## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,  
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 4, 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules (that is to say):—

After sub-clause 54 of By-law No. 123 there shall be the following sub-clause No. 55:—

No. 55.—All that piece of land having the following boundaries:—Commencing at a point 120 feet east of Nicholson-street building line on the northern boundary of a right-of-way which is 481 ft. 1 in. south of the south building line of Glenlyon-road; thence easterly along the northerly boundary of the right-of-way 134 ft.; thence northerly 202 ft. 7 in.; thence north-westerly along the boundary of right-of-way 167 ft. 9 in.; thence westerly 13 ft.; thence southerly 319 ft. 7 in. to the point of commencement.

### CITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

#### BY-LAW No. 100.

A By-law of the City of Warrnambool, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, as amended by section 11 (1A) of the *Local Government Act 1938*, and numbered One hundred, for the purpose of regulating, restricting, restraining, or prohibiting the erection, construction, conversion, and alteration of and any addition to buildings or erections, and authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings and erections erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expense of pulling down and removing such buildings or erections and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by any owner thereof, and for appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, as amended by section 11 (1A) of the *Local Government Act 1938*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Warrnambool, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Council of the City of Warrnambool, build, erect, or construct, or cause to be built, erected, or constructed, within the City of Warrnambool, any motor garage appurtenant to a dwelling-house or otherwise, unless such garage—

- (a) Does not project beyond the wall of the dwelling-house fronting the street, except if such wall is at least 100 feet from such street, in which case a garage may be erected 10 feet behind the general line of the rear of the neighbours' dwellings, such general line to be determined by the Surveyor, except where the consent, in writing, of the adjoining property owner is obtained and delivered to the Council, in which case the distance from the front fence shall be not less than 75 feet.
- (b) Is distant not less than 20 feet from the building line of the street or road to which such property has a frontage, or to which the dwelling thereon faces.
- (c) Is distant not less than 10 feet from any other street or road of a greater width than 25 feet.
- (d) (i) If constructed of wood or other material of a combustible nature, shall be at least 10 feet distant from any building used as a dwelling-house on the same allotment, and at least 6 feet distant from the boundary line of the contiguous allotment.  
(ii) If constructed of brick, stone, or concrete of a minimum solid thickness of 4 inches, and separated from or attached to the dwelling-house on the same allotment, may be built on the boundary of the said allotment for a length of 20 feet, provided that the face of such wall fronting the contiguous allotment and on which it abuts is properly plastered or rough-casted, or finished in a similar manner, and provided that no windows, opening, or aperture shall be made therein or thereon, and provided that a parapet is carried 12 inches above the roof or gutter.
- (e) That any such motor garage is at least 10 feet from any dwelling-house on a contiguous allotment which is constructed of wood or other combustible material, or at least 6 feet if the garage is constructed of brick, stone, or concrete, and the dwelling on the contiguous allotment is constructed of brick, stone, or concrete.
- (f) That the height of the walls of such motor garage does not exceed 8 feet to plate level, nor the height of the highest part of such motor garage does not exceed 10 feet.
- (g) That any such motor garage, when attached to a dwelling, or at a distance of less than 6 feet from the dwelling on the same allotment, is at least 6 feet from any building used as a dwelling-house, or any part of the building attached to such dwelling on any contiguous allotment.
- (h) That every such motor garage howsoever constructed under the provisions hereof shall be completed and finished in a manner which will not depreciate the value of the adjoining buildings, and to the satisfaction of the Engineer or Surveyor of the Warrnambool City Council.
- (i) The floors of every garage shall be constructed of incombustible material.
- (j) That any such motor garage exceeding four squares in area shall be built of brick, stone, or concrete of a thickness not less than 4 inches.
- (k) That any such motor garage not exceeding four squares in area shall be built of wood, iron, brick, stone, or concrete.
- (l) Where the garage is constructed of combustible material the walls shall be lined with incombustible material.

