### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and theneforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Melbourne has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been acquired for road purposes by the said Council within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land acquired for road purposes hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Melbourne aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.: of the said Act, viz .:-

### RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

AWARD No. 65 OF 31ST DECEMBER, 1941, RELATING TO RATES OF SALARIES AND WAGES FOR THE YEAR 1941.

THE Railways Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the Railways Act 1928 (No. 3759), hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

- 1. The rates of salaries and wages to be paid to officers and employees during the year One thousand nine hundred and forty-one shall be as set forth hereunder:—
- forty-one shall be as set forth hereunder:—

  (a) Adult male employees (except Gatekeepers) shall be paid a needs basic wage of 13s. per day subject to adjustment in the manner prescribed in the Orders of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration dated 17th April, 1934, and 23rd June, 1937 (Railway Award), respectively, and in addition the margins prescribed therefor in the Schedule to Award No. 20 of the 17th December, 1926, subject to the alterations and additions provided in the Schedule to Awards Nos. 22, 24, 25, 26, 30, 35, 40, 44, 45, 46, 49, 51, 56, 60, 61, and 62, and in the Schedule to this Award.

  (h) Adult male officers shall be noid a needs basic salary.
- (b) Adult male officers shall be paid a needs basic salary of £203 per annum, subject to adjustment in the manner prescribed in the Orders of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration dated 17th April, 1934, and 23rd June, 1937 (Railway Award), respectively, and in addition the margins prescribed therefor in the Schedule to Award No. 20 of the 17th December, 1926, subject to the alterations and additions provided in the Schedules to Awards Nos. 22, 24, 25, 26, 30, 35, 40, 44, 45, 46, 49, 56, 60, 61, and 62, and in the Schedule to this Award.
- (c) Adult male Gatekeepers with free quarters shall be paid a rate of 1s. per day less than the basic wage.

  (d) Casual employees shall be paid the hourly rates prescribed therefor in the Schedule to this Award adjusted as prescribed in clause 2 hereof.
- (e) Female employees and junior officers and junior employees shall be paid the rates prescribed therefor in the Schedule to this Award adjusted as prescribed in clause 2
- Schedule to this Award adjusted as prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

  2. The rates prescribed for casual employees, junior employees, and female employees are based on an adult male needs basic wage of 14s, 5d. per day, and those prescribed for junior officers are based on an adult male needs basic salary of £226 per annum, and the said rates shall on the same dates be increased or decreased in the following meanure: manner:
- (i) The hourly rates for casual employees shall be increased or decreased by one-eighth of the amount by which the adult male needs basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day is increased or decreased.
- (ii) The rates of pay of junior employees, female employees, and of junior officers shall be increased or decreased in proportion to the increase or decrease in the adult male needs basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day and/or the adult male needs basic salary of £226 per annum, such sum to be calculated to the nearest penny or the nearest pound (as the case may

Provided that the increase or decrease in any junior or female rate of pay shall not exceed the increase or decrease in the adult male needs basic wage.

- 3. (a) In addition to the rates prescribed in clause 1, sub clauses (a) and (c), the wage rates of all adult male employees shall be increased by a constant amount at the rate of 10d. per day.
- (b) In addition to the rates prescribed in clause 1, sub-clause (b), the salaried rates of all adult male officers shall be increased by a constant amount at the rate of £13 per
- annum.

  (c) The hourly rates prescribed in clauses 1 (d) and 2 (1) for casual employees shall be increased by the constant amount

- (d) Where the rate prescribed for female employees is at least an amount being 54 per cent. of the adult male basic wage payable from time to time as provided in clause 1 (a) of this Award, such rate shall be increased by an amount equal to the difference between 54 per cent. of the needs male basic wage and 54 per cent. of the sum of the needs male basic wage and the constant amount prescribed in sub-clause (a) of this clause, both calculations to be made to the nearest 1d, per day. ld, per day.
- (c) Junior male employees or officers and female employees in the grades set out in the following table shall, in addition to the rates prescribed elsewhere in this Award, be paid the constant amounts indicated hereunder:

