FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provisions as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same: And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 24th

day of December, 1935, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared chicory to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 7th April, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing Board in relation to chicory and assigned to such Board the name of "The Chicory Marketing Board": Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and from the ninth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, all chicory shall subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* be divested from the producers of chicory and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Chicory Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any chicory coming into existence within two (2) years from the ninth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, it shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Chicory Marketing Board as the owner thereof and to enable The Chicory Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such chicory shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Chicory Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Chicory Marketing Board by public notice or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by Regulations made under the said Act.

DECLARING THAT ONIONS SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE ONION MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provisions as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same: And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 9th day of December, 1935, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared onions to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 26th March, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing Board in relation to onions and assigned to such Board the name of "The Onion Marketing Board": Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and from the fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, all onions shall subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* be divested from the producers of onions and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any onions coming into existence within two (2) years from the fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two they shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof and to enable The Onion Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such onions shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Onion Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Onion Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by Regulations made under the said Act.

IMPRISONMENT OF FRAUDULENT DEBTORS  
(AMENDMENT) ACT 1941 (No. 4876).

DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION OF SECTION 3.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the sixth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI., intituled the *Imprisonment of Fraudulent Debtors (Amendment) Act 1941*, it is amongst other things enacted that section 3 of the said Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Wednesday, the first day of April, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, as the day upon which section 3 of the *Imprisonment of Fraudulent Debtors (Amendment) Act 1941* shall come into operation.

4. Any person who shall use or permit or suffer to be used any water supplied by the Trust contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and to a further sum of not more than Five pounds for each day (if more than one) that such offence continues.

5. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any pipe or pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use and may cease to supply him with water.

## BY-LAW No. 4029.—URBAN DISTRICT SUPPLIED WITH WATER FROM THE COLIBAN SYSTEM OF WATERWORKS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, hereinafter referred to as "the Commission", in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for preventing the waste or misuse of water supplied by the said Commission within the Urban District supplied with water from the Coliban system of waterworks:—

Every person who shall use or permit or suffer water supplied by the Commission to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and in cases of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Commission.

4. If any person supplied with water by the Commission wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Commission may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Commission to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.

## CLAUSES ADDED TO REGULATION XXV.—SCHOOL DISCIPLINE.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred under section 46 of the *Education Act 1928*, as amended by section 2 of the *Education Act 1941*, and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby add the following clauses to Regulation XXV.—School Discipline, viz.:—

8. (a) The Director, with the approval of the Minister, may issue such orders and instructions as he may consider necessary for safeguarding health and maintaining order and discipline in State schools.

(b) Pupils shall comply with such orders and instructions as may be issued under sub-clause (a) of this clause.

9. (a) Pupils who—

(i) do not comply with such orders and instructions as are mentioned in clause 8 above,

or

(ii) fail to observe the prescribed patriotic ceremony,

or

(iii) fail to comply with the lawful orders of their teachers,

or

(iv) are so unclean as to be offensive to, or dangerous to the health of, their teachers or other pupils,

or

(v) are guilty of misconduct or of improper or disgraceful conduct—

may, by order of the Director, with the approval of the Minister, be expelled from a State school.

(b) Notwithstanding anything in sub-clause (a) of this clause, no pupil shall be expelled from a State school on any ground relating to the religious or political opinions or beliefs of the pupil or of his parents, provided that such opinions or beliefs do not prevent the inculcation of a love of country or the observance of any prescribed patriotic ceremony in the school.

10. (a) In extreme cases, such as misconduct or improper or disgraceful conduct or failure to observe the prescribed patriotic ceremony or want of cleanliness, a head teacher may, pending an official decision, suspend a pupil from attendance at school.

(b) A head teacher, on suspending a pupil from attendance as provided in sub-clause (a) of this clause, shall immediately report the matter to—

(i) the Education Department,

(ii) the school committee or advisory council,

and

(iii) the parent or guardian of the pupil.

(c) On receipt of the head teacher's report, the Education Department shall cause an inquiry to be held into the circumstances of the case, and after such inquiry it shall be determined by the Director, with the approval of the Minister, whether the pupil shall be re-admitted to, or expelled from, the school.

11. Any pupil expelled from a State school pursuant to this regulation before attaining the age of fourteen years shall be afforded an opportunity (whether by means of correspondence or otherwise) of continuing his education up to that age.

12. The whole of the documents and records in the possession of the Education Department relating to the expulsion of any pupil from a State school pursuant to this regulation shall be destroyed—

(a) within a period of twelve months after the pupil attains the age of fourteen years,

or

(b) within a period of twelve months after the pupil is expelled—  
whichever is the later period.

A BY-LAW of the City of Box Hill made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 76, for—  
Requiring the removal of undergrowth, weeds, or grass from land within any area within the municipal district set forth in the By-law and declared therein to be a populous or residential area in cases where in the opinion of the Council

such undergrowth, weeds, or grass constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property, and enabling the Council in the event of default by the owner or occupier to remove the same and recover the cost thereof from the owner or occupier and for other purposes pursuant to the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Box Hill order as follows:—

1. The area set forth in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a populous area.

2. (a) Where in the opinion of the Council any undergrowth, weeds, or grass upon any land within the area set out in the Schedule hereto constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property the Council may cause to be served on the owner or occupier of such land a notice in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk requiring such owner or occupier to remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass within the time limited in such notice, not being less than seven days from the service thereof.

(b) If such owner or occupier shall refuse or neglect within the time limited in such notice to remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass from the said land the Council may by its officers, servants, or agents at any time thereafter enter upon such land and remove therefrom such undergrowth, weeds, or grass, and may recover the cost thereof in any Court of competent jurisdiction from the owner or occupier

## CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

## BY-LAW No. 93.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, numbered 93, made under the Local Government Acts, for requiring the removal of undergrowth, weeds, or grass from land.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray do hereby order and direct—

1. That the areas within the municipal district set forth in this By-law are declared to be populous areas.

2. Where in its opinion any undergrowth, weeds, or grass on any land within any of the said areas constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property, the Council may, by notice in writing addressed to the owner or occupier of such land, require such owner or occupier to remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass from such land within such reasonable time as shall be prescribed by such notice.

3. If such owner or occupier after service on him of a notice to remove undergrowth, weeds, or grass as aforesaid shall fail to do so within the time prescribed by such notice, the Council may cause such undergrowth, weeds, or grass to be removed from such land, and may recover the cost of such removal from the owner or occupier in default.
