AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 4025.—RATES AND CHARGES FOR WATER SUPPLIED—MORNINGTON URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE MORNINGTON PENINSULA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of tenements and lands within the Mornington Urban District within the Mornington Peninsula Waterworks District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Eighteen pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such tenement. Provided that the total amount of the rate payable annually for the supply of water as aforesaid to any such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Thirty shillings.

- (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Eighteen pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such lands. Provided that the total amount of the rate payable annually for the supply of water as aforesaid to any such lands shall not be less than the sum of Seven shillings and six pence.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1941, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1942, and shall be payable on the 5th day of December, 1941, at the office of the said Commission at Mornington.

3. The maximum quantity of water to be supplied per annum without further charge to properties rated by the Commission shall be the quantity, which, if charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to the rate payable per annum in respect of the properties so supplied.

4. For all water supplied per annum in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in clause 3 of this By-law, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons. Such charge shall be payable on demand at the office of the said Commission at Mornington.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are, hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

KORUMBURRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1942.

THE Korumburra Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Korumburra Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building, less than Six shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said land and tenements for the year commencing the 1st January, 1942, and shall be due and payable on the 1st January, 1942, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per one thousand gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity computed as in the last preceding clause is hereby fixed at One shilling per one thousand gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.

For water supplied for building and construction purposes the following charges shall be payable, namely:—

1. For buildings constructed of materials other than timber, iron, or fibro-cement, and for all concrete construction work whatsoever, including work carried out by the shire council, Five shillings (5s.) per £100. of the contract price or estimated cost of labour and material of all brick, stone, concrete, and plastering work to be done.
2. For timber, iron, and fibro-cement buildings, 2s. 6d. per 1,000 for all bricks used in the construction of chimneys, foundations, &c.

Builders and others desiring to use water from the Trust's mains shall lodge at the office of the Trust a written application for permission to do so, stating the site of the proposed building or structure, the owner's name, the type of construction, and the contract price, the estimated cost, or the number of bricks to be used, and shall, at the same time, pay the prescribed charge. In no case shall water be available before payment of the charge.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, on the 13th day of November, 1941, and the seal of the Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

KYABRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 2.

THE Kyabram Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for its Waterworks District:—

Part I.—Interpretation.

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“The Acts” means the Water Acts.

“Fittings” includes all appliances and things whatsoever (other than pipes) used in connexion with the conveying, supplying, storing, or regulation of the flow of water in or derived from a main.

“Main” means any pipe belonging to or under the control of the Trust and used for the conveying or supplying of water.

“Private Service” means and includes all pipes and fittings used in connexion with the supply of water from a main to a tenement and/or in connexion with the use or consumption of such water in or on such tenement.

“Service Pipe” means any pipe (not being a main) used for the conveying or supplying of water derived from a main.

“Trust” means the Kyabram Waterworks Trust.

“Works” means works of or in connexion with the laying, constructing, altering, repairing, or renewing of a private service or any part thereof.

All words used in this By-law which are also used in the Act shall have the meanings assigned to them by the Act.

Part II.—Construction and Arrangement of Works.

2. No person shall execute any works (except such works as are authorized by sections 191 and 194 of the Water Act 1928)—

(a) without having given to the Trust two days prior to the commencement of the execution of such works—

(i) notice in writing of his intention so to do specifying the tenement in or in respect of which it is proposed to execute such works and the time or times (being between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any week day except a public holiday or a Saturday or between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon on any Saturday, other than a public holiday) during which it is proposed to execute such works.

(ii) a complete specification in writing of the works proposed to be done, setting out the mode, form, strength, material, construction, dimensions, and arrangement of all pipes and other works intended to be used in the execution of such works.

(iii) a properly prepared plan drawn to a scale specified thereon of the premises in, on, or in respect of which it is proposed to execute the said works showing thereon all buildings, erections, and structures on the said premises, and the proposed arrangement of all pipes and other works which is proposed to lay or construct therein or thereon.

- (b) otherwise than during the time or times set out in the notice mentioned in sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of this clause.
- (c) at any time save between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any week day except a public holiday or a Saturday or between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon on any Saturday except a public holiday.
- (d) contrary to or not in conformity with this By-law or such specification and plan mentioned in sub-paragraphs (ii) and (iii) of paragraph (a) of this clause.

3. No person shall lay, construct, repair, or alter any private service unless every service pipe forming part thereof for such portion of its length as lies in or on private property is laid and constructed in such manner that the same is at all points at a depth of not less than 10 inches below the surface of the ground, nor unless every such service pipe for such portion of its length as lies in or on any public street, lane, or right of way or where it may be exposed to vehicular traffic is laid and constructed in such manner that the same is at all points at a depth of not less than 24 inches below the surface of the ground.

4. No person shall connect any lead pipe with any iron pipe except with a brass union coupling.

5. No service pipe which supplies (for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure) water to any tenement shall have a bore exceeding $\frac{3}{4}$ inch. No service pipe which supplies by measure water to any tenement shall have a bore exceeding $1\frac{1}{4}$ inch except by special consent of the Trust.

6. No person shall—

- (a) lay, construct, or alter any private service or any part thereof;
- (b) erect or construct any building, erection, or structure in such place, position, or manner that the whole of such private service is not easily accessible for the purposes of inspection, repair, and renewal.

Part III.—Materials.

7. No person shall use any pipe or fittings in or in connexion with a private service unless the same shall comply in all respects with the following specifications:—

- (a) Subject to the provisions of clause 10 and sub-clause (c) of clause 16 hereof, the whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (other than thimbles connecting the service pipes and mains), bends, reducing couplings, plugs, and the like, shall be of best quality galvanized wrought iron, copper, brass, lead, or asbestos cement.
- (b) All pipes and pieces shall be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, clear in bore, and (in the case of wrought iron piping) properly galvanized throughout, and shall be of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.
- (c) All ends of pipes (other than lead or asbestos cement pipes) bends and the like shall be properly and truly threaded and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, or fittings.
- (d) All stop-cocks and bib-cocks shall be screw-down high-pressure cocks made of hard brass or gunmetal.
- (e) The whole of the pipes and fittings shall be of the best quality and workmanship and shall be sound and free from all defects.
- (f) The whole of the pipes and fittings shall be submitted for examination and/or test to the Kyabram Sewerage Authority, and shall not be placed into position until passed and stamped with the stamp or mark authorized by such Authority.