- (b) Such war time loadings shall be payable under the same conditions as are prescribed in the Order of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration, dated 9th May, 1941, in the Victorian Daily Paid and Salaried Grades Consolidated Award.
- 5. If in any period during the currency of this Award the Commissioners are bound to pay to any grade referred to herein the rate provided in respect of such grade in any other Award or in any agreement, undertaking, or Act binding upon the Commissioners, then the rate prescribed herein shall not apply during such period, but there shall be payable in lieu thereof a rate not less than that provided in such other Award or in such agreement, undertaking, or Act.
- 6. Any increase prescribed by this Award or as a result of the quarterly cost of living adjustments shall not entitle any officer to a salary exceeding £500 per annum.

### REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Workers' Compensation Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf His Excellency the Governor of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

### PRELIMINARY.

I. These Regulations may be cited as the "Workers' Compensation Short title Regulations 1942," and shall come into operation upon publication in the and date of Government Gazette, and upon such publication the Regulations made under the Commence of Workers' Compensation Acts on 9th March, 1937, shall be repealed. These Regulations are divided into Parts and Divisions as follows:—

Part VI.—Duties and remuneration of Medical Referees under the provisions of the Second Schedule to the Act, and under sub-section 2 (b) of section 7 of the Workers' Compensation Act 1937.
Division (1)—Definitions and General Regulations.
Division (2)—Regulations as to references under paragraph (14) of the Second Schedule to the Act.
Division (3)—Regulations as to references under paragraph (17) of

# PART I .- ACCIDENT INSURANCE BUSINESS. 3. The office of the Insurance Commissioner (hereinafter referred to as the Place of "Commissioner") shall be at No. 412 Collins-street, Melbourne, which is hereby business appointed for that purpose, or such other place as the Minister may from time to time, by notice published in the Government Gazette, appoint.

4. Any employer desiring to enter into any contract under the Act (herein Form of referred to as "the proposer")---

(a) shall make a proposal to the Commissioner or to an approved Insurer for the same in such form of proposal, agreement and declaration as may be authorized by the Commissioner, and shall make and sign such declaration or declarations in connexion therewith prior to the issue of the policy or on any repeal thereof the transfer of the Commissioner.

issue of the policy or on any renewal thereof as the Commissioner or approved Insurer may require;

(b) shall supply the Commissioner or approved Insurer, as and when required, with a full and correct statement of all wages paid to "workers" in the employment of the proposer during the period relevant to the determination of the premium payable by him for such policy.

Any employer who fails to furnish any information required pursuant to this Regulation, or who, with the object of procuring the issue or renewal of a policy of accident insurance or indemnity, furnishes to the Commissioner or to an approved Insurer any information which is false in any particular shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

5. Upon receipt of the premium payable in respect of any proposal accepted Pollcy to by the Commissioner or by an approved Insurer, the Commissioner or approved be issued. Insurer shall cause to be issued and delivered to the proposer a policy in the form applicable to the particular contract.

- 6. No policy issued under the provisions of the Act shall be in force as against policy not the Commissioner or approved Insurer until the first premium or any instalment in force until thereof payable under such policy by or on behalf of the insured has been premium. actually paid.
- 7. Death or disablement may be proved by the production of such evidence Proof of as the Commissioner or approved Insurer deems necessary, having regard to the death or form of policy and to the circumstances of the case.

The Commissioner or approved Insurer may require a Statutory Declaration or other evidence as to the identity of the person killed or injured with the employee whose employer is insured under the policy.

Such book shall be bound together in such manner as to prevent any page being removed or withdrawn. Each page of the book shall be numbered consecutively and shall be used only for the purpose of facilitating the giving of notice. of accidents as aforesaid.

