SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT "POLLOCH," NAGAMBIE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c. &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the Game Act 1928.

None of the said articles, materials, or things set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be provided, fixed, or used for or in connexion with any works of the said Authority or for or in connexion with the use of the commodity or service supplied by any of such works unless the same are duly stamped or marked with the said stamp or mark of the Authority.
- 5. The use of the said stamp or mark by any person other than a duly authorized officer of the said Authority or by some person or body duly authorized in that behalf by the said Authority is prohibited.
- 6. The sale or supply by any person to any other person of any of the articles, materials, or things set forth in the Schedule hereto, and which are intended to be provided, fixed, or used for or in connexion with any works of the said Authority or for or in connexion with the use of the commodity or service supplied by any of such works which—

 - (a) are stamped or marked otherwise than as hereby prescribed, or
 (b) are not duly tested, stamped, marked, or authorized as hereby prescribed is hereby prohibited.
- 7. The fees for testing and for stamping or marking any of the articles, materials, or things set out in the Schedule hereto shall be those fees set opposite to the same in the said Schedule respectively.
- 8. Any person guilty of any contravention of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds in respect of any such contravention.

W HEREAS by Part I. of the Stock Diseases Act 1928, among other things, the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make Regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council by and with the advice of the Executive Council in exercise of the powers conferred by the above named Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

To Regulation 2 "Interpretation of Terms" of the Regulations made on the 31st October, 1938, there shall be added the following:-

"Factory" shall mean any premises where any dairy produce is received from any person other than the owner of such premises for the purpose of manufacture thereat; and includes any premises owned or controlled by a body corporate or unincorporate where dairy produce is received from any person whomsoever, including any member of any such body, for such purpose.

"Owner" includes occupier or person in charge, owner's agent or manager, and in the case of a body corporate or unincorporate the manager secretary or other controlling officer thereof.

After Regulation 45 in Part 2 of the Regulations made on the 31st October, 1938, there shall be added the following:—

46. No person shall remove from a factory any skim milk unless same has been heated to a temperature of not less than 180 degrees Fahrenheit, or any whey unless same has been heated to a temperature of not less than 160 degrees Fahrenheit, and the owner of a factory shall not allow to be removed from such factory any skim milk or whey unless same has been so heated.

This Regulation shall not apply in respect of any skim milk or whey which is removed for the purpose of manufacture.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the Health Acts, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shull be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in

the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less

the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

3. Supplies for country districts for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

4.
