CERTAIN PLANTS DECLARED TO BE NOXIOUS WEEDS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* (No. 3799), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the plants named hereunder to be noxious weeds for the purposes of the above Act, viz.:—

Salvia verbenaca, L. ("Wild Sage"), within the Shire of Minhamite.

Emex australis, Steinh ("Spiny Emex," "Three-cornered Jack," or "Cat's Head"), within the Shire of Kerang.

Onopordon acaulon, L. ("Stemless Thistle"), within the Shire of Wimmera.

Girsum acarna ("Soldier Thistle"), throughout the whole State of Victoria.

The Game Acts.

CLOSE SEASONS FOR QUAILS OF VARIOUS SPECIES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation remove from the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*. Quails, *Phasianidae*, and *Turnicidae*, all species, and the period of the close season to wit from the fifteenth day of May in each year to the thirty-first day of March next following (both days inclusive) set opposite the names of such birds, and I do hereby name the under-mentioned birds as birds which shall be included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*, and do set opposite the names of such birds in the said Schedule the periods shown opposite their names hereunder:—

Quails, *Phasianidae*, and *Turnicidae*, all species, except Brown Quail and Painted Quail—

From the first day of July in each year to the thirty-first day of March next following (both days inclusive).

Quail, brown, *Synoisus australis*, and Quail, painted, *Turnix varia*—

From the first day of June in each year to the thirty-first day of March next following (both days inclusive).

I do further direct that this Proclamation shall come into operation after the expiration of a period of one week from the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

NOTICE TO BOATMEN AND OTHERS.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that Henley on the Maribyrnong will be held on Saturday, 3rd February, 1940, and that persons in charge of motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day and night shall observe the following Regulations, viz.:—

Boat races must not be obstructed nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand and carry a bucket for fire-extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit shall be exposed. An approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be carried.

All non-competing boats shall be kept off the course during the racing programme, and the direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

AWARD NO. 61 OF 29TH DECEMBER, 1939.

Relating to Rates of Salaries and Wages for the Year 1939.

THE Railways Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the *Railways Act 1928* (No. 3759), hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

1. The rates of salaries and wages to be paid to officers and employees during the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine shall be as set forth hereunder:—

(a) Adult male employees (except Gatekeepers) shall be paid a needs basic wage of 12s. 2d. per day, subject to adjustment in the manner prescribed in the Orders of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration dated 17th April, 1934, and 23rd June, 1937 (Railway Award), respectively, and in addition the margins prescribed therein for the Schedule to Award No. 20 of the 17th December, 1926, subject to the alterations and additions provided in the Schedules to Awards Nos. 22, 24, 25, 26, 30, 35, 40, 44, 45, 46, 49, 51, 56, and 60 and in the Schedule to this Award.

(b) Adult male officers shall be paid a needs basic salary of £190 per annum, subject to adjustment in the manner prescribed in the Orders of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration dated 17th April, 1934, and 23rd June, 1937 (Railway Award), respectively, and in addition the margins prescribed therein for the Schedule to Award No. 20 of the 17th December, 1926, subject to the alterations and additions provided in the Schedules to Awards Nos. 22, 24, 25, 26, 30, 35, 40, 44, 45, 46, 49, 56, and 60 and in the Schedule to this Award.

(c) Adult male Gatekeepers with free quarters shall be paid a rate of 1s. per day less than the basic wage.

(d) Casual employees shall be paid the hourly rates prescribed therein for the Schedule to this Award, adjusted as prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

(e) Female employees and junior officers and junior employees shall be paid the rates prescribed therein for the Schedule to this Award, adjusted as prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

2. The rates prescribed for casual employees, junior employees, and female employees are based on an adult male needs basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day, and those prescribed for junior officers are based on an adult male needs basic salary of £226 per annum, and the said rates shall on the same dates be increased or decreased in the following manner:—

(i) The hourly rates for casual employees shall be increased or decreased by one-eighth of the amount by which the adult male needs basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day is increased or decreased.

(ii) The rates of pay of junior employees, female employees, and of junior officers shall be increased or decreased in proportion to the increase or decrease in the adult male needs basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day and/or the adult male needs basic salary of £226 per annum, such sum to be calculated to the nearest penny or the nearest pound (as the case may be).

Provided that the increase or decrease in any junior or female rate of pay shall not exceed the increase or decrease in the adult male needs basic wage.

3. (a) In addition to the rates prescribed in clause 1, sub-clauses (a) and (c), the wage rates of all adult male employees shall be increased by a constant amount at the rate of 10d. per day.