8. All lead piping used pursuant to the provisions of clause 10 and sub-clause (c) of clause 16 hereof shall be of best quality new lead piping of the following weights:—

- For piping $\frac{1}{2}$ inch diameter weight 6 lb. per yard.
 For piping $\frac{3}{4}$ inch diameter weight 9 lb. per yard.
 For piping 1 inch diameter weight $14\frac{1}{2}$ lb. per yard.
 For piping $1\frac{1}{4}$ inch diameter weight 22 lb. per yard.
 For piping $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch diameter weight 30 lb. per yard.

Part IV.—Connections to Mains.

9. No person, except by special consent of the Trust, shall affix or connect or cause or permit to be affixed or connected to any main more than one service pipe or private service for the supply of water for domestic purposes to any one tenement.

10. No person shall affix or connect any service pipe to any main save by means of a stop-cock ferrule to which a quarter bend of wrought iron or copper alloy or a length of not less than 3 feet of lead pipe is properly and securely attached.

11. No person shall connect or affix any service pipe to any main save by means of a tapping not exceeding in the case of each of the sizes of mains set out in the first column of the

table hereunder written, the size set opposite such size of main in the second column of such table:—

THE TABLE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

Size of Main.	Maximum Size of Tapping Allowed.
Not exceeding 2 inches	$\frac{1}{2}$ inch.
Exceeding 2 inches but not exceeding 4 inches	$\frac{3}{4}$ inch.
Exceeding 4 inches but not exceeding 6 inches	1 inch.
Exceeding 6 inches but not exceeding 8 inches	$1\frac{1}{4}$ inch.
Exceeding 8 inches but not exceeding 9 inches	$1\frac{1}{2}$ inch.
Exceeding 9 inches	2 inches.

12. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock properly secured shall be fixed on each service pipe (connected with or affixed to a main) between the main in or to which it is connected or affixed and a point three feet within the building line of the tenement which it supplies in such place and manner that such stop-cock is not more than three feet from such building line and is easily accessible for the purpose of and may be used for completely cutting off the supply of water to the private service of which such service pipe forms part. If a meter is affixed to such service pipe such stop-cock shall be fixed on the intake side thereof, and if such stop-cock is fixed between the main and the building line of the tenement it shall be covered with a cast-iron top.

Part V.—Repair.

13. Any person using any private service shall at all times keep same in proper repair.

14. If any person refuses, neglects, or delays to have any private service or any part thereof used by him properly repaired after having been required in writing by an officer of the Trust so to do the Trust, by its officers, servants, or agents, may enter into or upon any premises supplied by such private service or any part thereof, and may where necessary repair or renew such private service or any part thereof so as to prevent the waste of water, and may charge such person with the cost and expense of such repair or renewal and such cost and expense shall be a debt due by such person to the Trust.

Part VI.—Meters.

15. No person shall use any private service save for the supply of water for domestic purposes solely unless the whole of the water supplied to such private service passes through a meter.

16. No meter shall be affixed to or used in connexion with any private service or service pipe unless—

- (a) it is capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons;
- (b) in the case of a meter attached to a $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch, or 1-inch private service it is capable of registering any flow of not less than ten, fifteen, and thirty gallons per hour respectively;
- (c) it is properly and securely affixed to such private service or service pipe by means of lead connexions or quarter bends of wrought iron or copper alloy;
- (d) it is fixed truly level on a solid foundation of brick, stone, or concrete, the top of which foundation is level with the surface of the ground;
- (e) it is fixed in an easily accessible position;
- (f) it is fixed in such position and with such coverings that it is adequately protected from the possibility of accidental damage;
- (g) all washers used for connexion couplings in respect thereof are made of leather.

17. No person shall construct, place, stack, or store or permit or suffer to be constructed, placed, stacked, or stored any building, erection, material or thing over or upon any meter connected or affixed to any private service or shall do or permit or suffer to be done any act, matter, or thing whereby inspection of such meter shall be prevented, obstructed, or in any way rendered difficult or interfered with.

18. The remuneration in money for which the Trust may, pursuant to section 201 of the *Water Act 1928*, let for hire to any consumer of water supplied by measure any meter or instrument for measuring the quantity of water supplied and consumed is hereby fixed in the case of meters for use in connexion with either $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch or $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch private services at 7s. per annum and in the case of meters for use in connexion with 1-inch private services at 9s. per annum.

19. No person shall connect any service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing on such service pipe between such boiler, and any meter which records the quantity of water passing through such service pipe a self-acting valve in such manner and position as will prevent the pressure of the steam reversing or otherwise affecting the mechanism or dial of such meter.

Part VII.—Waste and Misuse.

20. No person, except by special consent of the Trust, shall use or permit or suffer the use of any private service for the supply of water to more than one tenement.

21. No person shall use or permit or suffer the use of any private service or any part thereof for the supply of water to any cistern tank or water trough unless such cistern tank or water trough is watertight and is provided with an equilibrium ball valve or other mechanism efficiently regulating the flow of water therein in such manner that such water shall not overflow such cistern or tank. No person shall affix any overflow pipe to any cistern or tank in such manner or position that is not open to inspection. In this clause water trough means a water trough used for the supply of water to animals.

22. No person shall construct, lay, or use any service pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with or supplies water to any urinal or water closet or any part thereof save through a cistern or tank.

23. No person shall use or permit or suffer the use of any private service for the purpose of supplying water to any bath capable of containing more than 100 gallons of water.

24. No person shall affix an overflow pipe to any bath.

25. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall waste the same or permit or suffer the same to run to waste.

26. No person shall take or carry away or permit or suffer any other person to take or carry away any such water from any premises supplied with water by the Trust, and no person shall sell any water supplied by the Trust.

