ALTERATION OF DAY APPOINTED FOR BANK HOLIDAY (KING'S BIRTHDAY).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Monday, the fourteenth day of December, 1942, is by section 13 of the *Banks and Currency Act 1928* appointed for a Bank Holiday: And whereas it is made to appear to the Governor in Council expedient that the said day should not be a Bank Holiday throughout Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of the said State, in pursuance of the provisions of section 16 of the said Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that the said day shall not be a Bank Holiday throughout Victoria, and appoint—

MONDAY, THE FIFTEENTH DAY OF JUNE, 1942,
to be a Bank Holiday throughout the said State.

Weights and Measures Act 1928.

ADDITION TO WEIGHTS AND MEASURES UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation made by the Governor in Council on the seventh day of November, 1938, the Cities of Moorabbin and Mordialloc and the Shires of Dandenong and Mornington were proclaimed to be a union for the purposes of the *Weights and Measures Act 1928*: And whereas the councils of all the aforesaid municipalities have requested that the Shire of Fern Tree Gully be added to such union: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare that, as from the first day of April, 1942, the Shire of Fern Tree Gully shall be added to and form part of such union, and do fix as follows the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such union under the *Weights and Measures Act 1928* shall be borne by the several municipalities as from the said first day of April, 1942, that is to say:—

City of Moorabbin	.. 30.816 per cent.
City of Mordialloc	.. 16.509 per cent.
Shire of Dandenong	.. 16.050 per cent.
Shire of Mornington	.. 8.053 per cent.
Shire of Fern Tree Gully	.. 28.572 per cent.

And, further, I do hereby fix two as the number of managers each council in the said union shall elect.

Fire Brigades Act 1928.
ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the councils of the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that the portions of such districts enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire districts respectively specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of such fire districts: And whereas certificates have been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the said portions of such municipal districts shall be added to and form part of the fire districts respectively specified accordingly:—

EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

(a) City of Heidelberg, Parish of Nillumbik, County of Evelyn.

Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment 19, section 1, of Crown portion 15; thence north-easterly along the main Greensborough-Queensdown road to Larch-crescent; thence northerly and north-easterly by Larch-crescent to a Government road forming the north boundary of section 7; thence easterly approximately 2 chains to Hillmartin-road; thence northerly along Hillmartin-road to the north-western angle of allotment 1, section 13, of Crown portion 22; thence easterly by the north boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to Ironbark-road; thence northerly by Ironbark-road to the northern boundary of the Parish of Nillumbik, and generally in an easterly and north-easterly direction by the aforesaid parish boundary to the Broad Gully-road; thence south-easterly by the last-mentioned road to the north-western angle of section 11c of Crown portion 21; thence easterly and southerly by section 11c to a point due west from the north-western angle of the land more particularly described in certificate of title, volume 6076, folio 1215087, registered in the name of E. C. Herbert, and easterly by a line to the last-mentioned angle; thence generally in a south-easterly direction by the north-eastern boundary of the land last mentioned to the Diamond Creek; thence south-westerly by the Diamond Creek to the north-western angle of allotment 4, more particularly described in certificate of title, volume 2862, folio 572232; thence south-easterly by the aforesaid allotment 4 to the Greensborough-Queensdown road; thence south-easterly by a direct line to the north-eastern angle of lot 13 on lodged plan No. 6681; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of the last-mentioned lot and lot 22, and continuing southerly by a production thereof to the northern boundary of allotment 53; thence westerly approximately 2 chains to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence southerly by the western boundary of the said allotment 53 to Harrington-street; thence westerly by Harrington-street and the north boundary of allotment 55A to the north-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment, and southerly by the western boundary thereof and a line to the south side of Orme-street; thence westerly by a line and the northern boundary of section F of Crown portion 16 to the Diamond Creek; thence generally in a southerly direction by the Diamond Creek to Wallowa-street; thence westerly by Wallowa-street to the Aqueduct-road; thence generally in a westerly and north-westerly direction by the Aqueduct-road to the point of commencement.

(b) Shire of Ferntree Gully, Parish of Scoresby, County of Mornington.

