PROHIBITION OF FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM THE TARAGO RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES FROM 1st MAY TO 31st AUGUST IN EACH YEAR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c., &c.

T. THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the eighth day of June, 1927, and published in the Government Gazette of the fifteenth day of June, 1927, respecting the prohibition of fishing in the Lang Lang and Tarago Rivers, and prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the Tarago River and its tributaries from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of August (both days inclusive) in each year.

NOTE.—The tributaries of the Tarago River referred to above do not include the Labertouche. Whisky, Gum Scrub. Dingley Dell, Muddy, and Brandy Creeks, which are closed to all fishing during the whole of each year.

VARIATION OF PROCLAMATION RESPECTING FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM THE TARWIN RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers menabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation vary the Proclamation made the second day of May, 1939, and published in the Government Gazette of the third day of May, 1939, by revoking paragraph (d) of such Proclamation, and prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the following waters during the periods mentioned:—

- (1) The Eastern Branch of the Tarwin River and its tributaries, from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of August (both days inclusive) in each year:
- (2) The Western Branch of the Tarwin River and its tributaries, from the first day of May to the fifteenth day of December (both days inclusive) in each year.

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Fire Brigades Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the Government Gazette declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the council of the municipal district hereinafter mentioned has requested that the portions of such district enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire district specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of such fire district: And whereas a certificate has been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the Fire Brigades Act 1928, do hereby declare that the said portions of such municipal district shall be added to and form part of the fire district specified accordingly:—

NORTH-EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

1. Shire of Shepparton, Parish of Shepparton, County of Moira: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of lot 4 on lodged plan 9379 of subdivision of part of Crown allotment 78; thence southerly by a road to the northern boundary of Crown allotment 17; thence north-westerly by the lastmentioned boundary to a point in line with the western boundary of lot 4 on lodged plan 9379 aforementioned; thence northerly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary, and easterly by the northern boundary of the aforementioned lot 4 to the point of commencement.

2. Shire of Shepparton, Parish of Shepparton, County of Moira: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 18B, Parish of Shepparton; thence southerly and south-westerly by the boundaries of the last-mentioned allotment to allotment 18A; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of allotment 18A to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 71 of section C; thence easterly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary to the north-eastern angle of the aforementioned allotment 71; thence southerly by a road to the north boundary of allotment 21; thence westerly by a road to the north-eastern angle of lot 25 on lodged plan No. 3132; thence southerly by a road and a line to the south side of the Shepparton-Benalla Country Roads Board main road, and north-westerly by that road to the north-eastern angle of allotment 10 of section E; thence southerly by a road to the northern boundary of allotment 16, and easterly and southerly by that allotment and allotment 17 to the most southerly angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence generally in a north-westerly direction by allotments 17, 5, and 4 to a road forming the western boundary of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by the boundaries of the Borough of Shepparton bearing north-easterly, southeasterly, northerly, westerly, and again north-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 18A; thence north-easterly by that allotment and allotment 18B to the point of commencement.

THE Railways Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the Railways Act 1928 (No. 3759), hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say) :-

Award No. 31.-Division .17 .- Youths Living Away from Home.

By deleting clauses (1) and (2) and substituting therefor the following:

By deleting clauses (1) and (2) and substituting therefore following:—

(1) Any Junior Clerk in receipt of a salary at a rate of less than £110 per annum who, in the opinion of the Commissioners, is obliged to reside away from home owing to the requirements of the Department, shall be granted a board and lodging allowance on the basis of the difference between his rate of salary and £110 per annum. (2), Any Lad or Apprentice in receipt of a wage at a rate of less than 7s, per day who, in the opinion of the Commissioners, is obliged to reside away from home owing to the requirements of the Department, shall be granted a daily board and lodging allowance for six (6) dayper week equivalent to the difference between his daily rate of wage and 7s, per day. This clause shall not apply to any Lad in the Refreshment Services Branch who is provided with board and lodging by the Department.

(2A) The rates referred to in clauses (1) and (2) shall be increased or decreased in proportion to the increase or decrease in the adult male needs basic salary of £230 per annum or needs basic wage of 14s, 8d, per day payable under the Australian Railways Union Victorian Daily Paid and Salaried Grades Consolidated Award, such sum to be calculated to the nearest pound or the nearest penny as the case may be: Provided that no alteration shall be made in the rates prevailing at the time unless and until the increase or decrease amounts to at least £8 per annum or 6d, per day, respectively.

FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

A PPLICATIONS are invited from officers (other teachers) in the employment of the Government of Victoria for nomination during 1943 for free places in a course for a degree, diploma, or licence at the University of Melbourne. The number of officers that may be nominated is five.

The nominations will be made by the Minister of Public Instruction on the recommendation of a Board consisting of the Chairman of the Public Service Board as chairman, the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools, and the Permanent Heads of three Departments other than the Education Department. The recommendations of the Board will be based on the age, suitability, qualifications, and period of service of the applicants, on the reports and recommendations of their Departmental Heads, and, if considered necessary, on the result of a personal interview. Applicants must be qualified for admission to the course upon which they desire to enter, and should have been in the employment of the Government of Victoria for at least one year, and, except in special cases, such as applicants who are returned soldiers or who have already completed part of their course, should be not more than 25 years of age. The nominations will be made by the Minister of Public than 25 years of age.

Each officer nominated for one of these free places will be admitted without fee to all lectures and examinations in the subjects of his course, and will be granted the necessary leave of absence to enable him to attend essential lectures, practical and other work, and examinations. He will not, however, be granted any allowance for books, materials, or other expenses involved in attending the University. He will be required to enter into an agreement with the Minister of Public Instruction, and be guaranteed by an approved surety, that he will not relinquish his course without permission, that he will carry out the conditions of his free place, and that, if required, he will remain and continue in the employment of the Government of Victoria during the period of three years next after the termination of his free place, and, if his free place extends over more than three years, an additional year for each year by which the term of his free place exceeds three years. The amount of liability under the terms of this agreement will not exceed £250.

The continuance of the free place will be dependent upon satisfactory reports by the Professorial Board as to the officer's attendance, conduct, progress at the University, and by the Departmental Head as to the manner in which he performs his official duties.
