PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 10 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1928*, it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby abolish the under-mentioned common, viz.:—

IN THE SHIRE OF DUNDAS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* (No. 3799), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the plant named hereunder to be a noxious weed for the purposes of the above Act within the Shire of Dundas, viz.:—

Acacia Armata, R.Br. "Acacia Hedge" or "Prickly Acacia" (except existing hedges not exceeding 10 feet in height and 10 feet in width).

Fire Brigades Act 1928.

ALTERATION OF WESTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that whenever the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board certifies that it is necessary or desirable that any specified portion of the metropolitan fire district or of any country fire district (as the case may be) be excised therefrom, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that such portion shall be excised accordingly, and that thereupon such specified portion shall for the purposes of the said Act no longer be included in or be part of such metropolitan or country fire district: And whereas it is also enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the Country Fire Brigades Board has certified that it is necessary and desirable that the whole of the municipal district of the former Borough of Ararat be excised from the Western Fire District: And whereas the Council of the Town of Ararat has requested that the whole of the municipal district of the Town of Ararat be added to and form part of such fire district and a certificate has been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the whole of the said municipal district of the former Borough of Ararat shall be excised from the said Western Fire District and that the whole of the municipal district of the Town of Ararat shall be added to and form part of the said Western Fire District.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I, E. J. - (3) For electricity supplied to the Mental Hygiene Hospital, a combined tariff (for all purposes included under (1) and (2) above)—8d. per unit.

The foregoing amendment shall apply as and from the 1st day of September, 1942.

 5th year—at the rate of 70s. 7d. per week.
 6th year—at the rate of 87s. 9d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

1st year—at the rate of 24s. 3d. per week.
 2nd year—at the rate of 33s. 0d. per week.
 3rd year—at the rate of 46s. 6d. per week.
 4th year—at the rate of 64s. 6d. per week.
 5th year—at the rate of 87s. 9d. per week."