27. No person other than a servant or agent of the Council of the Municipality of Rodney or the Kyabram Fire Brigade, in execution of his duty as such servant or agent, shall without the written permission of the Trust open close or otherwise interfere with any hydrant attached to any main.

28. No person, other than a servant or agent of the Corporation or body having the care and management of a public park or garden, shall, without the previous consent of the Trust, open close or otherwise interfere with any tap, valve, or other like regulator in, on, or connected with any service pipe used for the supply of water to such public park or garden.

Part VIII.—Inspection.

29. Any person authorized by the Trust in that behalf, either generally or for any class of cases or in any particular case, may at all reasonable times—

- (a) enter into or upon any premises for the purpose of inspecting and may inspect any private service or any part thereof or any works in course of execution therein or thereon; and/or
- (b) enter into or upon any premises for the purpose of superintending the execution of any works in course of execution therein or thereon, and may give to the owner or occupier of such premises or any person engaged in executing such works any directions or instructions necessary for the purpose of ensuring that all relevant provisions of this By-law shall be duly complied with and observed during and in connexion with the execution of such works;
- (c) for any such purpose as aforesaid may dig or excavate in or upon any such premises.

30. Any person who obstructs, hinders, impedes, resists, or opposes or refuses admission to any premises to or fails or neglects to carry out and observe all lawful directions and instructions given to him by any person duly authorized in that behalf shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

31. Any person who is guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

32. By-law No. 1 of the Trust, made the seventh day of December, One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and approved by the Governor in Council on the twenty-ninth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, is hereby expressly revoked.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity computed as in the last preceding clause is hereby fixed at Two shillings per one thousand gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Two shillings per one thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at six thousand gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1942.

THE Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and six pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Warracknabeal Urban District, except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 237 of the Water Act 1928.

1. Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Thirty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building, be less than Four shillings.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1942, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1942, at the office of the said Trust.

(a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which at a charge of Fifteen pence per one thousand gallons would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

(b) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity computed as in the last preceding clause is hereby fixed at Six pence per one thousand gallons.

(c) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling and six pence per one thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at twenty thousand gallons per annum.

(d) The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.

YACKANDANDAH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1942.

THE Commissioners of the Yackandandah Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law, viz.:-

1. General Rate.—A rate of Two shillings and six pence in the pound is hereby made for the year 1942 upon all property liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Trust, and such rate shall be based on the annual municipal valuation of the Shire of Yackandandah.

2. The minimum rate payable shall be Forty-two shillings and six pence.

The foregoing rates shall be due and payable in half-yearly moieties, in advance, on the first day of January, 1942, and the first day of July, 1942.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be employed by the Trust for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the rates hereby made.

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1942.

THE Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following rates for the supply of water on lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Yarrawonga Urban District.

On such lands and tenements a rate of One shilling and three pence in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Thirty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building, less than Five shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers and owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1942, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1942, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which at a charge of One shilling per one thousand gallons would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity computed as in the last preceding clause is hereby fixed at Nine pence per one thousand gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.

Ratepayers supplied with meters by the Trust shall pay an annual rental for such meters of Five shillings each.

A minimum charge of Seven shillings and six pence shall be chargeable to persons using water for garden or other like purposes, but the Trust may compel any owner or occupier to install a meter on the premises owned or occupied by him, in which case the said charge will be discontinued.

GENERAL PRESCRIPTION AS FROM 1st DECEMBER, 1941, AND UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE, OF ROUTES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN AREA ALONG WHICH MOTOR OMNIBUSES MAY PLY FOR HIRE.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 4 of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1928* (No. 3742), doth by this Order prescribe in Schedules (1) and (2) hereunder, as from 1st December, 1941, and until further notice, the routes within the metropolitan area along which Motor Omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted may ply for hire, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 19 of the said Act doth consent to the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board continuing to use as from 1st December, 1941, and until further notice, motor omnibuses to ply for hire within the metropolitan area along the routes described in Schedule (3) hereunder; also doth prescribe sections, terminal points and stopping places, time-tables to be observed by owners (including the said Board) of motor omnibuses plying for hire, fares to be charged, and the maximum number of motor omnibuses which may be licensed to ply for hire, or may be operated by the said Board to ply for hire, on such routes, as set forth in detail, in the said three Schedules.

DEVELOPMENTAL ROUTES.

His Excellency, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 5 of the said Act doth by this Order prescribe Routes Nos. 5A, 6A, 7A, 8A, 9A, 13A, 15A, 16A, 17A, 20A, 25A; 26A, 30A, 31A, 32A, 34A, 36A, 38A, 39A, 43A, 44A, 46A, 47A, 48A, 49A, 53A, 56A, 57A, 60A, 63A, 64A, 67A, 68A, 71A, 74A, 75A, 77A, 78A, 80A, 82A, 83A, 87A, 90A, 92A, 100A, and 102A, as described in Schedule (2) hereunder, as Developmental Routes.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

His Excellency, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 4, section 15, and section 19, of the said Act doth further prescribe the following general conditions in respect of metropolitan motor omnibus routes hereunder prescribed, or which at any time hereafter are prescribed under the provisions of the said Act, viz. :—

Week Days and Saturdays.—Except where otherwise indicated, the expression "week days" shall be deemed to include Saturdays.

Sections.—The term "Section" shall be deemed also to mean any part of the section, and the term "Sections" shall be deemed also to mean any part of any of such sections.

Stopping Places.—For the purpose of taking up and/or setting down passengers on routes, motor omnibuses shall in addition to stopping at such places as are specifically prescribed, also stop at such other places as may be convenient, and in all instances in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in the motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.—The fares shown under the heading "Fares to be Charged" shall be the fares to be charged for each adult.

Except where and as otherwise prescribed herein, the fares to be charged for children under twelve years of age (other than children under three years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers, and such half fares shall be calculated to the nearest higher penny for children carried on motor omnibuses operated by owners other than the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board, and to the nearest lower penny for children carried on motor omnibuses operated by the said Board.