Commencing at the Ferny Creek at the south-west angle of allotment 63D; thence by said allotment 63D bearing northerly and easterly to the south-west angle of allotment 72D; thence by that allotment, a line, and allotment 72E bearing northerly to the north-west angle thereof; thence by said allotment 72E bearing south-easterly to a road forming the eastern boundaries of allotments 96 and 95; thence by that road bearing northerly to the north-east angle of allotment 95; thence westerly by allotments 95, 94, 129, the boundary of the National Park and the State School Reserve to a road forming

the eastern boundary of allotments 107 and 106; thence northerly by that road to the north-east angle of allotment 106; thence westerly by allotments 106, 105, 104, 103A, to the south-east angle of allotment 78; thence north-easterly, north-westerly, and northerly by allotments 78, 53C, and 53F to the north-east angle of allotment 53F; thence westerly by that allotment to the south-west angle of allotment 76; thence northerly by that allotment, allotment 53K, and a Government road to the Forest-road; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of allotment 70; thence north-westerly by that allotment to Miller-road; thence south-westerly by that road to the south-west angle of allotment 64; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of allotment 61B; thence northerly by that allotment to the Dandenong Creek; thence westerly by that creek to the north-west angle of allotment 29; thence southerly by that allotment to Wantirna-Sassafras road; thence easterly by that road to the north-west angle of allotment 31; thence southerly by that allotment and allotment 32A to Boronia-road; thence easterly by that road to the north-west angle of allotment 40; thence southerly by that allotment to the Blind Creek; thence easterly by that creek to the north-west angle of allotment 54A; thence southerly by that allotment to Burwood-road; thence by a line bearing south-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 50; thence south-easterly by that allotment to Ferny Creek; thence easterly by that creek to Glenfern-road; thence south-easterly by that road to the south-west angle of allotment known as Dandenong Pre-emptive Right; thence easterly by that allotment and the Ferny Creek to the south-west angle of allotment 63; thence south-easterly by the Ferny Creek to the point of commencement.

(c) Shire of Narracan, Township of Moe, and Parishes of Moe, Yarragon, and Narracan, County of Buln Buln.

Commencing on Narracan Creek at a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 178A, Parish of Moe; thence westerly by a line and the road forming the northern boundary of the said allotment 178A to the most northerly angle of the Moe Cemetery Reserve; thence south-westerly by the road forming the north-western boundary of the Cemetery Reserve and south-easterly and southerly by the road forming the south-western boundary of the Cemetery Reserve and the western boundary of allotment 178 to the south-western angle thereof; thence westerly by a line to the north-eastern angle of allotment 177 and further westerly by the northern boundary of allotment 177 and a line in continuation thereof to the eastern boundary of allotment 166A; thence northerly by that boundary to the Princes Highway and north-easterly by that highway to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of the Racecourse and Recreation Reserve, Parish of Yarragon; thence north-westerly by a line and the road forming the north-eastern boundary of the Racecourse and Recreation Reserve and northerly by the road forming the eastern boundary of allotment 9, section F, Parish of Yarragon, to the southern boundary of allotment 10; thence north-westerly by that boundary 12 chains, more or less, to a drainage easement and north-easterly by that easement to the southern boundary of allotment 11; thence north-westerly by that boundary and north-easterly by the north-western boundary of the said allotment 11, a line, and allotment 12 to a point thereon distant 10 chains north-easterly from the most westerly angle of allotment 12; thence south-easterly and easterly by lines parallel to and 10 chains distant from the 3-chain road forming the southern boundaries of allotments 12 and A, Parish of Yarragon, and 2A, Parish of Narracan, to the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-westerly by a road to the northern boundary of allotment 1; thence south-easterly and southerly by the road forming the north-eastern boundary of allotment 1; the northern boundary of allotment 5B, the north-eastern and eastern boundaries of allotment 5D and the eastern boundary of allotment 5G to the most easterly angle of allotment 5F; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of that allotment to the main Gippsland railway line; thence north-westerly by that railway line to Narracan Creek; and thence south-easterly by that creek to the point of commencement.

SOUTHERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Winchelsea, Township of Winchelsea, Parish of Lake Lake Wollard, County of Grant, and Parish of Mirnee, County of Grenville.

south boundary of the last-mentioned allotment, and continuing by a projection of that line to the east boundary of allotment 3; thence southerly by the western boundaries of allotment 2, section X., allotment 5, section VII., allotment 1, section VII., and allotments 4, 3, 2, and 1 of section II. to the commencing point.

THE Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, hereby repeals Chapter II. of the Regulations relating to "Appointment and Promotion in the General Division", made by the Director of Mental Hygiene, and amends Chapters V. and VI. of the Public Service Regulations as shown hereunder, to take effect as from and inclusive of the 1st August, 1941, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

CHAPTER V.

Appointment to the General Division.

(Act No. 3757, Section 66.)

In clauses 1, 2, 3, 6, 8, 10, 12, 13, 14, 15, 17, and 18, for the word "Commissioner" (wherever occurring), substitute the word "Board".

Clause 13.

Add—

In the case of any applicant for a position in the Mental Hygiene Branch of the Department of Chief Secretary, "Government Medical Officer" in this and the preceding clauses includes Medical Officers at Mental Institutions.

CHAPTER VI.

Appointment and Promotion of Certain Officers of the General Division in the Public Library, Museums, and National Gallery; Penal Establishments and Gaols; Reformatory Schools, and Receiving Depots.

(Act No. 3757, Section 67.)

For the heading to the Chapter, substitute the following heading:—

Appointment and Promotion of Certain Officers of the General Division in the Public Library, Museums, and National Gallery; Penal Establishments and Gaols; Reformatory Schools and Receiving Depots; and Mental Institutions.

No certificate shall be issued in the case of a candidate for appointment to the office of Attendant in the Mental Hygiene Branch unless such candidate possesses a merit certificate or approved equivalent.

Add the following clauses:—

3A. No applicant will be registered as a candidate for appointment to the under-mentioned offices in the Mental Hygiene Branch unless such applicant is of good physical development and is not less than the height specified opposite the name of such office:—

Attendant 5 ft. 7 in.
Nurse 5 ft. 3 in.

4A. In order to qualify for promotion to positions on the nursing staffs of Mental Institutions, Attendants and Nurses in the Mental Hygiene Branch will be required to pass three examinations.

The First Examination—in anatomy and physiology and first aid—cannot be undertaken until an Attendant or a Nurse has been in the service of the Mental Hygiene Branch for a period of at least three months. In the event of an officer failing to pass the examination at the first attempt, the Board, on the recommendation of the Director of Mental Hygiene, may approve of such officer being given an opportunity to pass at the next examination.

The retention of Attendants and Nurses on the staff will be conditional on their passing the First Examination.

The Second Examination—in general nursing and duties—cannot be undertaken until after the end of the second year of service in the Mental Hygiene Branch.

The Third Examination—in mental disorders, nursing, and duties, together with elementary anatomy, and physiology of brain and nervous system—cannot be undertaken until after the third year of service in the Mental Hygiene Branch and until at least one year after the passing of the Second Examination. On the passing of this examination a certificate will be given to each successful examinee setting forth that he or she is a Trained Mental Attendant or a Trained Mental Nurse of the Department of Mental Hygiene. No officer shall be eligible for promotion to the positions of Attendant, Grade II., or Nurse, Grade II., unless such officer shall have passed the Third Examination.

The subjects for the examinations prescribed herein for officers of the Mental Hygiene Branch shall be those referred to in the syllabus of lectures adopted, from time to time, by the Director of Mental Hygiene. It shall be compulsory for Attendants and Nurses to attend the lectures arranged in connexion with the examinations which they are required to pass.

4B. For promotion to the positions of Attendant, Grade I., or Nurse, Grade I., in the Mental Hygiene Branch, selection will be made from among those Attendants, Grade II., or Nurses, Grade II., who have, by reason of their special fitness for the work, as well as by their good conduct and industry, proved themselves capable of taking charge of a large and important ward.

