## Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928 (No. 3736).

### MUNICIPAL DISTRICT PROCLAIMED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 85 of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928* (No. 3736) it is provided that the provisions of Part III. of the said Act shall apply only to the Municipal Districts of the municipalities specified in the Second Schedule and to any other Municipal District or part thereof to which the said provisions on the written request of the Council of the municipality are extended and applied by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*. And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Marong has made a written request to have the provisions of Part III. of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928* (No. 3736) extended and applied to the two parts of such Municipal District as set out hereunder, that is to say:—

No. 1. "All that part of the Township of Kangaroo Flat which is situated within the Marong Shire."

No. 2. "Commencing at a point being the junction of the Calder Highway at Specimen Hill with the western boundary of the City of Bendigo and the Shire of Marong; thence north-westerly along the said boundary to the junction with the Borough of Eaglehawk; thence north-westerly along the boundary of the Borough of Eaglehawk with the Shire of Marong to the boundary of the Parish of Nerring; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of the Parishes of Nerring and Marong to the Calder Highway; thence easterly to the commencing point."

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim that the provisions of Part III. of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928* (No. 3736) shall extend and apply to the aforesaid parts of the Municipal District of the Shire of Marong.

## AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules (that is to say):—

EXEMPTIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and upon the recommendation of the Public Service Board, has, by Orders made on the 14th July, 1941, exempted the officers specified hereunder from the provisions of sections 90 and 91 of the *Public Service Act 1928 (No. 3757)* :—

## DEPARTMENT OF CHIEF SECRETARY.

Officers of the Government Statist's Office, Department of Chief Secretary, who are required to work overtime, such exemption to be operative for a period of three (3) months from and inclusive of the 10th June, 1941.

## DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

(1) Charles Walter Robinson, Inspector of Liquor, when required to work overtime in connexion with the inspection of liquor on Saturday afternoons, public holidays, and between the hours of 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. (Monday to Friday) when engaged in the country.

(2) Officers of the Professional Division who are required to make inspections of public buildings on Saturday afternoons, public holidays, and in the evenings, for the purpose of seeing that the regulations in regard to overcrowding, fire-prevention, ventilation, &c., are complied with.

AMENDMENT OF PLUMBING AND GASFITTING  
REGULATIONS (No. 3).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. Regulation 4 of the Plumbing and Gasfitting Regulations (No. 3) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as from the first pay period to commence after the 1st day of July, 1941.

2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulation before the commencement of these Regulations.

3. For the said rescinded Regulation substitute the following:—

"4. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trades in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows, and shall commence on the first pay period after the 1st July, 1941, on, from, and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed under the provisions of the Acts and the Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trades shall be deemed to be amended accordingly:—

- (a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of six years—  
1st year—at the rate of 18s. 1d. per week.  
2nd year—at the rate of 25s. 6d. per week.  
3rd year—at the rate of 33s. 6d. per week.  
4th year—at the rate of 45s. 7d. per week.  
5th year—at the rate of 60s. 4d. per week.  
6th year—at the rate of 83s. 1d. per week.
- (b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—  
1st year—at the rate of 25s. 6d. per week.  
2nd year—at the rate of 33s. 6d. per week.  
3rd year—at the rate of 45s. 7d. per week.  
4th year—at the rate of 60s. 4d. per week.  
5th year—at the rate of 83s. 1d. per week."

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE POMPAPIEL WATERING PURPOSES RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the Land Act 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of so much of the Reserve for Watering Purposes in the Parish of Pompapiel as is indicated in red colour on plan marked P/1.7.40, attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.5146, and known as Pompapiel Watering Purposes Reserve.

### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge at all times.
2. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited any waste paper, bottles, tins, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve.
3. No person shall, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained—
  - (1) gather, pick up, cut, pluck, dig up, remove, or have in his possession while in the Reserve, or take away therefrom, any live or dead timber;
  - (2) ring-bark or strip or remove bark from any tree, bush, or shrub.
4. No person shall dig or remove soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
5. No person shall remove, displace, or damage any board, plate, pump, pipe, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee of Management of the Reserve.
6. No person shall put into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received from agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1928.
8. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work and duty.
9. No person shall break glass of any kind on the Reserve, or leave thereupon anything which will injure any person.
10. No person shall camp on any portion of the Reserve except on that portion set apart by the Committee of Management, and then only after obtaining a permit, subject to the payment of such fees and under such conditions as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine.

The Council of the Shire of East Loddon has been appointed a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as provided in the schedule. *Cheques, Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits.* Preliminary deposits will be returned to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

The amount of the preliminary deposit required with each tender must be enclosed, and the amount must be clearly written in and the designation stated.

Security will be required, as provided in the tender form, either in bank guarantee (bank to be approved by the Tender Board), Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, Saving Bank deposit book or fixed deposit receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited, and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual, and that for a breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board, provided the quality of the articles offered is satisfactory and the rates tendered are considered reasonable—

- (b) to tenders for articles manufactured within any other part of the British Empire.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. In these conditions and in the form of contract and schedule hereto annexed the words "Government Printer" shall include the officer bearing or acting under that title, or such other officer as the Government may from time to time appoint to perform the duty in the matter in relation to which the expression is used. The word "Storekeeper" shall mean the officer (or officers) of the Government who inspects and takes delivery of the stores. The word "Schedule" shall mean and embrace the schedule or schedules hereunto annexed.

2. *Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.* In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

3. The Government will order from the contractor those articles enumerated in the schedule for which his tender is accepted.

4. The first delivery under this contract, equal to one half the quantity contracted for, shall be made not later than 30th November, 1941, and the remainder shall be delivered not later than 28th February, 1942. Should the contractor so desire, the whole quantity contracted for may be delivered by the date first specified.

5. The supplies are to be in accordance with schedule conditions where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

6. All packages, cases, wrappings, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor. The net weight only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour, &c., may be required in the packing and delivery of the supplies.

7. All supplies shall be made to the Government Printer. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by that officer in terms of contract. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce an invoice and specification showing the number and contents of each package in duplicate to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall give an acknowledgment to the contractor of the receipt of the stores delivered by him.

8. All papers supplied, excepting Item 33, must be supplied in reams, and must be according to the specification as set out in the Schedule, and cut to the true size ordered. Each ream must contain 500 sheets, and must be supplied flat (unless otherwise specified). No creased or damaged paper will be accepted.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Government Printer, whose decision shall be final. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor. 2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part of the municipal district, that is to say, the area comprised within the following boundaries:—

That part of the municipal district of Footscray commencing at the intersection of the west side of Maribyrnong-street with the south side of Wingfield-street, bounded on the north by Wingfield-street aforesaid in a line bearing westerly to the intersection of the south side of Wingfield-street with the east side of Cowper-street; thence bounded on the west by Cowper-street aforesaid, in a line bearing southerly, along the east side of Cowper-street to its intersection with the north side of Youell-street; thence bounded on the south by Youell-street aforesaid in a line bearing easterly along the north side of Youell-street