5th year—at the rate of 68s. 4d. per week.
6th year—at the rate of 87s. 3d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

1st year—at the rate of 26s. 1d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 35s. 4d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 47s. 3d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 62s. 11d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 87s. 3d. per week.

The above rates include allowances as compensation for time lost for prescribed holidays.

RE-DEFINITION OF AREA OR LOCALITY WITHIN WHICH THE DETERMINATION OF THE WATCHMEN'S BOARD SHALL BE OPERATIVE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive

Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Order, that is to say:—

The area or locality within which the Determination of the Watchmen's Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

A NON-FERROUS METALS BOARD TO BE APPOINTED AND ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF SUCH BOARD AND OF THE ENGINEERS AND BRASSWORKERS (UNSKILLED) BOARD.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby:—

(1) Declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of producing rods, bars, sections, angles, sheets, strips, or ingots from brass, copper, or other non-ferrous metals.

(2) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of four members and a Chairman, two of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and two as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of producing rods, bars, sections, angles, sheets, strips, or ingots from brass, copper, or other non-ferrous metals: Also, that such Wages Board may in any Regulation, Determination, Order, instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Non-ferrous Metals Board and that the area or locality within which the Determination of the said Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

(3) For the purpose of adjusting the powers which the said Non-ferrous Metals Board and the Engineers and Brassworkers (Unskilled) Board may lawfully exercise, deprive the Engineers and Brassworkers (Unskilled) Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in the process, trade, or business of producing rods, bars, sections, angles, sheets, strips, or ingots from brass, copper, or other non-ferrous metals and confer such power exclusively on the Non-ferrous Metals Board.

ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF THE FARRIERS BOARD AND OF THE FARRIERS (COUNTRY) BOARD AND RE-DEFINITION OF THE AREA WITHIN WHICH THE DETERMINATION OF THE FARRIERS BOARD SHALL BE OPERATIVE.

1. This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-law No. 22 (hereinafter called the Principal By-law).

2. The following clauses, numbered 32 and 33, shall be added to the Principal By-law:—

32. Every house shall be provided with a water-closet connected to public sewerage system, or to an improved septic-tank system, or with a pan closet complying with the General Sanitary Regulations 1931 (Health Act), or any amendment thereof.

33. A house shall be provided with—

- (1) a bathroom fitted with a suitable bath fixed in a position, and having a water tap over it and a waste pipe leading from it to an impervious drain;
- (2) a wash-house or laundry fitted with a copper boiler and at least one wash trough, and having water laid on to the said boiler and each trough, and waste pipes from each trough to an impervious drain.

Provided that—

- (a) In the case of a house in a locality where no public water supply is available portable tubs may be substituted for wash troughs, and water need not be laid on to the bath, boiler, and tubs;
- (b) it shall be permissible to have a combined bathroom and wash-house;
- (c) in the case of a building which contains one or more houses within the meaning of these Regulations, one wash-house or laundry fitted with a copper boiler, and at least two wash troughs, may be provided for every five houses.

3. That at the end of clause 3 (2) the following words be added:—

“Such permit shall only remain in force and effect for twelve months from the date of issue of same.”

4. The Principal By-law shall be amended as follows:—

1. Clauses 12 and 27 of the Principal By-law are hereby repealed, and the following clauses shall be substituted therefor:—

12. No person shall erect, or cause to be erected or constructed, any dwelling-house on land included in the area set out in the schedule listed hereunder and attached to this By-law, unless the said building shall cover an area exclusive of all out-buildings, verandahs, or porches, and attached sleep-outs of more than 100 square feet in area, not less than that set out hereunder.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 3 (BUTCHERS).

NOTE.—(1) This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(2) Butchering and/or Small Goods Making were proclaimed on the 9th October, 1939, as Apprenticeship Trades under the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* for the Metropolitan District.

Full particulars of the apprenticeship regulations for these trades may be obtained on application to the Secretary, Apprenticeship Commission, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2.

(3) By Order in Council, dated the 13th October, 1941, the Shops Board No. 4 (Butchers' Country), and the Shops Board No. 5 (Butchers, Provincial) were each deprived of its power and such power was conferred exclusively on the Shops Board No. 3 (Butchers).

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a butcher, or feller of meat, or maker or seller of small goods" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 26th November, 1941, the adjusted Determination of this Board, which came into operation as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1941, shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

Each juvenile shall within 14 days of accepting employment supply a certificate to the Master Butchers Meat and Allied Trades Federation of Australia and to the Australasian Meat Industry Employees Union stating his correct age and his period of service in the industry.

PROPORTION OF JUVENILES AND APPRENTICES.

The number of apprentices and/or unapprenticed juniors employed in any one shop or slaughter-house whether consisting of a shop, small goods factory, or factory only, or of a shop, slaughter-house, and factory combined, shall not exceed one to three or fraction of three adult weekly employees. An employer actually working in the shop, slaughter-house, or the factory for the whole or a substantial part of his time shall be treated as an adult for the purpose of this clause.

Where on any day a slaughterman is engaged in mixed killing, he shall not exceed the equivalent of twelve beef carcasses on the basis that one beef carcass equals six woolly sheep or six and one third other sheep and/or lambs (including ram lambs).

Each beast slaughtered for kosher purposes shall count for the purposes of the tally as one and a third.

A slaughterman's work shall consist of sticking down, taking out neck sweetbreads (if any), taking off the skin, taking out offal, wiping up the carcass, and hanging, all in a workmanlike manner.

Time taken off for collecting pay shall not affect the day's tally.

(4) **HOURS.**—The number of hours to constitute an ordinary week's work shall be 44.

The hours of work on any day shall be continuous except for a meal interval which shall be allowed between the hours of 12 noon and 1 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive.

(5) **TERMS OF ENGAGEMENT.**—All employees (other than casuals) shall be paid the full weekly wage fixed herein irrespective of the hours worked not exceeding the weekly hours fixed.

(6) **EMPLOYEE'S WEEK.**—When any employee is engaged for a week's work, each week shall commence from the day on which he is engaged.

