REVOCATION OF APPOINTMENT OF PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Proclamations issued on the 5th day of November, 1941, the 18th day of November, 1941, and the 9th day of December, 1941, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 12th day of November, 1941, the 19th day of November, 1941, and the 10th day of December, 1941, respectively, the following days were appointed, under the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 187 of the *Public Service Act 1928*, for public holidays throughout the parts of Victoria respectively specified in connexion therewith, that is to say:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 11TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1942, throughout the North and South Ridings of the Shire of Metcalfe;
WEDNESDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1942, throughout the Borough of Castlemaine, the Shire of Newstead and Mount Alexander, the Maldon Riding of the Shire of Maldon, and the Taradale, West, and Chewton Ridings of the Shire of Metcalfe:

And whereas it is made to appear to me expedient that the said days should not be public holidays throughout such parts of Victoria respectively specified: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Public Service Acts, do by this my Proclamation declare that the said days shall not be public holidays throughout the parts of Victoria aforesaid.

PROCLAMATION RESCINDED AS TO PART.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928*, do hereby rescind the Proclamation dated the 13th July, 1903, whereby certain lands in the Parish of Clarksdale were defined as the Township of Berringa, so far as regards the portion thereof hereinafter described, viz.—

127 acres 1 rood 16 perches, Township of Berringa, Parish of Clarksdale, County of Grenville: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment 3 of section 16; bounded thence by that allotment bearing N. 88 deg. 35 min. W. 1,001 links, by allotment 4 bearing S. 88 deg. 35 min. W. 1,324 links, by lines bearing N. 9 deg. 37 min. W. 900 links, N. 34 deg. 40 min. W. 390 links, N. 0 deg. 11 min. E. 245 links, and S. 76 deg. 44 min. W. 1,611 5/10 links, by a road bearing N. 4 deg. 47 min. E. 277 links, N. 20 deg. 4 min. W. 678 5/10 links, N. 0 deg. 58 min. E. 729 links, N. 58 deg. 43 min. W. 530 links, N. 2 deg. 32 min. W. 334 5/10 links, and N. 12 deg. 8 min. E. 40 links; and thence by lines bearing S. 89 deg. 50 min. E. 5,004 9/10 links, and S. 1 deg. 25 min. IN pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 521 and 525 of the Local Government Act 1928, the Council of the Shire of Braybrook doth hereby order that the land next hereinafter described shall be a public highway from the date of publication of this Order in the Government Gazette, that is to say:—

WARRAGUL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1942 (BY-LAW No. 34).

THE Warragul Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes, of One shilling (1s.) in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Warragul Urban District.

1. Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty-six shillings (26s.), and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Twelve shillings and six pence.

2. The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

3. The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity computed as in the last preceding clause is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

4. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.

5. The minimum charge per annum for services to Government premises shall be Two pounds ten shillings, and for excess water over 50,000 gallons the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

6. Such rates and charges are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1942, and shall be due and payable on the first day of March, 1942, at the office of the Trust, Queen-street, Warragul.

VARIATION OF ORDER APPOINTING A COAL AND COKE BOARD AND ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF SUCH BOARD AND OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 12 (FUEL AND FODDER).

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts for the time being in force, the Governor in Council did, by Order, appoint a Wages Board described as the Coal and Coke Board, and did by further Order vary and adjust the powers of the said Board: And whereas it is expedient further to vary and adjust the powers of the said Board in the manner hereafter appearing: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the

powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby—

1. Vary the Orders above-mentioned so that in substitution for the powers thereby conferred, the said Coal and Coke Board shall be given the following powers, that is to say:—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed—

(a) in any business or occupation connected with the sale or distribution of coal or coke by any—

- (i) coal importer;
- (ii) coal mine owner;
- (iii) gas company;
- (iv) agent or contractor who distributes coal or coke for any coal importer, coal mine owner, or gas company.

(b) in the process, trade, business, or occupation of burning, preparing, grinding, grading, or distributing charcoal in a form suitable for use in power-producing or heat-producing units.

2. Adjust the powers of the Coal and Coke Board and of the Shops Board No. 12 (Fuel and Fodder) by depriving the said Shops Board No. 12 (Fuel and Fodder) of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of burning, grinding, grading, or distributing charcoal, and conferring such power on the Coal and Coke Board.

