AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

- 1. him from the Council to mark such house or building with such number or name as the Council may direct or approve, or to renew the number or name thereof as aforesaid, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings, and the Council may cause such number or name to be so marked or renewed and recover the expense thereof from the owner or occupier of such house or building before any justice, and where such expense is paid by or recovered from the occupier he may deduct the same from any rent payable by him to the owner.

If such owner or occupier, after service on him of a notice to remove undergrowth, weeds, or grass as aforesaid, shall fail to do so within the time prescribed by such notice, the Council may cause such undergrowth, weeds or grass to be removed from such land, and may recover the cost of such removal from the owner or occupier in default.

4. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not less than Twenty shillings and not exceeding Twenty pounds for each and every offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence under the By-law is continued.
