## NATIONAL SECURITY (EMERGENCY POWERS) ACTS.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the

### REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE TEMPORARY EXTENSION OF THE PORT OF MELBOURNE.

AT the request of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the National Security (Emergency Powers) Acts, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Port of Melbourne (Extension) Regulations. Citation.

2. So much of the waters of the part of Port Phillip Bay hereinafter described as are not already part of the Port of Melbourne within the meaning of the Harbor Trust Acts shall during the present war be deemed to be part of the said Port and vested in the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners, and the provisions of the Melbourne Harbor Trust Acts shall extend and apply and take effect accordingly. Temporary extension of Port of Melbourne and vesting in Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners.

#### DESCRIPTION OF PART OF PORT PHILLIP BAY.

Commencing at a point on the Southern side of the Breakwater Pier at Williamstown, such point being situated on the prolongation northerly of a true meridian which passes through the Gellibrand Pile Light; thence true south ( $180^{\circ}$ ) to a point from which the Fawcner Light Beacon bears true east, thence by a line bearing  $90^{\circ}$  1.7 nautical miles, thence by a line bearing  $0^{\circ}$  00' to Low Water Mark O.S.T. at South Melbourne, and thence by a straight line to the point of commencement.

3. Nothing in these Regulations shall be deemed to affect the control of the Gellibrand pile light. Saving as to Gellibrand pile light.

And the Honorable Arthur Albert Dunstan, His Majesty's Premier of the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