4C. In filling a position of Hospital Attendant or Hospital Nurse in the Mental Hygiene Branch, except in any case where the Director of Mental Hygiene certifies that such position should be filled by a Hospital Trained Nurse, a selection shall be made of an Attendant or a Nurse who has passed the Third Examination prescribed herein, and who has demonstrated his or her capacity for the special work required to be performed.

ACT No. 3757, SECTION 66.

The Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, hereby repeals all Regulations relating to "Classification of General Division," and makes the following Regulations in lieu thereof, to take effect as from and inclusive of the 1st August, 1941, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

CHAPTER VII.—CLASSIFICATION OF GENERAL DIVISION.

1. The scale or amount of salary assigned to any office in the General Division shall be that entered opposite the name thereof in the Schedule hereto.

2. Where a minimum salary is not assigned to his office in the Schedule, the officer shall be entitled to be paid the salary in the Schedule without addition thereto.

3. Where a minimum salary and a maximum salary are assigned to his office in the Schedule, the officer, except as hereinafter provided, shall commence at the minimum salary, and may proceed by increments, not exceeding thirteen pounds each, at intervals of not less than twelve months, until he attains the maximum salary of the office.

4. Every increment shall be discretionary, and no increment shall be payable except on the certificate of the Permanent Head of the Department that such increment has been earned by good conduct and efficient service, and the recommendation of the Board.

5. Where an officer is promoted or transferred to any office without an immediate increase in salary, time served in his former office may, at the discretion of the Board, be counted in reckoning the interval for the first increment in his new office.

6. Any officer transferred or promoted to any office or grade in the General Division shall thereupon be junior to any officer already in such office or grade, but shall be paid an amount not less than that which he was receiving immediately before such transfer or promotion, provided that such amount is not greater than the maximum rate for such office or grade.

7. Unless it be found necessary to appoint a duly qualified person from outside the Public Service, a vacant office in the General Division shall be filled by the transfer or promotion thereto of the officer who in the opinion of the Board possesses the particular qualifications required for such office, and is next entitled by merit, good and diligent conduct, length of service, relative seniority, and the nature of the work performed by him.

8. An officer shall not be eligible for promotion or transfer to the position of garden labourer or gardener in the Botanic Gardens, Melbourne, unless he has passed the examination prescribed for appointment to such position as set out in clause 19 of Chapter V. of these regulations.

9. The granting of the first, second and third increments to officers occupying the positions of Attendant, Grade III., or Nurse, Grade III., in the Mental Hygiene Branch of the Department of Chief Secretary, as provided in the Schedule hereto, shall be conditional on their passing the first, second and third examinations, respectively, as prescribed in clause 4A of Chapter VI. of these regulations.

10. If any officer in the General Division on the staff of a Mental Institution is absent from duty on sick leave, no deduction shall be made from the salary of such officer on account of allowances if the officer is under medical treatment at his own home or at a general hospital. It shall be at the discretion of the Medical Superintendent as to whether unmarried male officers and female officers shall remain at the institution or be allowed to leave the institution for treatment elsewhere. When an officer on sick leave is drawing his allowances, the full charge for such allowances, as provided in these regulations, shall be made if he is on full pay, half the charge shall be made if he is on half pay, and no charge shall be made if he is receiving no pay.

4. Otherwise than as provided in these rules the practice and procedure upon applications to a Judge under The Liquor Control Order (Victoria) shall be that provided in the Rules of the Supreme Court for applications originating in chambers.

Cemeteries Act 1928.

NEW GENERAL CEMETERY, HERNE HILL, GEELONG. REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act 1928, the Trustees of the New General Public Cemetery, Geelong, hereby make the following Regulations, which shall come into force immediately after publication in the *Government Gazette*:—

1. Every Certificate of Right of Burial in an allotment in the cemetery shall be issued by the Trustees.

2. Every person who, without the consent of the Trustees, transfers a Certificate of Right of Burial to another person shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations.

3. No Certificate of Right of Burial transferred from one person to another without the consent of the Trustees shall be recognized by the Trustees as granting the right of burial in an allotment in the cemetery to such person to whom it has been transferred.