- (m) Where garages are constructed on both sides of a house or villa pair, either level with the front of the house or at a distance of less than 15 feet from the front of the house, then either one or other of these garages shall be at a distance of not less than 6 feet from the boundary of the contiguous allotment, notwithstanding the fact it may be of brick, concrete, or stone.
- (n) Where a garage forms part of the lower floor of a two or more storied building, then it shall be completely separated from the rest of the building by means of a wall or walls of brick, stone, or concrete of a minimum thickness of 4 inches, and a ceiling constructed of at least 4 inches of reinforced concrete. Neither walls or ceiling shall have any opening therein which shall open into any part of the interior of the dwelling or part of the dwelling to which it is attached.
- (o) Brick, stone, or concrete garages on contiguous allotments may be joined together, provided they are separated by a parapet wall of 4 inches thickness, and provided that they are both at least 10 feet from any dwelling or part of any dwelling.
- (p) Where a garage is attached to a dwelling it shall be separated therefrom by an unbroken wall of brick, stone, or concrete of a minimum thickness of 4 inches.
- (q) Any person desiring to build, erect, or construct, or cause to be built, erected, or constructed, any such garage within the boundaries of the City of Warrnambool shall prior to commencing the building, erection, or construction thereof, submit plans and specifications of such garage to the Engineer or Surveyor of the City of Warrnambool for his inspection and approval, and shall pay to the Council a fee of Five shillings for the inspection and approval of such plans by such officer.
- (r) The erection of such garage, and the materials to be used in connexion therewith, shall at all times be to the approval of the said Engineer or Surveyor.
- (s) If a motor garage be wholly or partly built, erected, or constructed contrary to this By-law the Council may, by its agent duly authorized in writing, enter on the land on which such garage is wholly or partly built, erected, or constructed, and pull down and remove the same, or cause the same to be pulled down and removed, and may sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing the same, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fee or penalty due by the owner thereof.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Warrnambool.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the City of Warrnambool, on the twenty-second day of April, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one, and was confirmed at the meeting of the said Council held the twentieth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and forty-one.

#### SHIRE OF AVON.

##### BY-LAW No. 15.

A By-law of the Shire of Avon, made under Part IV. of the *Health Act 1928*, and numbered 15, for the Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairy-men, and Purveyors of Milk, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Acts* and of every other power enabling them on that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Avon order as follows:—

1. All former By-laws as far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Avon.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

- "Approved" means approved by the Council or Inspector  
"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Avon;  
"Dairy Farm" means any premises where cows are kept or kept for the purposes of producing milk for sale, or for preparing any dairy produce for sale, and includes the animals thereon;  
"Inspector" includes any acting or assistant inspector  
"Proprietor" includes the owner, the occupier, any person in charge thereof, or any person by or on whose behalf any trade on such premises is carried on.

5. (a) Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall before the first day of January in each year forward an application for registration or renewal of registration of himself as such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk on the form as herein prescribed, with the prescribed fee, to the shire secretary, if an original application, together with a plan of the premises.

(b) The Council may grant the application with or without such modifications as it thinks fit; or

(c) The Council may refuse to grant such application.

6. Where any dairy or dairy farm is newly established, constructed or is intended to be established or reconstructed or altered such premises shall not be used as a dairy farm or constructed or altered until written permission from the Council or its Inspector has been obtained.

7. All dairy farms shall conform with the conditions prescribed, and the Council may from time to time give notice to the proprietor to take or cause to be taken (within a time specified in such notice) such steps as may be necessary for the better construction and drainage of the buildings on the premises, and for the disposal of all drainage from such dairy farm.

8. Every proprietor of a dairy farm shall provide at the milking shed during the time of milking an ample supply of clean water, receptacles, and cloth for cleansing purposes.

9. An apparatus approved by the inspector shall be provided and used by every proprietor of a dairy farm for the purpose of heating water for the cleansing, steaming, sterilizing of dairy utensils, and shall be placed in a place approved by the Inspector, and no such apparatus shall be used unless such is approved by the Council or the Inspector.

10. No stagnant water which by its situation is likely to contaminate any dairy produce shall be permitted to stand upon any dairy premises.

11. Every milking shed, cow bail, yard, or stable on a dairy farm shall be kept in a clean and wholesome condition.

12. The proprietor shall maintain or cause to be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition every dairy, and its fittings, apparatus, receptacles, vessels, and utensils thereon.

13. Every proprietor of a dairy farm shall provide and maintain an impervious receptacle, approved by the Inspector, in which all refuse which is offensive or likely to be offensive shall be placed with the least possible delay, and the contents of such receptacles shall be removed at least once in each week, or with greater frequency as may be directed by the Inspector, and every such receptacle shall be provided with a properly fitting lid and kept in a place approved by the Inspector, and after each emptying shall be thoroughly cleansed.

14. No person shall cause, permit, or suffer poultry, or other animals to be at large in any yard adjoining a milking shed, cow bail, dairy, or separator room, and the proprietor shall provide and maintain suitable sheds, pens, or pens for such poultry, horses, or other animals as may be used on the dairy farm.