The following reductions in premiums may be allowed to employers whose wages sheets in respect to "workers" employed by them exceed £5,000 per annum and the reduction shown in paragraph (a) hereunder will be based on the amount of wages paid away, while the reduction shown in paragraph (b) will be dependent on the claims experience.
  - (a) The reduction in premiums on the wages sheet is to be on the following
    - (1) Where the wages sheet exceeds £5,000 but not £10,000 per annum 5 per cent. of the net premium ;

A worker in receipt of weekly payments shall not be required, after a period of one month has elapsed from the date on which the first payment of compensation was made (or if the first payment is made in obedience to the award or order of the Board, from the date of the award or order) to submit himself for examination by a medical practitioner provided by the employer except at the following intervals:—Once a week during the second month, and once a month during the subsequent months.

### PART VII.-MISCELLANEOUS.

Application to certain industries of provisions of section 28 of

57. Every employer in any of the industries set out in the Fifth Schedule to these Regulations (to which industries section 28 of the Act is hereby directed to apply) shall, on or before the 31st day of December in each and every year, send to the Chief Secretary in the form in the Sixth Schedule hereto, a correct return of the number of injuries in respect of which compensation has been paid by the employer under the Act during the twelve months ending on the 6th day of November then next preceding.

58. Every employer (including in the term the representative of an employer) of a "worker" within the meaning of the Act, shall upon the request of any member of the Police Force, or any officer duly authorized by the Insurance Commissioner, produce for inspection by such member of the Police Force or officer written evidence of the fact that the employer has at the date of the request for inspection duly complied with section 37 of the Act.

Every employer (defined as aforesaid) who without reasonable excuse fails or neglects to comply with such request shall be guilty of an offence under this Regulation and be liable in respect of the same to a penalty not exceeding Five records.

Commitment.

59. Any order made or issued pursuant to the provisions of section 3 of the Workers' Compensation (Amendment) Act 1938 shall be in the form, with the necessary modifications, of the form contained in the Third Schedule of the County Court Act 1928 or to the like effect.

### FIRST SCHEDULE.

Workers' Compensation Acts.

NOTICE OF ACCIDENT.

Course of Action to be Taken by an Injured Worker.

Notice in respect of an injury under the Workers' Compensation Acts shall be given to the employer and shall give the name and address of the person injured and particulars of the accident. Such notice shall be given orally or in writing to the employer or any person designated for the purpose by the employer or any foreman or other person under whose supervision the worker is employed.

Provided that an entry in the "accident book" kept by the employer shall be sufficient notice of an accident for the purpose of the Acts.

### PROCEEDINGS.

### Time for Taking Proceedings.

Any claim for compensation with respect to any accident must be made within six months from the occurrence of such accident or, in the case of death, within six months from the time of death:

Provided that failure to make a claim within six months shall not be a bar to the maintenance of proceedings if the failure were occasioned by a mistake, absence from the State, or other reasonable cause.

### INDUSTRIAL DISEASES.

A worker suffering from an industrial disease specified in the Fifth Schedule to the Workers' Compensation Acts and set out in this notice shall give notice as in the case of accident and when certified by a certifying medical practitioner to be suffering from such disease his claim to compensation will be fully investigated.

BENEFITS UNDER THE ACTS EXTEND TO ALL EMPLOYEES. (Including Tributers in Mines and Timber Fellers or Clearers Working under Contract.)

Except-

A person whose remuneration exceeds £400 a year;
 A person whose employment is of a casual nature and is employed otherwise than for the purpose of the employer's trade or business;
 A member of the employer's family dwelling in his house.

### AMOUNT OF COMPENSATION PAYABLE.

Where Death Results from accident or from specified industrial disease :-

.(a) Where dependants left totally dependent on worker's earnings-

A sum equal to four years' earnings; maximum, £750; minimum, £400.

(b) Where dependants left in part dependent on worker's earnings-

An amount, proportionate to the extent of dependency, agreed upon, or determined by the Board.

(c) Where no dependants left-

Reasonable expenses of medical attendance (including ambulance service and maintenance in hospital) and burial; maximum, £75.

Permanent Injuries.—(In addition to weekly compensation during temporary total incapacity to a total of £25)—lump sums as specified in the Fourth Schedule to the Workers' Compensation Act 1928 and set out in this notice.