4. Every person who is guilty of a breach of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for every such offence.

HEATHCOTE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1942.

THE Heathcote Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Two shillings and six pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of the lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Heathcote Urban District.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity computed as in the last preceding clause is hereby fixed at Two shillings and six pence per one thousand gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.

The amount of the preliminary deposit required with each tender must be enclosed, and the amount must be clearly written in and the designation stated.

Security will be required, as provided in the tender form, either in bank guarantee (bank to be approved by the Tender Board), Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, Saving Bank deposit book or fixed deposit receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited, and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual, and that for a breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board, provided the quality of the articles offered is satisfactory and the rates tendered are considered reasonable—

- (a) to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth;
- (b) to tenders for articles manufactured within any other part of the British Empire.

Rates tendered must include T.T. exchange ruling at time of tendering.

Tenders enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words, "*Tender for Supplies to the Government Printer*" written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender Box at the Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. In these conditions and in the form of contract and schedule hereto annexed the words "Government Printer" shall include the officer bearing or acting under that title, or such other officer as the Government may from time to time appoint to perform the duty in the matter in relation to which the expression is used. The word "Storekeeper" shall mean the officer (or officers) of the Government who inspects and takes delivery of the stores. The word "Schedule" shall mean and embrace the schedule or schedules hereunto annexed.

2. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

3. The Government will order from the contractor those articles enumerated in the schedule for which his tender is accepted.

4. The first delivery under this contract, equal to one half the quantity contracted for, shall be made not later than 30th November, 1942, and the remainder shall be delivered not later than 28th February, 1943. Should the contractor so desire, the whole quantity contracted for may be delivered by the date first specified.

5. The supplies are to be in accordance with schedule conditions where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

6. All packages, cases, wrappings, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor. The net weight only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour, &c., may be required in the packing and delivery of the supplies.

7. All supplies shall be made to the Government Printer. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by that officer in terms of contract. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce an invoice and specification showing the number and contents of each package in duplicate to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall give an acknowledgment to the contractor of the receipt of the stores delivered by him.

8. All papers supplied, excepting Item 38, must be supplied in reams, and must be according to the specification as set out in the Schedule, and cut to the true size ordered. Each ream must contain 500 sheets, and must be supplied flat (unless otherwise specified). No creased or damaged paper will be accepted.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Government Printer, whose decision shall be final. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense, such expenses to be deducted as in clause 10. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in clause 10.

10. In the event of the goods not being delivered within the time stated the Government Printer may, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Printer to the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, for each and every default, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as set out in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

In the event of any alteration in the duty of Customs or Telegraphic Transfer Exchange, which may affect any of the items included in the contract, the Government or the contractor, as the case may be, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected, and the contractor shall, if called upon, submit such documentary evidence as may be required by the Government to permit of the calculation of any such allowance.

14. The contractor shall not insure the material against wear risk.

Provided the material is consigned on a separate bill of lading to the Government of Victoria any loss or damage in transit occasioned through risks covered by the London Institute Marine War and Strike Clauses shall be to Victorian Government account, subject to the production by the contractor of documentary evidence satisfactory to the Tender Board.

Part 9 refers to the minimum area of dwelling rooms, minimum height of rooms, and attic rooms. Part 10 refers to the pitch of roof and height of chimneys. Part 11 refers to light and ventilation. Part 12 refers to the material to be used, namely, brick, cement, sand, concrete, lime mortar, old materials, timber, and steel reinforcements. Part 13 refers to excavations, foundations, and footings. Part 14 refers to brick walls, damp courses, internal walls, and parapet walls. Part 15 sets out the requirements for a new timber building to be constructed. Part 16 sets out the requirements for a new timber veneer construction. Part 17 refers to the provisions applicable to flats and flat buildings. Part 18 refers to the requirements as to shop buildings, and sets out that any street verandah erected after the 1st day of April, 1942, shall be supported by cantilevers, brackets, or projecting supports, and requires that any verandah erected before the 1st day of April, 1942, which is supported otherwise than by cantilevers, brackets or projecting supports, shall before the 1st day of April, 1942, be pulled down and removed.
