HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 48.

THE Hamilton Waterworks Trust, hereinafter referred to as "the Trust," the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the following By-law for restricting or prohibiting the use of water for other than domestic purposes within its district:—

1. By-law numbered 47 of the Hamilton Waterworks Trust shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. Except for fire-fighting purposes no person shall take or carry away or permit or suffer any person to take or carry away from any premises any water supplied by the Trust to such premises.

3. No person shall use or permit or suffer to be used for the purpose of watering or irrigating any lawn, garden, plantation, or any vegetation whatsoever, any water supplied by the Trust.

4. No person shall use or permit or suffer to be used any water supplied by the Trust for any non-domestic purposes save for manufacturing, fire-fighting, or commercial purposes.

5. Any person who is guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day after notice from the Trust that such offence continues.

6. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does or causes to be done anything in contravention of this By-law the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any pipe or pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use and may cease to supply him with water.

7. This By-law shall have effect throughout the whole of the Trust District.

8. This By-law shall come into operation at such time as the Trust from time to time directs by notice published in a newspaper circulating generally within the Urban District and cease to have operation at such time as the Trust from time to time directs by a notice so published.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "OAKLEIGH PUBLIC PARK AND GARDENS RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands temporarily reserved by Orders in Council dated the 21st October, 1940, and 15th September, 1941, as a site for Public Park and Recreation in the City of Oakleigh, Parish of Mulgrave, and known as the "Oakleigh Public Park and Gardens Reserve."

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, light any fires therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any paper or rubbish; nor leave or deposit or break any glass; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.
7. For the purpose of clauses 5 and 6 "cattle" shall mean cattle as defined by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
8. No person shall, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, bring into the Reserve any dog, unless such dog is controlled by a chain or cord.
9. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at the time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
15. No person, except a labourer or workman employed in the Reserve, shall enter any garden plots therein.
16. No person shall drive, ride, place, leave, or park any motor car or other vehicle in or on the Reserve or any portion thereof, except in any area set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management, and then only with the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. The driver or person in charge of such motor car or other vehicle shall take up position in any such area

and/or park the same in such place and in such manner as he shall be required to do by the Committee of Management or its duly authorized officer. No person shall ride any motor cycle or bicycle in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

17. No person shall engage in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, golf, baseball, or any other like game, nor shall any hand perform in the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

18. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods or articles of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

19. No person shall cross or trespass on the playing ground during any cricket or football match, or sports, show, &c., or during practice at football or cricket, when any such crossing or trespassing would cause undue interference with the progress of the aforesaid sports, football or cricket, show, &c.

20. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve or any portion of the Reserve for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission, shall pay to the Committee of Management such a fee as the Committee may consider reasonable and consistent with the Regulations, but the maximum fee shall not exceed the sum of Ten guineas per day.

21. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, or table, or any support, fastening, or fitting used or constructed, or adapted to be used, for the exhibition of any regulation or notice, and fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.

22. No person shall, while in a state of intoxication, be in the Reserve, and no person shall behave in a disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance therein, or obstruct any servant of the Committee of Management, or interfere (not being a player) with any game or sports therein, or use insulting words or gestures or otherwise misbehave.

23. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, on such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the portion so set apart.

24. No person shall, in the Reserve, wilfully obstruct, disturb, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or on any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his duty or work.

25. No person shall bathe in the artificial lake or other water in the Reserve except by the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

26. No person shall pollute or cause to be polluted the water in the artificial lake or any other water in the Reserve.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the City of Oakleigh as a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928* as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
