AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

NOTICE OF INTENTION RE LABELLING BOXES, ETC., OF FISH CONSIGNED, SOLD OR MARKETED.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation revoking the Proclamation made the second day of July, 1920, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the seventh day of July, 1920, respecting labelling boxes, &c., of fish consigned, sold or marketed, and prescribing methods of and regulations for consigning, selling, and marketing fish, whether taken in Victoria or elsewhere, as follows:—No person shall consign, sell or market any fish in any box, basket or other receptacle unless there is securely attached to such box, basket or other receptacle a label showing distinctly the Christian name and surname and address of the person who caught the fish.

RULES MADE PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH 5 (5) (c) OF THE LIQUOR CONTROL ORDER (VICTORIA) DATED 18TH MARCH, 1942, MADE BY THE PREMIER OF THE STATE OF VICTORIA UNDER REGULATION 45 OF THE COMMONWEALTH NATIONAL SECURITY (SUPPLEMENTARY) REGULATIONS.

1. In these rules the expression "The Liquor Control Order (Victoria)" means The Liquor Control Order (Victoria) dated the eighteenth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, made by the Premier of the State of Victoria under Regulation No. 45 of the Commonwealth National Security (Supplementary) Regulations.

2. Every summons under paragraph 5 of The Liquor Control Order (Victoria) shall be intituled:—

"In the Supreme Court

In the matter of the Commonwealth National Security (Supplementary) Regulations, No. 45, and in the matter of The Liquor Control Order (Victoria)

and

In the matter of the Closure Order in respect of premises known as between, Applicant, and, Inspector of Police, Respondent".

3. Every such summons shall be served upon the Inspector of Police who has made the Closure Order which it is sought to revoke.

4. Otherwise than as provided in these rules the practice and procedure upon applications to a Judge under The Liquor Control Order (Victoria) shall be that provided in the Rules of the Supreme Court for applications originating in chambers.

RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

ORDERS OF 27TH FEBRUARY, 1942.

Relating to certain matters arising out of Awards No. 8 and No. 55.

In the matter of the *Railways Act 1928*, and in the matter of references by the Australian Railways Union for interpretation of certain matters arising out of Awards No. 8 and No. 55 of the Railways Classification Board.

THESE references having come on for hearing before the Railways Classification Board, and the said Board having heard the representations made on behalf of the parties concerned, it is ordered that the matters referred to be and the same are hereby interpreted as follows:—

AWARD No. 8.

Division 14—Travelling and Incidental Expenses.

(1) Under the provisions of clause 5, sub-clause (b) of this Division, Mr. E. Cooper, stationmaster, Tallygaroopna, is entitled to the payment of an allowance for one meal in respect of the shift worked by him on 30th July, 1941.

(2) Mr. W. H. Burland, bond tester, is not entitled to the payment of a "trip" allowance for one meal under the provisions of clause 11 of this Division in respect of the days during April, 1939, on which he was engaged working between Croydon and Lilydale.

AWARD No. 55.

Division 7—Minimum Allowances.

The provisions of clause 2, sub-clause (c), of this Division are applicable in the case of Guard A. H. DeGrandi, who was rostered to sign on at Ten a.m. on 4th April, 1941, and was informed at about 9.40 a.m. on that date that he was not to undertake his rostered shift, but was to travel per the Twelve noon up train to Melbourne for medical examination.

ORDER OF 12TH MARCH, 1942.

Relating to certain matters arising out of Awards No. 8 and No. 61.

In the matter of the *Railways Act 1928*, and in the matter of references by the Australian Railways Union for interpretation of certain matters arising out of Awards No. 8 and No. 61 of the Railways Classification Board.

THESE references having come on for hearing before the Railways Classification Board, and the said Board having heard the representations made on behalf of the parties concerned, it is ordered that the matters referred to be and the same are hereby interpreted as follows:—

AWARD No. 8:

Division 10—Holiday Duty.

Leading Shunter Kearney is entitled under the provisions of this Division to be granted an extra day's pay, or a day's leave on full pay, in respect of each of the following shifts:—

- (1) 11.10 p.m. on 24th December, 1940, to 9.20 a.m. on 25th December, 1940.
- (2) 11 p.m. on 26th December, 1940, to 6 a.m. on 27th December, 1940.

NOTE.—This interpretation is not to be taken as expressing any view as to the application of the provisions of Regulation 76 in regard to the days concerned.

AWARD No. 61.

Under the provisions of clause 4 of this award, Shunter A. P. Waterman is not entitled to be paid the marginal rates prescribed for "Shunter, who, on 26th July, 1926, possessed a Guard's certificate."

State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932.

AWARD No. 58 OF 27TH MARCH, 1942, RELATING TO RATES OF PAY OF CERTAIN GRADES AT THE STATE COAL MINE.

THE State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the *State Coal Mine Industrial Act 1932* (No. 4030), and constituted as provided by the said Act and the Order in Council made thereunder, hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

1. That as on and from the 18th January, 1942, adult male workers included in Part III. of the Schedule to the Act (except those for whom weekly rates are prescribed) shall be paid a basic wage of 15s. 8d. per day when working on a basis of twelve shifts a fortnight, 17s. 1d. per day when working on a basis of eleven shifts a fortnight, and 18s. 10d. per day when working on a basis of ten shifts a fortnight, and, in addition, the margins prescribed in the appropriate awards in operation.

ADDITION TO REGULATION.

BY-LAW No. 260.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 260, to provide for the protection and control of the tree reserves and gardens, garden plots, lawns, and ornamental plantations in or upon any street or road.

THE Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, order as follows:—

1. In this By-law "Reserve" means a tree reserve, garden, garden plot, lawn, or ornamental plantation in or upon any street or road in the City of Melbourne.

2. No person shall interfere with, remove, damage, or destroy any seat, tree guard, tree, shrub, grass, flower, statuary, fountain, or property in any Reserve, or light any fire in any Reserve, or leave in any Reserve any bottles, fruit peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, dead animal, or refuse of any kind.

3. No person shall climb over any seat or fence in or around any Reserve, or lie on any seat or grass in any Reserve, or stick bills on any fence, seat, tree, post or other structure in any Reserve, or cut names, letters, or marks on any tree, seat, gate, post, or fence or other structure in any Reserve, or otherwise deface same, or write thereon.

4. No person shall bring into any Reserve any dog unless held by a chain or cord, or shall permit or allow such dog to urinate or defecate in or upon any lawn in any Reserve.

2. The owner of any land within any of the areas hereinafter set forth and declared to be populous or residential areas upon receipt of notice in writing under the hand of the Municipal Clerk stating that, in the opinion of the Council, any undergrowth, weeds, or grass on any land owned by him constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property, and requiring such owner to remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass within a time specified in such notice (not being less than three (3) clear days from the receipt of such notice), shall within the specified time remove or cause to be removed such undergrowth, weeds, or grass.

3. Upon default being made by any occupier or owner of land who has been served with such a notice in removing or causing to be removed the undergrowth, weeds, or grass within the time specified in such notice, the Council may by its officers and employees enter upon such land and remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass at the expense of the occupier or owner, and the Council may recover from such occupier or owner the expense incurred by it in such removal.

4. The following areas within the Municipal District of the Shire of Flinders are hereby declared to be populous or residential areas, viz.:—Balnarring, Balnarring Beach, Bittern, Coles Beach, Cape Schanck, Crib Point, Dromana, Federal Naval Base, Flinders, Main Ridge, Merricks, Portsea, Red Hill, Red Hill South, Rosebud, Rye, Shoreham, Sorrento, Stony Point, McCrae, Rosebud West.

5. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than £20.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Flinders.