RE-DEFINITION OF AREA OR LOCALITY WITHIN WHICH THE DETERMINATION OF THE COAL AND COKE BOARD SHALL BE OPERATIVE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Order, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the *Farmers' Protection Act* 1941 in that behalf His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. In these Regulations the expression "Act" shall mean the *Farmers' Protection Act* 1941, the expression "Board" shall mean the Farmers' Debts Adjustment Board, and the expression "section" shall mean section of the *Farmers' Protection Act* 1941.
2. 5. Meetings called pursuant to section 10 shall be held on a day not less than fourteen days after the day on which the notification of such meeting is published in the *Government Gazette*.
6. Minutes of every meeting held pursuant to section 10 and any adjournment thereof shall be made by the chairman of the meeting or some person authorized on his behalf, and such minutes shall be signed by the chairman.
7. The chairman of any meeting called by the Board may adjourn such meeting from time to time and from place to place.
8. A creditor may attend by proxy any meeting called by the Board.
9. No written notification of the place, day and hour to which any meeting called by the Board has been adjourned shall be required to be given.
10. If a creditor attends any meeting by proxy, such proxy may attend and vote at all subsequent meetings without any further authority.
11. A proxy shall be in the prescribed form.
12. The chairman of any meeting called by the Board may act as proxy for any creditor.
13. Upon written request by the Board a creditor of a farmer to whom a limited stay order has been issued shall, within fourteen days of the date of such written request, furnish the Board with proof of his claim against such farmer and shall give every facility for verification thereof.
14. The Board shall be entitled to hold from time to time formal or informal conferences with the farmer and/or all or any of his creditors.
15. During the operation of a stay order the farmer shall make available at all reasonable times for inspection by the Board or any person authorized by the Board, any property, assets or accounts.
16. A valuator shall be entitled to receive a minimum fee of £1 per valuation and a maximum fee of £10 per valuation, as certified to by the Board, provided that in special cases, the Board may pay such higher fee as may be agreed upon by the valuator and the Board.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

"4A. No person shall use or drive or have charge of a motor car in connexion with which is used a gas producer which permits the escape therefrom of any flame, spark, live coal or any burning material whatsoever, or permits any leakage of gas;

"4B. No person shall on any public highway or on any land discharge from a gas producer fitted to or on a motor car any live coals, hot ashes or other burning material whatsoever from which fire or sparks may be emitted except into a fireplace constructed for the purpose or into a hole below the level of the surrounding ground capable of readily and completely receiving such live coals, hot ashes or other burning material.

The aforesaid live coals, hot ashes or other burning material shall be forthwith saturated with water by the person discharging the same so that any fire or sparks will be completely extinguished."

ADJUSTMENTS OF ACCOUNTS, ETC.

WHEREAS in consequence of an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 31st May, 1939, whereby an area was severed from the municipal district of the Shire of Swan Hill (hereinafter called the Shire) and was constituted a separate municipality under the name of the Borough of Swan Hill (hereinafter called the Borough), certain property, income, assets, rights, liabilities, expenses, and matters required to be apportioned, settled, adjusted and determined as between the Shire and the Borough: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, pursuant to the provisions of section 19 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, hereby order:—

A. That in regard to all matters apart from the Electric Supply Undertaking—

1. The Shire shall forthwith transfer and assign to the Borough all its right, title, and interest in—

- (a) Lands as described in Schedule No. 1.
- (b) Leases and licences as described in Schedule No. 2.
- (c) Furniture, equipment, plant and tools as described in portions (a), (c), (e), and (g) of Schedule No. 3.
- (d) Arrears of rates as per Schedule No. 4.
- (e) Arrears of sanitary rates as per Schedule No. 5.

The furniture, equipment, plant and tools described in portions (b), (d), and (f) of Schedule No. 3 shall be apportioned as set out in such portions and allowed in Schedule No. 6.

3. The Shire shall forthwith after the receipt thereof by it pay to the Borough all rates and sanitary charges and interest thereon which, after the 31st day of May, 1939, became or shall hereafter become due or owing to the Shire in respect of any lands or tenements situate within the municipal district of the Borough and which hereafter shall have been received by the Shire.

4. The Shire shall forthwith transfer and assign to the Shire and the Borough as tenants in common in equal shares all its right, title and interest to or in the infectious diseases ward of the Swan Hill Hospital. Such infectious diseases ward shall hereafter be under the sole control of the Borough, subject to such conditions as are contained in Schedule No. 7.

5. The Shire shall with all possible despatch and at its own cost and expense, but not exceeding £250, repair the road known as Boundary-road with such materials and in such manner as may be approved by or to the satisfaction of the engineer for the time being of the Borough.

