*Land Act 1928.*

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 4889. "An Act to authorize the Treasurer of Victoria to guarantee the Payment to the Commonwealth Bank of Australia by the Amalgamated Freezing Company (Victoria) Proprietary Limited of Moneys advanced by the said Bank to the said Company by way of Overdraft for the purposes of its Undertakings at Ballarat Bendigo and Donald during the Financial Year 1942-1943, and the Payment of Interest on such Moneys."

No. 4890. "An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million seven hundred and fifty-three thousand three hundred and forty-five pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and forty-one and One thousand nine hundred and forty-two."

No. 4891. "An Act to provide for the Institution of Proceedings in respect of Markets in the City of Melbourne by an Officer authorized by the Council of the said City."

GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 73.

*A By-law for Making and Levying the Rates for the Year Commencing on the First day of July, 1942.*

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the *Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1928*, and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works, or any extension of such works:—

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area and supplied with water for domestic purposes:—

- (a) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £20—Twenty shillings per annum.
- (b) On any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £20—One shilling in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) On any land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £5—Five shillings per annum.
- (d) On any such land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof exceeds £5—One shilling in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1942, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1943, and shall be payable in two equal instalments on the twenty-first day of September, 1942, and the first day of January, 1943.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

##### REGULATION No. 1.

A Regulation of the Shire of Alexandra, numbered 1, made under the Health Acts, for prescribing fees for the registration and renewal and transfer of registration of premises throughout the Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Alexandra make the following Regulation, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

The following fees shall be payable to the secretary of the Shire of Alexandra by any person making application for registration, annual renewal of registration, or transfer of registration of the following premises, respectively:—

- Offensive trade premises (other than hide and skin stores)—Three pounds.
- Offensive trade premises (hide and skin stores), One pound.
- Offensive trade premises (any butcher's shop at which fat is rendered from materials derived from such shop)—Ten shillings.
- Boarding houses—Five shillings.
- Common lodging houses—Five shillings.
- Eating houses—Five shillings.
- Premises at or in any part of which eggs for sale are received or stored for the purpose of being chilled—One pound.
- Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream, ginger beer, hop beer, or any similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, or other mineral water, or any artificially aerated water—Two shillings and six pence.
- Cattle sale yards—One pound.
- For any transfer of registration—Two shillings and six pence.
