PROCLAMATION

DDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "LITTLE RIVER RECREATION RESERVE." ADDITIONAL

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the Land Act 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations, and to rescind any rules and regulations, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and deceney therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind clauses 4 and 12 of the Regulations made on the 25th January, 1911, and in lien thereof make the following additional Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 6th August, 1883, as a site for Public Recreation in, the Town of Rothwell, Parish of Bulban, and known as the "Little River Recreation Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

(A) The Committee of Management shall have power to let the Reserve, or any portion thereof, to any club or association for the purpose of the construction or the erection of, or otherwise providing recreation and sporting facilities, subject to the payment of such rent and/or fees, and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

(B) The Committee of Management shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, or person for the purpose of playing games or holding fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows, or sports, or for athletic training, or other physical recreation,

(C) Every person using the Tennis Court or Pavilion, or any other sporting improvement on the Reserve, shall pay to the Committee of Management, or to any caretaker or other official appointed by the Committee of Management for the purpose, a sum not exceeding Two shillings and six pence (2s. 6d.) per day; but the Committee of Management may, in accordance with arrangements made with any club for use of fully paid-up members of such club or persons present by the invitation of such club.

(D) No club, association, or person shall at any time hold or take part in any entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided that any person not otherwise offending against these Regulations may enter on the Reserve and use the tenniscourts, pavilion, or other sporting improvement, subject to payment of the fee hereinbefore prescribed.

(E) No club or association of any kind, having for its object

(E) No club or association of any kind, having for its object (E) No club or association of any kind, having for its object physical recreation, or any member or members of any club or association, nor any other person shall at any time play, practise, train, or engage in any game or sport or athletic exercise within the Reserve without the permission, in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, unless any such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized by such Committee to play in the Reserve at such time.