(7) **TIMES OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.**—

(8) **OVERTIME.**—The following rate shall be paid for overtime:—

Within the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work in excess of 44 hours in any week } Time and a half.
Outside the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work }

(9) **CASUAL LABOUR.**—Casual employees (i.e., persons employed during any week for not more than one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work) shall be paid the following rates:—

Slaughtermen 28s. per day (Monday to Friday inclusive) and 14s. on Saturday.
Labourers 19s. 6d. per day.

(10) **PAYMENT FOR HOLIDAYS.**—Employees (other than casual employees) shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—

Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Cup Day, and Butchers' Picnic Day.

(11) **SPECIAL RATE FOR SUNDAY AND HOLIDAYS.**—Double time shall be the special rate payable for all work done on Sunday and the holidays mentioned in Clause 10, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of such holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

(12) **NOTICE TO WORK ON HOLIDAYS.**—Except in the case of unavoidable accident or emergency, three days' notice shall be given to an employee who is required to work on a holiday prescribed in this Determination.

(13) **SICK LEAVE.**—Any employee who has been in the employment of the same employer for a period of not less than three months and who does not attend for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time lost unless such employee produces or forwards within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such absence, but such employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health or accident for more than four days in each year or a proportionate less time during any shorter period of employment.

(14) **ANNUAL LEAVE.**—(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of one week's annual leave shall be allowed to all employees after twelve months' continuous service from the 26th November, 1941.

(b) The time for taking such annual leave shall be left to the reasonable discretion of the employer.

(c) Where it is not practicable for the employer to grant such annual leave, payment may be made in lieu thereof.

(d) Employees employed for less than twelve months shall be entitled to *pro rata* annual leave.

(15) **SMOKO INTERVAL.**—All employees shall be allowed twenty minutes smoko each forenoon and afternoon without deduction of pay.

(16) **PAYMENT OF WAGES.**—Wages shall be paid not later than Friday in each week, and must be paid during working hours.

(17) **TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.**—Except in a case where an employee is inefficient or has been guilty of a misdemeanour seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or employee.
Provided that this clause shall not apply to tacklemen, slaughtermen, or labourers.

(18) **STOP WORK MEETINGS.**—No stop work meetings shall be held by employees during working hours. If, in contravention of this clause, a stop work meeting should be held, the pay for the time lost may be deducted.

(19) **TIME BOOK FOR SLAUGHTERMEN.**—Every slaughterman shall indelibly record daily his correct times of beginning and ending work, also the daily tally of work performed by him in a book which shall be furnished by the employer. Such time book shall be produced for inspection during reasonable hours to the Secretary of the Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union or any official thereof duly authorized in writing by the President and Secretary of the local branch or sub-branch of the Union.

(20) **TREATMENT OF INJURED STOCK.**—

(a) The employer shall have power to call on slaughtermen during the following periods to kill stock that require immediate treatment, viz.:—During smoko intervals, between 12 and 1 p.m., and after 5 p.m. on week days, and after 11 a.m. on Saturdays. Stock killed during such periods are to be considered extra to the day's tally, and shall be paid for at one and a half times the ordinary rates.

(b) Where a watchman is employed, he shall be able during his period of watch, but not during the hours when slaughtering operations are being carried on, to kill and dress any injured or crippled sheep or lambs that may require attention.

(32) NOTICE TO WORK ON HOLIDAYS.—Except in the case of unavoidable accident or emergency, three days' notice shall be given to an employee required to work on a public holiday prescribed in this Determination.

(33) MIXED FUNCTIONS.—Where an employee performs on any day functions of a mixed character, he shall be paid for that day at the rate applicable to the function for which the highest rate is payable.

(34) PAYMENT OF WAGES.—Wages shall be paid not later than Friday in each week in the employer's time.

PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO ALL OTHER PERSONS.

(35) HOURS OF LABOUR.—(1) In retail butchers' shops and small goods factories the ordinary working hours shall not exceed in number 44 per week.

(2) No time worked on a Sunday shall be reckoned as part of such ordinary hours.

(3) (i) Each daily period of work comprised in such ordinary working hours shall be unbroken except by prescribed meal intervals.

(ii) No such daily period of work shall exceed in duration nine hours exclusive of prescribed meal intervals.

(iii) Such daily periods of work shall be so arranged that on at least one day in each week the employee concerned shall finish his ordinary hours of work not later than 12.30 p.m.

(4) No time worked before 6 a.m. or after 8 p.m. shall be reckoned as part of such ordinary hours.

(5) (i) Subject to compliance with the foregoing provisions and with those hereinafter contained the employer may for any of his employees fix each day's starting and finishing times of ordinary hours of work (inclusive of special starting and finishing times for any day next preceding a public holiday observed by him for the employee concerned).

(ii) The employer shall state such times in advance in a notice posted in his establishment so as to be readily accessible and visible to the employee concerned.

(iii) The employer may from time to time substitute other starting and finishing times if not less than a week in advance of the substituted times he states such times in a notice posted so as to be visible to the employee concerned together with the next previous notice concerning such times.

(iv) Every fixation of starting and finishing times shall be made in respect of a period which shall not be less than a week in length.

(36) MEAL INTERVALS.—(a) Employees shall be granted one hour for lunch on a full working day between noon and 2 p.m.

(b) Employees called upon to start work before 7 a.m. shall be allowed one hour for breakfast to commence before 10 a.m.

(c) Meal intervals where allowed shall not be counted as part of the daily or weekly hours worked.

(37) OVERTIME.—All time worked—

(a) In excess of 44 hours per week; or

(b) In excess of 9 hours on five days of the week and 5½ hours on the day on which the ordinary hours of work are fixed to finish not later than 12.30 p.m.; or

(c) Before the fixed starting time or after the fixed finishing time—
shall be paid for at overtime rate namely time and a half.

No employee shall be called upon to work overtime after 7 p.m. without a break of one hour or payment of 2s. tea money.

(38) SPECIAL RATES AND ALLOWANCES.—Where an employee is temporarily transferred during working hours from one shop or factory to another the employer shall pay such employee all costs of transit and travelling time.

