Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I, E. J. ELECTRIC TRAMWAYS OF THE STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

AMENDMENT OF TRAMWAY BY-LAW No. 1.

PURSUANT to the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 16 of the *State Electricity Commission Act 1929*, the State Electricity Commission of Victoria hereby, subject to the consent of the Governor in Council, amends the schedules to the By-law made pursuant to sub-section (1) of the said section, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 9th day of March, 1937, as follows, that is to say:—

- (i) In the Second Schedule, under the heading "Adult Cash Fares", the words "Lake Weeroona" shall be repealed, and the words "Thunder-street" substituted therefor.
- (ii) In the Second Schedule, under the heading "Ticket Section, 2d.", the words "Lake Weeroona" shall be repealed, and the words "Corner Nolan and Bridge streets" substituted therefor.
- (iii) In the Second Schedule, under the heading "Ticket Section, 2d.", after the word "terminus" first appearing the following shall be added:—
"Between Nolan and Bridge streets and Thunder-street terminus."
- (iv) In proviso 4 to the schedules, under the heading "Bendigo", the words "Lake Weeroona" shall be repealed, and the words "Thunder-street" substituted therefor.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE REGULATIONS RESPECTING NETTING IN WATSON'S, WOOROO- NOOKE, AND DEW'S LAKES, NEAR CHARLTON.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamation made the twelfth day of January, 1937, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirteenth day of January, 1937, respecting netting in Watson's, Wooroonooke, and Dew's Lakes, near Charlton, and permitting the use of gill or set nets for the purpose of taking fish in Watson's, Wooroonooke, and Dew's Lakes (commonly known as the Wooroonooke Lakes) from the first day of December in each year to the thirty-first day of August next following, provided—

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of tenements and lands within the respective Urban Districts and Urban Divisions as set out hereunder:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of such amount in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such tenement as is set down in column 2 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the Schedule hereto: Provided that the total amount of the rate payable annually for the supply of water as aforesaid to any such tenement shall be not less than the sum set down in column 3 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of such amount in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of such lands as is set down in column 2 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule: Provided that the total amount of the rate payable annually for the supply of water as aforesaid to any such lands shall be not less than the sum set down in column 4 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1942, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1943, and shall be payable on the 27th day of November, 1942, at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, at the place set down in column 6 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule.

3. The maximum quantity of water to be supplied per annum without further charge to properties rated by the Commission shall be the quantity which, if charged for at the amount per 1,000 gallons set down in column 5 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said schedule, would give an amount equal to that payable per annum in respect of the properties so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making and levying rates.

4. For all water supplied per annum in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in clause 3 of this By-law the charge shall be one shilling per 1,000 gallons.

Such charge shall be payable on demand at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at the place mentioned in column 6 opposite the name of the respective Urban District and Urban Division in column 1 of the said Schedule.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

(b) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Council in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

(c) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council is hereby fixed at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 30,000 gallons.

(d) The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Council.

6th year—at the rate of 89s. 6d. per week.

1st year—at the rate of 24s. 9d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 33s. 9d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 47s. 6d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 65s. 9d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 89s. 6d. per week."
