#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* (No. 3799), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the plant named hereunder to be a noxious weed for the purposes of the above Act within the Shire of Dunmunkle, viz.:—

*Tribulus Terrestris*, L. ("Caltrop").

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this seventh day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-one, and in the fifth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

#### PUBLIC SERVICE EXAMINATION.

NOTICE is hereby given that an examination of candidates for appointment to the Clerical Division of the Public Service of Victoria will be held at Melbourne and such other places as may be found necessary, commencing at 9.15 o'clock a.m. on Tuesday, the 26th August, 1941.

The examination will be open to youths who are under nineteen (19) years of age on the 26th August, 1941.

A candidate will be required to enter for competitive examination in handwriting, and in the following subjects as prescribed for the School Intermediate examination, viz., English, Arithmetic, and at least four other subjects.

The conditions and subjects of examination are set out on the printed entry form, obtainable at the Office of the Public Service Board, Public Offices, Treasury-place, Melbourne.

One hundred (100) candidates will be selected for appointment as vacancies occur.

The commencing salary is £91 (£208 on attaining the age of 21 years), rising to a maximum of £299 a year, with a long service increment of £13 a year.

Entries for examination, accompanied by an examination fee of Fifteen shillings (15s.), must be lodged at the Board's Office on or before Saturday, the 2nd August, 1941.

REGULATIONS.—APPOINTMENT OR TRANSFER TO THE CLERICAL DIVISION.—CHAPTER III.

THE Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, hereby amends Chapter III. of the Public Service Regulations, as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

In Clauses 1, 2, 3, 6, 8, 9, and 10, for the word "Commissioner" (wherever occurring) read the word "Board".

For—

Clause 5.

Read—

5. A candidate shall be required to enter for competitive examination in Handwriting and in three of the following subjects as prescribed for the School Leaving Examination of the University of Melbourne, viz.:—

*Honours Subjects.*—English, Languages other than English (not more than two may be taken), Mathematics I, II, III, IV. (one, two, or three in number, but not more, may be taken), British History, European History, Greek and Roman History (not more than two History subjects may be taken), Commercial Principles, Commercial Practice, Economics, Geology, Geography, Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Agricultural Science, Animal Biology.

*Pass Subjects.*—English, Languages other than English (not more than two may be taken), Mathematics I, II, III, IV. (one, two, or three in number, but not more, may be taken, provided that Mathematics I. may not be taken with either Mathematics II. or Mathematics III.). British History, European History, Greek and Roman History (not more than two History subjects may be taken), Commercial Principles, Commercial Practice, Economics, Geology, Geography, Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Agricultural Science, Animal Biology, Drawing.

Provided that a candidate may elect to enter for competitive examination in either four or five of the School Leaving subjects prescribed herein, in which case, if he passes in more than three of such subjects, only the three subjects in which he obtains the highest number of marks shall be counted in determining his aggregate of marks.

A candidate may not enter for both Honours and Pass in the same subject.

A candidate who enters for both Honours and Pass in any of the under-mentioned groups of subjects may select therefrom the subjects in which he desires to be examined as set out hereunder:—

Languages (other than English).—One Honours subject and one Pass subject.

Mathematics.—Not more than two Honours subjects and one Pass subject: provided that Pass Mathematics I. may not be taken with either Honours Mathematics II. or Honours Mathematics III.

History.—One Honours subject and one Pass subject.

The maximum number of marks that may be awarded to a candidate shall be—

School Leaving Honours subjects	..	150 each.
School Leaving Pass subjects	..	100 each.
Handwriting	..	80.

The minimum number of marks required in order to obtain a pass, third class honours, second class honours, or first class honours, in each subject of examination shall be as determined by the examiners. Provided that, in any case where a candidate has been passed by either of the two examiners in any subject, of the School Leaving Examination for which he has entered in accordance with these Regulations, he shall be deemed to have obtained a pass in such subject.

In determining the aggregate of marks of any candidate, the marks to be counted in any Pass subject shall be the average of the marks awarded by the two examiners in such subject.

The marks obtained by candidates in Honours subjects shall be standardized in such manner as determined by the Board.

The marks in any subject in which a candidate fails to obtain a pass shall not be counted in determining his aggregate of marks.

No candidate shall be included in the number to be selected for appointment—

(a) unless he obtains a pass in Handwriting and in at least three of the School Leaving subjects for which he has entered, and

(b) unless he is recorded by the University of Melbourne as having passed the School Leaving Examination in English and either the School Leaving Examination in a branch of Mathematics or the School Intermediate Examination in Arithmetic, or has passed such other examinations as may be deemed by the University of Melbourne as equivalent thereto.

And—

11. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing Regulations, which shall operate only in respect to examinations held in conjunction with the public examinations of the University of Melbourne, the Board may from time to time cause additional examinations to be held, in which case the provisions hereinafter contained shall apply.

12. The Board shall give, in the *Government Gazette*, six weeks' clear notice of every examination for appointment to the Clerical Division.