(b) In addition to the rates prescribed in clause 1, sub-clause (b), the salaried rates of all adult male officers shall be increased by a constant amount at the rate of £13 per annum.

(c) The hourly rates prescribed in clauses 1 (d) and 2 (i) for casual employees shall be increased by the constant amount of 1½d.

(d) Where the rate prescribed for female employees is at least an amount being 54 per cent. of the adult male basic wage payable from time to time as provided in clause 1 (a) of this Award such rate shall be increased by 54 per cent. of the constant amount prescribed in sub-clause (a) of this clause.

(e) Junior male employees or officers and female employees in the grades set out in the following table shall, in addition to the rates prescribed elsewhere in this Award, be paid the constant amounts indicated hereunder:—

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 12th day of November, 1930, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of December, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of December, 1930, and any amendment thereto are hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations."

2. Regulation 51A of the principal Regulations is hereby repealed and the following Regulations substituted therefor:—

"51A. (a) When any vessel (except a vessel towing another vessel equipped with an efficient sound signal) is approaching the Williamstown Road Ferry the Master thereof (if such vessel be not under pilotage) or the Pilot having the conduct thereof (if such vessel be under pilotage) shall, when the bow of such vessel is abreast of the points set out in paragraph (b) hereof, sound or caused to be sounded upon the whistle of such vessel a prolonged signal blast of six seconds' duration.

(b) The points at which such signal blast shall be sounded shall be the following:—

(i) When a vessel is proceeding upstream towards the Williamstown Road Ferry: No. 12 beacon on the starboard hand approximately 2,000 feet from the said Ferry and indicated in day time by the word "Whistle" shown in red letters on a white ground and in night time by an occulting red Neon light of the following characteristic:—

Light, 5 seconds; eclipse, 1 second.

(ii) When a vessel is proceeding downstream towards the Williamstown Road Ferry: No. 19 beacon on the starboard hand approximately 2,000 feet from the said Ferry and indicated in day time by the word "Whistle" shown in red letters

on a white ground and in night time illuminated by an occulting green Neon light of the following characteristic:—

Light, 5 seconds; eclipse, 1 second.

(c) When such signal has been sounded by any vessel approaching the Williamstown Road Ferry the person in charge of such Ferry shall not permit the said Ferry to leave her berth until the vessel which has so sounded the signal shall have passed clear of the Ferry."

1. In estates as to which probate or administration shall hereafter be granted to the Public Trustee:—

(a) Upon the gross amount of assets realized—

On any sum up to £5,000—£2 10s. per centum.

On all in excess of £5,000 up to £10,000—£2 per centum.

On all in excess of £10,000—£1 per centum.

(b) Upon such part of the capital of any estate realized by a former trustee, executor or administrator, as becomes vested in the Public Trustee on the original trusts, and upon such part of the capital of any estate as is cash in the hands of the Public Trustee at the time when the estate is vested in him—£1 per centum.

(c) Upon unrealized real or personal property transferred or delivered in kind to any person entitled thereto being a devisee, legatee, next of kin, beneficiary, cestui que trust, or other person of a like character, upon the value of such property as fixed by the Public Trustee, but after deducting therefrom all legal or equitable mortgages or charges secured thereon or owing in respect thereof:—

Up to £10,000—£1 5s. per centum.

On all in excess of £10,000—15s. per centum.

Minimum charge under this heading or 2½ per centum on the value of the property transferred or delivered (whichever shall be the lesser amount)—£2.

(d) For obtaining a grant of probate or administration on behalf of a foreign executor or administrator where the Public Trustee accounts to such executor or administrator, and does not himself administer the local estate:—

SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

BY-LAW NO. 70.

A By-law of the Shire of Dandenong, made under the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720) and numbered 70, for appointing in streets and roads standing places for motor cars. By-law No. 66 is hereby repealed.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720) and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows:—

In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—

- "Motor car" means a motor car as defined in section 197 (7) (c) of the *Local Government Act 1928*.
- "Parking area" means any standing place for motor cars appointed under this By-law.
- "Driver" includes any person in charge of a motor car.

1. Such parts of Lonsdale-street, Princes Highway, Clow-street, McCrae-street, King-street, Dandenong, as are set out in the schedule hereto, are hereby appointed and may be used, subject as provided in this By-law, by drivers as parking areas.

2. The Council of the Shire of Dandenong—

- (i) may by resolution from time to time discontinue for such period as it thinks fit any parking areas appointed hereunder;
- (ii) may appoint from time to time such officers as parking area attendants as it thinks proper to supervise the parking areas and remove any such officer or attendant.