### Temporary Total Incapacity for Work.

Where no children under fourteen years of age-

A sum equal to two-thirds of the average weekly earnings; not to exceed £2 10s. per week. Total liability of employer, £700.

Where there are children under fourteen years of age totally or mainly dependent on the earnings of the "worker"—

A sum equal to two-thirds of the average weekly earnings: not to exceed £2 10s. per week. In addition a weekly payment of 8s. 6d. for such child with a limit of £1 14s. for all children. Total weekly payment not to exceed two-thirds of the average weekly earnings, or £3 7s. 6d. (whichever is the greater). The total liability of employer, £750.

### Partial Incapacity for Work.

Where partial incapacity for work results from an injury the worker is entitled to a weekly payment equal to two-thirds of the difference between his average weekly earnings before the accident and the amount he is earning or able to earn after the accident.

Workers under Twenty-one Years of Age.

Where average weekly earnings are less than £1—Compensation—100 per cent. of such average weekly earnings. Where average weekly earnings are not less than £1—Compensation—Not less than £1.

Ambulance, Medical, Nursing, Hospital and Chemist Expenses.

In this Schedule "Hospital" means an institution within the meaning of the Hospitals and Charities Act 1928 at which medical or surgical treatment for in-patients and out-patients is provided or a hospital registered under the Health Act 1928.

Where an employer is liable to pay compensation in respect of any personal injury by accident to a worker arising out of and in the course of the employment of that worker there shall in addition to any compensation otherwise payable under the Workers' Compensation Acts be paid by or on behalf of the employer a sum of not more than Twenty-five pounds towards the payment of claims in respect of the following matters:—

- (a) Any expenses, not exceeding Two pounds, for transport of the worker to hospital (whether by ambulance or otherwise) arising out of the accident;
- (b) Any fees, not exceeding Ten pounds, payable to any medical practitioner in respect of any medical or surgical treatment or examination arising out of the accident;
- . (c) Any fees, not exceeding Three pounds, payable to any registered nurse in respect of any nursing services arising out of the accident; and
- (d) Any expenses, not exceeding Ten pounds, incurred by any hospital in affording maintenance attendance and treatment arising out of the accident to the worker:

Provided that if payment within the respective limits hereinbefore provided of all such claims made within six months after the happening of the accident does not exhaust the sum of Twenty-five pounds, then the balance of such sum (or such part of such balance as is necessary for the purpose) shall be applied—

- (i) firstly, in or towards the payment of any claims in respect of any sums, not exceeding Two pounds, payable to any registered pharmaceutical chemist in respect of the supply of medicines or drugs arising out of the accident; and
- (ii) secondly, if such balance is not then exhausted, in the payment of the amounts by which any of such claims for transport treatment examination services maintenance attendance medicines or drugs exceed their respective limits as aforesaid, or (where such balance is insufficient for that purpose) in the part payment of such excess amounts in their respective proportions.

### REGULATIONS UNDER THE LAND ACT 1941.

In these Regulations the word "Right" shall mean a Right to occupy an area. not exceeding one acre in extent, for the purposes of an apiary.

Every application for a Right shall be made either by letter or in person to the Secretary for Lands, Melbourne, or to any District Land Officer, who, upon being satisfied that the area required is available for the purpose, may accept payment of an amount of £1 5s. and issue a receipt therefor.

The Secretary for Lands may thereupon cause to be issued to the applicant a Right in the form following, which form shall be used with such modification as may from time to time be required.

The holder of this Right is entitled, without payment, to a right of ingress, egress, and regress for himself and his agents and workmen, with or without horses or vehicles, over and across any land held under an annual grazing licence or a lease under the Land Act 1934 between the apiary area and any public road or track by the shortest practicable route. He or they shall close all gates or slippanels that he or they may open, and in default thereof shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. The Minister may at any time cancel this Right in the event of it being proved to his satisfaction that the holder has committed or permitted a contravention of any of these conditions.