6. The Borough shall pay to or allow in account with the Shire the amounts set out on the debit side of the Severance Adjustment Account, Schedule No. 6, and the Shire shall pay to or allow in account with the Borough the amounts set out on the credit side of the said account. The amount of the balance of such account (£4,971 13s. 11d.) shall be paid by the Borough to the Shire by annual instalments of £500, the first of such instalments to be paid at the expiration of twelve months from the date of this Order in Council, and the balance of such amount (viz. £471 13s. 11d.) at the expiration of ten years from the date of this Order in Council. In addition the Borough shall pay to the Shire interest (at a rate each year equal to the rate payable by the Shire to its bank on overdraft at the date of payment of the annual instalment heretofore mentioned) on the amount from time to time owing by the Borough to the Shire under this clause, such interest to be calculated yearly and to be paid on the same dates as for the payment of the instalments of principal heretofore mentioned. The Borough shall have the right to pay off the whole or any portion of the amount owing by it to the Shire under this clause at any time, together with interest (at the same rate as above) to the date of payment.

7. REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Voting by Post (Armed Services) Act 1941* and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Voting by Post (Armed Services) Regulations".

2. In these Regulations—

- "District" means electoral district.
- "Principal Act" means *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1928*, as amended by any Act.
- "Province" means electoral province.
- "War Service" means engagement in the present war on naval, military, or air service outside Victoria but within the Commonwealth with His Majesty's naval, military, or air forces or with the naval, military, or air forces of the Commonwealth.

3. (1) Any elector for any province or district in which an election is about to be held who satisfies the Returning Officer that he is engaged on war service may before polling day make application in the form or to the effect of the Schedule hereto to the returning officer for such province or district for a postal ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such election instead of attending personally to tender his vote thereat.

(2) The form of application shall be signed by such elector in his own handwriting and shall have at the foot thereof a certificate signed by an authorized witness as hereinafter defined that such authorized witness—

- (a) has satisfied himself as to the identity of the elector;
- (b) has seen the elector sign the application in the elector's own handwriting; and
- (c) knows that the elector is engaged on war service; and such certificate shall set out the State in which the elector is so engaged.

4. An authorized witness shall not witness the signature of any such elector on the counterfoil of his postal ballot-paper unless the authorized witness has satisfied himself as to the identity of the elector and has seen the elector sign such counterfoil in his own handwriting.

5. The provisions of the following sections of the Principal Act shall apply to voting by post by electors on war service, viz.—

Paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of sub-section (3) of section two hundred and seventy-four; sections two hundred and seventy-six, two hundred and seventy-seven, two hundred and seventy-eight, two hundred and seventy-nine, and two hundred and eighty; sub-sections (1) and (3) of section two hundred and eighty-one; sections two hundred and eighty-two, two hundred and eighty-three, two hundred and eighty-four, two hundred and eighty-seven, two hundred and eighty-eight, two hundred and eighty-nine, two hundred and ninety, two hundred and ninety-one, and two hundred and ninety-two.

6. The provisions of section two hundred and eighty-six of the Principal Act are hereby applied for the purposes of these Regulations with the following adaptation—

"In paragraph (d) for the words 'this Act' there shall be substituted the expression 'the Voting by Post (Armed Services) Regulations'."

7. (1) The following persons shall be authorized witnesses within the meaning of these Regulations:—

All commissioned officers of the naval, military, or air forces of the Commonwealth.

In this Regulation "commissioned officers of the naval, military, or air forces of the Commonwealth" means—

- (a) commissioned officers of the naval forces of the Commonwealth;
- (b) officers of the military forces engaged on war service within the meaning of the Commonwealth Act known as the *Defence Act 1903-1941*; and
- (c) officers of the Royal Australian Air Force engaged on war service within the meaning of the said Act.

(2) No person who is a candidate at any election shall be an authorized witness at or in connexion with that election.

8. The Twenty-sixth Schedule to the Principal Act with the following adaptations shall be applied for the purposes of these Regulations—

- (a) for the declaration required of the voter the following declaration shall be substituted—"I declare that I have not already posted a ballot-paper in respect of or voted personally at any election held or to be held on the polling-day of the election for which this vote is given";
- (b) after the word "residence" wherever occurring there shall be substituted the expression—" (being the address of the Naval, Military, or Air Force establishment where he is stationed)"; and
- (c) under the heading "Instructions to Authorized Witnesses" for the expression commencing with the words "An authorized witness shall not" and ending with the words "such postal ballot-paper" there shall be substituted the words "An authorized witness shall not witness the signature of any elector to his postal ballot-paper unless the authorized witness has satisfied himself as to the identity of the elector and has seen the elector sign the counterfoil in his own handwriting."