3. No driver shall cause or allow or permit his motor car to obstruct or occupy in a parking area any opening prescribed or established under the provisions of this By-law for any purpose prescribed by this By-law or for any cross traffic.

4. The driver of any motor car shall in any parking area park his motor car—

- (a) as directed by the parking area attendant in charge of the parking area; or
- (b) if no such attendant be present shall take up his position therein in the order of his arrival thereat and in such manner as will enable him to take up or leave such position without disturbance to other motor cars already parked and also in such a way as will permit the latter to leave their respective positions without difficulty and not otherwise.

5. It shall be lawful for the said Council by notice in writing under the hand or by the direction of the Shire Secretary from time to time as may be convenient or necessary to fix or appoint openings through and in such parking areas to permit of cross traffic, and also from time to time to vary the same or any of them, and also in like manner from time to time to appoint, alter, or vary the hours during which such parking areas or any of them shall be available for use.

6. The provisions of this By-law shall not affect any stands already fixed or appointed, or which may hereafter be fixed or appointed by the said Council as stands for vehicles licensed by the Council as hackney carriages.

7. No person not being an officer or employee of the said Council or otherwise authorized by the said Council shall destroy, remove, or in any other manner interfere with any notice (including any standard or other erection supporting any such notice) which has been fixed or placed by the said Council upon any street, roadway, or building or other public place, or upon any verandah or other building.

8. No person not being an officer or employee of the said Council or otherwise authorized by the said Council shall affix any notice, sign, or other thing on to or in any street or footway, or erect, drive, or fix any post, spike, peg, or other erection or thing upon or into any street or footway.

9. Any wilful contravention of the foregoing provisions by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

10. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. Every person shall for any act or default contrary to the provisions of clause 2 of this By-law, forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum of not more than Ten pounds and not less than One pound.

4. Every person who fails to abate the flow or escape of water as aforesaid one clear day after a notice in writing, signed by the Shire Secretary of the said Shire of Rodney, has been served upon him or left at the house, land, or premises so owned or occupied by him, or over which he has a right of way or easement requesting him to abate the flow or escape of water shall, for every day on which such person so fails to comply with such notice, be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds and not less than Three pounds.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Rodney.

In this By-law the word person shall include any incorporated body.

1. For the purpose of this By-law, the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them:—

“Merry-go-rounds” shall include roundabouts and whirligigs of every nature, whether motivated by machinery, electrical and/or steam power, and/or pulled or pushed by human agency.

“Swing boats” shall include structures known as swing boats, and also all structures of a like nature for identical purposes of amusement, whether operated manually or mechanically.

“Shooting galleries” shall have the meaning assigned thereto by the *Police Offence Act* 1928 and/or any similar legislation.

“Person” shall include a corporation.

“Surveyor” shall include engineer and/or any other officer acting in a similar capacity.

2. No person shall set up and/or operate, whether for hire or not, any merry-go-round, swing boat, and/or shooting gallery within the boundaries of the Shire without first notifying the surveyor for the time being of the said Shire of

his intention so to do, at the same time advising the said surveyor as to the proposed site of such setting up and/or operating of the said merry-go-round, swing boat, and/or shooting gallery, and obtaining the consent, in writing, of the said surveyor to such setting up and operating of such merry-go-round, swing boats, and/or shooting gallery.

3. The said surveyor shall have authority to refuse such consent absolutely if in his opinion the site for the proposed setting up is not suitable or the said merry-go-round, swing boats, and/or shooting galleries are unfit or unsafe for setting up and/or operating, or are of such a nature or kind which if operated would cause a nuisance either by noise or in any other manner whatsoever to any person or persons within the said Shire, or he may grant such consent conditionally on such alterations and/or repairs as he shall specify in writing being carried out in respect of such merry-go-rounds, swing boat, and/or shooting gallery.

4. That consent by the said surveyor to the setting up and/or operating of such merry-go-rounds, swing boat, and/or shooting gallery shall in no wise interfere with the liability of the applicant to observe the provisions of any statutory enactment and/or regulation in force within the State of Victoria governing the setting up and/or operating of merry-go-rounds, swing boats, and/or shooting galleries, but that this By-law is in addition and not in substitution for such statutory enactment and/or regulation.

5. That whilst such merry-go-round, swing boat, or shooting gallery is operating within the said Shire, such merry-go-round, swing boat, or shooting gallery shall each be under the personal superintendence and control of some person over the age of twenty-one years, who shall be present personally whilst such merry-go-round, swing boat, or shooting gallery shall be in operation.

6. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Five pounds.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Rodney, save and except the grounds from time to time in use in the townships of Kyabram and Tatura for the holding of the Annual Agricultural Shows in Kyabram and Tatura.
