ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 4884. "An Act to amend Sections Three and Four of the *Sheep Dipping Act 1928*."

No. 4885. "An Act to vary the Objects of certain Trusts declared in two Trust Deeds relating to Funds raised for the Benefit of Limbless Soldiers in Victoria, and for other purposes."

Wheat Products Prices Act 1938 (No. 4595).

VARYING PROCLAMATION FIXING THE MAXIMUM
PRICE OF BREAD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Wheat Products Prices Act 1938 (No. 4595)*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council

of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee, do hereby vary the Proclamation made on the twenty-second day of December, 1938, fixing the maximum price at which a four (4) pound loaf of bread may be sold, delivered to the buyer within the localities mentioned in the said Proclamation as follows:—

In place of the following:—

"Cities of Geelong, Geelong West, the Town of Newtown and Chilwell, and the Shire of South Barwon and of the Moorpanyal Riding of the Shire of Corio—One shilling (1s.)."

There shall be substituted the following:—

"Cities of Geelong and Geelong West, the Town of Newtown and Chilwell, the Moorpanyal Riding of the Shire of Corio and the Kardinia and Barwon Ridings of the Shire of South Barwon—Eleven pence half-penny (11½d.)."

Rest of the Shire of South Barwon—One shilling (1s.)."

And do hereby fix Eleven pence (11d.) to be the maximum price at which a four (4) pound loaf of bread may be sold in shops in such of the localities mentioned in my Proclamation made on the 22nd day of December, 1938, where delivery of bread has ceased since the 1st January, 1942.

And I do further declare that this Proclamation shall come into force at half-past Twelve o'clock a.m., on Thursday, the third day of September, 1942.

Health Acts.
EXTENSION OF A MEAT AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, 1, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation extend the boundaries of the Corio Shire Meat Area to include the following portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Corio:—

“That area of land bounded by a line commencing on the shore of Corio Bay at the eastern end of Victoria-street, and proceeding westerly along the centre of the said Victoria-street along the southern boundaries of Crown allotments 58, 67, 70, 75, and 78, Parish of Moorpanyal, County of Grant; thence southerly along the centre line of Thompsons-road along the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 80, Parish of Moorpanyal; thence south-easterly along the centre line of the Midland Highway on the north-eastern boundary of Crown allotment 82, Parish of Moorpanyal, to Church-street; thence westerly along the centre line of Church-street to Vines-street, along the southern boundaries of Crown allotments 82, 83, 84, Parish of Moorpanyal; thence northerly along the centre line of Vines-street on the eastern boundaries of Crown allotments 1, 2, 3, and 4, Parish of Moorpanyal, to the Midland Highway; thence south-easterly along the centre line of the Midland Highway on the south-western boundary of Crown allotment 93, Parish of Moorpanyal; thence northerly along the centre line of a Government road on the eastern boundaries of Crown allotments 93, 95, 96, 97, 98, 135, 134, 133, and 132, Parish of Moorpanyal, and the eastern boundaries of Crown allotments 85, 86, 87, 88, 89, and 91, Parish of Moranghurk, County of Grant; thence easterly along the centre line of a Government road running easterly on the north boundaries of Crown allotments 52, 51, 47, 46, 45, 40, 39, 38, 37, 36, and 35, Parish of Moranghurk, and continuing easterly to the shore of Limeburners Bay; and thence southerly by the shores of the said Limeburners Bay and the aforesaid Corio Bay to the starting point.”

Relating to Rates of Pay of Certain Workers at the State Coal Mine, Wonthaggi.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928* and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, and numbered 262, to amend By-law No. 207.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, the Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall from and after the date of the same coming into operation be read and construed as one with By-law No. 207 intituled "A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928* and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, and numbered 207, for or with respect to the placing fixing and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways and of any apparatus pipes and appliances in or on under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps and the removal of such petrol pumps apparatus pipes and appliances: the granting renewal and transfer of licences and applications therefor; licences and conditions to be contained in licences; prescribing fees for granting or renewal or transfer of a licence; providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps" and any By-laws amending the same.

2. The fees in respect of (a) every licence for a petrol pump (other than a portable petrol pump) in or on any footway; (b) the transfer of every such licence; and (c) the transfer of every licence for a portable petrol pump which is used on any footway for the purpose of selling or supplying motor spirit shall for the year ending the thirtieth day of September, 1942, and for every year thereafter respectively be reduced by an amount equivalent to seventy-five per centum of the fees in each such case prescribed by By-law No. 207, as amended by By-law No. 213.

CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

BY-LAW No. 92.

A BY-LAW of the City of Footscray made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and every other power it thereunto enabling and numbered 92:—

- (a) For regulating and/or prohibiting the erection or construction of any building to be used or occupied for residential purposes.
- (b) to regulate and/or prohibit the alteration or adaptation of any existing building to be used or occupied for residential purposes.
- (c) Prescribing regulations in relation to the erection or construction or alteration or adaptation of any existing building to be used or occupied for residential purposes.
- (d) Repealing any By-law or part thereof heretofore in force in the Municipality inconsistent with or repugnant to this By-law.

Repeal.

Part XVIII. of By-law No. 80 of the City of Footscray is hereby repealed.

Operation.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Footscray.

Restriction of Buildings Designed to Contain or Capable of Containing more than One Residence.

1. No person shall erect or construct or cause to be erected or constructed any building or alter or adapt any existing building to be used or occupied as or for more than two separate residences or which building is or designed as to

be capable of being used or occupied as or for more than two separate residences.

2. So far as the same may be applicable the general provisions of all existing By-laws of the Municipality of Footscray as well as the general provisions of this By-law and also the special conditions in sub-paragraphs (a) to (g) inclusive of this paragraph shall apply to the erection, construction, alteration, or adaptation of any building to be used or occupied as more than one residence or so designed as to be capable of being used or occupied as or for more than one residence.

Consent of Council.

(a) The Council may make such inquiries as it deems proper in order to ascertain that such building, erection, alteration, or adaptation will comply with the requirements of this By-law, and no person shall proceed with such erection, construction, alteration, or adaptation until the Council has had a reasonable opportunity of making such inquiries, or has consented in writing to the erection or construction or alteration or adaptation of such building or proposed building.

Building to be Fire Resisting.

(b) That such building or erection is built of brick, stone, concrete, or other fire-resisting material approved by the surveyor.

Maximum Height.

(c) That the height of such building shall not exceed two stories.

Minimum Frontage, Area, and Spaces.

(d) The minimum frontages and areas on which building of this class may be erected, and the minimum distances from boundaries, and the percentages of open spaces which shall be left about such buildings shall be as shown in Table "F":—

Projections.

(e) No projection from the external wall of such buildings shall be made nearer than 3 feet to the boundary of land not in the same occupation.

Minimum Floor Area.

(f) Each unit of a pair of residences shall be in itself a complete dwelling of not less than 600 square feet in floor area, and shall be provided with all necessary lavatory, sanitary, and kitchen accommodation as herein before provided for in regard to dwelling houses.

To be Fire Isolated.

(g) Each unit of a pair of residences shall be fire isolated from any other part of the building to be used or intended

to be used for separate occupation, and each such unit shall have its own separate means of entrance and exit to the open air for the use of the occupants thereof.