13. Applications must be lodged with the Board at least three weeks before the first day of examination, and be accompanied by an amount of fifteen shillings (15s.), being fee for the examination.

14. A candidate must, on the first day of examination, be under nineteen years of age, and must forward to the Board an application, in his own handwriting, on the prescribed form, stating his full name and address, the date and place of his birth, the subjects for which he is entering, and the place at which he desires to be examined, together with a certificate satisfactory to the Board of his good moral character and industrious habits. Provided that the above-mentioned provision with regard to age shall not apply to an eligible discharged soldier.

15. An officer of the General Division who is a candidate must furnish a certificate of good conduct and health from the Permanent Head of his Department.

16. A candidate shall be required to enter for examination in Handwriting and in the under-mentioned subjects as prescribed for the School Intermediate examination, viz.:—

(i) English.

(ii) Arithmetic, and

(iii) Four of the following: French, Latin, British History and Civics, Geography, Algebra, Geometry and Trigonometry, Physical Science, Physics, Chemistry, and Commercial Principles and Practice.

Provided that a candidate may not enter for more than one subject in each of the following groups, viz.:—

(i) French and Latin.

(ii) Physics and Physical Science.

(iii) Chemistry and Physical Science.

Provided further that a candidate may elect to enter for examination in five subjects as prescribed herein, in addition to Handwriting, English, and Arithmetic, in which case only the four of such additional subjects in which he obtains the highest number of marks shall be counted in determining his aggregate of marks.

The maximum number of marks that may be awarded to a candidate shall be—

Handwriting	..	80.
Each other subject	..	100.

In order to pass the examination, a candidate must obtain at least 50 per centum (50%) of the maximum number of marks in Handwriting, in English, and in Arithmetic, and at least 50 per centum (50%) of the total number of marks available for the subjects counted in determining his aggregate of marks.

17. The Director of Education shall, as soon as practicable after an examination has been held, forward to the Board a return showing the marks in each subject obtained by every candidate.

18. Any person who is an eligible discharged soldier shall, if he passes the examination, be entitled, irrespective of age and in priority to all persons whomsoever, to be appointed to the Clerical Division.

19. The Board shall cause to be entered in the "Register of Qualified Candidates" in the order of their merit, the names of candidates qualified under the provisions of clause 18, and then, up to but not beyond the published number to be selected for appointment; the names of all other candidates who have passed the examination, including eligible officers of the General Division. If two or more successful candidates secure the same total number of marks, their order of merit shall be determined by the number of marks awarded to them in (1) English, (2) Arithmetic, (3) Handwriting, and, if these numbers are all the same, then by lot.

20. Every candidate who is included in the number selected for appointment, or who is qualified under the provisions of clause 18, shall furnish the Board, within seven days after being required so to do, with a properly certified extract of his birth entry from some official register of births, or other evidence of age satisfactory to the Board, and also a certificate from the Government Medical Officer of sound bodily health and freedom from any physical defect likely to impair his efficiency in the performance of clerical duties.

21. The name of a candidate shall be removed from the "Register of Qualified Candidates"—

(a) for failure to comply with the provisions of clause 20 of these Regulations;

(b) on his nomination for appointment by the Board; or

(c) on his attaining the age of twenty-two years—unless he is an officer in the General Division who has served two years in such Division, and who, if appointed after the 1st December, 1912, is not more than thirty years of age, or unless he is an eligible discharged soldier.

REGULATIONS.—TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.—  
CHAPTER IX.

THE Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, hereby amends Chapter IX. of the Public Service Regulations, as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

PART III.—MISCELLANEOUS.

Travelling by Motor Car, Motor Cycle, or Bicycle.

For—

Clause 47.

Read—

47. Officers who use their own motor cars, motor cycles, or bicycles, and who are not in receipt of a commuted allowance in which the cost of locomotion is included, may, with the approval of the Minister, be paid a mileage rate as set out hereunder, or such weekly or yearly allowance as may from time to time be fixed by the Board:—

	For the first 5,000 miles in a financial year.	Mileage over 5,000 miles in a financial year.
Motor cars—		
Over 9 h.p. . . . .	5d. a mile. . . . .	4½d. a mile.
9 h.p. and under . . . . .	4d. a mile. . . . .	3½d. a mile.
Motor cycles, with side-cars . . . . .	2½d. a mile. . . . .	2½d. a mile.
Motor cycles . . . . .	2d. a mile. . . . .	1½d. a mile.
Bicycles . . . . .	1d. a mile, irrespective of mileage.	

NOTE.—H.p. means horse-power as registered in accordance with Regulations under the Motor Car Act.

Provided that, in any case where the Board is satisfied that a mileage rate as above mentioned paid to an officer should be increased, such increased rate may be allowed as the Board shall determine.

Provided also that an officer shall not incur an expenditure in excess of £200 during any financial year either for the use of his own car on official business or for motor car hire or both, unless the Permanent Head certifies that the expenditure is necessary in the interests of the efficient working of the Department, and the approval of the Treasurer is obtained.

