PROCLAMATION

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor, of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor, of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

The Fisheries Acts.
NETTING IN CUNNINGHAME ARM AT LAKES ENTRANCE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke so much of the Proclamation made the eleventh day of October, 1921, and published in the Government Gazette of the nineteenth day of October, 1921, re netting at Gippsland Lakes Entrance, as relates to Cunningham Arm, and prohibit in the waters of such Arm, eastward of an imaginary line running approximately north-north-west (magnetic) from the inner end of the eastern pier of the "Lakes Entrance" to the inner end of the pier at Bullock Island, during the whole of each year the use of all trammels, trawls and other nets or engines whether fixed or unfixed except seine or hauling nets not exceeding in length 400 fathoms each; provided that the use of such nets shall be prohibited from ten o'clock in the morning of each Friday until sunrise on each Sunday following throughout the year and within one hundred feet of any wharf, pier or jetty in such Arm. Privately owned jetties will not be considered jetties for the purpose of this Proclamation.

PROCLAMATION

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, and by virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1928 (No. 3697), do by this Proclamation declare each of the diseases named hereafter to be an infectious disease—

- Scabies,
- Impetigo,
- Pediculosis.

AMENDMENT OF PROCLAMATION RELATING TO THE TRADES USUALLY CARRIED ON IN CONNEXION WITH THE RECEPTION AND DISPOSAL OF NIGHTSOIL AND REFUSE AND RUBBISH ADDED TO THE LIST OF OFFENSIVE TRADES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c. &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1928* (No. 3697), I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, do by this my Proclamation amend my Proclamation of the fourth day of November, 1940, by substituting for paragraph 1 thereof the following paragraph:—

"1. Any of the trades usually carried on in or in connexion with—

the reception of or the carriage of or the disposal of nightsoil; nightsoil depots, nightsoil pan-washing depots; nightsoil pan changing depots; premises where nightsoil whether in a pan or other vessel or a vehicle or otherwise is kept while awaiting carriage or disposal; premises where any nightsoil pan or other vessel which has been used for holding nightsoil is kept whether in a vehicle or otherwise while awaiting washing carriage storage or re-use; premises where any vehicle which has been or is being used for carrying nightsoil is washed or kept whether for immediate use or otherwise."

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF MELBOURNE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and henceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Melbourne has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Melbourne aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF MELBOURNE.

All that piece of land, being part of Crown allotment 18, section 2, Parish of Doutta Galla, County of Bourke, commencing at the south-eastern corner of lot 110 on plan of subdivision numbered 1039, and registered at the Office of

Titles, and bounded by the northern boundary of Chelmsford-street bearing west 2 ft. 1 in.; thence by a line bearing north 12 deg. 44 min. west 131 ft. 7 in.; thence by a line bearing north 10 deg. 40 min. west 117 ft. 10 in.; thence by the original western boundary of Bent-street (formerly New-street) bearing south 11 deg. 6 min. east 118 ft. 34 in., south 13 deg. 40 min. east 12 ft. 4 in., and south 13 deg. 11 min. east 119 ft. 2½ in. respectively to the commencing point.

VARYING PROCLAMATION FIXING THE MAXIMUM PRICE OF BREAD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Wheat Products Prices Act 1938* (No. 4595), I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee do hereby vary the Proclamation made on the twenty-second day of December, 1938, fixing the maximum price at which a Four (4) pound loaf of bread may be sold, delivered to the buyer within the localities mentioned in the said Proclamation as follows:—

In place of the following:—

"City of Bendigo, Borough of Eaglehawk, Township of Kangaroo Flat in the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye, the Township of Spring Gully in the Shire of Strathfieldsaye

REGULATIONS.—TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES—
CHAPTER IX.

THE Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, hereby amends Chapter IX. of the Public Service Regulations, as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

PART III.—MISCELLANEOUS.

Travelling by Motor Car, Motor Cycle, or Bicycle.

For—
Clause 47.

Read—

47. Officers who use their own motor cars, motor cycles, or bicycles, and who are not in receipt of a commuted allowance in which the cost of locomotion is included, may, with the approval of the Minister, be paid a mileage rate as set out hereunder, or such weekly or yearly allowance as may from time to time be fixed by the Board:—

	For the first 5,000 miles in a financial year.	Mileage over 5,000 miles in a financial year.
Motor cars—		
Over 9 h.p.	5½d. a mile	5d. a mile
9 h.p. and under	4½d. a mile	4d. a mile
Motor cycles, with side cars	3d. a mile	2½d. a mile
Motor cycles	2½d. a mile	2d. a mile
Bicycles	1d. a mile, irrespective of mileage.	

NOTE.—H.p. means horse-power as registered in accordance with Regulations under the Motor Car Act.

Provided that, in any case where the Board is satisfied that a mileage rate as above-mentioned paid to an officer should be increased, such increased rate may be allowed as the Board shall determine.

Provided also that an officer shall not incur an expenditure in excess of £200 during any financial year either for the use of his own car on official business or for motor car hire or both, unless the Permanent Head certifies that the expenditure is necessary in the interests of the efficient working of the Department, and the approval of the Treasurer is obtained.

An officer authorized to claim mileage rates will not be permitted to hire motor cars, except in cases of emergency, and then only with the approval of the Minister.

SALE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act* 1928, the Trustees of the Sale Public Cemetery make the following rules and regulations, that is to say:—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be hereby rescinded.

2. The charges for burying in or otherwise using the cemetery must be paid before an order can be given for the particular work or privilege required.

3. Orders for interments must be given to the caretaker at least seven ordinary working hours before the time appointed for the burial so as to allow sufficient time for digging the grave within ordinary working hours as defined by the determination of the Cemetery Employees Board.

4. The caretaker will dig all ordinary graves, but when brick graves or vaults are required then the excavations must be made and the ground filled in or removed under the inspection and to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

5. The hours fixed for interment are from 10 a.m. till 5 p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. till 4 p.m. during the other four months. No interments may be made on Sundays except with the approval of the Trustees, and then only on the written recommendation of the local Health Officer, or as the Trustees otherwise think fit.

6. A drawing of every stone, tomb, or pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every inscription, must be submitted to the Trustees, without whose approval it shall not be erected or inscribed.

7. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in and cemented and covered by a slab of stone or iron.

8. All materials required in the completion of any stone or any other work shall be fully prepared before taken into the cemetery, and all such materials used and foundations made must meet with the approval of the Trustees.

9. Every stonemason or contractor doing work in the cemetery shall clear away all debris within 48 hours of the completion of the work.

10. The grounds will be open to the public daily from sunrise to sunset.

11. No new grave can be made without paying for the ground or satisfying the Trustees that it has already been paid for.

12. Instructions for interments in ground previously purchased must be accompanied by documentary evidence of authority to issue such instructions.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Part 1 of the Stock Diseases Act 1928 the Governor in Council is empowered to make Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and whereas certain Regulations were, on the thirty-first day of October, 1938, made under the powers thereby conferred and whereas it is expedient to amend the said Regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof in exercise of the said powers and of all other powers him thereunto enabling, doth amend the said Regulations as follows (that is to say):—

After Regulation 33 in Part 1 of the Regulations there shall be added the following:—

“33. (a) CATTLE AND SWINE FROM THE AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY, via NEW SOUTH WALES. The introduction of cattle and swine from the Australian Capital Territory into Victoria will be permitted provided all the requirements of these Regulations have been complied with, and they are accompanied by a declaration duly completed in the form of Schedule A.C.T.”
