DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION OF ACT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the fifth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI, intituled the *Maintenance (Widowed Mothers) Act 1941* (No. 4862), it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Thursday, the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, as the day on which the said *Maintenance (Widowed Mothers) Act 1941* shall come into operation.

Forests Act 1928 (No. 3685).

"PROCLAIMED PERIOD" AND "PROCLAIMED AREAS"
WHERE SERIOUS DANGER FROM FIRES EXISTS.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Forests Commission with respect to the period of twelve months commencing on the eighteenth day of December, 1941, has reported to the Minister of Forests that, owing to climatic conditions, serious danger of fire exists in the parts of Victoria specified in the Schedule hereunder: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby declare—

- (a) the period from the twenty-fifth day of December, 1941, to the fifteenth day of March, 1942, both days inclusive, to be a "proclaimed period", and
- (b) the areas of Victoria specified in the Schedule hereunder to be "proclaimed areas".

Such parts of the counties enumerated hereunder as—

- (1) are not situate in a city or in a town or in a township of more than one thousand inhabitants; and
- (2) are not Mallee country within the meaning of the *Land Act 1928*.

Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules (that is to say):—

PHARMACY BOARD OF VICTORIA.

FURTHER REGULATIONS.

UNDER and by virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Medical Act 1928*, the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Pharmacy Regulations 1941," and shall be read and construed as one with "The Pharmacy Regulations 1930", "The Pharmacy Regulations 1931", "The Pharmacy Regulations 1933", "The Pharmacy Regulations 1934", and the Regulations made by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria with the approval of the Governor in Council on the thirteenth day of March, 1935, and thirteenth day of November, 1935, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the tenth day of April, 1935, and twenty-ninth day of January, 1936, respectively, and the Pharmacy Regulations 1939, which Regulations and these Regulations may be cited together as "The Pharmacy Regulations".

2. Every person desiring to make application to the Board to accept in lieu of the requirements (other than the requirement of passing the final examinations) specified in paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of section ninety-five of the *Medical Act 1928* a course of training of a standard substantially equivalent to the standard fixed by the said paragraph shall make an application to the Board in the form or to the effect of the schedule hereto.

3. Every such application shall be accompanied by—
(a) the original indentures or articles of apprenticeship (supported by a statutory declaration that the apprenticeship has been served) or a certificate of having undergone the course of training described in such application as the case may be;
(b) the original certificates and diplomas obtained on completing the course of study and passing the examinations described in such application; and
(c) such other evidence of the course of training and study undergone by the applicant as the Board in its discretion may require.

4. Every applicant shall at the time the application is made—

- (a) furnish a properly certified extract of his birth entry from some official register of births or other evidence of age satisfactory to the Board; and
- (b) furnish a certified photograph and proof of identity satisfactory to the Board.

5. The Board may in its absolute discretion refuse to grant the application, grant it in part, or grant it in full as the case may require: Provided that no applicant shall be exempted from the final year of study at the College of Pharmacy, Melbourne.

6. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £3 3s.