An officer authorized to claim mileage rates will not be permitted to hire motor cars, except in cases of emergency, and then only with the approval of the Minister.

### INCOME TAX RETURNS.

#### NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Income Tax (Assessment) Act 1936 (No. 4440)* and the Regulations thereunder, I hereby require returns of all income derived during the year ended 30th June, 1941 (or the accounting period, if any, adopted under the Act in lieu of that year), to be furnished to me in such of the forms provided for the purpose as is applicable, containing the information and particulars mentioned or referred to in the form, and verified by declaration as therein set forth, and accompanied by all such balance-sheets, profit and loss accounts, statements, and other documents as are mentioned in the form or as are requisite, on or before the date hereinafter stated:—

On or before 31st July, 1941—

- (a) By every person resident in Victoria (other than a company) whose total income from all sources, both in and out of Victoria, derived exclusively under one or more of the following headings, viz., remuneration as an employee, stipend, rent, interest, annuities, dividends, or any other source (not being a business in the ordinary acceptance of that term) was not less than £100.

On or before 30th August, 1941—

- (b) By every person domiciled in Victoria (other than a company) whose gross income from all sources, both in and out of Victoria, derived wholly or partly from a source which is a business in the ordinary acceptance of that term, including a professional business, was not less than £100.
- (c) By every company resident in Victoria whose total income derived from all sources, both in and out of Victoria, was in excess of £1.
- (d) By every person not domiciled in Victoria, other than a company, whose total income derived from all sources in Victoria was not less than £50.
- (e) By every non-resident company whose total income derived from all sources in Victoria was in excess of £1.
- (f) By the partners resident in Victoria or by any one of them of the total income of every partnership. When there is no partner resident in Victoria, the return is required to be furnished by the agent in Victoria for the partnership. Each individual partner whose total income, both from the partnership and from other sources, is not less than £100 is also required to furnish a return.
- (g) By the trustees resident in Victoria or by any one of them of the total income of every trust. When there is no trustee resident in Victoria, the return is required to be furnished by the agent in Victoria for the trustees.

Every owner or charterer of ships, whose principal place of business is out of Australia, who had amounts paid or payable to him in respect of the carriage of passengers, live stock, mails, or goods shipped in Victoria, is hereby required to make and furnish a return, before the departure of the ship from its last Victorian port, of the amount so paid or payable.

Every agent for a principal, whether resident or non-resident, is hereby required to furnish a return demanded of his principals.

Every person or institution holding money lodged at interest in Victoria is hereby required to furnish a statement showing the names and addresses of depositors to each of whom interest in excess of £25 was paid or credited during the year ended 30th June, 1941, and the amount of interest paid or credited to each.

## OFFERS FOR WATTLE BARK IN THE STATE FORESTS, ETC., 1941.

OFFERS, endorsed "Offer for Wattle Bark, lot \_\_\_\_\_," and addressed to the Secretary, Forests Commission, Melbourne, will be received at this office up to Twelve noon on Friday, 15th August, 1941, for the right to strip and remove wattle bark on and from the following areas. The general conditions hereunder will apply in every case where not expressly stated to the contrary, and special conditions will also apply where provided. Full particulars may be obtained from the officer in charge in each case, or on application to the Commission.

## GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. No stripping shall be commenced until the applicant has lodged the deposit specified, and holds a duly signed authority on this form to commence operations.
2. Notification that stripping operations have been commenced must be forwarded, in writing, to the officer in charge within 48 hours from the date thereof.
3. Offers must be AT A PRICE PER TON, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE SPECIES OF WATTLE, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge, and at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided, and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.
4. Satisfactory arrangements must be made with the Commission for payment of royalty prior to removal of the bark.
5. No trees shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree specially marked by him to remain standing shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.
6. In the event of stripping being permitted on any area regarded as a tourist resort all tops must be lopped, stacked, and burned under the direction of the officer in charge. The burning under this provision must be carried out in accordance with the written conditions specified by the District Forester.
7. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course or to obstruct any road or track.
8. No tree of less than 5 inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or leather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, valid reason.
9. The whole of the work shall be done under the supervision of the officer in charge in accordance with his instructions and to his satisfaction.
10. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt. in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.
11. No bark shall be removed without the express permission, in writing, of the officer in charge, and it must be properly bundled, securely tied, carted from the forest, and weighed at the weighbridge named, not later than one month from the date of stripping the bark.

12. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of the officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking, cooking, or other operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.

13. No live tree, other than wattle, shall be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.

14. All stripping must cease by 31st March following the date of signing this contract, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall become the property of the Crown.

15. The violation of any of the above or following conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Forests Commission shall have power to absolutely forfeit the whole or part of the deposit to the Crown, and to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of voidance. The officer in charge, in his discretion, shall have power to instantly suspend operations pending the decision of the Forests Commission being made known.

16. No offer will necessarily be accepted.

17. The deposit specified in schedule must accompany each offer.
