COMMONWEALTH NATIONAL SECURITY (SUPPLEMENTARY) REGULATIONS.

STATE OF VICTORIA.

LIQUOR CONTROL ORDER No. 2.

WHEREAS by Regulation 45 of the Commonwealth National Security (Supplementary) Regulations it is provided that notwithstanding anything contained in the law of any State, where the Premier of the State is of opinion that it is in the interests of the defence of the Commonwealth or the effectual prosecution of the war that limitations or restrictions on the sale, supply, disposal, possession or use of intoxicating liquor in the State, additional to, or different from, the limitations and restrictions prescribed by the laws of the State, should be imposed, he may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* of the State, prohibit, restrict, control or regulate the sale, supply, disposal, possession or use of intoxicating liquor in the State.

Now therefore I, Albert Arthur Dunstan, Premier of the State of Victoria, do hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Liquor Control Order (Victoria) No. 2. citation.

2. The Liquor Control Order (Victoria) is amended—

- (a) by omitting the figures "49" in the preamble and inserting in their stead the figures "45"; and Clerical alteration.
(b) by adding at the end of clause six the following sub-clause:—

"(2) All extensions of permits under sub-section (3) of section forty-three of the *Licensing Act* 1928 and all permits granted pursuant to sub-section (6) of section forty-four of the *Licensing Act* 1928 shall on and after the day upon which the Liquor Control Order (Victoria) No. 2 is published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* be void and of no force or effect and any fee of One pound paid under either of the said sections in respect of the extension or grant of any permit so avoided shall be refunded to any person who has paid the same." Liquor permits for special occasions.
