REVOCATION OF PROCLAMATION DECLARING NEW SOUTH WALES TO BE A RECIPROCATING STATE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and in pursuance of the provisions of the Schedule to the *Income Tax (Rates) Act 1937* and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made on the twenty-fourth day of January, 1938, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-sixth day of January, 1938, declaring the State of New South Wales to be a reciprocating State for the purposes of the Income Tax Acts (so far only as the same relate to the Special Tax).

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners (hereinafter called "the Commissioners") make the following Regulations:—

- (1) the erection or use on any land within the municipal district of tents or other temporary structures or buildings for the sale of goods therein or therefrom; and
- (2) the sale of goods in or from such tents, structures, or buildings;
- (3) the sale of goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, or any other vehicle, boxes, baskets, crates, bags, or other receptacles standing or placed on streets or on vacant land.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Swan Hill order as follows:—

1. No person shall on, from, and after the first day of July, 1942, without the previous consent, in writing, of the Council—

- (a) erect or use on any land within the municipal district of the Borough of Swan Hill any tent or other temporary structure or building for the sale of goods therein or therefrom; or
- (b) sell any goods in or from any such tent, structure, or building.

2. No person shall without the previous consent, in writing, of the Council, sell any goods from any stall, motor car, cart, truck, barrow, or any other vehicle, box, basket, crate, bag, or other receptacle standing or placed on any street, road, or public place or on vacant land (not being Crown land or land under the care and management of the municipality of the Borough of Swan Hill) within the area set forth in the Schedule hereto.

3. No child (as defined by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928*) shall be employed as a street hawker or itinerant trader or be permitted to manage or occupy a stand in any such street, road, or public place within the area set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

No cattle shall, between the hours of Six o'clock ante meridian and Nine o'clock post meridian be driven in that part of the municipal district of the Borough of Swan Hill commencing at the south-western corner or angle of Curlewia-street at its intersection with Karinie-street; thence in a line bearing south-east and south along the western boundary of Curlewia-street across Jones-street, King-street, Mary-street, Chapman-street, Pye-street, Pritchard-street, McCallum-street, McCrae-street, Rutherford-street, and Wood-street to Wills-street; thence in a line bearing south-west along the North-western boundary of Wills-street to Campbell-street; thence in a line bearing south along the western boundary of Campbell-street across Burke-street, Gray-street, Connell-street, Long-street, Kimberley-avenue, Bath-street, and Watty-street, to Werril-street; thence in a line bearing south-west and west along the northern boundary of Werril-street, across Coronation-avenue to Yana-street; thence in a line bearing north along the eastern boundary of Yana-street to Gray-street; thence in a line bearing west along the north side of Gray-street to Murlong-street; thence in a line bearing north along the eastern boundary of Murlong-street across Rutherford-street, McCallum-street, Pritchard-street, Pye-street, and Chapman-street to Karinie-street; thence in a line bearing east along the southern boundary of Karinie-street across Thurla-street and Euston-road to the point of commencement.

3. This By-law shall have operation throughout that part of the Borough of Swan Hill within the boundaries above described.

4. This Regulation shall come into force on the day after the day of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
