ALTERATION OF DAY APPOINTED FOR PUBLIC HOLIDAY (KING'S BIRTHDAY).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Monday, the 20th day of December, 1943, is by sub-section (1) of section 187 of the *Public Service Act 1928* appointed for a Public Holiday: And whereas it is made to appear to me expedient that the said day should not be a Public Holiday throughout Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of the said State, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 4 of the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1934*, do by this my Proclamation declare that the said day shall not be a Public Holiday throughout Victoria, and appoint—

MONDAY, THE 7TH DAY OF JUNE, 1943,
to be a Public Holiday throughout the said State.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF MALVERN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any

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municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Malvern has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved as a street by the said council within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land reserved as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Malvern aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF MALVERN.

All that piece of land, being part of Crown portion 24, Parish of Prahran, County of Bourke: Commencing at the north-eastern extremity of Crown portion 24, Parish of Prahran, at a point on the south building line of Toorak-road; thence by lines bearing south 0 deg 8½ min. west for a distance of 800 ft. 7 in.; thence north 88 deg. 33 min. west for a distance of 1 foot; thence in a northerly direction for a distance of 800 ft. 7 in.; thence south 89 deg. 13 min. east for a distance of 1 ft. 7½ in. to the starting point.