15. The proprietor shall provide and maintain a properly constructed and covered receptacle of suitable capacity in which shall be placed with the least possible delay all droppings and stable refuse. Such receptacle shall be provided at a place approved by the inspector, and shall be emptied at least once in every week, or with such frequency as may be directed by the Inspector.

16. No accumulation of manure shall be permitted within 150 feet of any dairy, farm house, or any place wherein its products are kept or stored, or any milking shed, manure shall be lightly scattered over the surface of ground in a thin layer.

17. The proprietor of every dairy farm shall cause dairy buildings, separator room, milking sheds, and bails to be lime-washed or treated in other manner approved by the Inspector at least once in every twelve months, and at other times as may be required by the inspector. That the inspector may approve that this requirement



not apply to any part of such ceiling, roof, or walls as may be properly painted or varnished, or constructed of or covered with any material which would render lime-washing unsuitable or inexpedient, and as may be otherwise properly cleansed.

18. The separator bowl and all parts of the separator which come in contact with milk or cream shall be effectively cleansed on each occasion of use immediately after the process of separating, first by immersion and washing in warm water and soda and finally by hot water and steam. All dairy utensils and appliances shall, after use, be properly cleansed in the same manner.

19. Milch cows shall not be permitted to graze on any land whereon there is impure water, rubbish, or refuse.

20. No person shall cause, permit, or suffer milch cows to feed on any land whereon there is any musty, unsound, decayed, or unwholesome food which may injuriously affect the milk or health of the cows, and if an inspector has reasonable grounds for supposing that any cattle food on the premises is unsound or unfit for the use as food, he may require the proprietor to remove such food from the dairy farm premises, and refrain from using it for any dairy purposes.

21. No swine shall be kept or permitted to be or to approach or to remain within 150 feet of any dairy produce premises, milking shed, cream separator room, or cream storage room.

22. Except with the written approval of the Council, calves shall not be housed under the same roof as that which covers the milking bails at any dairy farm premises, or within 50 feet of a dairy building.

23. No fowl house or bird roost shall be permitted to exist within 150 feet of any dairy or premises wherein dairy produce is handled, kept, or stored.

24. No person shall cause, permit, or suffer any dog, cat, fowl, or other domestic animal or bird to have access to or remain in any milking shed, dairy building, or separating room.

25. If the construction or situation of or material used in any piggery or stable or other conditions under which swine or other domestic animals are kept or enclosed on dairy farm premises is in the opinion of an inspector detrimental to the quality of the dairy produce obtained on such premises, the proprietor of such premises shall forthwith make such alteration as the inspector may by notice, in writing, require.

26. Every proprietor of a dairy farm shall provide an abundant supply of wholesome water. Such proprietor shall cause any tank or other receptacle which may be provided on such farm for containing water to be emptied and cleansed as often as may be necessary to prevent the contamination of any water that may be kept therein.

27. No person shall cause, permit, or suffer the pollution of any water supply used for cleansing purposes.

28. No person shall cause, permit, or suffer any nuisance to be committed or exist on any dairy farm.

29. The proprietor of every dairy farm shall, with respect to every milking machine used in such dairy farm, comply with the following provisions:—

- (a) The releaser and vacuum tank shall be either in the open air or in an apartment (hereinafter called the releaser room) other than that used for milking (hereinafter called the milking shed), and if the releaser room is under the same roof as the milking shed there shall be between the releaser room and the milking shed a complete and draught-proof partition, or, in the alternative, a passage walled on both sides throughout the width and height of the releaser room, open at both ends to the air, and not less than 6 feet wide throughout;
- (b) No internal combustion engine or steam engine shall be in the same room as the releaser or cream separator;
- (c) An adequate supply of water, and a suitable plant for the boiling of sufficient water and the generation of sufficient steam for thoroughly cleansing, steaming, and sterilizing the milking machine and its appurtenances shall be installed and maintained near the machine;
- (d) The body of the vacuum tank shall be in two parts, or, in the alternative, the diameter of the cover shall be as nearly as possible equal to that of the tank;
- (e) The releaser and vacuum tank shall be coupled together by short removable connexions;
- (f) The connexions to the vacuum tank, from the vacuum pump, releaser, and milking shed vacuum pipe respectively shall be as straight as possible, and, if it is reasonably practicable, shall be independent of each other;

