Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand and carry a bucket for fire-extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit shall be exposed. An approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be carried.

All non-competing boats shall be kept off the course during the racing programme, and the direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

Passengers on any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark, and no boat deemed by the River Officer, or his deputy, to be too large, or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly, shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

No fireworks or firearms are to be discharged from any boats, unless permission of the River Officer or his deputy

has been given for so doing.

After sunset, motor boats shall have a red light exhibited, and shall go slow.

Motor boats shall not tow any boat,

After sunset, rowing boats shall have a white light exhibited.

All boats must give way to racing boats going upstream to the start of the course.

  - (i) The hourly rates for casual employees shall be increased or decreased by one-eighth of the amount by which the adult male needs basic wage of 144. 5d. per day is increased or decreased.

- 3. The articles, materials, or things set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be tested and stamped or marked by the said Authority before being used for or in connexion with any works of the Kyabram Sewerage Authority or for or in connexion with the commodity or services supplied by any of
- 4. None of the said articles, materials, or things set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be provided, fixed, or used for or in connexion with any works of the said Authority or for or in connexion with the use of the commodity or service supplied by any of such works unless the same are duly stamped or marked with the said stamp or mark of the Authority.
- 5. The use of the said stamp or mark by any person other than a duly authorized officer of the said Authority or by some person or body duly authorized in that behalf by the said Authority is prohibited.
- 6. The sale or supply by any person to any other person of any of the articles, materials, or things set forth in the Schedule hereto and intended to be provided, fixed, or used for or in connexion with any of the works of the said Authority or for or in connexion with the use of the commodity or service supplied by any of such works which—
  - (a) are stamped or marked otherwise than as hereby prescribed, or
- (b) are not duly tested, stamped, marked, or authorized as hereby prescribed, is hereby prohibited.
- 7. The fees for testing and for stamping or marking any of the articles, materials, or things set out in the Schedule hereto shall be those fees set opposite to the same in the said Schedule respectively.
- 8. Any person guilty of any contravention of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds in respect of any such contravention.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Two pounds ten shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Twelve shillings and six pence.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1941, and shall be payable on the 1st day of March, 1941, at the office of the said Trust. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases

of special agreement with the Trust) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate payable for the lands and tenements so supplied. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Six pence per 1,000 gallons. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.