(39) HOLIDAYS.—(a) The following days or the days observed in lieu thereof except for the unavoidable delivery of small goods shall be holidays and shall be paid for as though worked—

New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Union Picnic Day.

For work done in the delivery of small goods on these days, time and a half rates shall be paid up to 9.30 a.m., and on Good Friday up to 11.30 a.m.

(b) In the Metropolitan District, Melbourne Cup Day shall be observed as a holiday instead of King's Birthday.

(c) On any such holidays except Christmas Day, Anzac Day and Union Picnic Day, employees if required shall work for not more than two hours, but on Good Friday for not more than four hours at time and a half rates.

(d) If an employee is dismissed within fourteen days before any of the holidays above mentioned and is re-engaged within fourteen days after any of the holidays above mentioned he shall be deemed to have been dismissed for the purpose of evading payment for such holidays and any payment so evaded shall be due and payable to the employee.

(e) For any work done on holidays except as provided in the preceding sub-clause of this clause, double time shall be paid.

(40) SUNDAY WORK.—All work performed on Sundays except attention to horses or other live stock shall be paid for at double rates. For attention to horses or other live stock on Sundays ordinary rates shall be paid.

(41) ANNUAL LEAVE.—(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of one week's annual leave shall be allowed to all employees after twelve months' continuous service from the 1st May, 1941.

(b) The time for taking such annual leave shall be left to the reasonable discretion of the employer.

(c) Where it is not practicable for the employer to grant such annual leave, payment may be made in lieu thereof.

(d) Employees employed for less than twelve months shall be entitled to *pro rata* annual leave.

(42) PAYMENT OF WAGES.—(a) Wages due under this Determination to a weekly employee shall be paid in cash not later than Thursday in each week.

(b) Employers may, if they so desire, keep two days' pay in hand.

(c) Where the services of an employee are dispensed with all wages owing to him shall be paid to him on the day of dismissal.

(d) Wages due under this Determination to a casual employee shall be paid immediately on the termination of work on each day on which he is engaged.

(43) TIME BOOKS.—(a) Each employer at each place at which he carries on business under this Determination shall provide a time book or time sheet in the form prescribed hereunder in which each day's hours of work of each employee shall be entered (including overtime, if any), and the wages received each week; such entries shall, at least once a week, be vouched for by the signature of the employer or his representative or manager.

(b) The time book or time sheet so entered and vouched for if countersigned by an employee representing the Union of employees shall be evidence of the time actually worked by an employee for all purposes under this Determination including overtime.

(c) The time book or time sheet shall, on demand, be produced by the employer for inspection at the place where it is kept at any time between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday to Thursday inclusive and between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Friday to an official of the Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union who has been authorized, in writing, to inspect the same by the General Secretary or the Secretary of a State Branch of the said Union; or to an official of the Master Butchers' Meat and Allied Trades' Federation of Australia who has been authorized, in writing, to inspect the same by the General Secretary or the Secretary of a State Branch of the said Federation.

Provided that one further demand may be made within a fortnight of a previous demand if the secretary, district secretary, or organizer certifies in writing that the reason for such further demand is that he suspects that a breach of this Determination is being or has been committed, and that such certificate is produced to and a copy thereof handed to the employer or his responsible officer at the time of demanding such further inspection.

(d) An inspection shall not be demanded unless the Secretary of the Union or Federation or the District Secretary or Organizer of any division of the Union or Federation suspects that a breach of this Determination is being or has been committed.

(e) Only one demand for such inspection shall be made in any one fortnight at the same establishment and no inspection shall be demanded on a Saturday.

(f) The official making an inspection shall be entitled to take a copy of entries in the time book or time sheet relating to the suspected breach of this Determination.

(44) RIGHT OF ENTRY.—A duly accredited representative of the Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union shall have the right to enter employers' premises during the meal hour for the purpose of interviewing employees on legitimate Union business on the following conditions :—

- (a) That he produces his authority to the manager or such other person as may be appointed by the employer;
- (b) That he interviews employees only at the place where they are taking their meal;
- (c) That not more than one representative visit the premises at any one time;
- (d) That not more than one representative visit the same premises more than once in a week;
- (e) That if any employer alleges that a representative is unduly interfering with his business or is creating disaffection amongst his employees or is offensive in his methods or is committing a breach of any of the previous conditions such employer may refuse the right of entry.

(45) ENGAGEMENT.—(a) Except in casual employment, all employment shall be by the week. An employee, to become entitled to payment on a weekly basis, shall perform such work as the employer shall from time to time require on the days and during the hours usually worked by the class of employee affected.

(b) Employment other than casual shall be terminated only by a week's notice on either side, and such notice may be given at any time during the week. This shall not affect the right of an employer to dismiss an employee without notice for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty or misconduct, in which case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only, or to deduct payment for any day on which an employee cannot be usefully employed because of any strike or through any breakdown of machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible.

(c) An employee not attending for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of such non-attendance unless he produces or forwards to his employer, within twenty-four hours of the commencement of such absence, evidence satisfactory to the employer that his non-attendance is due to personal accident arising out of and in the course of his employment or to personal ill-health necessitating such absence.

Provided that an employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal accident or personal ill-health, or both, for more than six days in each year. An employer may by agreement with any employee grant such employee a clear week's holiday on full pay in lieu of payment for absences through sickness.

For the purposes of this clause the period between the coming into operation of this clause and the first day of July, 1940, shall constitute a year, and thereafter each year shall commence on the first day of July.

(46) CASUAL EMPLOYEES.—(a) A casual employee, that is, an employee who is not employed for a full week, shall be paid one-sixth of the weekly wage prescribed in this Determination for the class of work he performs, plus 10 per cent. of such one-sixth for each day or part of a day on which he is employed. For time worked in excess of 8 hours on any one day, time and a half rates shall be paid.

(b) Where a casual employee is required to perform more than one class of work on any one day, he shall be paid for the whole of that day at the highest wage prescribed in this Determination for any of the work which he performs.