- (g) The milk pipe shall be of brass tinned on the inside or internally lined with other approved metal, or wholly of other metal approved by the inspector, and no iron piping, whether galvanized or not, shall be used in the vacuum or releaser system;
- (h) The vacuum pump, vacuum tank, and releaser shall be so installed and maintained that all lines of pipes shall be as straight as possible;
- (i) The milk pipe and vacuum pipes shall have a sufficient fall, which shall be provided and maintained so as to be as regular as possible, for the purpose of proper drainage;
- (j) All pipes shall be coupled in lengths in an approved manner to enable them to be easily taken down for cleansing;
- (k) All taps and other fittings shall be of a design approved, and shall be fitted in an approved manner to enable them to be easily taken apart for cleaning;
- (l) In every other respect not expressly referred to herein, milking machines shall be cleansed in a proper and efficient manner.

Provided that nothing in this By-law shall be held to make compulsory the installation of a vacuum tank or releaser.

30. (a) All separation of cream from milk at any dairy farm shall be done in a room that is well lighted and ventilated to the satisfaction of the council, and provided with a substantial floor and drain, both made of concrete impervious to moisture and having a smooth surface capable of being readily cleaned.

(b) On every dairy farm in which the separator room or milk collecting room is under the same roof with an engine room there shall be a passage, walled on both sides throughout the width and height of the separator room or milk collecting room, open to the outer air at both ends, and not less than 6 feet wide throughout between the engine room and the separator room or milk collecting room.

31. No person shall cause, permit, or suffer any poisonous or odorous disinfectants to be kept in the dairy or milking sheds.

32. Where an electric supply is available the yards, milking bails, separator room, and dairy shall be adequately lighted by electric light to the satisfaction of the inspector.

33. Every receptacle used for the storage of garbage or refuse used or intended to be used for the feeding of swine shall be so constructed as to present durable smooth impervious surfaces inside and outside, and shall be provided with a cover presenting like surfaces, and capable of being fitted closely to such receptacle so as to prevent the omission of offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from the contents of such receptacle. Whilst any such receptacle contains such garbage or refuse matter it shall not be permitted to remain open wholly or in part longer than is necessary for the discharge or for the reception of such garbage as the case may be, and at all other times it shall be kept closed by means of the cover aforesaid.

34. The holding yards or pens for the holding of cows during milking time shall be graded with a slope to an open drain running the full length of such yard and of such width as to be able to be swept with a broom, and such drain shall continue to at least 30 feet beyond the confines of the milking shed or bail or yards, whichever may be the nearer, to an approved point of discharge.

35. All paddocks, lands, enclosures, and premises used as grazing ground for the dairy cattle, and any buildings relative thereto shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by the inspector, and no person shall cause, permit, or suffer the use of such paddock, land, or enclosure if such use is likely to be prejudicial to the health, by affecting the milk or otherwise.

36. All cattle and other animals on any dairy farm may be inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are in the opinion of the inspector or other qualified person likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, and any other diseased animal shall be forthwith removed from such dairy farm if ordered by such inspector or other qualified person as aforesaid.

37. If at any time there exists on the dairy farm any animal which is suffering from any disease which is injurious to health, the proprietor or person in charge shall forthwith notify the inspector of such disease, and the milk from any such diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever, and any utensils or vessels being contaminated by such diseased cow or by milk therefrom shall be effectively disinfected and sterilized forthwith. On the appearance or knowledge of any disease affecting any animal on any dairy farm such animal shall forthwith be isolated by the owner, and shall remain in isolation until freed by an order of the inspector.

38. The fees payable for the registration as cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk shall be as hereunder, in accordance with the number of cows on the premises:—

- (a) Not more than 5—a fee of Three shillings.
- (b) More than 5, but not more than 7—a fee of Four shillings.
- (c) More than 7, but not more than 20—a fee of Ten shillings.
- (d) More than 20, but not more than 35—a fee of Twelve shillings and six pence.
- (e) More than 35, but not more than 50—a fee of Seventeen shillings and six pence.
- (f) More than 50, but not more than 65—a fee of Twenty-five shillings.
- (g) More than 65, but not more than 80—a fee of Thirty shillings.
- (h) More than 80—a fee of Two pounds.
- (i) For every person selling milk for human consumption, being a milk vendor or purveyor of milk—a fee of Two shillings and six pence, in addition to any fee prescribed as above, provided that such fees shall not exceed Two pounds.

39. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done, or failing to do any act directed to be done by this By-law, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds; but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.
