall provide boiling water for the use of employees at meal times.
    (b) First aid appliances and requisites shall be provided free of cost by employers for the use of employees meeting with injuries
  - (c) The employer shall provide for his employees reasonable facilities for the taking of meals and changing of clothes
- (18) Posting Determination.—A copy of this determination shall be posted up by the employer in a conspicuous place, accessible to all employees.
- (19) PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.—The wages rates set out in clause (3) are based upon the following basic wage and pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of section 21 of the Factories and Shops Act 1934, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount and at the same time as such basic wage. Provided that the wages of apprentices and improvers above 21s. shall be adjusted proportionately to adjustments of the basic wage, such adjustments to be to the nearest 6d., half or less than half of 6d. to be disregarded.

The basic wage shown hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause 20.

- (b) During each future successive period beginning with the first pay period to commence in a May, an August, a November, or a February, the amount of the basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statisticians "All Items" retail price index numbers.

For the purposes of this Determination, the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician:—

- (1) The index number set to be applied is that assigned to Melbourne.
  (2) The index number for the calendar quarter next preceding the period of thirteen weeks for which the adjustment is