(c) In addition to the rate payable under sub-clause (a) hereof casual employees shall be paid all fares above 4d. per day reasonably and necessarily incurred.

(47) MIXED FUNCTIONS.—Where an employee performs on any day functions of a mixed character he shall be paid for that day the wage rate applicable to the function for which the highest rate is payable.

(48) MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.—(a) The employer shall provide boiling water for the use of employees at meal times.

(b) First-aid appliances and requisites shall be provided free of cost by employers for the use of employees meeting with injuries while on duty.

(c) The employer shall provide for his employees reasonable facilities for the taking of meals and changing clothes.

(49) POSTING DETERMINATION.—A copy of this Determination shall be posted up by the employer in a conspicuous place accessible to all employees.

(50) LIMITATION OF FEMALE LABOUR IN RETAIL BUTCHERS' SHOPS.—Except as provided in this clause no female shall be engaged in work or be employed in a retail butcher's shop: Provided that an employer may engage one or more females to act as cashier or cashiers and to perform general clerical work in any shop, the number so engaged not to exceed that necessarily required to perform such work in such shop: Provided further that a female having been so engaged may perform the following work in addition to her duties as cashier or clerk :—

- (a) wrap meat or small goods either in paper or cartons;
- (b) divide sausages, frankforts, or other small goods, and for this purpose may use a knife for cutting purposes;
- (c) sell goods already prepared but not fresh uncooked meat; and
- (d) sell fresh uncooked meat at any time in which all male employees in such shop are necessarily absent therefrom because of the lunch period or other good reason and only during any such time but not otherwise may use a knife for the purpose of cutting fresh uncooked meat.

(51) PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.—The wages rates set out in clause 2 (B) are based on the following basic wage and pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of section 21 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount, and at the same time as such basic wage. Provided that the wages of apprentices and improvers in clause 2 (A) above 21s. shall be adjusted proportionately to adjustments of the basic wage, such adjustments to be to the nearest 6d., half or less than half of 6d. to be disregarded.

The basic wage shown hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause (52).

(52) ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.—(a) For work done before the beginning of the first pay period to commence in February, 1942, the amount of the basic wage shall be as prescribed in clause (51).

(b) For work done during each future successive period of or near a quarter beginning with the first pay period to commence in a February, a May, an August, or a November, the amount of the basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method, according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statistician's "All Items" retail price index numbers.

For the purposes of this Determination the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer, or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician:—

- (1) The index number set to be applied to a place is that assigned to Melbourne.
- (2) The index number for the calendar quarter next preceding the period of thirteen weeks for which the adjustment is made is to be ascertained.
- (3) The amount assigned in the following table (or in any extension thereof) to the index number division comprising that number is to be ascertained.
- (4) The basic wage shall be of that assigned amount during such successive period plus the additional constant loading as prescribed in clause (51).

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE CIGAR TRADE BOARD.

This Determination on the 3rd December, 1941, applies to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not included within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of Cigar Making," has made the following Determination, viz. :—

(1) That on the 3rd December, 1941, the last and all previous Determinations of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(5) OVERTIME.—That any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of 44 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(6) HOLIDAYS.—All weekly wage employees shall be granted the following holidays without deduction of pay, viz.—Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day and Melbourne Cup Day—when such holidays are observed on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday.

Pieceworkers shall be granted the same holidays as are granted to weekly wage employees.

Adult pieceworkers shall be paid for such holidays at the "All Others" rate provided for weekly wage employees.

Juvenile pieceworkers shall be paid at the rates provided for such employees under the age scale in Clause 3.

Provided that an employee who is voluntarily absent on the working day immediately preceding and the day immediately succeeding any one of the above-mentioned holidays, shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

DETERMINATION OF THE CEMETERY EMPLOYEES BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 5th December, 1941, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and the Order in Council thereunder, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest price or rates which may be paid to any person employed in or about a cemetery as a grave digger, grave decorator, gatekeeper, labourer, or gardener" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 5th December, 1941, the adjusted Determination of this Board which came into operation as from the first pay period commencing in November, 1941, shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) Any employee who is required to handle explosives shall be paid 1s. per day extra for each day or part of a day on which he handles such explosives.

(4) RE-INTERMENTS.—Persons employed on re-interments shall be paid for each such re-interment the sum of £1 in addition to the ordinary rates.

(5) TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK—

Time of Beginning.	Time of Ending.
7.30 a.m. ..	12 noon on the day on which the half-holiday is locally observed.
7.30 a.m. ..	5.15 p.m. on the other working days of the week.

(6) OVERTIME.—All work done outside the hours specified as the times of beginning and ending work, or for any work done within such hours in excess of 44 hours in any week, shall be paid at the rate of time and a half. Provided that any employee who is required to do any work after 1 p.m. on the day on which the half holiday is locally observed shall receive a minimum payment for four hours work at such overtime rate. Such overtime shall be paid for in cash, and employees shall not be booked time off in lieu thereof.

(7) HOLIDAYS.—(a) Employees shall, as far as practicable, be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, this condition shall only apply for the day so substituted, or should any such holiday occur on a Sunday and a day is not so substituted, employees shall be entitled to a holiday in lieu of same on a day to be arranged between the employees and the Trust concerned.

(b) Any employee who having been instructed to report for work on any holiday mentioned in sub-clause (a) hereof shall if he so reports be entitled to payment as follows:—

- (i) An allowance of 5/- if not given a start at work.
- (ii) A full day's wage if required to do any work on any such day.

The allowance or wage provided for in (i) and (ii) hereof are in addition to the payment of a day's pay to which an employee is entitled under sub-clause (a).

(8) SUNDAYS.—All work done on Sundays shall be paid for at double time. Provided that any employee who is required to be on duty solely for the purpose of opening or closing the cemetery and/or for acting as a patrolman or as a supervising attendant shall receive a minimum payment of 6s., and any employee called on duty to do any other work shall receive a minimum payment of one pound for each Sunday he is so required to work.

(9) PICNIC DAY.—The 3rd Wednesday in February in each year shall be observed as a holiday within a radius of 20 miles of the General Post Office, Melbourne, and at Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong. Employees (except those required to carry out essential services) shall be entitled to such holiday without deduction of pay.

Employees required to carry out essential services may receive ordinary rates of pay only for work done on such day.

(10) FARE ALLOWANCE.—Any employee residing outside a radius of five miles from his place of employment shall in addition to any other amounts to which he may be entitled under this Determination receive the sum of Two shillings per week as a fare allowance.

(11) TERMS OF ENGAGEMENT.—Any employee (other than a casual employee) willing and available to work shall in respect of each week of his employment be paid the full weekly wage fixed by this determination.

(12) ANNUAL HOLIDAY.—(a) Any employee (other than a casual employee) who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months, shall be granted 6½ days (exclusive of Sundays and the days mentioned as holidays in clause (7)) annual holidays in each year on full pay. Such leave shall be granted within three months of becoming due.

(b) Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period exceeding twelve months and who is discharged for any reason other than for a misdemeanour shall be entitled to holiday pay consisting of one-half days pay for each month of service subsequent to the date when the last previous annual leave provided for in sub-clause (a) became due.

(13) PAYMENT OF WAGES.—Wages shall be paid not later than Thursday in each week.

(14) SICK LEAVE.—Any employee (other than a casual employee) who has not less than twelve months' service with the same employer shall be entitled to leave of absence on account of ill-health or accident, provided he has submitted within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence satisfactory evidence that same is not the result of his own misconduct. If the conditions hereinbefore stated have been complied with, the employee shall also be entitled during such absence in any year to payment as follows:—

- (a) For the first two weeks, full pay.
- (b) For the next two weeks, half pay.

Provided that where, under any scheme of insurance or an accident relief or provident fund, to secure the benefit of which the employer has paid the necessary premium or under any Workers' Compensation Act, compensation becomes payable for any of such days of absence, the employer shall not be bound to pay more of such wage than is sufficient with such compensation to make up the full or half pay as the case may be.

For the purpose of this clause a year shall mean a period of twelve months commencing on the 1st day of January in each year.

(15) WET PLACES.—Employees required to work in wet places shall be provided with leather or rubber knee boots.

(16) DEFINITION.—A casual employee is a person who is not required to report for duty on each or every ordinary working day, but who is called upon to do certain specified work at irregular intervals.

(17) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Except in a case where an employee has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker. This clause does not operate in the case of a casual employee.

(18) PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.—The wages rates for males set out in clause (2) are based upon the following basic wage and, pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of section 21 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount, and at the same time as such basic wage. Provided that the wages of apprentices or improvers shall be adjusted proportionately to adjustments of the basic wage, such adjustments to be to the nearest 6d., half or less than half of 6d. to be disregarded.

The basic wage shown hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause (19).

(19) ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.—(a) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in February, 1942, the amount of the basic wage shall be as prescribed in clause (18).

(b) During each future successive period beginning with the first pay period to commence in a February, a May, an August, or a November, the amount of the basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statistician's "All Items" retail price index numbers.

For the purposes of this Determination the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician:—

- (1) The index number set to be applied is that assigned to Melbourne.
- (2) The index number for the calendar quarter next preceding the period of thirteen weeks for which the adjustment is made is to be ascertained.
- (3) The amount assigned in the following table (or in any extension thereof) to the index number division comprising that number is to be ascertained.
- (4) The basic wage shall be of that assigned amount during such successive period.

DETERMINATION OF THE TEA PACKING BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 12th December, 1941, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portions of the City of Sandringham as are not included in the said District, the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warramboul; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the Determination of the Grocers Board) employed either inside or outside a factory or work-room, in the process, trade, or business of preparing tea, coffee, cocoa, or chocolate for trade or sale, including blending, weighing, filling packets, wrapping, packing, or labelling," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 12th December, 1941, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination,

(4) OVERTIME.—Overtime shall be paid for as follows:—

- (a) Within the hours provided in clause (3) in excess of 44 hours in any week—time and a half.
 (b) Outside the hours provided in clause (3)—time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter.

(5) HOLIDAYS.—Employees shall be granted the following holidays without deduction of pay:—New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, and within the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, Melbourne Cup Day, and after 12 noon on Show Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) SPECIAL RATES.—Any employee who is required to work on a Sunday or any day mentioned in Clause (5) shall be paid double time for such work.

(7) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Except in a case where an employee has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker. If such notice be not given, a week's wages shall be paid or forfeited, as the case may be, in lieu thereof.

(8) SICK PAY.—Any weekly employee not attending for duty shall lose his or her pay for the actual time lost unless such employee has had not less than 12 months' service and he or she produces or forwards within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence satisfactory evidence to the employer that his or her non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such absence, but such employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health or accident for more than six days in each year commencing from the 23rd April.

(9) ANNUAL LEAVE.—All employees shall be granted one week's leave of absence on full pay, on completion of each twelve months' service with an employer.

Should an employee's services be terminated (other than for misconduct) before the completion of any twelve months of service, he or she shall be entitled to a pro rata leave of absence or payment in lieu of same. An employee dismissed for misconduct is not entitled to this leave of absence or payment.

(10) PAY DAY.—Employees shall be paid on a day not later than Thursday in each week.

(11) POSTING OF DETERMINATION.—A copy of this Determination shall be posted in a conspicuous place at or near the entrance of each floor in a building if any employees are employed on such floor at any work covered by this Determination.

(12) REST PERIOD.—An interval of ten minutes each morning and afternoon shall be given as a rest period to all employees, and shall be counted as time worked.

(13) MEAL ALLOWANCE.—Any employee who is required to work overtime for one hour or more on any day shall receive a meal allowance of one shilling and sixpence for each day he or she is so required to work.

(14) DEFINITIONS.—

Foreman: A person held directly responsible by the employer for the carrying out of the work, and who has the charge and direction of the employees.

Headman or Headwoman: A person on a floor who directs other employees in their work and who is held responsible for work done on that floor notwithstanding he or she may be under the orders or takes instructions from the foreman.
